## NEMCI PRODIRAJO NA RUSKI FRONTI

Angleški general Wall dospel v Egipt

## SEVERNA IRSKA BOMBARDIRANA

Moskva, 7. jul. — Nemške motorné divizije so zavojevane v ostrih bitkah z ruskimi četami pri Voronežu, mestu ob progi žežnice Moskva-Rostov. Poročilo iz tega mesta pravi, da je položaj kritičen.

(Nemško vrhovno poveljstvo je naznalo okupacijo Voroneža, ki leži deset milij vzhodno od reke Don, kjer se odpira pot proti oljnemu polju v kavkaških pokrajinal. Pariška radioposta, katero kontrolirajo nacijski, pravi, da so Nemci začeli prodrijeti v smeri Poverina, drugega važnega žežniškega križišča, po okupaciji Voroneža.)

Moskva, 7. jul. — Vrhovno poveljstvo je priznalo, da so Nemci prodrijeti 120 milij daleč v ofenzivi na fronti pri Kursku in se približali reki Don in Voronežu, žežniškemu centru ob progi Moskva-Rostov. Kursk leži 280 milij južno od Moskve. Poveljstvo je tudi priznalo, da je položaj kritičen, ker so Nemci vrgli vso razpoložljivo oboroženo silo v bitke proti Rusom, da zlomijo odpor in si utevijo pot v južno Rusijo.

Sovjetskim armadam na tej fronti poveljuje maršal Timošenko, nemškim pa maršal Fedor von Bock. Rusko poveljstvo pravi, da so morali Nemci plačati visoko ceno v ubitih in ranjenih vojakih za izvajevanje uspeha. Več tisoč vojakov je padlo v bitkah.

Kairo, Egipt, 7. jul. — Angleški letalci stalno bombardirajo osiščne kolone, zbrane na južni strani El Alameina. Maorske čete iz Nove Zelandije so bile vrzene v naskoke na osiščne pozicije. Poročilo pravi, da te čete, ki napadajo sovražnika z bodočimi, povzročajo strah med Nemci in Italijani.

Neki angleški letalec, ki se je udeležil napadov na osiščne kolone, je povedal, da se nahajajo na cesti ob egipčanskem obrežju kupi razbitih osiščnih tankov in motornih vozil. Glavna osiščna armada je koncentrirana na ozemlju, ki leži dvanajst milij zapadno od El Alameina in deset milij od Sredozemskega morja.

London, 7. jul. — Radijsko poročilo iz Pariza pravi, da je general Archibald P. Wavell, vrhovni poveljnik britiske oborožene sile v Indiji, dospel v Kairo, kjer je takoj začel konferirati o vojni strategiji z generalom Auchinleckom, poveljnikom britiskih armad v Egiptu.

Cungking, Kitajska, 7. jul. — Kitajski in angleški letalci so razbili 86 japonskih bojnih letal v štirih napadih na japonske baze pri Kantonu, glavnem mestu južne Kitajske, poroča kitajsko poveljstvo. Bombe, ki so jih vrgli, so potopile tudi japonsko topničarko na reki Jangtse v bližini Hankova.

Washington, D. C., 7. julija. — Ameriške podmornice, ki operirajo v vodah pri Aleutskih otokih v bližini Alaske, so torpedirale tri japonske rušilce. Trije rušilci so bili potopljeni, eden pa poškodovan. Mornarični deparment pravi, da so bili japonski rušilci napadeni in potopljeni na praznik ameriške neodvisnosti.

Belfast, severna Irsk. 7. jul. — Sovražna bojna letala so danes zjutraj metalna bombe na severozahodno obrežje, kjer so zbrane ameriške čete. Napad je trajal 90 minut. Bombe, ki so jih vrgla letala, niso povzročile velike škode.

Nekaj naših ljudi je v izgnanstvu v Srbiji, na Poljskem, v Ukrainskem, v Rumuniji, in bogove kje še. Veliko žensk so odpeljali v Nemčijo. Tam so tudi otroci. Istotako se je dogodilo krepkim in delazmočnim fantom.

Vsi ti bodo najbrže doživeli konec vojne. Hoteli bodo domov. Kaj jih bo čakalo, ko pridejo?

Potrebovali bodo pomoč, da zopet zasadijo korenine v rodno zemljo. Potrebovali bodo gmočno pomoč: denar, semena, živino, orodje.

