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Liga narodov se uklonila pred fašistično Italijo

Abesinski delegat se je jokaj, ko je Zeneva javno priznala, da ne more rešiti njegove države

RIMSKE PROSLAVE

Zeneva, 21. apr.—Na včerajšnji seji odbora trinajstice Lige narodov je prišlo do tragičnega prizora, ko je ta priznal, da ne more storiti ničesar za Abesinijo. Wolde Mariam, abesinski delegat, ki je morda zadnji, katerega ima afriška država v Zenevi, se je razjokal, ko je videl, da Liga narodov ne bo kaznovala fašistične Italije, ker je invadirala Abesinijo in s tem kršila določbe ženevskega konvencija. Prosil je člane odbora za besedo, da bo izrazil svoje mnenje, kar mu je bilo dovoljeno, toda izustil je le nekaj besed. Čustva so ga premagala, ni mogel nadaljevati govora in se je jokaj kakor otrok.

Na popoldanski seji se je toliko okrepil, da je prečital protest proti Ligi narodov, ker je pustila Abesinijo na cedilu, toda glas se mu je tresel.

"Ali se bo Liga narodov zadovoljila samo s platoničnim apelom na Italijo, naj sodeluje pri poskusu za vzdrževanje miru?" je vprašal reprezentante držav s tožljivim glasom. "Ali je to efektivna pomoč, ki jo morejo dati v Ligi narodov članice države, ki so podpisale XVI. člen ženevskega konvencija, Abesiniji? Liga narodov ni izpolnila obljube, ki jo je dala v oktobru preteklega leta, temveč se je uklonila pred močnim napadalcem in zapustila Abesinijo, ki je šibka."

Svet Lige narodov je sprejel resolucijo, v kateri izreka obžalovanje, ker so se poskušali glede ustavitve sovražnosti v Afriki izjaviti. Dalje vsebuje boječ opomin, da so članice Lige narodov obvezane izvajati sankcije in apel na Italijo, naj hitro zaključi konflikt.

Po mnenju britske delegacije je celo ta negativni rezultat pomemben delni trijumf, ker se je morala ona silno boriti, da niso bile obstoječe sankcije proti Italiji preklicane. Zunanji ministri Eden je v svojem govoru namignil, da bo Anglija izstopila iz Lige narodov, če ne bo ta kaznovala Italije, dočim je Stanley M. Bruce, reprezentant Avstralije, izjavil, da pomembnih poskusov, da se ustavi sovražnost v Afriki, pomeni, da bi treba zavreči vse načrte kolektivne varnosti.

Addis Ababa, 21. apr.—Tu se je pričelo splošno izseljevanje v hribovja na jugozapadu, ko so se začele širiti govorice, da so Italijani že v bližini mesta, čeprav so poročila javljala, da italijanska armada še ni prekorčila gorovja na južni strani mesta Desje. Glavna cesta, ki vodi do Jimme, je natrpana z begunci in vse trgovske aktivnosti v abesinski prestolici so v zastoju.

Rim, 21. apr.—Tu so v teku velike priprave, da se proslavi splošna zmaga italijanskega orožja v Abesiniji z eno proslavo 2589-letnice ustanovitve Rima. Vse je tako urejeno, da se bo glavna proslava ustanovitve Rima vršila v istem času, ko bo armada maršala Pietra Badoglio vkorakala v Addis Ababo. Fašistične organizacije po vsej Italiji so bile mobilizirane za sodelovanje pri proslavi.

Važen odlok new-yorskega sodišča

Voditelji organizirane delavstva pozdravljajo razsodbo

Albany, N. Y. — (FP) — Odlok newyorškega apelatnega sodišča, vrhovnega državnega tribunala, da je zakon brezposelnostnega zavarovanja ustaven, je izval navdušeno odobravanje v krogih organiziranega delavstva. Predsednik državne delavske federacije in drugi delavski voditelji so izjavili, da je odlok kazipot drugim državam, ki se niso sprejele take zakonodaje.

Sodišče je razglasilo ustavnost zakona s petimi proti dvema glasovoma in s tem odpravilo konfuzijo, ki je nastala zaradi konfliktnih odlokov, ki so jih prej podala nižja sodišča.

Frederick E. Crane, načelnik apelatnega sodišča, je poudaril, "da brezposelnost ograža obstanek čedalje večjemu številu državljanov in vlada, ki bi to situacijo ignorirala, aploh ne zasluži tega imena."

Manjšina sodišča je podprla argumente Associated Industries of New York State, organizacije delodajalcev, da brezposelnostni zakon ni v skladu z državnim ustavo. Ta določa, da morajo delodajalci prispevati določeno vsoto od skupnih mezdnih izplačil v brezposelnostni sklad. Poleg tega bo v državni sklad prispevala federalna vlada, toda brezposelnostni bodo deležni podpore iz tega sklada šele 1. 1938.

