## Obiralci bombaža zmagali v stavki

Izvojevali so višje place in druge pridobitve

Memphis, Tenn. — (FP) —

"Sedeča" stavka 20,000 obiralcev bombaža v Oklahoma, Alabami in Arkansusu je bila uspešna.

Stavko je vodila unija Southern Tenant Farmers, včlanjena v uniji United Cannery,

Agricultural, Packing & Allied Workers (CIO). Obiralci so se

Through the medium of "Glas Svobode," a Slovene weekly, the idea spread and the leading elements began negotiations which resulted in calling a convention in Chicago for April 6, 1903. Ten delegates of Slavija, one of Triglav, La Salle, and one from Johnstown, Pa., representing Adria Lodge, constituted this convention. The delegates of Slavija represented also six other lodges which could not afford to send their own representatives.

### The American Baseball War—Better Than Any Bomb Crashing, Yet Full of Misgivings

The American newspapers have for days headlined — not the battles of China, Spain, or the one-sided Nazi-Czech affair, but the "mighty battles" on the home baseball front — the current World Series which usually stir this country every October.

The interest manifested by the American public in this "Civil War," the excitement of the people of all classes, ages, and of both sexes in disregarding all other news and eagerly watching the headlines of the sports reports and listening in on the radio to these items only — is something that utterly defies description, something that a disinterested observer cannot understand.

Anyone with no interest whatsoever in sports, and to whom the names "Cubs," "Yankees," etc., may mean as much as Mei-Mei-Mong in far-off China, and lacking a good sense of humor, may feel thoroughly disgusted in scanning the first page of his favorite paper and not finding his favorite news. Another more patient will shrug his shoulders and laugh it off.

It is true that regardless of what one may think or say, this kind of "war" is infinitely better than any war that the other parts of the world are chronically addicted to. It is far better to read a headline, no matter how dry or meaningless, about World Series fans crashing each other about than — bombs crashing through the New York or Chicago skyscrapers . . .

Yet, all is not clean fun that parades under the banners of sports. There is much — and the American press is not mum about it — business, crooked business, in this yelling, banging, and hitting for titles and trophies.

While glancing at this grand clash in general, we cannot help thinking about our own sports business in the SNPJ. Nothing among us can be compared to the enormous scale just witnessed; nothing of that bigger sports world can reflect upon us. Ours is only entertainment, pure and simple, with the view of helping the Society and pushing it over the road of progress.

But even this tiny bit of athletic endeavor in the SNPJ must follow the rules of — fair play. Trouble is likely to arise — and we have had some experience of this kind lately — whenever and wherever these rules were broken. A member having no sense of fair play should keep his hands off the Society athletics.

## Features of the New Insurance

It is evident that many of our members do not thoroughly understand the provisions and features of the new insurance. We can readily understand this as it is more complicated than the old insurance was, therefore, the following explanation is again published, which should be carefully read by all members. It would be advisable, especially for lodge officers, to save this article and in case of necessity read it over again.

Certificate D contains the following provisions:

**1. ASSESSMENT LOAN:** After a certificate has been in force for 3 years or more, and provided the assessment of the member has been paid during that period, if for some reason or other such member is not able to continue with payments, he may apply for a loan against his reserve. The amount of reserve is not alike for all members; it depends upon the amount of death benefit insurance carried by the members number of years that certificate was in force, and the age rate. For instance, if the age rate is 24 years and the amount of insurance \$1000, after a membership period of 3 years, a member may borrow up to the sum of \$12.72 against his certificate. The necessary application for assessment loan must be filed for this purpose, which can be secured from the Main office through the local lodge secretary upon request. A loan for assessment shall not be granted upon one application for more than 6 months at a time, and this loan should never exceed the amount of the reserve. An annual interest rate of 4% shall be charged each half year against the amount of the loan. In the event that a loan is not refunded to the Society before the death of a member, it shall be deducted from his death benefit insurance upon his death. When a reserve of a member is exhausted and it is not reimbursed with the interest, and member fails to pay assessment, the certificate of such member automatically becomes null and void.

**2. PAID-UP INSURANCE:** If a member decides to withdraw from the Society, he may apply through the local lodge secretary for a paid-up certificate, providing he has been a member for a sufficient length of time. Such member must notify the local secretary during the period when his certificate is in force, i. e., within one month after payment of the last assessment. Suspended or canceled members are not entitled to a paid-up certificate. The amount of a paid-up certificate shall depend upon the original amount of insurance and period of membership, similar to the case of loan value.

**Illustration:** A member's age rate is 26 years, is insured for \$1000 death benefit and has been a member for 10 years; he shall receive after that period a paid-up certificate, if so desired, in the amount of \$221. However, a member who obtains a paid-up certificate loses all his membership rights, and retains only the insurance provided by the certificate which will be paid by the Society upon his death. It is important that members become aware of this fact.

