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Lojalno vojaštvo zasedlo gorovje v bližini Madrida

VROČE BITKE V SEVILLI

Madrid, 28. jul. — Vladno poročilo se glasi, da je situacija v guvernerskem gorovju, ki se razteza 50 milj severno od Madrida, zadovoljiva. Premier Jose Giral, ki se je včeraj vrnil s fronte v Madrid, je izjavil, da so se rebeli umaknili in vladne čete jih sedaj zasledujejo. Druga poročila naglašajo, da so se pekovski delavci dobro izkazali v akciji, kakor tudi cestni železničarji. Okoli 60 bikoborcev, med temi tudi ženska Pilar Rodriguez, se je pridružil vladnim četam.

Stotnik Ambrosio Ristori, poveljnik vladnih čet, je dejal, da se je večje število fašističnih rebelov utaborilo na nasprotni strani Alto de Leona, odkoder so bili preganjeni prejšnji dan. Ti so imeli strelci in sedaj iz zasede napadajo vladne čete. Bolnišnice Rodegasa križajo so silno zapolene v tem kraju, ker morajo skrbeti za okrog dva tisoč ranenih vojakov.

Dovoz živil in potrebnih vladnim četam je tedaj problem. Delo je bil rešen, ko je vlada začela pobirati govejo žvino, koloni in druge potrebščine v kmetijskih vaseh in zagotovila kmete, da bodo prejeli odškodnino.

Državna milica in lojalne čete sedaj pomikajo proti Saragosi. Ena kolona je že dosegla mesto Sigüenza, ki je oddaljeno sto milj od Madrida. Saragosa je pod kontrolno rebelov, katerim poveljuje general Cabanellas. Druga kolona lojalnega vojaštva je odšla iz Valencije proti Terzolu, tretja, ki je bila mobilizirana v Barceloni, pa je včeraj zasedla mesto Caspe, ki leži 75 milj južno od Saragose.

Vladne čete kontrolirajo ozeblje centralne Španije in vzhodno obrežje, fašistični rebeli pa so izmed 50 provinc. Samo tri provinc — Seville, Cadiz in Huelva — so na jugu, druge so vse na severu.

Vlada je naznanila padec vojaških barak v Alcazarju in militaristične akademije v Toledu. Barake in akademiji, ki so bile v rokah rebelov, so podlegle bombardiranjem iz zraka. Ostali del mesta so vladne čete že prejele. Trdnjava, ki se je dvigala ob reki Tagus, je bila porušena v teku bombardiranja. Okoli 1500 rebelov, ki so se skrili v podzemskih hodnikih trdnjave, se je podalo.

Vladna enota 7500 mož, ki je izšla iz soboto pregnala rebelo iz Alcazara in zasedla mesto, se je pridružil lojalnim četam, ki napadajo Cordoba, rebelno trdnjavo. Te so včeraj bombardirale trdnjavo.

Druga lojalna armada se pomika proti Seville, ki jo okupirajo rebeli v začetku revolucije. Madridska vlada pravi, da so prve čete dosegle mesto in sedaj se tam vrše vroče polnočne bitke.

Nekaj vprašanj na br. Keržeta

Stavka farmskih delavcev v Californiji

Federalne avtoritete podpirajo veleposelstnike

Santa Ana, Cal. — (FP) — Veleposelstniki so napovedali vojno poljedelcem delavcem, ki so zastavljali za zvišanje mezde 30 centov na uro v okraju Orange, v nekdanji trdnjavi kukuksklastov. Pri zatiranju stavke so delujejo najeti pobojniki, šerifski deputiji in državna milica. Nočni jezdec so nedavno razbili shod stavkarjev v Palcienti in pretepli govornike. Trinajst stavkarjev je bilo v navalu aretiranih in obtoženih kaljenja miru.

Delavske organizacije v Los Angelesu so poslane zivila stavkarjem, toda deputiji so ustavili tovorne avte, na katerih so bila živila, ko so dospeli v stavkovno okraj. "Western Workers", glasilo delavskih unij v San Franciscu, poroča o izgonu organizatorjev unije poljedelških delavcev iz Fullertona in Medine.