Elmer F. Andrews, državni delavski komisar, je dejal, da bo odlok newyorškega sodišča pospešil uveljevanje zakonov brezposelnostnega zavarovanja tudi v drugih državah. Dosele je slično zakonodajo sprejelo dvanaest držav.

Težavno reševanje treh mož iz rudnika

Moose River, Nova Scotia (Kanada), 21. apr. — Množica delavcev je že devet dni na delu s kopanjem rova v tukajšnjem zlatem rudniku do trojice možkih, katere je zasulo 12. aprila. Eden je že umrl od slabosti in dva še živita. Zasuati možje niso rudarji, temveč obiskovalci in eden teh je zdravnik.

40,000 oseb vložilo prošnje v čikaškem okraju

MESEČNI PRORAČUN

Chicago, 21. apr.—Joseph L. Moss, direktor okrajnega biroja javne blaginje, je po konferenci z uradniki svojega biroja podal izjavo, vsebujočo navodila tistim, ki so vložili aplikacije za starostno pokojnino, odkar je državna legislatura uveljavila penzijski zakon. Moss pravi, da je v okraju Cook (Chicago) vložilo prošnje nad 40,000 oseb, to da nobena ne bo dobila penzije pred prvim majem. Ako ne bo federalni odbor socialne zaštite do tega datuma odobril illinoiskega penzijskega načrta, bodo do penzije upravičene osebe prejemale samo \$15 na mesec. Druga navodila, ki jih je objavil Moss, so:

Prošilec, ki nima rojstnega lista, da bi dokazal svojo starost, mora dobiti zapriščeno izjavo dveh državljanov, ki ga poznata 30 ali več let.

Prošilec mora bivati najmanj pet let v Illinoisu, drugače ni upravičen do penzije. Ako nima drugih dokazov, da biva toliko časa v državi, mora dobiti zapriščeno izjavo dveh državljanov, ki bosta to potrdila.

Zakon zahteva, da morajo otroci podpirati svoje starše, če so odvisni od njih pomoči, toda neporočeni sinovi in hčere, ki zaslužijo manj ko \$100 na mesec, in poročeni otroci, ki zaslužijo manj ko \$150 na mesec, so oproščeni prispevkov za vzdrževanje svojih staršev.

Podpora (maksimalna vsota \$30 na mesec, če bo dodatna vsota iz federalnega sklada zagotovljena) bo določena na podlagi mesečnega proračuna, ki določa \$9.08 za živila, \$4.18 za kurivo, \$1 za plin, \$1 za elektriko, \$2.08 za obleko, \$11 za stanarino in \$1.66 za druge potrebnosti. Ako bo imela oseba druge dohodke, se bo vsota podpore znižala toliko kakor bo znašal dohodek.

Oseba, ki ima v gotovini ali vrednostnih papirjih več ko \$250, ni upravičena do penzije. Vsak prošilec mora dokazati, da je ameriški državljan. Naturalizirani državljanji morajo predložiti državljanске papirje, v Ameriki rojene osebe pa morajo navesti in dokazati kraj svojega rojstva.

Najstarejša mumija najdena v Egiptu

Kairo, Egipt, 21. apr. — Profesor Selim Hasan je našel staroegiptovski grob z žensko, ki je bila pokopana pred 5700 leti in katere se lahko smatra za doslej najstarejšo mumijo na svetu. Mumija — truplo hčere faraona Cefrena — je zelo dobro ohranjena in bogato okrašena z zlatim nakitom.

Med prijetimi španskimi fašisti je 16 duhovnov

Madrid, 21. apr. — V provinci Oviedo je bilo zadnje dni čez 300 oseb aretiranih zaradi fašističnih in republikanih sovražnih aktivnosti. Med temi je tudi šestnajst katoliških duhovnikov.

Število ubitih v Palestini naraslo na 19

Jerusalem, 21. apr. — Novi spopadi med Arabci in Judi v Jafi in Tel Avivu so dvignili število mrtvih izgnancev na 19. Ubitih je bilo 15 Judov in štiri Arabci. Nemiri pa še niso prenehali in bati se je novih žrtv. Izgredi so političnega in verskega značaja.

Na Poljskem prihaja novi režim

Delavci v Lvovu oklicali generalno stavko

Variava, Poljska, 21. apr. — Tu se je včeraj vršila važna konferenca med voditelji raznih političnih strank, iz česar sklepajo, da bo kmalu prišlo do reorganiziranja kabineta. Konferenca so se udeležili Vincent Witos, vodja kmetijske stranke; general Josef Haller in Vladislav Sikorski, voditelj narodne demokratske stranke; Ignac Paderewski, svetovnoznani pianist, in voditelji organizacije legionarjev, ki jo je ustanovil pokojni poljski diktator.

