### Hanoi ne vidi nobene kršilive "sporazuma"!

Nova, "splošna" rdeča ofenziva, ki se je začela preteko nedeljo z obstreljevanjem južno vietnamskih mest, ni Hanoi nobena kršitev "sporazuma" o končanju letalskih napadov na Severni Vietnam.

HONG KONG. — Severno-vietnamsko zunanje ministrstvo je preko radia Hanoi objavilo, da ima "južnovietnamsko ljudstvo" pravico napasti oborožene sile Združenih držav "na kateremkoli kraju Vietnama" in da bo to delalo vse, dokler se ne bodo te umaknile iz Južnega Vietnama.

Izjava odločno zanikava, da bi bil Severni Vietnam obljudilani koncem oktobra, da ne bodo rdeči napadali južnovietnamskih mest, omejili vojskovanje in spoštovali določila o Demilitarizirani coni med obema Vietnamoma. Hanoi trdi, da so Združene države na svoji roki in brez kakršnekoli obvezbe od strani Hanoia ustavile lani vse napade na Severni Vietnam. Hanoiski listi so ameriške vesti o "sporazumu" ob končanju napadov na Severni Vietnam lani 31. oktobra označili v zadnjih dneh za "nesramno laž".

V Hanoiu pišejo, da so Združene države objavile vesti o "sporazumu" o omejitvi vojskovovanja lanskem jesen kot pogoj za razširitev pogajanja v Parizu in ustavitev napadov na Severni Vietnam, da bi imele vedno priložnost uporabiti "kršitev" tega sporazuma od strani "vietnamskega ljudstva" za razširitev vojskovanja.

### Humphrey proti Sentinel protiraketni obrambi

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. — Bivši podpredsednik ZDA, demokratični predsedniški kandidat preteklo jesen H. H. Humphrey, je včeraj v govoru na univerzitetu nastopil proti gradnji Sentinel protiraketnega obrambnega sistema, ki ga je sicer odobrila Johnsonova administracija, katere član je bil tudi sam Humphrey.

Humphrey se boji, da bi nadaljevanje gradnje obrambnega sistema otežilo razgovore s Sovjetsko zvezo o omejitvi raketeve oboroževanja ali pa jih celo onemogočilo.

### Zahodno-evropski svet je spet zasedal

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Svet Zahodno-evropske zveze se je ta teden znova sestal na politični posvet, čeprav je Francija pretekel teden proti temu protestirala in odpovedala svoje sodelovanje v svetu. Posvet se je udeležil tudi zastopnik Zahodne Nemčije, ki bi rada spor s Francijo spravila s sveta. V Bonnu so iskali kompromis, pa jim ga ni uspelo doseči.

DETROIT, Mich. — General Motors Corporation je pozvala lastnike 2.4 milijonov Chevroletov in drugih avtomobilov letnikov 1965-1968 in vrsto tovornjakov na pregled, ker je pri nekaterih izpušni sistem, pri drugih pa vžigalni sistem nezanesljiv. Skupno je družba pozvala na pregled 4.9 milijonov avtomobilov, ko so omenjene napake povzročile vsaj 4 smrtnne nesreče.

### Zadnje vesti

LIZBONA, Port. — Precej hud potres je podrl nekaj dimnikov, prekinil električno napeljavlo in ranil kakih 60 ljudi. Potres so čutili tudi v Maroku in Afriki.

NEW ORLEANS, La. — Clay L. Shaw, ki je obtožen, da je koval zaroto proti življenju predsednika ZDA J. F. Kennedyja, je včeraj pred sodiščem izjavil, da je "občudoval" J. F. Kennedyja in ga volil za predsednika. Trdil je, da ni poznal ne Oswalda, Kennedyjeva morilca, in ne D. W. Ferria, ki naj bi bil s tem povezan v "zaroti".

CLEVELAND, O. — De Gaulle je preskrbel, da je Nixon lahko uvidel na prvi pogled, da se v Evropi znajo prepirati ravno tako dobro, ako ne še bolje, kot v Ameriki. Kot nalašč je pripravil v dnevih, ko je bilo že jasno, kdaj bo Nixon šel v Evropo, svoj načrt, kako predletati NATO in EGS (Skupni trg) tako, da bodo Amerikanci postavljeni pod kap, ako že ne pred vrata. Svoj načrt je sporočil Londonu, pa ni tega storil tudi našram Ameriki, čeprav je lahko izračunal, kateri dan bo Nixon njegov gost. Ako De Gaulle ne bi bil De Gaulle, bi mu to Amerika z vsem svetom zamerila.