Stavkarji, po večini mehiški in filipinski delavci, pravijo, da tudi federalne avtoritete pomagajo veleposelstnikom pri zatiranju stavke. Federalna uprava vladna v Santa Ani je poslala večje število stavkokazov v stavkovno okraj, imigracijski urad v južni Californiji pa je naznanil, da bo deportiral vse nedržavljanke, ki posivajo poljedelške delavce v boj proti izkoriščevalcem.

V stavki v okraju Santa Ana, ki je izbruhnil pred dvema tednoma, je prejevanih nad dva tisoč delavcev.

Kompanija kapitulirala pred unijo

Konec dolge borbe proti organiziranemu delavstvu

Battle Creek, Mich. — Mednarodna zveza strojnikov je izvajala znatno zmago, ko je Duplex Printing Press Co. priznala krajevno unijo in podpisala pogodbo. Dolga leta se je kompanija odločno upirala kolektivnemu pogajanju in s tem izvajala serijo stavk. Proti uniji se je borila tudi na sodiščih, a končno je morala kapitulirati.

Pravkar podpisana pogodba določa zvišanje mezde deset do dvajset odstotkov in uposlitev vseh delavcev, ki so bili odpusteni v zadnjih mesecih zaradi njihovih aktivnosti. Vsem tem bo družba plačala mezdo za ves čas, ko so bili brez dela. Pogodba določa nadaljnje zvišanje mezd pet odstotkov 1. januarja prihodnjega leta.

S padcem te protiunijake trdnjave je unija strojnikov izvajala priznanje v vsej industriji tiskarskih strojev.

New York, 28. jul. — Okrog šest tisoč oseb, ki so bile odvisne od javne podpore, je dobilo delo v privatnih industrijah v mesecu juniju, se glasi poročilo, ki ga je pravkar objavila Charlotte E. Carr, direktorica newyorške relifne administracije. Elmer F. Andrews, državni industrijski komisar, je istočasno naznanil, da je državni uposeljalni urad preskrbel delo v privatnih industrijah 77,168 osebam v prvi polovici tega leta. To pomeni porast 45.7% v primeri z isto dobo preteklega leta.

IZJAVE TREH VODITELJEV

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Voditelji organiziranega delavstva pravijo, da je governor Landon, predsedniški kandidat republikanske stranke, v svojem govoru, ko je sprejel nominacijo, jasno pokazal, da je na strani ameriških plutokratov. Francis J. Gorman, podpredsednik unije tekstilnih delavcev, je dejal, da je Landon ponovil besede ječlarskega in šezarskega instituta, organizacije ječlarskega trasta, ko je dejal, da je on naklonjen organiziranju delavcev, a to se mora izvršiti brez pritiska s katerekoli strani.

"Kolikor se tiče naše unije", je dejal Gorman, "bo povečala svoje aktivnosti. Njen cilj je organiziranje vseh delavcev v tekstilni industriji. Protijunijake stališče, ki ga je zavzel Landon, glavni predstavnik Wall streeta in Ameriške lige svobode, je dokazuje, da se moramo pripraviti na obrambo svojih pravic, ki smo jih izvojevali s težkimi žrtvami v zadnjih letih."

John L. Lewis, predsednik rudarske unije in član Delavske neustrankarske lige, je rekel, "da delavska točka v programu republikanske stranke ne bo zapeljala nobenega delavca."

Woolworth Co. izhazuje velike profite

Washington, D. C. — Woolworth Co., lastnica velikega števila petcentnih in desetcentnih prodajaln v Združenih državah in Kanadi, je imela preteklo leto \$31,247,000 profita, kar kaže poročilo, ki ga je pravkar objavila federalna borzna komisija. Kljub protestu s strani kompanij. To pomeni, da je družba naredila \$100,000 dobička dnevno v preteklem letu, da bi stalno kričali, da ne more plačevati dostojnih mezd dekletom, ki so uposlene v njenih prodajalnah. Tem plačuje le \$8 do \$10 na teden. Isto poročilo naglašja, da so direktorji prejeli poleg visokih plač tudi nagrade v skupni vsoti \$1,143,321. Direktor B. D. Miller je dobil \$309,880, W. J. Rand \$113,726 in J. E. Hollis \$88,743.