Konfiskacija nedeljske izdaje lista "Gazeta Poljska" je ustvarila senzacijo. Urednik tega lista je polkovnik Ignac Matuzewski, glavni vodja legionarjev. Ta list se je smatral za vladno glasilo, odkar je prišla Pilsudskijeva vlada na krmilo pred desetimi leti.

Matuzewski je sam spisal uvodnik, v katerem je žigosal vlado, ker je dovolila policijske napade na delavce, ki so demonstrirali v Lvovu, Krakovu, Lodzu in nekaterih drugih mestih. V teh napadih je bilo 60 oseb ubitih in veliko število ranjenih. V uvodniku je pozval vlado, katero tvorijo člani radikalne grupe legionarjev, naj resignira.

Premier Kosciakowski se sedaj pogaja z zmernimi elementi glede sestave koalicijske vlade, a tem pa je imel veliko opozicijo pri konservativnih, ki hočejo imeti besedo pri formiranju novega kabineta. Kdo bo prihodnji premier, še ni jasno, toda za to pozicijo se pogajajo Kazimir Bartel ter generala Sosnowski in Sikorski.

Lvov, Poljska, 21. apr. — Delavske organizacije v tem industrijskem mestu so oklicale 24-urno generalno stavko v znak protesta proti policiji, ki je streljala na delavce, ki so se udeležili demonstracij zadnji četrtek in je ubila 16 oseb.

Večina Nyejevega odseka to priporoča

Washington, D. C., 21. apr. — Senatski odsek, ki je pod vodstvom senatorja Nyeja preiskal trgovino z orožjem in municijo, je včeraj objavil priporočilo večine tega odseka za nacionaliziranje orožne in municijske industrije ter ladjedelnic za gradnjo bojnih ladij. Večina odseka — štirje senatorji (trije demokrati in eden republikanski progresivec) — je za to, da vlada kupi ali zgradi svoje tovarne za izdelovanje vsega orožja in streliva, kolikor ga potrebuje za armado, in prav tako sama gradi vae bojne ladje ter drugo opremo bojne mornarice.

Manjšina odseka — dva republikanec stare šole in eden demokrat — je pa proti temu in navaža potratu in korupcijo, ki lahko pride iz tega.

Chicago. — Durland Nash in Robert Goethe, 19-letna mladenci, ki sta priznala sokrivdo pri roparskem umoru dr. S. C. Peacocka, sta bila 20. t. m. obsojena na 199 let zapore vsak. Druga dva sokrivca, enako mlada, sta umaknila priznanje krivde in bila sta pridržana za poročno obravnavo.

Pariz.—(FP)—Ljudska fronta bo izšla zmagovita iz volilne borbe in njeni kandidati bodo dobili najmanj 85 odstotkov oddanih glasov pri splošnih volitvah, ki se bodo vršile zadnjo nedeljo v aprilu in prvo nedeljo v maju, pravijo voditelji fronte.

Pri prvih volitvah bo vsaka stranka, ki je reprezentirana v združeni fronti, glasovala za svoje kandidate, pri drugih, ki se bodo vršile teden pozneje, bodo pa glasovali za kandidate tiste stranke v združeni fronti, ki bodo dobili največ glasov pri prvih volitvah. Tako določa dogovor. Geslo združene fronte je: "Zapodimo fašiste iz parlamenta!" in "Porazimo reakcijo!" S pomočjo socialističnih radikalcev, močne stranke liberalcev, ki ji načeljuje Edouard Daladier, je amaga zagotovljena kljub manevrom reakcije, ki hoče napraviti konfuzijo med volilci.

Orjaško oko proti nebu

Novi 200-colski teleskop za zvezdarno na
Mountu Palomarju, katerega velikanski stekla-
ni zrcalo dospe še ta mesec v Kalifornijo, bo po-
cenitvi strokovnjakov prodri v svetovni prostor
5.8 kvintilijonov km, torej na daljavo, ki znaša
dvakrat toliko, kolikor prodornost dosedanjih
največjih daljnogledov. Pričakujejo, da bo or-
jaško oko zagledalo kakšnih sto milijonov zvez-
tij in da bo vrglo novo luč na doslej neresena
vprašanja, da-li so na Marsu živa bitja ali ne.

Teoretično bi bil novi daljnogled sposoben
razločiti kakor nebotični visoko oplopie na
luni. Celotno samo dva metra narazen leželi svetli
točki na površini meseca bi se dali s tem veli-
kanom spoznati. Radovednež, ki bi v San Fran-
ciscu v primerni višini naperil teleskop na Be-
hišo v Washington, bi lahko brez posebnega
truda opazoval, kaj se dogaja okrog njenih
ken. V praksi bo takšno gledanje na daljavo
seveda drugačno, ker vse povečalne moči zavo-
ljo motenji iz zemeljskega ozračja ne bo moglo
izkoristiti.

