Vigorous plans are now being made toward conservation of neighborhoods and the curbing of blighted areas, for it is finally being realized that even a city cannot afford to ignore the conditions of its neighborhoods for any length of time without feeling serious effects!

Building Commissioner William D. Guion states: "We believe that the area council, which is organized right down to street units, can do more than the law in bringing about improvements. The Hough area has an excellent setup whereby each street is represented at the meetings by block leaders who report the activities of the area council to the residents of their respective streets.