Razvoj kmetijskih zadrug na Danskem

Letni promet mlekarne je sto milijonov dolarjev

Copenhagen, Danaka, 28. jul. — Ameriška komisija, katero je predsednik Roosevelt poslal v Evropo, da proučuje zadrugništvo, je sedaj dobila prve podatke o razmahu kmetijskih zadrug na Danskem.

Komisija je včeraj dospela v Copenhagen iz Švedske, kjer je študirala industrijsko zadrugništvo. Tu je dobila informacije o velikem prometu kmetijskih zadrug, ki kontrolirajo lavos in prodajanje poljskih pridelkov. Danaka se ponaša s svojimi kmetikimi zadrugami, ki so bolj razvite kakor v katerikoli drugi državi.

Voditelji zadrugnega gibanja so komisiji povedali, da imajo mlekarne zadrug 190,000 članov med 206,000 kmeti. Poleg mlekarne imajo kmetje kupovalne in razpečevalne zadrug ter tovarne umetnih gnojil. Kokoljereji so tudi dobro organizirani.

Prva zadruga mlekarne na Danskem je bila ustanovljena l. 1882, danes pa zadruga mlekarne kontrolirajo 90 odstotkov vsakega lavosa masla in njih letni promet znaša \$100,000,000. Zadruga, ki razpečavajo špeh, izkazujejo \$95,000,000 prometa na leto. Kupovalne in razpečevalne enote danskih kmetov so združene v centralni organizaciji — v zvezi danskih zadrugnih društev.

Zadruga kreditna društva so tudi v veliko pomoč kmetom. Ta dajejo kmetom, ki hočejo izboljšati svoje kmetije, posojila do 60 odstotkov ocenjene vrednosti njihovih zemljišč.

Rooseveltova komisija, ki jo tvorijo Jacob Baker, Leland Olds in Charles E. Stuart, se bo mudila na Danskem en teden in proučevala zadrugništvo, nakar bo odpotovala v Zenevo.

V Evropo se vrača demokracija, pravi delavski vodja

FAŠISTI V DEFENZIVI

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — "Fašistični val, ki je ogražal vse evropske države, je zadel ob pečine in demokracija je apet na pohodu", je dejal M. H. Hedges, član izekutivnega odbora Mednarodne bratovščine električarjev, ob svojem povratku iz Evrope. "Zasluga za to gre francoskim delavcem. Odločno stališče, ki so ga zavzeli francoski delavci, ni samo preprečilo fašistične diktature v Franciji, temveč tudi v Belgiji, Švici in na Holandskem."

Hedges se je udeležil mednarodne delavske konference v Ženevi kot reprezentant ameriškega organiziranega delavstva in potem obiskal več evropskih držav. "Zastopniki delavstva, ki so se udeležili šenevske konference, so trdno uverjeni, da se demokracija vrača v Evropo in da bodo fašistične diktature kmalu strmoglavljene", je dejal Hedges. "Nemčija in Italija, glavni fašistični trdnjavi v Evropi, se majata. Zmaga francoskega delavstva je vili novega poguma zatiranim in znamenja kažejo, da bo ljudstvo strmoglavilo svoje tlačitelje."

To dejstvo je tako očitno, da ga ne more nobena zdrava pamet utajiti, hkrati pa je boleče za marsikoga med nami. Iskrena samokritika je zmirom boleča, ne sme pa biti dvoma, da ni potrebna.

Naš zadnji članek je bil le uvod v razpravo — ki je lahko dolga, mora pa biti dosledno stvarna — o našem bolečem problemu. Ta uvod je morda postavil marsikoga pred zagonetko, kaj prav za prav hočemo povedati. Dvoumnosti ne sme biti in skrivalec tudi ne, zato bomo nadaljevali te članke.