Mount Palomar, s katerega bo največji tele-
skop na svetu zrl v globino svetovnega prostora,
je skoraj 2000 m visok hrib v gorovju San
Diega, v bližini mehiške meje. Zrak je tu ve-
no kristalno čist, mir in tišina vladata naokoli,
nobene mestne luči ne bodo mogle motiti op-
zovanj, saj je San Diego, prvo veliko najbližje
mesto, oddaljeno skoraj 200 km od Palomarja.

Teleskop gradi kalifornijski tehnološki za-
vod, ki bo svoje delo dovršil po vsej priliki l.
1940, torej čez štiri leta. Tehtal bo okrog
500 ton in stroški zanj bodo znašali skupno 2
do 3 milijone dolarjev. Ogromno zrcalo zanj se
izdelovali v corniških steklarnah v državi
New York. Samo ta velikanski blok stekla tehta
17 ton, je 58 cm debel in ima premer 5 m. To
zrcalo bodo sedaj nič manj nego 4 leta nepre-
stano brusili v nekem laboratoriju prej omenje-
nega tehnološkega zavoda. Laboratorij ima
stene obložene s plutovino, zrak v njem pa vzdu-
šujejo avtomatično vedno na isti temperaturi
in isti vlažnosti.

Brusilni stroj tehta 100 ton in je visok 10 m.
V tem stroju se bo steklena klad navzlic svo-
ji velikanski teži vrtela kakor hleb sira in bru-
silne priprave bodo polagoma, toda sigurno
vdolbe v njegovo površino dovršeno paraboli-
sko krivuljo. Potem bodo dali izbrusenemu ste-
klu prevleko iz aluminija, da bo videti kakor
ogromen, gladek krožnik z luknjo na sredi. Na
koncu pa bodo izgotovljeno zrcalo montirali na
dno 16.5 m dolge in 5 m široke teleskopske
cevi, potem pa bo orjak lahko začel namenjeni
mu delo kot oko, ki bo človeško oko prekašalo
za 360.000-krat.

To zrcalo samo na sebi seveda ne povečuje,
temveč učinkuje le kot zbiralec žarkov. V
govem gorjčcu se bodo podobne zvezde izražale
tolikšno svetlobo, da jih bo mogoče povečavati
s sistemom izredno močnih leč. V ostalem pa
astronomi ne bodo imeli časa, da bi svoj najpo-
vejši in najdragocenejši instrument naravnal
na takšen objekt, kakršen je luna, ki jim je
vendar že dovolj znana. Orjak bo marveč na-
daljeval delo od tiste točke dalje, kjer je op-
ovedal doslej največji teleskop na zemlji, nam-
reč veliki teleskop v zvezdarni na Mountu Wi-
sonu, ki ima polovico manjši premer nego nje-
gov novi konkurent. Ta orjak na Mountu Wi-
sonu je segal namreč "samo" v globino 2.4
kvintilijonov kilometrov, kjer je mogel sicer
prof. dr. Edwin Hubble komaj še doznati ne-
koliko meglic. Učenjaki, ki se bodo posle-
vali novega teleskopa, bodo sedeli v njegovi
notranjosti v posebnem vozičku in gledali v nje-
govo zrcalo, torej ne v zvezde, temveč samo v
zrcalno podobo zvezd. V splošnem pa sploh ne
bodo opazovali s svojimi očmi, temveč bo to
opravljala zanesljiva fotografska plošča, ki je
bodo po razvitju preiskali pod mikroskopom.

Uspešno sredstvo proti revmatizmu

Rimski kemični državni zavod poroča, da mu
je skoraj uspešno izslediti skrivnost čudečnega
lečila proti vsem vrstam revmatizma, ki ga je
uporabljal neki Alberto Rinaldi in je z njim
ozdravil nešteto ljudi.

Skrivnost tega lečila je vzel Rinaldi s seboj
v grob, ko ga je pred kakšnim letom dni umoril
neki slaboumi kmet. Največji uspeh je do-
bil Rinaldi, ko je slovitega dirigenta Arturo
Toscaninija rešil bolesterne otredlosti v skrajno
desne roke. Vest o tej ozdravitvi je šla skozi
vso Italijo in napravila Rinaldija slavnega. Ko
so ga pokopali, se je njegovega pogreba udele-
žilo tudi Toscanini. Bolnike, ki so jih drugi
zdravniki proglašali za neozdravljive, je Rinaldi
ozdravil brez težave. Po njegovi smrti je
zdravstvena oblast takoj zaplenila vse stekla-
ne z njegovo mešanico in jih je dala na razpolo-
go državnemu kemičnemu zavodu. Kemični
analiza je doslej dognala, da je v tej mešanici
cela vrsta najrazličnejših snovi, med drugimi
posebno kakovit, neka spojina arzena in oglji-
kovega vodika, v metilnem alkoholu raztop-
ljen strihnin, glicerinov fosforat, gvanin ali
Italijanski kemiki upajo, da bodo Rinaldijevo
lečilo kmalu lahko dali na razpolago revmatiz-
kom.