**3. AUTOMATIC EXTENDED TERM INSURANCE:** A member who ceases to pay his assessment, shall remain insured for the entire amount of insurance carried at the time of discontinuing payment of assessment, and his certificate shall remain in force until the reserve is fully exhausted. The reserve for automatic extended insurance also depends upon the period of membership and the amount of insurance. As an illustration, we shall take a member who has been insured in this plan for a period of 8 years, at the age rate of 26 years, for \$1000 death benefit, at the time when he discontinued paying assessment. This member has a reserve of paid assessment for a period of 7 years and 254 days. However, as in the previous instance of the paid-up certificate, such member loses all membership rights and the beneficiaries are entitled only to the insurance. When the reserve is exhausted, he is automatically canceled. A member who has been on reserve over a period of 3 months must undergo a medical examination if he desires to become an active member again.

**4. CASH SETTLEMENT AT AGE 70:** When a member attains the age of 70 years, he may apply for a cash settlement for the amount that his certificate provides. Applications for this purpose can be obtained from the local lodge secretary, which must be properly filled out as required and forwarded to the Main office through the local lodge. After receiving a cash settlement at the age of 70, one is no longer a member of the lodge or Society.

**Certificate Plan "E":** This plan provides the same privileges as D, i. e., LOANS FOR ASSESSMENT, PAID-UP CERTIFICATE, AUTOMATIC EXTENDED INSURANCE and CASH PAYMENT AT THE AGE OF 70 YEARS, with the exception that in plan E, a member discontinues paying assessment into the mortuary fund after a period of 20 years and remains insured for life. If such member desires to be insured for sick and disability benefits also, he may do so; but he must continue paying for such insurance, which we trust the members comprehend. I also wish to mention that plan E provides a larger reserve for assessment loans, paid-up insurance and extended insurance than plan D. For instance, for a 3 year period of membership, at the age rate of 24 years, and \$1000 insurance, a member could borrow up to \$36.88 for payment of assessment. A paid-up certificate in the amount of \$472 could be obtained for the same amount of insurance, at age rate 26 years, and a membership period of 10 years. For automatic extended insurance for the same period of membership, age rate, and amount of insurance as in plan D, a member would be entitled to 18 years and 363 days of extended insurance. After that period, if a member does not pay assessment, the certificate automatically becomes null and void.

In order to give a better understanding, we are inserting a scale for each plan of insurance for the age rate of 25 years and \$1000 death benefit.

In regard to how much credit a member would be allowed and how much assessment he would pay if he transferred from plans A, B or C to either of the new plans, let it be stated that it is impossible to give detailed information here, as each such case has to be computed separately and individually. We must also take into consideration the fact that we have in our Society such members who do not know in which plan they wish to be insured. Today they are in plan A; they transfer to B, and later they desire to be insured in plan C. They pay a few assessments and then change their minds again and wish to go back to plan A. Hence, we recommend THAT EACH MEMBER OBTAINS ALL POSSIBLE INFORMATION FROM THE LOCAL LODGE SECRETARY, ESPECIALLY IN REGARD TO THE AMOUNT OF ASSESSMENT, BEFORE DECIDING TO TRANSFER INTO A DIFFERENT PLAN.

**NEW INSURANCE OF THE JUVENILE DEPARTMENT, ENDOWMENT PLAN, WITH CASH PAYMENT AT THE AGE OF 16 YEARS.** This plan provides for the following: If a child is insured at the age of 6 months or before, upon attaining the age of 16 years, the Society shall pay him \$280 cash. During the same period he will be insured up to the amount of \$1000 death benefit which in case of death will be paid to the beneficiary or beneficiaries, providing, of course, the assessment was paid for him. (The cash payment has been decreased for \$20 because the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Illinois ruled that according to the new law no member who has entered the Society after this law became effective can remain in the juvenile department after he has attained the age of 16 years. We have obtained this information after the juvenile by-laws were already issued.)

### CIO And AFL Force

#### Newspapers to Suspend Publication

WILKES-BARRE, PA.—Cooperation from all Wyoming Valley CIO and AFL unions helped the Wilkes-Barre Chapter 120, American Newspaper Guild, force the four local newspapers to suspend publication Oct. 3. The strike was called October 1, after publishers walked out on the Guild's negotiating committee seeking the 5-day week and other improved working conditions at all publications.

The breach resulted after publishers stalled in negotiations despite warnings by the Guild that the local's membership would not work without a full Guild contract on October 1, after the temporary agreement, in effect 9 months, expired Sept. 30. The Guild won the temporary agreement, which included a Guild shop, after a 5-day strike last November at the Wilkes-Barre Record, a morning paper, which resulted also from "stalling" tactics on the publishers' part.

An attempt by the printers' union to have the publishers resume negotiations with the Guild was rejected by the publishers. Both evening papers, the Times-Ledger and Evening News, managed to get out papers Oct. 1 and Oct. 3 when printers crashed the picket line, as they also did Oct. 2 at