Da bomo na jasnem, je treba osvetliti nekatere pojme. Naše stališče glede političnih aktivnosti med slovenskimi delavci v Združenih državah se ni prav nič spremenilo. Ker verujemo v demokracijo, verujemo tudi, da se mora delavski boj v glavnem usmeriti v politično akcijo. Pribili smo že zadnjič, da o iskrenosti, poštenosti in najboljnjih namenih te politične akcije, ki jo vodijo naše politične skupine, ni najmanjšega dvoma; to se pravi, da nihče med nami ne išče kakih osebnih koristi od tega gibanja. Kljub najboljši volji, prizadevanju, nesebičnemu delu, idealizmu in veliki poštenosti — nismo in ne bomo dosegli nič toliko časa, dokler se velika ameriška delavska masa ne poloti te akcije. Zaman je vse delo in vse žrtve, dokler se ta masa ne briga za lastno politiko in dokler to politiko vodijo priseljenci s peščico domačih bojevnikov, veliko premajhno peščico in še ta je pomešana z idealisti, ki se bolj zanimajo za teorije kakor za praktično delo in raje sanjajo o nasilni revoluciji kakor o potrebni izobrazbi zabitega ameriškega delavca.

Pravilno dihanje

Nad 3000 let star kitajski pregovor pravi: "Globoko dihanje čisti razum in podaljšuje življenje." A tudi drugi stari kulturni narodi so se bavili z intenzivnim proučevanjem dihanja. V Indiji so spravičali dihanje celo v vazo z vero in jogiji so morali del svojega vadbenega življenja uporabljati za dihalno gimnastiko. Tako so morali n. pr. izmenoma vdihavati skozi eno nosnico in izdihavati skozi drugo, pa so bili (in so še danes) priprani da vdihavajo na ta način "vesoljno silo".

Cepprav mi ne verjamemo v takšna mistična ozadja dihanja, vendar vemo, da nam daje življenje neobhodno potrebni sveži, kisli kisli zrak. Globoko dihanje pa ima še druge učinke. Kisik, ki ga vsrkavamo z vsakim dihom, rabi pred vsem za preosnovno produktov, ki nastajajo s mišičnim delom, in pripravlja tako mišice za novo delovanje. Globoko dihanje odpravlja porabljeni kri iz posameznih organov in jo nadomešča s svežo krvjo.

Prani koš deluje kakor gumast balon z dve ma odprtina. Prva je namenjena zračni mu, druga krvnemu dovodu. Čim manjša je odprtina za zrak, tem več krvi morajo pljuča pri razširjanju med vdihavanjem vskakati in na robe. Zato je dihanje z odprtimi usti, ki so do večja nego nosnice, nad vse škodljivo. Varkavanje krvi iz organov se pri dihanju z ust otežuje in zmanjšuje, dihanje skozi nos pa spravlja več krvi v prsni koš. To lahko sam preizkusimo s tem, da dihamo nekaj časa z usti. Če potem nenadno začnemo dihati z nosom, občutimo sploščeno majhno omedlevico, izvirajo od tod, da se kri močneje odpravlja iz možganov. Če dihamo skozi eno samo nosnico se krvni tok skozi možgane še bolj pospeši. Je giji so, kakor rečeno, to vrsto dihanja prakticirali, da bi dosegli boljše duševno zmogljivost. Tudi mi položimo včasih kadar mišlimo nehoče prst na nos in zožimo s tem eno nosnico. V nasprotju s tem so zelo malo inteligentni obrazci nekih otrok, ki imajo izrastke v nosu in so prisiljeni dihati skozi usta.

Že pri normalnem dihanju opazimo v Roentgenovi sliki, da je senca srca pri vdihavanju večja, pri izdihavanju manjša. Pri globljem dihanju so velikostne razlike še večje. Globoko vdihavanje spravlja več krvi v srce, srce more opravljati večje delo. Pri dobrem izdihavanju se potem srce tem bolje sprosti, posebno če dihamo sunkovito. To lahko izkoristimo v neko vrsto srčne gimnastike, če hočemo posamezne dele srčnega delovanja podpreti, posebej če jih srce zavoljo obolenj ne zmore več polnem obsegu.