Initiative Motion of Lodge No. 584 Did Not Receive Sufficient Support

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

HELD ON FEB. 4 AND 5, 1936

Chairman Petrovich opened the meeting at 9 a. m., explaining that he called the meeting for two days so that we will have time to examine the report sent to us by the Moody's on our investments. It will be necessary to discuss their recommendation that we sell some of the bonds, which we now hold.

The following order of business was adopted:

1. Report for the last half of 1935
2. Mortgages and Properties
3. Selling and refunding of bonds.
4. Buying of bonds
5. Miscellaneous

Brother Petrovich read the report as prepared, which was approved with some minor changes.

The question, how our activities could be improved, was then discussed. Suggestions were made that help be given to our treasurer, so that he could devote more time to our investments. Changes in the set-up of the Finance Committee were also proposed, but as those changes could not be made now, it was decided to wait for our convention in 1937.

The reports of our representatives in Gary, Ind., Detroit, Mich., and Milwaukee, Wis., were read and approved. The members of the Finance Committee are of the opinion that the values of real estate are gradually improving and therefore do not recommend the disposal of the properties at this time, where the loss is too big for our organization.

A review of the mortgage disclosed an improvement and was decided to postpone any action at present against the parties who are delinquent in the payment of their obligations, providing they continue to improve the same.

The renewal of the mortgage on Slovene Workers' Home in Detroit, Mich., was approved.

A motion to approve the expenditure to remodel a property in Cleveland, Ohio, was passed.

Brother Petrovich was given full power of action on every case in Cleveland, O. On the question of renewal of mortgages he is to confer with our attorney in Cleveland.

Editor's Note:—B.O. Lotrich's contention that the famous Haymarket bomb affair is a fore-runner of the May day manifestations, or connected with the eight-hour workday movement, is not in accord with the historical facts. Where does Bro. Lotrich get his American Labor history? The Haymarket riot was the result of bloody fighting between the police and strikers at the McCormick shops on May 3, 1886, with six workers killed and many wounded. The anarchists thereupon called a mass-meeting at Haymarket for the evening of the following day, May 4, to protest those killings. At the close of that meeting somebody threw a dynamite bomb into the police killing seven of them and wounding 60. Four leading anarchists (Spies, Parsons, Fischer and Engel) were hanged for that crime; although not guilty of actual bomb-throwing, nevertheless, they were held responsible because of their constant preaching of violence as the only solution for all workingmen's troubles. The American workers, especially those groups active in their own political movement, like the Socialist party, have always held that the Chicago anarchist outbreak of 1886 has inflicted a great damage to the labor cause in America, and they never mentioned that and tragedy but with a warning to the workers. Why should we now, after 50 years, glorify that tragedy and try to connect it with the international Labor day manifestations?

Minutes of the Semi-Annual Meeting of the Supreme Board of the Slovene National Benefit Society

held at the Society's headquarters in Chicago, Ill., February 6, 7 and 8, 1936

Bro. Petrovich moved that the supreme board authorize the finance committee to invest Society's funds in municipal bonds as well as in federal bonds. He explained that good municipal bonds could be obtained which give a yield of as much as one-half per cent more than federal bonds, and that the additional interest would, over a term of years, amount to a considerable sum.

The motion was seconded.

Bro. Vider asked the board not to get a wrong impression, and said that neither he nor any of the administrative officers usurp the rights of anyone else, but that the by-laws charge them with certain responsibilities which duties they try to fulfill. They opposed the purchase of short-term bonds because of the loss of interest involved. The administrative committee was always willing to co-operate with the finance committee, but, unfortunately, seldom received any co-operation in return. He charged the members of the finance committee with constantly referring to and depending on Moody's Service for guidance, in spite of the fact that even the officials of that service admitted that they did not know what would happen in the future. In his opinion Moody's Service was not of any great help to us.

Bro. Godina cautioned against purchasing the bonds of any southern state or of any small town with an uncertain future, in event that Bro. Petrovich's motion was adopted.

Bro. Cankar stated that, at present, the yield of a good municipal bond is hardly any higher than that of a federal bond, and that there is nothing in the financial aspect to prove that we would be better off by acquiring municipal bonds instead of federal securities.

