

## DETROITSKA KONFERENCA NA ROBU POLOMA

Governer Murphy še vedno upa, da bo konflikt poravnani

## UNIJA OBJAVILA SVOJE ZAHTEVE

Detroit, Mich., 9. februar.—Konferenca med uradniki korporacije General Motors, Johnom L. Lewisom, načelnikom Odobra za industrijsko organizacijo ter reprezentanti avtne unije je bila pretrgana danes zjutraj, nakar sta governer Murphy, ki predseduje konferencam in Lewis podala izjavi, v katerih sta pojasnila svoje stališče. Governer je naznani, da se bo konferenca obnovila danes zvečer, dasi je korporacija nekaj ur prej namignila, da se ne bo udeležila nadaljnji sestankov z reprezentanti avtne unije.

Murphy je še vedno optimističen, kar kaže njegova izjava, da sta obe stranki zdaj bližje sporazuma kot kdaj prej, odkar trajajo razgovori. Glavna sporna točka je, kar priznavata obe skupini, vprašanje, ali naj avtna unija reprezentira vse delavce pri kolektivnih pogajanjih s korporacijo.

Gorovice o polomu pogajanju nočijo utihnuti. Sedaj še ni gojovo, ali bo korporacija poslala svoje reprezentante na konferenco, ki se bo nocoj obnovila. Iz včerajšnje izjave, ki jo je podala korporacija, je razvidno, da bo konferenco bojkotirala. V tej izjavi naglaša, da "mora upoštевati pravice vseh delavcev, ne samo onih, ki so člani avtne unije."

William Green, predsednik Ameriške delavske federacije, je zdaj posegel v situacijo. V telegramu, ki ga je poslal governeru Murphyju, je zahteval začito interesov delavcev, ki so včlanjeni v unijah ADF, v tej kontroverzi. Green in drugi člani eksekutivne ADF že dolgo časa vodijo opozicijo proti Lewisovemu odboru, ki skuša organizirati delavce v industrijski masne produkcije v industrijskih unijah.

Lewis je včeraj pojasnil zahteve avtne unije. Te so:

Korporacija General Motors mora priznati avtno unijo kot predstavnico vseh delavcev v dvajsetih tovarnah, ki so ustavile obrat v sedanji stavki, pri kolektivnih pogajanjih. Vse druge sporne točke se morajo rešiti na nadaljnjih konferencah med reprezentanti avtne unije in uradniki korporacije. Vse tovarne korporacije, one, ki so imenovane v seznamu in one, ki niso, so ustavile obrat, morda obnoviti obrat v času, ko se bodo vrnila pogajanja, da se doseže dogovor glede drugih spornih vprašanj. Razume se, da korporacija ne sme zapostavljati nobenega delavca zaradi unijskih aktivnosti in vsi morajo biti ponovno uposleni.

Centralna unija je na zahtevo časnikarskega gilda za zaključila, da temu listu toliko časa ne dovoli uniske znamke, dokler ne sprejme odloka vladnega delavskega odbora.

## Malaga prišla pod fašistično kontrolo

### Mussolinijeve čete prve vkorakale v mesto

Gibraltar, 9. februar.—Fašistični uporniki imajo popolno kontrolo nad Malago, nad glavnim pristaniščim mestom ob Sredozemskem morju na jugu Španije. Tako po okupaciji so fašisti naznani, da bodo vse lojalisti, ki so jih zajeli, prali pred vojno sodišči. Okrog pet tisoč lojalistov so fašisti že arstirali.

Vest je Almerije, iz vladnih virov se glasi, da je bilo na armadi, ki je invadirala Malago, 20.000 tujcev, med temi Italijani, Nemci in Maročani. Ista vest naglaša, da so paskok na mestu vodili način na nemški bojni ladj. Graf von Spee. Prvi regiment, ki je vkorakal v mesto, so tvorili Italijani; tem so sledili vojaki tujške legije in Maročani.

Lojalisti so se pogumno borili, a niso bili uspešni premoći fašistične armade. Okupacija je bila popolna, ko so se uporniške čete strnile na glavnem trgu Plaza de Constitución. Tako nato so se pričele plenitve in požigi v glavnem delu mesta. Fašisti, ki so jih lojalisti držali v ježah, so bili takoj izpuščeni, medtem pa so tulle sirenje na fašističnih bojnih ladjah, ki so sodelovali pri bombardiranju mesta pred vkorakanjem fašističnih čet v Malago.