Timely Thoughts

800 New Juveniles

That's the net result of the campaign for first three months.—According to official figures released in the organ last week, the first three months of the present Juvenile Membership Campaign, ending June 30, have brought in approximately 800 new juveniles or, to be exact, 788.

The official announcement jubilantly states that whenever the members of our Society determine to do things they always accomplish them successfully. This they have clearly demonstrated anew during the current drive for new juvenile members. The result accomplished thus far is convincing enough to believe that at the end of the campaign our Society will again pass the 50,000 mark, in both departments. But in order to attain this goal we must at once decide to enlist every eligible youngster into our Juvenile Department.

ONE MORE THING. We noticed, with considerable regret, that on the list of twelve lodges and individual members who succeeded in procuring the greatest number of new juvenile members for June, not a single English speaking lodge or individual belonging to ESL is represented! Why? Can it be the heat? Or the drought? Or the dull summer period? Remember that the senior lodges and individual members active in the campaign are not immune to these natural calamities. It simply means that you'll have to step on it. It is up to you ESL members to speak up now—with actual results! Remember that the future of your lodge very largely depends upon the number of juveniles on your lodge roster.

Impulse Obeyed

Just a word or two about good intentions. The other day an auto driver "intended" to stop at a railroad crossing. He even "intended" to slow down and to put on the brakes—but he didn't. There was a terrific smash-up and he lost his life. Had he obeyed his first impulse, he would have avoided the smash-up. We know people who always intend to get busy, but they couldn't stand the heat, nor the rain, nor the cold, nor the wind... and their "good intentions" never amount to anything.

On the other hand, there are some people who have the best of intentions but the trouble with them is that they become too easily discouraged. They are readily content to let things drift, trusting in some "supernatural" power to provide ways and means.

ALL TOO OFTEN good intentions are lost in indifference. If we once tackle a proposition and are bound and determined to go through with it, we'll often find that results are surprisingly good. There are many worthy things we intend to do, but often fail to do them. For instance, to speak to some one we know, about becoming protected in the Slovene National Benefit Society and about insuring his children in it during the present campaign. Also, to solicit new subscribers to the Daily Prosveta.

It is mainly a matter of intention followed by performance. The impulse of good intentions should be obeyed immediately, and in most cases it will bring forth good results.

Women's Business

We'll make an exception and say a word or two about women, or rather, to be more precise, about "Contemporary American Women Poets," a book of comprehensive anthology, containing the work of 1,311 poets, edited by Tooni Gordi.

It is a known fact that women in this country are active in practically every field of endeavor. They are active in strikes, labor parades, in science, art, politics, as well as in the kitchen, the nursery, etc. At any rate, the above-mentioned anthology reveals few love poems as per the reviewer Jos. Shipley in the July 25 New Leader, but it does reveal a surprising number of poems on social themes.

PROMINENTLY REPRESENTED are the well-known names—Edna Milley, Margaret Widdemer, Lucia Trent, Harriet Monroe, and others. More important than the names is the fact that one could gather from this book an excellent collection of labor poems. Babette Deutch has a vehement poem on Sacco and Vanzetti, while Mary Sinton Leitch's and others' in that category are aimed at lynching; lost and won strikes; against injustices; etc., etc. From these labor poems, in the reviewer's opinion, "emerges a quiet insistence on seeing the world as it is and on having the woman's share in it, and in the struggle to make it a world habitable for self-respecting humans."

Social Consciousness

Whenever we speak of social consciousness, we include all workers—factory, miners, railroad, sailors, white collar, small merchants, laboratory, and all.

Social consciousness or mindedness—a feeling for others—is the prime necessity of all workers. Without a sincere and deep social consciousness a workers' victory will never materialize and we will not witness a real collective society.

Capitalists cannot be socially-conscious if they are true to themselves and to their capitalistic end and means. Let us not look for it where it does not exist and where it cannot be. We must, however, inquire why there is not more social consciousness among workers.