When the vote was taken, Bro. Petrovich's motion was carried by a majority vote. The finance committee can, therefore, in addition to federal bonds also buy municipal bonds. The administrative committee has, of course, the same rights in regard to approval of purchase as heretofore.

Bro. Petrovich moved that the supreme board declare that the administrative committee did not have sufficient reason to oppose the recent purchase of short-term bonds.

Bro. Cvetkovich seconded the motion.

In support of his motion, Bro. Petrovich explained that the Society might benefit if, in these times, when federal bonds are very high, short-term bonds were bought, even tho the interest rate on short-term bonds is considerably lower, because they could at any time be converted into cash. Suppose, short term bonds, maturing in three years, are bought now. When they mature the money will be available for the purchase of bonds with higher interest rates than are available to-day. So that even if a lower yield is obtained for the three year period, in the long run the Society would receive a larger return on its investment. Conditions will undoubtedly change in the next three years and it is practically certain that bond prices will be lower. He cited various statistics to support his views.

Bro. Somrak called attention to the fact, that this matter was thoroughly discussed at the Waukegan convention. Short term bonds are advisable where it is necessary to be prepared to convert them into cash quickly. But for ordinary investments, as in our case, long-term bonds are preferable. Furthermore, no one knows how conditions will be three years hence.

Bro. Vogrich thought that the main reason for

this friction was because we have two committees, each of which considers itself responsible, but whose opinions differ. The Society already owns some short-term bonds; more are not needed. It is also very doubtful if federal bonds will be much cheaper three years hence. These bonds are principally held by banks and large financiers who need not sell them at a loss. Neither can we expect any considerable increase in interest rates, since the federal government itself is trying to bring about lower interest rates in general. The Society, at present, does not need liquid assets, because it does not lack cash. With short term bonds there is, in addition, also much additional work. If we hold the long term bonds to maturity, we need fear no loss. Even should they drop to 84—as Liberty bonds did long ago—there can be no loss if we hold them till maturity when full face value will be paid. He cited examples.

Bro. Olip said that, in his opinion, it was high time to get rid of the old custom of buying bonds and then entirely forgetting about them. It is vitally necessary to constantly watch our investments. It seems advisable to consider that the price of short-term bonds does not fluctuate as much as does the price of long-term bonds and that they can be converted into cash more readily so that should the price of long-term bonds drop, advantage could be taken of the opportunity to buy them. He recommended that the members of the administrative committee make use of Moody's Service, which, so far, they had not done.

Bro. Cankar thought that it was impossible for the supreme board to decide intelligently as to who was right in the matter of short-term bonds, since no one can know what conditions will prevail two or three years from now. Moody's Service reasons that the financial cycle will continue in the same sequence as formerly, but the administrative committee believes that, after this crisis, the economic system of this country will develop along entirely different lines than it did after depressions we had in the past.

Bro. Godina did not think that anyone was to blame. He said that it was merely a difference of opinion. The opinion of the administrative committee was and still is that federal bonds with higher interest rate should be bought.

Bro. Cvetkovich considered it advisable to have federal bonds of both varieties: short- and long-term. Many financial authorities are of the opinion that the prices of federal bonds are artificially high and that they will go down. The inflation will cause a lowering of bond prices. Short term bonds are the safest and most stable.

Bro. Gradisek warned against speculation. In his opinion speculation was not profitable either for the individual or for an organization. Had our Society confined its investments entirely to federal bonds in the past ten years, our finances would have been in excellent shape to-day, with no defaulted bonds. It has been a good but very costly lesson to us.

Bro. Zaitz said that he believed that the intentions of the finance committee were of the best. On the other hand, it was also evident that the administrative committee had acted in good faith, so that it was difficult for the supreme board to take sides with either committee. He therefore moved that the supreme board declare that in its opinion both committees had had the best interest of the Society at heart when considering the short term

bonds, and that the finance committee had acted correctly as previously explained during the discussion.

Bro. Petrovich withdrew his motion and seconded that of Bro. Zaitz.

Bro. Vider said he had no doubt that Bro. Zaitz's intentions were good; but it should not be overlooked that such a decision would leave the impression that the administrative committee did not know what it was doing. The members of the administrative committee had primarily considered the rate of interest and the fact that we could not afford to put our funds into investments with too low a yield if we were to continue with our high solvency. There is no assurance that we will profit sufficiently in the long run by being able to buy bonds with a higher yield, to cover the loss of interest incident to placing our funds in short term securities for a period of three years. Officials of Moody's Service admit that they, themselves, consider it a speculative matter.

The motion of Bro. Zaitz was carried by a majority vote.

Ten minutes recess.

Bro. Malgal moved that, in cases of purchase of bonds the same have not been delivered within the time specified in the purchase agreement, the order be cancelled.—He explained that the purpose of this was better harmony in handling the securities, and also to prevent any investment house from making a profit at the expense of the Society.

