## Senator Bulkley napada Newton D. Baker govori one, ki strašijo delavce radi dela v tovarnah

Porthsmouth, Ohio, 2. novembra. Nikdar ni bilo zbranih še toliko državljanov v tem mestu, kot jih je prišlo včeraj, ko je naznanil zvezni senator Bulkley svoj prihod. Tekom svojega govora je senator Bulkley napadal visoki tarif republikancev, kot vzrok, da smo si nakopali sovražstvo narodov in je tako nastala depresija, nakar je udrihal po onih republikanskih voditeljih, ki strašijo državljanje, češ, da ne bodo dela dobili, ako bo izvoljen demokrat. Bulkley je povdarjal, da je glasovnica tajna, da nihče ne more vedeti, kaj se voli, a z resnim glasom je povdarjal, da republikanci niso tekom zadnjih treh let mogli dobiti dela za ameriške delavce, ga bodo mogli še manj v bodočnosti, ker bodo vztrajali pri visokem tarifu, ki je pač ugoden za velekapitaliste, a delavcu trga delo. New York, 2. novembra. Newton D. Baker je sinoči pred ogromno množico naroda povdarjal, da če bo Franklin D. ## Država Ohio je znižala davke. Znižana vrednost za \$252,864,000

Državna davčna komisija v državi Ohio je v sredo ukazala, da se zniža davčna vrednost posestev v Clevelandu in okolici za 12.18 odstotkov, kar pomeni, da bodo posestniki plačevali od \$252,864,000 lastnine manj davkov. Ta odločitev davčne komisije je bila enoglasna, in razven če se kdo ne pritoži na sodnje, obstane. Vsa davkom podvržena lastnina v Cuyahoga county je precejnjena na \$1,920,000,000, in vrednost te lastnine je znižana za \$252,864,000, od te lastnine se ne bodo plačevali davki. Na davčnih listinah, ki jih dobi decembra meseca, boste opazili, da so vaši davki za približno od 10 do 13 procentov nižji, kot so bili doslej. Samo Clevelandčani bodo plačali manj davka na leto \$1,436,591, in enako tudi davkoplačevalci v East Clevelandu, Cleveland Heights, Lakewood in po drugih predmestjih. Računa se, da bodo ljudje raje plačevali znižane davke. Odločitev državne davčne komisije je izzvala vsepovsod splošno zadovoljstvo in priznanje.

## Bill Rogers svetuje

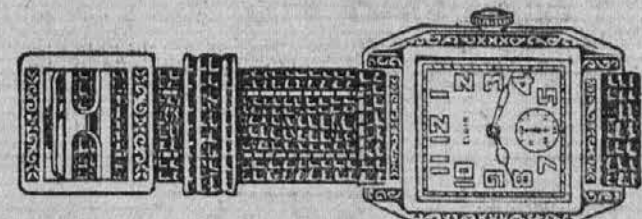

# GOV. WHITE SPEAKS AT S. N. HOME MONDAY

## Bulkley, Lausche, Boyd and Baker Also Scheduled to Talk on Election Eve

Both Halls Used to Accommodate Large Audience; Dr. William Lausche's Orchestra, Five Foot Harmony Four and Lausche-Udovic Duet Give Entertainment

The greatest galaxy of national and state figures to appear in the 23d Ward on any single occasion, will take the platform of the Slovenian National Home, St. Clair Ave., Monday night, Nov. 7, to address the local Democrats in behalf of the democratic presidential candidate Franklin D. Roosevelt and the entire Democratic state and county slates.

In order to accommodate the immense crowd expected to gather for the gigantic rally on the eve of the presidential election, both halls of the National Home have been reserved for the occasion, with a loudspeaker system carrying the speakers' voices to the audience in the lower hall of the auditorium.

For the first time in the history of the 23d Ward Democratic Club the governor of Ohio will address the members of the organization. The Hon. George White, Democratic candidate for reelection, has consented to make a special trip here and speak in behalf of the state Democratic slate. Not since James Cox addressed the community in 1920, at which time he was candidate for the presidency, has the ward had the opportunity of being host to such a distinguished speaker.

Gov. White's appearance here on election eve is all the more noteworthy in so much as he is breaking the time-honored custom of gubernatorial candidates in remaining in their home cities on the eve of the election.

Newton D. Baker, nationally known former secretary of war, is also scheduled to uphold the Democratic banner at this gathering. Prior to the 1932 Democratic convention in Chicago, many political powers and newspapers clamored to put Baker into the field for the presidency, but the Clevelanders modestly remained in the background and supported Al Smith for the nomination. With the nomination of Roosevelt, however, Baker fell in line and is now wholeheartedly behind the New York governor and the entire Democratic state and county slates.

Senator Robert J. Bulkley of Ohio, candidate for re-election and one of the most popular civic leaders in the state, will also appear before the gathering Monday night. With all straw votes indicating his re-election by a wide margin, Bulkley is devoting himself primarily to the support of Roosevelt and the Democratic state and county tickets.

Other familiar figures to address the group are Frank T. Cullitan, candidate for county prosecutor, and William Boyd, candidate for state representative. Both gentlemen are well known in this community for their past accomplishments.

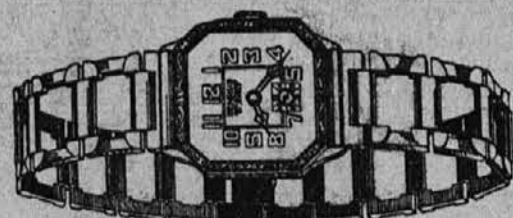
Tony Zagar vs. Al Hejna, 135 pounds. Wild Bill Jacobson will be one of the principals in a wrestling bout.