Among American workers there still prevails the individualistic interest, that is, — each for himself regardless of the other fellow. Everyday experience should have convinced the masses that individualism in the economic world is already dead. Modern, mechanical, mass production of necessities is social by its very nature from the fact that everyone is included in the system of production by performing a certain part of his work. Why has not the American worker awakened to this fact? Because he looks only at the means of production and the product, and these two are still in the hands of individuals and individual groups; he cannot comprehend the social nature of production and sees only the result—the private capital.

This economic contradiction is confusing and misleading. In other words, the average worker has accustomed himself to think in terms of his predecessors generations ago, before the era of social production while all of this was performed individually. This shows how slowly average person changes his mind and concepts. The average American still looks at economic production through the eyes of the middle nineteenth century; the American capitalist through careful use of every means of culture safeguards the old economic theory as long as possible. This is the pillar upon which private capitalism hinges!

In the age of individual production, when everyone produced for his own needs, private ownership of tools and product was logical. That theory ceases to be logical when capital produced on a large scale is socially-produced.

The logical development of economic needs is that socially-produced capital must also be socially-owned capital! This is the only practical solution of the present economic crises.

As long as the mass of the American workers will live under the delusion that every worker is a potential capitalist if he so desires—thinking in terms of individual production which no longer exists—so long will live the greatest contradiction in the history of mankind: a system of social production of necessities with a private ownership of capital and product.

To remove this contradiction, social consciousness is necessary. It is necessary that the workers begin to think in terms of group interests of all the workers, instead of their own, personal. This is the key to the solution of the economic question.

American economy will never again be individualistic. This passed away forever with the advent of machines and mass production. He who still thinks in terms of economic individualism is fully 80 years behind modern times. He is in a true sense backward, even though he is unconscious of the fact and cannot be responsible for his ignorance.

Those who continuously strive to awaken their fellow workers to social consciousness are the best educators. Keep up this good work until the end of your day!

Pauperism and Recovery

No one with any sense of social responsibility should permit himself to be deceived by the stories of increased industrial activity which defenders of Roosevelt policies like to repeat.

The fact is that business has shown an improvement. Especially has this improvement been noted by the owning class, who have seen their profits rise to and beyond pre-depression figures. But there is the further fact that—

While business booms the number of Americans who need and receive some form of relief is not shrinking.

Private industry prospering while millions of people are jobless! What does this mean?

It means that Capitalism has decided to get along without the people whom they do not need. It means that there is being formed a new economic class, a class neither master nor slave, a dependent class which must be taken care of—and ruled and regulated.

With the development of modern machinery the millions who are now unemployed have no real right to ever hope for another honest job. Young men and young women are facing the future with strong chances of entering the class of dependents. Human and moral values are degenerating even while private business grows more prosperous.

And this condition means something else. It means that—

Unless the army of dependents is increased private industry is headed for another collapse—and another and another until the final crash ends in the destruction of civilization itself.

Only the blind will find hope in a business revival which leaves a third of the nation's population out of the picture. Only "liberals" with a supreme contempt for the intelligence and self-respect of the exploited working class would advance such prosperity as a campaign argument.—Reading Labor Advocate.

Unemployment Insurance in Wisconsin

With continued attacks made by subversives on the principle of unemployment insurance given tangible form in the Federal Social Security Law enacted by congress last year, it is interesting to note that unemployment insurance legislation went into effect in Wisconsin the forepart of July without any of the disruptive effects on business in that state which would have naturally resulted if the lamentations of the reactionary Jeremiahs had any legitimate basis.

The Wisconsin law affects approximately 3,000 employers and brings under its scope 400,000 workers, who are eligible for benefits if they lose their jobs and earn an average of \$1,500 a year or less.

Other states have placed unemployment insurance laws on their statute books since the enactment of the Federal law, but none of the benefits prescribed are payable to the jobless until next year or later. The benefits under the Wisconsin law became effective the first of July and gives that state the honor of being the first one with unemployment compensation legislation in complete operation.

The Wisconsin law was enacted in 1931, but because of the business depression the 2 per cent payroll tax levied upon employers did not begin until 1934. These assessments, segregated in separate reserve accounts, now total \$12,000,000. It is from this fund that jobless workers will be compensated.