Bro. Vogrich told about one instance where the firm had been several days late in delivering some bonds and that during this time the price of the bonds had gone down, which enabled the firm to make a profit since they could then procure the bonds for less than the price on the day that we made the purchase.

Bros. Petrovich, Cvetkovich and Olip explained the matter. They said that it often happens that a firm does not have the bonds on hand for immediate delivery, and also that the Society received interest on them from the day they were bought regardless of whether the bonds had been received or not. They also pointed out that where there was a delay in delivery, the price might go up in the meantime, which would mean a loss to the investment house.

Bro. Malgal's motion was carried.

Bro. Petrovich thought it advisable to discuss the problem of the sale of some of our securities. It was his contention that Moody's Service had given sound advice concerning the sale of bonds. He did not think that they were always right in their judgment. By extensive study they try to help us to avoid making errors again. He thought it would be best for the Society to dispose of some of its Florida, Texas and Carolina bonds.

Bro. Vogrich explained that Moody's did not furnish reports on some of our bonds and that in cases where advice was given, we ourselves had to take legal action or other means to protect our investments. He gave detailed data on many instances, citing figures and quoting letters. In his opinion it was the desire for a high rate of interest that has brought us into our present unfortunate predicament. He reminded that he had continually cautioned against this danger; he complained about being ridiculed for this, and frankly admitted that he did not know everything, but neither did Bro. Olip nor for that matter Moody's Service. Unjustified accusations must be entirely stopped. He also called attention to the fact that various municipal bonds are in the process of reorganization. The supreme office is constantly striving to save whatever can be saved. He then told of a number of specific instances of this and said that the standing of many bonds had improved. However, if all the bonds now in default should prove a total loss, the Society would nevertheless recover without serious consequences.

Bro. Petrovich thought it was that only safe investments be made in the future.

Bro. Olip was convinced that the present market was such that it was advisable to sell some bonds, especially those that had an uncertain future.

Bro. Somrak related some of the experiences of past years. He said, "I was a member of the finance committee at the time when the market crashed and everyone without exception was badly hit. Banks and other institutions and individuals all suffered alike. Conditions were to blame for it and not this or that individual, and it is ridiculous to point an accusing finger at anyone and say, 'He bought them!' When selling bonds we should remember that the bonds must seem attractive to the buyer and that they may be equally as attractive to us. Since we cannot arrive at a general conclusion, I move that the matter be left to the finance committee to decide upon and to take proper action. The motion was seconded.

Bro. Zaitz granted that the crisis had not been caused by Somrak or by Vogrich—nor by himself. Nevertheless, we had been repeatedly warned against the purchase of industrial bonds and those of southern states, even before the depression. Bro. Vogrich in particular was constantly urging greater caution. Had not all been infected by the fever for speculation we might have made safer investments. He then enumerated certain defaulted bonds that he thought should either be reorganized or sold. Sooner or later it would be necessary to write off these losses.

Bro. Vider did not think it advisable, under existing conditions, to take any drastic steps. Wherever there is any hope of improvement it would be better to wait.

A motion was made by Bro. Zaitz that Bro. Vogrich be delegated to devote his entire time to financial matters, particularly to the reorganization of defaulted bonds, and to attend to all the correspondence with the finance committee, thus relieving the supreme secretary of many duties. Ordinary clerical work, now being done by Bro. Vogrich, is to be performed by clerks.

Bro. Petrovich seconded the motion and added that several days ago the finance committee had expressed the same opinion, namely, that Bro. Vogrich devote his entire time to financial affairs.

Bro. Cankar said that he, too, thought that certain defaulted bonds should be sold, altho he was afraid that we might not get much for them. He thought that we had already seen the lowest prices in the bond market. He also was much in favor of the motion to have Bro. Vogrich devote more time to our financial affairs, adding that he suggested the same thing a number of times before. Our treasurer is preoccupied and clerical assistance must be given him if we want him to take proper care of this.

Bro. Vogrich was pleased to hear it authoritatively acknowledged, for the first time in many years, that he was working at all.

The motion of Bro. Zaitz was carried by a majority. Bro. Vogrich will, therefore, in the future devote his attention exclusively to financial matters.

The motion of Bro. Somrak was carried by a majority. The question of the disposal of bonds is accordingly left to the discretion of the finance committee.

Bro. President adjourned the meeting at 12:10 P. M.

FOURTH SESSION

Afternoon of February 7

Bro. Cankar called the meeting to order at 1 P. M.

All supreme board members were present.

The discussion on financial matters was continued.

Bro. Petrovich reported that he had incurred considerable personal expenses and loss of time in managing of a house in Cleveland which had be-

come the property of the Society, and thought it only reasonable if he were adequately compensated.