### Encouraging Campaign Results

#### Cooperation Is the Keynote of Success

On May 31 our Victory Membership Campaign concluded the first quarter of its twelve-month period. The campaign opened on March 1, 1942, and will close on March 1, 1943.

The complete tabulation of new members secured during the first quarter of the campaign—March, April and May—shows that a total of 1475 new members were enrolled in the Society. This is an impressive gain for a three-month period and it is hoped that the remaining nine months of the drive will continue to be equally productive—which would mean that at the conclusion of the campaign the SNPJ would boast of a total of approximately 6,000 new members.

In March, the first month of the campaign, the drive brought our Society a total of 530 new members—the largest gain thus far in one month.

The month of April, the second campaign month, shows a total gain of 315 new members, or 215 less than the first month. Obviously, our campaign workers opened the drive with great enthusiasm and then slightly relinquished their vigor.

The third month of the campaign, the month of May, showed that our campaigners regained their March vigor, for the tabulation for this month shows that 375 new members were added to the membership roster.

Basing our conclusion on the excellent record so far achieved—1475 new members in the first campaign quarter—we can say that during the summer months there is not likely to be a let-down in the enrollment, although this might otherwise be the usual trend of the season.

Speaking of our campaign success thus far attained, we can say that the general conditions have been favorable everywhere. Most of our people are working and the outlook for the immediate future in this respect is indeed bright. All war industries are operating at full capacity and expansions are going on constantly.

Therefore, it is up to all of us to utilize the present situation to our advantage by bringing into our lodges all insurable prospects, adult and juvenile alike. We must remember that by doing this we not only aid those who need our Society's protection, but we help our organization and also our country.

Our campaign workers in different parts of the country have demonstrated beyond any doubt that new adult and juvenile members can be secured, as can be seen from their reports published in these columns weekly. Of course, they have to work, and work hard and systematically.

We cannot emphasize too strongly that our Victory campaign serves a twofold purpose—it helps the SNPJ by increasing its membership in both departments and it aids our country by awarding War Bonds to campaign contestants and lodges.

Therefore, let us cooperate to the fullest extent of our ability to bring the campaign to a satisfactory conclusion and to help our country in its present struggle.

In short, what we have accomplished in the first three campaign months, can be accomplished also in the second quarter. With our concerted effort we can maintain our progress throughout the campaign. Let us remember that cooperation is the essence of progress and the keynote of success.

**This Week**

The past weekend saw thousands of motorists on the highways all over the country. However, the effect of the war on motor travel this year has been noticed everywhere and many a trip was planned to a closer resort or place of interest. The urge "to go somewhere" over the Fourth is general and is hard to resist in spite of pending travel restrictions and conservation of tires and gasoline.

We started out rather late Saturday morning, drove at a comparatively slow pace to the state line of Wisconsin and proceeded north. After driving some 150-odd miles we reached our destination—Fond du Lac on the southern tip of Lake Winnebago. The lake, as an old settler informed us, is one of the two largest inland lakes in the country, being 36 miles long and 12 miles wide and flanked on all sides by numerous resorts, beaches, cottages, farms and tourist homes. To be sure, the better spots on the shore are privately owned and adorned by palatial estates.

Lake Winnebago is interesting because it is situated in a valley surrounded by rolling country and hills. Swimming in it can be enjoyed all summer through due to its gently receding waters. Fishing also is plentiful, and there are many boats of varied descriptions. The soil in this section is rich and dairy-seems to be the chief occupation. One of the dairy companies advertises its product in this original style: "You can whip our cream but you can't beat our milk." Another slogan we noted was for Chilton, Wis., "The milk vein of the world," and the amusing one for Sheboygan, "City of chairs, cheese, churches and children."

On Sunday morning we drove northeast to Manitowoc which is located some 175 miles north from Chicago, on the shores of Lake Michigan. Manitowoc is noted for its shipyards. This year in particular the shipbuilding industry is flourishing everywhere, and Manitowoc is no exception. It is said that this city is the only one on the shores of the Great Lakes where submarines are being constructed.

Returning to Chicago we stopped at Sheboygan long enough to visit a few relatives and friends, but because of lack of time we failed to see all whom we intended to visit. It is interesting to know that Sheboygan has been only little affected by war as far as work is concerned. They attribute this to the nature of the industries operating in the city, mostly manufacturing of furniture and dairy products.