Marsagny je zanikal vesti, da se regularne enote nemškega "Reichswehra" borijo na strani fašističnega generala Franca, prisnal pa je, da ima Franco okrog 25.000 nemških "prostovoljcev". Stevilo italijanskih "prostovoljcev" je večje, toda natančni podatki niso.

V lojalističnih vrstah je nastala velika zmleinjava, ko so jih fašisti obkrojili od vseh strani. Nekateri vodilni anarhisti in sindikalisti so se pravocasno umaknili v ameriški proti Motrilu in Ameriji, dočim so bili drugi ujeti, ki so se skutali vkrati. Neko poročilo javlja, da je več lojalistov utonilo, ko so skušali pobegniti.

Investiranje jednotinega denarja

Kljub tej reformi iz leta 1929, je bila X. konvencija leta 1933 prisiljena še bolj omejiti bolniške in tudi druge podpore. Izplačilne lestvice iz leta 1929 v bistvu ni spremnila. Odščipnila pa je podporo na obeh koncih in poleg tega napravila še mejo, ko se je po določenem času podpora absolutno končala, čeprav je član še imel rezervno. Slednje se predvsem tiče dolgoletnih članov, ki niso prejeli dosti ali pa nici podpore, toda jih je zagrabilo dolga bolez.

Po prejšnjih pravilih je na primer 20-letni član, ako ni bil prebolan, lahko nepretrgoma prejeman 20 mesecev celo in 43 mesecev polovično podporo. Po zadnjem konvenciji je celo podpora v nem letu omejena na 90 dni za vse člane. Ta omejitev se mi je že takrat zdela prehuda in nepotrebna.

Prešla konvencija je tudi podaljšala čakalno dobo s trem na pet dni in reducirala podporo na drugem koncu. Vsoto skupne podpore na dnu lestvice, to je za dolgoletne člane, sicer ni dosti reducirala, v §1 skladu le za \$35 — od \$1245 na \$1210. V \$2 skladu je ta redukcija znašala več, od \$2490 na \$2100. Glavna redukcija je seveda bila druga. Po prejšnjem lestvici je bil po dveh letih članstva vsak član upravljen za vsako nadaljnje leto do 30 dni cele in 60 dni polovične podpore. Zadnja konvencija je v §1 skladu to znižala na 20 dni cele in 40 dni polovične podpore; v dvadolarškem skladu pa na 10 nadaljnjih dni cele in 40 dni polovične podpore.

Razlika je tudi precej velika med endolarskim in dvadolarškim skladom. Proporčno dela prvi za eno tretjino večji povprečni prebitek kakor drugi. Pomen vsega tega je, da bo treba reševati vsak sklad zase. To je storila tudi prešla konvencija.

V endolarskem in dvadolarškem skladu se da podpora zvišati. Toda kako? Sprejem ali zadržati? Ali na obeh koncih? V endolarskem skladu je tudi slednje mogoče izpeljivo, v dvadolarškem skladu pa ne. V obeh skladih pa je mogoče skrajšati čakalno dobo, na primer s pet na tri, dva ali en dan.

Kakov izkazuje rekord bolniških skladov zadnjih treh let, preostanek endolarskega skladova dovoljuje skrajšanje čakalne dobe (ko bolnik po pravju tajniku in zdravniku ne prejema podpore) za dva dni (a petih na tri dni), ako ne znaša povprečno število novih bolnikov v tem skladu nad 1652 na mesec; za tri dni, ako število novih bolnikov ne znaša mesečno nad 1101; za štiri dni, ako število novih bolnikov ne znaša mesečno nad 826; za pet dni (bolniška podpora s prvim dnehom), ako ne znaša nad 660.

Preostanek dvadolarškega razreda dovoljuje skrajšanje čakalne dobe za dva dni, ako ne znaša povprečno število novih bolnikov v tem skladu nad 587 na mesec; za tri dni, ako ne znaša število nad 291; za štiri dni, ako število novih bolnikov ne presegne 293 na mesec. (Koliko je bilo povprečno število novih bolnikov na mesec v zadnjih treh letih, ki morajo biti baza za to kalkuliranje, mi nis znan; te številke bo lahko podal glavni bolniški tajnik.)

