LET THE PEOPLE SPEAK

Much is being said and written about post-war Europe, and there is pretty general agreement that some sort of federative principle will guide the peace-planners. But no one has yet attempted to outline the structure of this federation, or to think in terms of who is to operate it.

It is altogether likely that European federation will boom large at the peace-conference table. But who will sit at this table as representatives of the national States? With few exceptions, the pre-war States were ruled by economically strong groups whose idea of State sovereignty was protection of their own class interests. Any attack on this sovereignty was and still is regarded by these ruling classes as an act of desecration tending to limit their thus-far limitless power. The make-up of the eight or ten Governments or national committees which "rule" from London, with London's recognition and support, has not altered this in any respect.

New Social Content

It is not enough to mouth "federation." Germany was a federation, as was the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Mankind will not take one forward step if the new federations are to be scarred with the old social make-up. The new federations must be filled with a new content, a strongly socialized content. A federation must have a degree of control over its parts, and the right to interfere, within determined limits, in their activities. It is here that one runs up against the problem of sovereignty, which for so many existing Governments has come to serve as a screen for class-interest, class-exploitation, and intolerance.

The idea of State sovereignty must be abandoned, and the present Governments replaced by representatives of the workers. The war must not blind the workers to this truth. Men must be made to realize that all their unbelievable suffering and sacrifice will have been of no avail if the "rearrangement" of the world be left to those who gave birth to the Hitlerian monster, and through it, to the present war.

All socialist and truly national parties should make it part of their agenda to depose the present Governments, and see to it that representatives of the bulk of the nation be seated at the peace conference. Let the people speak!

A release to the press from the State Department acknowledges receipt by the White House of over 200 telegrams from foreign-born groups and individuals expressing eagerness to accept responsibilities and fulfill duties in the pursuit of the war effort.