Ko je londonska vlada zvedela o generalovem načrtu, je takoj rekla, da ga ne more sprejeti. Ga je pa obenem po zasebni poti sporočila javnosti. Tako je Amerika zvedela o vsej zadevi po kanalih, ki so dostopni vsakemu politiku. Seveda je tudi to rodilo slabo voljo, ako že ne kaj več.

Pa naj o vsem tem kdo misli, kar hoče, težko je dvomiti, da je tako obnašanje v Parizu in Londonu rodilo nov

### Federal Reserve bo nadaljevala napor za omejevanje inflacije

Načelnik Federal Reserve bo nadaljevali napor za omejevanje inflacije.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — William McChesney Martin Jr. je skupnemu kongresnemu gospodarskemu odboru dejal, da je Federal Reserve Board odločen nadaljevati z naporom za omejevanje inflacije. Tokrat ne misli popustiti, kot je storil nekajkrat v zadnjih treh letih, ko se je pojala na obzoru nevarnost gospodarskega zastoja. Politiko "pičlega denarja" bo Federal Reserve Board nadaljeval, dokler ne bo dosegel cilja, pa četudi bi to imelo povečati brezposelnost.

Načelnik Federal Reserve je dejal, da skuša omejiti inflacijo, ne da bi pri tem spravil deželo v nevarnost deflacije in seveda z njo zvezane brezposelnosti. To vodilo so v preteklih tednih vodniki sedanje vlade in njene gospodarske politike ponovno podčrtali.

Gospodarski svet, z bankami na celu, ni še čisti preprican, da je zvezna vlada odločena uporabit svojo moč in inflacijo trdo zavreti. Martin je to priznal, ko je omenjal "verjetnostno vzel", pa je poudaril, da tokrat Federal Reserve in vsi ostali "mislijo resno" in da ne bodo odnehati.

Vsa ta zagotovila in izjave imajo brez dvoma cilj vplivati senhoweru dobro okreva in da na javnost in doseči cilj brez no-

vih trdih ukrepov, ki bi mogli v Bivši predsednik ZDA gen. D. Eisenhowerovu zavreti bolj, kot vlada

**DeGaullovi cilji in pota**

Gen. Charles De Gaulle je usoda Francije od leta 1940, ko je pobegnil iz domovine pred Hitlerjevimi tanki in oklical "Svobodno Francijo" iz svojega zavetja na Angleškem. Mož je bil odločen dvigniti Francijo, ki je podlegla Hitlerjevim divizijam, k novi moči in ugledu. Pri tem je računal na podporo francoskih kolonij in seveda zavezničkov, v prvi vrsti Velike Britanije in Amerike.

Vojaska sile "Svobodne Francije" so komaj obstajale, celo francoska vojna mornarica je pod poveljstvom admiralja Darlana ostala zvesta vladi v Vichyju. De Gaulle ni mogel pridobiti na svojo stran francoske severne Afrike, dokler jo niso Američani zasedli. Pri tem je vendar zahteval za sebe priznanje kot vodnika in govornika Francije. Roosevelt in Churchill se za to nista vedno brigala v taki meri, kot je De Gaulle zahteval. Tega jima ni nikdar pozabil, tudi potem ne, ko so ameriško-britanske čete osvobodile Francijo in je De Gaulle vzpostavil svojo vlado v Parizu.

De Gaulle ni bil občutljiv v pogledu časti in vpoštovanja samo do zavezničkov, prav tako občutljiv je bil do lastnih rojakov. Ko ga ti niso poslušali in mu izkazali zaupanja, kot ga je pričakoval, se je mož leta 1946 užaljeno umaknil iz vlade in iz Pariza. Čakal je v prostovoljnem "izgnanstvu" vse do leta 1958, ko ga je Francija poklicala nazaj in mu ponudila vodstvo. Ni ga enostavno sprejel, zahteval je spremembu ustave tako, da je imel v rokah skoraj diktatorsko oblast.

Čeprav je obljudil vojno v Alžiriji zmagovalno končati, se je pobotal alžirci in jim dal neodvisnost, ko je spoznal, da je to za Francijo v danih razmerah edini trezni izhod. V Franciji je postopno ustvaril stalnost, poskrbel za red in mir, v katerih cvete gospodarstvo. Francija se je res nenačadno naglo gospodarsko popravila in okreplila. Ko je imel tako De Gaulle, kot je sodil, razmere doma urejene, osnovo za francoski ugled in moč ustvarjeno, se je z vneročno lotil popravljanja francoskega mednarodnega ugleda.

