Moskva, 28. jan. — Mehinski poslanik Fernando Matti se odpravlja na odhod iz Rusije. Vsej njegov štab se odpelje domov še ta teden po sklepnu mehiški vladni načrtu, ki ga je zvezča z propagatorji, pričeli posluževati terorizma. Policija je zasledovala osebe, ki so razširjali omenjeni list med prebivalce; neki raznašalec lista je bil arretiran in je bil izpuščen na svoboščelo, ko je podal izjavo, da bo takoj zapustil mesto.

V zaroti, da ljudstvo ne izve o mahinacijah trusta, sta sodelovala župan in policijski načelnik.

Washington, D. C. — (F. P.)

Stjepan Zinič, urednik hrvaškega komunističnega lista "Radnik", proti kateremu je bila izdana odredba za deportacijo, je dobil dovoljenje od zveznega delavskoga departmента, da lahko odpotuje v Rusijo, toda stroške potovanja mora plačati sam. Mednarodna delavska obramba je apelirala na tajnik delavskoga departmента Davisa, naj Ziniču dovoli odhod v Rusijo mesto v Jugoslavijo. Svoj apel je utemeljila z izjavo, da bi bil lahko Zinič v Jugoslaviji ekskurcionist radi njegovih radikalnih aktivnosti. Davis je apel upošteval in izdal zadevno dovoljenje.

Editorial Notes

REMARKABLE progress has been made in the past year by our organization, as evidenced in a news item report of last week on the front page. Thirty-five new subordinate lodges were organized, and a total of 6716 new members admitted in 1929. In the meantime the organization's assets have correspondingly increased and today stand over the four million mark.

RADICAL changes have taken place in reorganizing the Juvenile department recently. At its yearly session in Chicago last week the Supreme board of the Slovene National Benefit Society has completely changed the course of insurance and the death benefit in that department to meet the requirements of the government statutes. Assessments in the Juvenile department, as reported, will be divided into three consecutive classes.

MORE freedom is given our local lodges in Canada by virtue of the granting of the license by that government, to do business of insurance and the sick benefit among our people there. In recent years, many of our immigrants from Europe established permanent stay in the Dominion, and our organization's wishes to help them have been fulfilled by this authoritative act. With this permission the main obstacle in Canada has been removed. To carry out an extensive plan there it is necessary that each province separately grants similar concessions, for each province is also governed by its own laws.

DETAILS of the decisions, changes and enactments will be published immediately after the completion of all matters involved, so that every member will be acquainted with them promptly. With an organization growing so rapidly and with the ever changing demands it is only natural that along with them come new enactments.

ANNOUNCING the extended term for the Jubilee campaign a few weeks ago, we emphasized the fact that many more new members could be brought into our local lodges by planning systematic lodge canvassing among your friends and acquaintances. Several live wires in each lodge with the co-operation of the rest of the members a lot could be accomplished; and your lodge, where it is possible, will increase its membership considerably, so that it will be one of the "Big Ten" in the next tabulation, which shall appear after the close of the present drive.