Bro. Somrak moved that the case be referred to the administrative committee for adjustment.

Bro. Ambrosich seconded the motion, which was unanimously adopted.

Bro. Zaitz inquired what action was contemplated in regard to the loan made to the Six Point Realty Co.

Bro. Petrovich read a letter from Mr. Heller who had investigated the financial affairs of the company on the order of the supreme office. Mr. Heller did not think that we should foreclose now. He recommended that the company be requested to furnish monthly financial statements and that all receipts over \$50.00 be used to pay taxes and interest charges.

Bro. Olip added that the financial and the administrative committee both believed that this property was well managed.

Bro. Cankar ruled that the recommendations will be duly considered.

Croatian Hall in South Chicago

Bro. Cankar gave a detailed account of the condition of the Croatian Hall in South Chicago. He also made a report on the Home in Springfield which, he said, is rented and in a fairly good position at the present time. Concerning the Croatian Hall he, also, had nothing favorable to report. He also made brief reports on various other properties which had come into the Society's possession. Conditions in Gary had shown some improvement lately.

Brothers Zaitz, Vider, Olip, Terzelj and Somrak discussed the situation regarding the Croatian Hall.

Bro. Cankar did not believe it necessary to close the Hall, as some predict. Further efforts will be made to interest local lodges in taking it over.

Bro. Petrovich informed the meeting that the loss of \$87,500 to the Slovene National Home in Cleveland would soon fall due.

Bro. Godina moved that the mortgage be extended. The motion was seconded and unanimously adopted.

Bro. Somrak described briefly the activities and the progress of this Home and said that the directors hoped to obtain a reduction in the rate of interest.

Bro. Olip called attention to the fact that the convention had determined the interest rate.

Bro. Cankar regretted the inability of the supreme board to do anything in a case like this, where it was not only proper to reduce the interest rate but also necessary, particularly so when at the present time we were investing money for us low as 2%.

Lack of Space in Supreme Office

Bro. Zaitz desired an explanation of why nothing had been done about remodeling the supreme office. At its meeting last August the supreme board had instructed the administrative committee to attend to the matter.

Bro. Vider explained that the administrative committee had engaged a well-known firm of architects, who had made a complete survey of the premises and had estimated that the addition of another story would cost from \$20,000 to \$22,000.

Bro. Cankar mentioned that meantime our neighbor, Bro. Berger, notified us that he is willing to sell us his property for what it had actually cost him, namely \$42,000. Should we accept this offer, we could move the printer, the manager's and the editor's department into that building.

Bro. Somrak recalled the dispute over this property that occurred many years ago, and thought that a serious mistake was made in not buying it then, which was now difficult to correct. But nevertheless he made a motion to acquire the property and door if it could be bought for a reasonable price.

Ten minutes recess.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE HELD ON FEB. 4 and 5, 1936

(Continued from page 7)

A new proposal for Six Point Realty Co. was read and approved. The members of the Supervising Committee, present at this time, desired some information regarding our activities, were given satisfactory explanation, and improvements of the same in general were discussed with them.

Most of the time on the second day of our meeting was taken up by reading and discussing the report of Moody's Investors Service on our investments. Two representatives of the said firm were also present for a time. It was decided to follow their recommendations and sell some of our weak bonds, in order to improve our portfolio. The Moody's are to advise us of the best time for disposal of the bonds in question.

Regarding the Bluffton college bonds it was decided that effort be made to form a bondholders' protective committee and to draft a re-funding plan.

As to new investments it was decided to wait for the decision of the Supreme Board as regards investing in Federal and Municipal bonds.

AMERICANIZATION

East Palestine, Ohio.—Among the European immigrants now in the United States there are many thousands who cannot speak the English language, who have never become naturalized, know nothing about the way in which American government is carried on, and have no comprehension of American political democracy or social problems. This situation was not fully appreciated until the outbreak of the world war. During the past few years an earnest attempt has been made both by the public educational authorities and by private organizations to Americanize these people by helping them to learn the language, to obtain a knowledge of American history, to become naturalized, and to acquire proper conception of what American democracy implies. This does not mean, of course, that we desire all people, of whatever race, to possess the same temperamental traits, or hold the same opinions, or have the same point of view. Diversity in individual qualities, physical, mental, and moral, is not undesirable provided the differences are not so great as to prevent the elements from adequately understanding one another. By Americanization we do not mean, therefore, that every newcomer to this country should submerge his individuality in the general mass, discard his own traits, and put a veneer of nationalistic chauvinism. Rather it implies that those who are the

children of the soil, the native-born, should exemplify the golden rule towards the immigrant and should endeavor to show him, by action as well as words, the meaning of good citizenship in a democracy.