Kaj bo gorovil, ne vem, toda nis se bo čuditi, če bo kakšna trpká beseda privrela iz častiljivega moža. Tudi naprednjaki imamo veliko grehov, tudi v nas lahko prijeti pušča.

Na tem mestu naj rečem, še to: Med ameriškimi Slovenci je zelo pičlo število oseb, ki se o njih lahko reče, da so izobrazeni, zato pa imamo več pedantov, polovičarskih inteligenčev in nekaj takih, ki imajo dobro izobrazbo, ali v njih je vse premalo

nja, da se "leva" najlaže ukroti, ako se mu izpoljuje zobje, in to  
se je zgodilo s prakticiranjem pri bolniški podpori, s čemer je bila  
izvršena temeljita operacija, kar pa zopet ni vsem povoljno. Nekat-  
teri člani argumentirajo, da se godi krivica mladim članom, ker je  
prenikla levičevska za prva leta; drugi pravijo, da so prizadeti starji  
člani vsled omejitve podpor za gotove bolezni in sugestirajo, da  
se vrnemo k določbam od leta 1929, da bi se podpora plačevala po  
priročljivo, ne prvo ne drugo; vse to smo že preizkusili in bi bilo  
nesmiselno ponovno uvajati nekaj, kar se ni izkazalo koristno za  
jedoto.

Večina ameriških bratskih organizacij, kakor tudi takozvani  
privatni "group insurance," ne plačajo podpor za prvi sedem  
dni, in zatem kvečjedem do 15 tednov na leto. Privatne kompanije  
imajo poleg že omejene podpore na gotovo število tednov tudi  
zelo stroge določbe glede bolezni, ako ni človek prvečan na poste-  
ljo, ni deležen podpore. Ni dolgo, ko sem naletel na slučaj, da se  
je naš član prijavil bolnim valed prehlajenja, zakar smo mu izpla-  
čali podporo za 28 dni \$56.00, privatna kompanija mu pa ni pla-  
čala niti centa iz razloga, ker mu je zdravnik dovolil sprehod. Iz  
tega je razvidno, da kljub vsem omejitvam, naša jedota plača  
več podpore kot tuje organizacije.

Nas bolniški problem je danes povsem drugačen od nekdaj.  
Sedaj gre za zvišanje podpore, in najlaže je zagovarjati tak  
argument, kajti visoke podpore se nihče ne brani. Povod za to je  
rezerva, ki se je nabrala v bolniškem skladu, in nekatere že skrb, kaj bomo z denarjem. Bratje in sestre, le bodite uverjeni, da nam  
bo dotednica rezerva zelo prav prišla. Le škoda, da ni vsaj petkrat  
višja. Ako bi pričeli graditi rezerve pred petnajstimi leti, bi zna-  
šala danes par milijonov dolarjev, od katere, vse bi se polovic  
podpore plačevalo z obrestnimi in bi sedaj brez skrb znižali ases-  
ment ali zvišali podporo.

Predno se odločimo za eno ali drugo spremembu v svrhu zvi-  
šanja podpore, je potrebno, da vzamemo v poštev preizkušnje in na  
podlagi istih ukrepamo in izravnamo nedostatke. Razumeti mor-  
amo to, ako posezemo pregloboko v "bolniški žep," se bo rezerva  
kaj hitro izčrpala in to bi pomenilo zopet izredne doklade. Naj  
omenim, da je bilo od leta 1921 do zaključka leta 1936, vplačane-

ga izrednega asesmenta samo v bolniški skladu, pad \$320,000.00,  
torej ni nič čudnega, da se še danes slišajo govorice po naselbinah,  
da imamo pri jedoti vedno izredne asesmente, däširavno pri dru-  
štih v Združenih državah izrednega asesmenta nismo imeli od leta  
1933, toda ljudem, ki jim ni jedota pri srcu, pride vse prav in  
izrabijo vsako priliku v svoje name.