**Bro. M. G. Kuhel Lauds Lipmann's Stand**

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Following is a letter by Bro. M. G. Kuhel, Supreme Treasurer of SNPJ, which appeared in the Chicago Sun of July 6, and is in praise of Walter Lippmann's articles dealing with Prof. Renner's "proposal" to carve Europe to his particular pattern.)

I wish to congratulate Walter Lippmann on his articles in The Chicago Sun dealing with Dr. Renner's "Map for a New World." May his subsequent installment be equally encouraging to those of us who still believe in the principles of democracy, square deal and equal opportunity for all. Prof. Renner, Lippmann's target, evidently does not possess this faith.

Any one, with some knowledge of previous and present conditions in blood-soaked Europe, cannot help wonder in astonishment how an American can devise such a devilish plan—not for a permanent peace, as Dr. Renner designed it, but for an eternal war among our paternal nations, both little and great? The peace conference, following World War I, divided Slovenia among Italy, Austria and Jugoslavia. One-third of the already small nation was held under the yoke of Nazi and Fascist regimes for over 20 years without ever having a chance to determine whether it wanted to be there. When Jugoslavia was invaded and subjugated on Good Friday last year, the Jugoslav portion of Slovenia was further divided, piecemeal fashion, among Germany, Italy and Hungary. Dr. Renner, who claims the distinction of being an American expert on political science, or geopolitik, seems to be rather satisfied with the existing conditions in geopolitical division of Europe still leaves the Slovene territory within the Italo-German-Hungarian borders. And, according to his formula for world peace, this arrangement will guarantee the cultural autonomy of all has-been nations.

I sincerely hope Mr. Lippmann will continue to enlighten your readers and other equally democratic Americans about the dangers of "scientific" maps and will succeed in uncovering the misleading motives for such poisonous schemes. He has studied the Atlantic Charter proposed by President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill, while Prof. Renner evidently prefers his intimidation method to bring about future peace. The Slovenes are only one of the score of nations so affected by the proposed monstrosities.

**SNPJ FINANCE COMMITTEE****Meeting of March 14**

Meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. All members of the committee were present except Sec'y Vider, due to illness.

Minutes of the Feb. 14 meeting were approved. Chairman Petrovich reports it has not been possible to sell the Ohio Forge and Foundry Co. stock, the best price being about sixteen. Kneeland and Co. suggested we place the stock in their listing for disposal and it might be possible to get about twenty dollars a share. He is authorized to use his discretion in this matter.

The situation in regard to our ineligible assets was about the same as May 3, 1940. Sale of such assets was not desirable. These included the Ashland Manufacturing District, Chicago; William Campbell Land Co.; City Hall Square Bldg.; Detroit-Cleveland Liquidating Trust; Frischkorn Real Estate Co.; Chas. W. Harras Co.; Lake Shore Athletic Club; Lake Ports Supply Company, and several others. He suggests this the proper time to dispose of our real estate holdings. Decided to push the sale of these holdings. He will check into the Van Sweringen bonds for our next meeting.

Kuhel reported on the following matters: Three FHA loans numbered 15, 40 and 42 totaling \$9500 were repaid in the Cleveland area. One loan in the amount of \$2800 was repaid in the Chicago area. Conventional loan number 38-J with an unpaid balance of \$787 was repaid in full. \$4000 in West Allis (Wis.) bonds matured and were paid March 1. The mail vote decision was to sell the Transylvania (N.C.) certificates bearing interest at 1½%; these were sold for \$300.

It was unanimously agreed that the request be granted upon payment of usual fee.

Seldon-Morfat, Harvey, Inc., offer to dispose of our Edinburg (Tex.) bonds. Petrovich will secure more information before we sell these bonds. Seldon-Morfat, Inc. offer to sell our \$1000 City of Bessemer (N.C.) bonds. Decided to secure more information before they are sold. Unanimously decided to sign approval for the reorganization of the Associated Gas and Electric Corp.

The property with loan 107-S, 2737 Evergreen Avenue, Chicago, is being sold for \$9000. They ask us to take back a loan of \$4900. Decided to accept the full payment with a 3% prepayment fee or make a loan equivalent to 50% of the appraised value for the new mortgagor.