Ko je prišlo do kubanske krize, je De Gaulle naglo in brez omahanja sporočil: Francija bo stala ob Združenih državah, če kubanski spor privede do vojne s Sovjetsko zvezo in njenimi podporniki. De Gaulle je upal, da bo dosegel priznanje v Londonu in v Washingtonu ter skupno s tem odločal o usodi svobodnega sveta. V Londonu in v Washingtonu za to niso kazali navdušenja in De Gaulle se je užaljeno umaknil, ko je bila njegova udeležba pri vodstvu sveta tako hladno sprejeta.

Johnson je pustil De Gaulla, ki je prišel na Kennedyjev pogreb v Washington, preko 20 minut čakati pred očmi vsega sveta (na televiziji), predno ga je sprejel. Trdili so, da je bil to odgovor na nevljuden sprejem, ki ga je Johnson doživel pri De Gaullu, ko ga je obiskal kot podpredsednik ZDA. Tako osebno poravnavaanje računov seveda ni moglo vplivati dobro na odnose med Parizom in Washingtonom. De Gaulle je začel odkrito hoditi svojo lastno pot in skušal na svojo roko povečavati ugled svoje domovine, pa naj je bilo to tudi na škodo zavezniške skupnosti.

Načrtno je gradil francosko vodstvo svobodne Evrope in uspeval, dokler je imel trdno oporo v Zahodni Nemčiji. od Erhardom ta ni štala več tako trdno ob Franciji kot preje pod Adenauerjem, tudi pod kanclerjem Kiesingerjem se položaj v tem pogledu ni bistveno spremenil. Ameriški vpliv je postajal De Gaullu vedno bolj neznen. Odgovoredal je vojaški del pogodbe NATO in sporočil francoskim zavezničkom, da morajo tekom enega leta umakniti svoje oboževane sile s francoskih tal. Ko je tako drobil zavezniško vojaško moč in slabil ameriški vpliv na evropskih tleh, je pridigal o Evropi od Atlantika do Urala, neodvisni od Združenih držav.

Članice NATO v Evropi, prav posebno že Zahodna Nemčija, se pri tej DeGaullovi politiki niso nič dobro počutili. Skušale so premočen francoski vpliv omejiti z vlivom Velike Britanije v Evropsko gospodarsko skupnost, ki jo De Gaulle spremeno rabi v francosko korist. Britanska prisotnost bi mu to onemogočila ali vsaj zelo otežila, zato Velike Britanije v Evropsko gospodarsko skupnost noče.

De Gaulle se je lotil gradnje lastne atomske oborožene sile, da bi v tem pogledu napravil Francijo neodvisno. Lanska finančna kriza mu je te načrte hudo zavrla. Sovjetsko-satelitski vdor je pokazal Evropi očitno, da je njena varnost le v povezavi z Združenimi državami, vsak up na kako neodvisno pot v tem pogledu se je izkazal prazen. De Gaulle išče in vrta dalje.

Tako je 4. februarja predložil v razgovoru z britanskim poslanikom v Parizu novo organizacijo svobodne Evrope pod vodstvom "štirih sil", Francije, Velike Britanije, Nemčije in Italije. Torej nekaj takega, kar sta zahtevala v letih pred drugo svetovno vojno Hitler in Mussolini. Seveda bi

moralna Evropa pod vodstvom "štirih" biti neodvisna od Združenih držav, zato bi bilo treba uničiti NATO. Da bi v Londonu načrt laže sprejeli, jim ga je De Gaulle skušal osladiti s ponudbo o reorganizaciji Skupnega trga v rahlošo gospodarsko povezavo svobodne Evrope, v katero bi naj stopila Velika Britanija in članice njenega gospodarskega bloka.

V Londonu so DeGaullovi načrt zavrnili in ga sporočili zaveznikom, čeprav naj bi bil predmet zaupljivih razgovorov. To je nejevoljo v Parizu še povečalo. Preprič med Londonom in Parizom je dosegel višek, ko se je ameriški predsednik Nixon podal na pot v Evropo. Nixon lahko na svoji pot po zavezniški Evropi spoznava neposredno, kako trdno je to zavezništvo. Iz DeGaullovin ust in iz ust DeGaullovin nasprotnikov bo Nixon na tej svoji poti lahko boljše spoznal ozadje ciljev in potov DeGaullove politike, ki dela ZDA toliko težav.