The minimum unemployment benefit is \$5 a week. The minimum is increased to \$10 for those whose full-time pay is \$25 a week; to \$12.50 for an average pay of \$25 to \$30 a week, and to \$15, the highest rate, for workers who normally are paid \$30 a week.

The duration of the unemployment compensation depends on how long an employee has worked for his employer after the probationary service period prescribed by the law has expired.

Unemployment insurance has been advocated by the American Federation of Labor for a number of years. The operation of the Wisconsin law will be watched with considerable interest by organized Labor and other progressive movements.—Minn. Union Advocate.

Give the Judges Their Due

Let's give the Devil his due, and say a good word for the courts when we can. Two opportunities just now present themselves.

Out in California a high school student was suspended for refusing to salute the flag. Her father applied to the Superior Court for a mandamus compelling the school board to reinstate her. In granting such an order the judge declared that legal compulsion to salute the flag is an infringement of "the liberty guaranteed by the federal and state constitutions."

Women's Round-Table

What Does It Mean?

Every woman should be seriously concerned with the recent Supreme court decision which declared that the New York state minimum wage law for women is unconstitutional.

It means that employers will have the right to hire and exploit women for as low as they wish without any interference from state or Federal governments.

It means that the pay of many laundry workers has already been cut from \$15.40 a week to \$8 and \$6 a week.

It means that in some beauty parlors operators are being hired for as low as \$3 a week.

It means that waitresses were cut from \$7.25 a week to \$5.10 a week.

It means that all women will have a full share of liberty (!): those who try to get rid of unearned millions on foreign princes and those who stand all day long at the mangle machines under the sharp eyes of foreman for \$4 a week.

It means that employers in other states will not be slow to follow New York in effecting a similar wage reduction.

It means that Luciano's or Capone's vice ring will be able to thrive quite well regardless of whether these gentlemen happen to be in the house or not. The name of the leaders is not important. The conditions for such rackets are made fertile. Can you imagine any girl being able to live in a city decently with \$3 or \$6 or \$8 a week wages?

What is the way out for these working women and others like

them? Organization! Unions! A cooperative demand for decent wages and working hours! It'll be a long, hard fight, but one that is bound to come.

The Chicago Pioneers have set another precedent of which they can be justly proud. Their last picnic emphasized strictly all union-made goods. No other brands of cigars, cigarettes, or bread were bought, despite the fact that we had tempting offers from non-union concerns by way of putting on an advertising campaign that would doubtless have brought in a bigger attendance.

While the Big Four continue to grind out fabulous profits from their highly-touted brands, regarding workers as merely a part of plant equipment, the union brands use the union label as a guarantee of union wages, union hours and recognition of collective bargaining.

Collective bargaining is the basis of all fair Labor relations.

It is the tap root and the foundation of a sound industrial structure. It is the thing most hated by profit-hungry, despotic employers, such as the United States Steel Corporation and the big four tobacco companies.

Every unionized plant or industry helps not only those immediately employed; it helps Labor everywhere. The first union was established at tremendous sacrifice. Compared to that, the last union was established with ease. The first union was established in defiance of public sentiment. The last union had public sentiment with it.

Every union helps every union. Patronize the products and services of every union. Look for the label and demand it until you get it. On cigarettes it is easy, for every leading place carries the union brands. On some other things it is harder to get, but persistent demand will help to bring more unions into being. Use your buying power to build unionism.

In New Jersey a woman teacher was dismissed for getting married. A high court has ordered that she be reinstated, on the ground that a law or rule forbidding female teachers to marry is unconstitutional, as depriving them of rights or interests without due process of law.

To refuse to salute the flag is, we think, rather silly. But it is much sillier, and wicked besides, for the state to try to make hypocrites of our boys and girls by compelling them to express a regard for the national emblem which they do not really feel.

As for the rule excluding married women from the teaching staff of our public schools it is utterly stupid as well as unjust. Other things being equal, a woman who has the emotional experience of married love and of maturity is a better teacher than one whose life is not thus enriched.

So all judges are not lacking in a social conscience. Here and there one speaks and acts in accord with equity and the ideals of democracy.—T. N. L.
