Chicago St. Aloysius Scores Upset, Trips Fast St. Michaels in Midwest Circuit

WAUKEGANITES TRIP BARAGAS; STEVE-FLORIAN TILT SHELVED; DROP FIRST ROUND CURTAIN

Three Teams in Virtual Tie for First Place Position; Second Half to Get Under Way Sunday

With what meager information we have received regarding the St. Michael and St. Aloysius baseball game played at Trumbull Park Sunday, June 23, it has been definitely established that the St. Als scored an upset by defeating the first place St. Michaels by a score of 4 to 3. This surprising turn of events has tumbled the league headlong into another perplexing situation which finds three teams in a tentative tie for first place honors, with only the percentage column and the number of games played to make the difference.

Though the details of the game are not available, we know that the pitching of Frank Ribich and the bat of J. Kovacic figured largely in the victory for the St. Als. The game was nip and tuck until the fifth, when Kovacic unleashed a home run with two on board to sew up the contest. The St. Michael crew threatened in the ninth, but their rally fell short, largely due to the relief pitching of Kovacic. Mlinarich worked on the mound for the Mikes.

Joel Beat Baragas, 5 to 2
The Waukegan St. Joel rang up their second win when they took the Milwaukee Baragites into camp in a game played at West Allis, the score being 5 to 2. The funny part of it is that the Waukeganites achieved a victory on exactly two hits. These hits, however, were of a timely variety.

Through the aid of an error, two walks and a single by Repp, the St. Joels scored two runs in the fourth. Going into the ninth, with score knotted 2-all, the Waukeganers forged ahead when Frank Ogrin walloped a terrific home run to tally three runs.

The Milwaukee hitting attack was a bit stronger, though quite fruitless, for they only obtained only two runs on seven hits off Petrovic. Stanley Winkler led his mates with two hits, one a triple in the ninth to account for the tie score. Fred Grahek worked on the mound for the Baragites. It was his wildness and a bit of ragged support that determined the count against him.

A DEFINITION OF PATRIOTISM

The following beautiful definition of patriotism was given many years ago by the Rev. L. J. O'Hern, D. D., at a Field Mass celebrated at the Training Station, U. S. Navy Yard, Norfolk, Va. In this month which marks Independence Day it may be considered timely to again call it to the attention of our readers:

"Were I asked for a definition of Patriotism, I should define it as Love of Country, and Loyalty to its life and interests—love tender and strong; tender as the love of a son for his mother, strong as the pillars of Hercules; loyal, generous and disinterested, shrinking from no sacrifice, seeking no reward save the nation's honor and the country's good.

"It is that return of affection which every loyal citizen is bound to make to the state, for the benefits received from and through her.

"It is like the filial devotion which a grateful child offers to its parents.

"It is, therefore, not a matter of mere sentiment, but a duty building to faithful service. Consequently an unpatriotic citizen is like an unworthy son, who lifts his hand against the mother who bore him.

"The first evidence of genuine patriotism is a spirit of unflinching loyalty to those who represent authority, whether we happen to agree with their policy or not. This loyalty springs from that respect for authority which must be a first principle to every citizen worthy of the name. And lastly, patriotism exacts obedience as a duty, no matter whether that duty may lead. It is the very essence of unselfishness, for the patriot puts aside his own interest when the welfare of his country is at stake."

held in San Francisco in 1938. St. Edward's University has already agreed to be represented there. The college hopes to present at that time the largest possible Symphonic Tamburitza Orchestra. It will be composed of all students attending St. Edward's at that time and those who have graduated and who have played in one of the tamburitza orchestras here.

We are trying, therefore, to get the names of all young men in high school or out of high school who are interested in studying tamburitza music, Yugoslav literature and history. As an officer of a Yugoslav lodge I feel sure that you will be glad to bring this matter to the attention of your members and to send us the names and addresses of young men who can now play the tamburitza or who want to learn to play. Mr. Matthew G. Gouze, formerly of Ely, Minn., who was chosen to serve as the concert master of the World's Fair Tamburitza Orchestra two years ago, has been secured by the college to offer instruction in tamburitza playing, musical harmony, and history.

Living expenses at St. Edward's are less than at most American colleges. Boys with exceptional talent will be given an opportunity to work part of their way through college. But remember this, that all who come will be given instruction in tamburitza playing free of charge.

One more point. We can also use young men who can sing very well. With the large tamburitza orchestra, for which we are making plans, we want to have a choral club of about 32 voices. We want to sing songs of the best Yugoslav choral numbers, operatic airs, and folk-songs.