## FOREST CONSERVATION

There are really two kinds of conservationists. The historical conservationist is slow to accept the grim reality that modern conservation must take into account the pressure of people and work toward the goal of conserving while using our resources. By contrast, the contemporary conservationist is endeavoring to work out a living arrangement between people and land. He advocates "multiple use." He believes that our forest lands, which represent a renewable natural resource, must be devoted to wildlife preservation, recreation and economic utilization. He believes these various uses are compatible.

Recently the multiple-use concept received impressive endorsement from the Society of American Foresters — a nonpolitical, nonprofit association of more than 16,000 members. In stating its forest policies, the Society says, "Optimal use should be made of forests and related lands... Ordinarily... forest lands will contribute the most benefits to the economy and to society if administered under the multiple-use concept of land management. In the absence of demonstrable need for single or limited use, skillful coordination of uses should be the goal of professional forest land management."

With the U.S. population growing rapidly beyond 200 million souls, there is really no alternative to the modern management practices of the timber industry. These include high-yield forest production, recreation and conservation — all on the same acres.



The facility is the first of its kind to be financed with new long-term, low interest loans available from the U.S. Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD), which under the National Housing Act can grant 50-year loans at three per cent annual interest.

"This is the first time Teamsters anywhere in the United States launched such a project," Mr. Presser said. "It exemplifies what can be achieved through labor, government, and business cooperation on a community-wide project."

## MEMORIES OF SLOVENIAN 1920s IS RELIVED BY JACOB STREKAL

(Continued From Last Week.)

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Last week Mr. Strekal recounted the beginnings of the Euclid Foundry Co. on old St. Clair Ave. and Lake Shore R. R.

These ambitious people always looked to a prosperous future. They mortgaged their own homes to help with neighborhood developments. They were obliged to live conservatively.

As youngsters we used to frequent a swimming hole nearby, then go to the Foundry to wash off. At lunch time it was visible that these employees live conservatively.

Their dinner consisted of a jar of cooked beans with onion and vinegar, sometimes soup meat was combined to make a better meal.

On week ends if they had barley as their main meal, they would have home smoked ham or sausage sandwiches for lunch. These workers denied themselves better food. They conserved for their families and their children. Hard work, low calorie dietetic food has sent many a worker to an early death.

The buildings were erected with high ceilings, with an overhead crane. Today they are occupied by the Weber Equipment Co. The crane was operated by the careful and able Paul Vidmar, who was a master of his trade.

The workers molded large and small castings, large molds which often took several days to complete and were molded below ground.

MANY NEW innovations were invented by these employees. Every thing prospered well up to the year of 1930, when the long economical depression sent prices tumbling down. Non-union shops were cutting prices, competing for orders which were hard to come by. The sales staff could find few orders.

MANAGEMENT PLEADED with labor to take a pay cut. The employees, with a limited education, did not foresee the great long depression, turned against management. Communication between labor and management was poor.

After several attempts to make improvements the Managers left their employ, taking with them several large accounts. Mr. Pike, and Mr. Penosa worked hard to regain the work, but the odds were against them, while the property was free of debt until 1932.

There finally appeared a Mechanics lien against them, so in 1933 they applied for a mortgage loan with a local fraternal, which was always helpful to the poor working man. After several years the depression continued, bills were piling

UPON HIS appointment as a Municipal Judge of Cleveland, later Mayor of Cleveland, Governor of Ohio, then Senator Lausche, Mr. John Princ was made President. Had they been able to continue 2 more years, they would have succeeded in their venture. Today we have only history left, that it did exist.

The above mentioned shareholders and employees of the Euclid Foundry Company I knew each and every one personally. I feel that I grew up with them. I can truthfully say and vouch for each and every one of them, that they were men of their word, proud of their adopted land, America, that gave them food and shelter at the time of their need. At all times their honor was above approach.

Many were members of fraternal organizations that were active in those days, and still prospering in the fabulous sixties. They are: American Fraternal Union J.S.K.J., Slovenian Mutual Benefit Society A.D.Z., Grand Carnolian Catholic Union K.S.K.J., and Western Slovani Association Z.S.Z.

I hope I have, at least in part, brought out forgotten portion of the Slovenian Industrial Complex, which perhaps was the only Foundry held publicly by Slovenians, all in the United States. I wanted these accomplishments and achievements like these to be brought out and shared with others for the recognition of our forefathers past efforts. Their efforts in Culture and Industry added much to the growth of America.