### OUR AID TO THE UNIONS—CRIMINAL INSINUATIONS—THANKS FOR ADVICE FROM THE "RIGHT" AND "LEFT"

The auto workers of the country are striking for their elementary rights. Hundreds, if not thousands, of the SNPJ members are involved in this mighty struggle. Especially is this true in Cleveland, Ohio, where is a large body of our members strike-bound in the Fisher Body shops.

Our Society, which is a priori an organization of workers, has always supported its members morally and financially wherever they struck in conjunction with other toilers for a just cause. It is on record that thousands of dollars have been paid by the Society to its members in such conflicts in the years gone by.

To live up to its record, the SNPJ has through its Administrative Committee just voted a sum of \$300 for the benefit of its striking members in Cleveland. The Society stands by the striking auto workers and hopes that their industrial union of the CIO will soon celebrate its complete victory. Stand fast, brothers, in this struggle, we are with you!

Rev. Milan Slaje, a well known Catholic priest of Lorain, O., is of the opinion that the fund for the Spanish victims of fascism, collected by the SNPJ lodges and individual members, will never see Spain. He writes in the Zarja, organ of the Slovenian Women's Union of America, that he thinks this money will stay in the U. S. and it will "help to solve the financial difficulties of some Slovene socialists and communists."

As the SNPJ lodges and individual members, as mentioned before, have so far collected some \$3000 or more for this fund, and inasmuch as this fund is handled by Bro. Vincent Cainkar, our President, the Rev. Slaje's insinuations smack of an accusation that the Society harbors crooks and thieves in its midst. Bro. Cainkar will in the near future publish in the Prosveseta the documentary proof which will show that every dollar received by Bro. Cainkar was forwarded to the proper committee in New York, and it will, furthermore, show where this money went from New York and what it is being spent for.

Upon publication of this evidence we will have more to say about Rev. Slaje's unwarranted and slanderous fabrications.

Our Society is "fortunate" in having so many "friends" who are worried as to the outcome of our next convention. These outside "friends" of ours are now busy giving advice up to complete programs to our membership.

The Chicago clerical "friends" of the SNPJ know the "best course" our Society should pursue, and, therefore, are very anxious that our lodges elect the "right kind" of delegates. Of course, they are willing to help to that end, and the SNPJ members would oblige them very much if they would listen to them—to them only.

Then we have some "friends" on the other extreme who would not trust anybody in the SNPJ but their own kind. Presently, this group concentrates in Pittsburgh, Pa., and lingers under apparent communist leadership. Their notion is, as outlined in their set of measures, that the SNPJ should be run primarily to heal all the troubles of the extremists in this and other countries.

Our "friends" of the right and the left have forgotten one important fact, that is, that the great majority of our members are of mature mind, and this majority has proved that it knows how to run its Society! The mature and intelligent members need no outside advice, and they will reject all such interference.

For the financing of elaborate athletic tournaments, I would suggest that the Supreme Board be empowered to make financial distributions to the matches and tournaments arranged. The amount to be allocated could be arrived at by considering the scope of its importance. For example, the Labor Day affair, because of its national recognition, would receive more consideration than a tournament of local recognition. Individual lodges forming athletic teams should assume the responsibility of raising their own athletic funds. In this latter case, some exceptions would have to be made where certain lodges have developed extensive athletic programs and cannot raise sufficient funds to carry on. But by no means must initiative to raise their own funds to promote athletics be destroyed. We must recognize the need of shouldering responsibilities to carry on activities which we might cherish.

Such a program as above suggested would not be a backward step from that of other Slav fraternal benefit societies. My inquiries of a few such organizations, larger and smaller than our own, have indicated that they have virtually the same athletic program functioning.

My recommendations of athletics in the SNPJ are made, however, only as a means for advancing the SNPJ and its social ideal. As editorially once stated: "Athletics for SNPJ, not SNPJ for athletics," or, in other words, athletic matches and tournaments should be encouraged among our members and lodges only as a means of advancing the high fraternal and social idealism of the SNPJ, which has for its purpose the establishment of a world wherein true brotherhood and fraternalism can be practiced to the fullest. Athletics for athletics' sake must be out of the question.

In all in all, the question is one which could be given considerable discussion. The technical problems that are involved require unlimited time for debate. My views are stated—they can be changed by others writing on this same problem. After all, I'm only an amateur. Let's hear from you all.
