

PREISKAVA PRE- NOGOVNE KRI- ZE SE USTAVILA

Predsedniku senatnega odseka se zdi politična kampanja bolj važna kot pa trpljenje rudarjev.

Washington, D. C. — Senator Watson, predsednik senatnega odseka za meddržavne trgovske zadeve, je ukinil zaslišanje o razmerah v premogovniški industriji od dne 30. marca do 9. aprila, ne da bi vprašal rudarje, ako jim je ta odločitev zaslišanja všeč ali ne in ne da bi za-
devo predložil odseku, ampak dejal je, da bo govoril za odpo-
moč farmarjem.

Senator Watson je že ves čas, odkar so trajala zaslišanja o razmerah v premogovniški industriji, čakal na priliko, da od-
potuje iz Washingtona v Indi-
ano, da tam vodi kampanjo za
izvolitev delegatov za konven-
cijo republikanske stranke. Ne
glede na to, da se rudarji na-
hajajo v obupnem položaju in
da je zanje takojšnja akcija po-
trebna, je senator Watson usta-
vil zaslišanja za deset dni.

V političnih krogih se že si-
lijo prerokbe, da bodo rudarji
glede kongresne akcije v tem
letu razočarani. Nobena pred-
loga ne bo najbrž predložena do
meseca maja, na to pa upajo
premogovniški podjetniki, da bo
poražena v kongresni zbornici
ali senatu. Vrh tega bodo po-
jetniki še svarili pred "sociali-
stičnimi" poskusi in pred fede-
ralno kontrolo premogovniške
industrije, češ, da taka kontro-
la vodi v socializem. Premogov-
niški podjetniki vado, kako je
treba učiti in svariti, da velika
denarna močnja ne bo trpela
škode.

Fall potegnil dva senatorja v oloje

Trije voditelji republikanske
stare garde zapleteni v petro-
lejsko korupcijo.

El Paso, Tex. — Albert B.
Fall, bivši tajnik notranjih za-
dev v Hardingovi administraciji,
je 2. t. m. izjavil, da so mu Will
M. Hays, bivši poštni tajnik, bi-
viši senator Lenroot iz Wiscon-
sina in senator Reed Smoot iz U-
taha svetovali leta 1923, da piše
znano pismo senatnemu preisko-
valnemu odseku, v katerem je
prikril "posojilo" od olnega
magnata Dohenyja. Fall je v o-
menjenem pismu dejal, da mu je
vsoto \$100,000 posodil časnika-
ski magnat MacLean. Doheny je
dobil od vlade koncesijo za izko-
riščanje javnih oljnih vrelcev v
Kaliforniji istočasno kot Sinclair
v Teapot Domu.

Fall zdaj priznava, da je bilo
pismo glede MacLeana prevara.
Pisal ga je po nasvetu Smoota,
Lenroota in Haysa v svrhu, da
se očuva republikanska admini-
stracija očitkov, da so njeni čla-
ni imeli finančne transakcije z
oljninimi magnati. Fall še vedno
zavrača, da so denarne vsote, ki
jih je prejel od Dohenyja in Sin-
clairja, bile "posojila", ne pa
podkupnina.

Poljsko-litvinska konferenca razbita.

Koenigsburg, 3. apr. — Polj-
sko-litvinska mirovna konferen-
ca, ki je hotela likvidirati sedem-
letno neoficijalno vojno radi Vil-
ne, se je razbila. Spor gre na-
zaj pred Ligo narodov.

je postal budistični menih. Od-
šel je v neki samostan v Tibetu.

Separatna pogajanja rudarjev v Illinoisu

Fishwick javlja, da 40 premo-
govnikov nadaljuje obrat po u-
nijskih pogojih. Rudarji zapu-
šajo mnoga mesta, "Vstajši",
ki zborujejo v Pittsburghu,
pozivajo neunijske rudarje na
štrajk.

Springfield, Ill. — Včeraj (to-
rek) so se vršile mnoge lokalne
konference med zastopniki ru-
darske unije in premogovniških
družb po Illinoisu. Harry Fish-
wick, predsednik 12. distrikta
UMWA, poroča, da se bodo se-
paratne konference nadaljevale
in kjerkoli lastniki rogov obno-
vijo jacksonvillsko pogodbo, se
smejo rudarji tamkaj vrniti na
delo.

Fishwick pravi, da so razni o-
peratorji do danes obnovili to-
liko pogodb, da približno 40 pre-
mogovnikov obratuje dalje po u-
nijskih pogojih. Trinajst nadalj-
nih jam nadaljuje obrat v oko-
lišču Bellevilla. Druge družbe,
ki so obnovile jacksonvillsko pogo-
dbo, so: Brewerton Coal Co. v
Pinckneyville, Harrisburg Coal
Co., ki obratuje dve odprti jami
v Harrisburgu, Firebrand Coal
Co. v Norris Cityju in razne dru-
ge. Družbe, ki podpišejo separ-
atno pogodbo in morda obnove
obrat še ta teden, so: Security,
Gayle in Perfection v Duquoinu,
West Virginia mines v Coulter-
villu, Forsyth, De Cota in Black
Servant v Elkhartu.

V West Frankfortu, Herrinu
in Marionu ni še nobenega zpa-
menja lokalnih pogodb. Rudar-
ske družine, so se od tam začele
seliti drugam za delom. V tak
okollišč je okrog 20,000 rudar-
jev izprijih.

Pittsburgh, Pa. — Na konfe-
renci "Odbora za rešitev unije"
UMWA je bilo 2. aprila predlo-
ženih po Powersu Hagoodu
več resolucij, ki očrtujejo pro-
gram za osvoboditev kontrole nad
krajevnimi unijsmi in se tičejo
žene v stavki, mladih rudarjev,
mezde in prihranjanja zamorskim
delavcem ter poziva rudarje na
vseh neorganiziranih poljih na
štrajk 16. aprila. Voditelji so
povedali zastopnikom, da je ilu-
zija, upati na kakšno pomoč od
senatnega preiskovalnega odse-
ka.

Osem milijonov brezpo- selnih, pravi Shipstead

Senator iz Minnesote izjava iz
številke delavškega departmen-
ta, da je danes toliko ljudi brez
dela v Ameriki.

Washington, D. C. — Farmar-
ski-delavski senator Shipstead
iz Minnesote je 2. t. m. izjavil v
senatni zbornici, da je na teme-
lju poročila tajnika za delo Da-
visa izračunal, da je danes čez
osem milijonov delavcev brez
dela v Združenih državah. Davis
je poročal, da on domneva 1,874-
050 brezposelnih delavcev.

Shipstead je rekel, da Daviso-
vo število ne znači totalnega šte-
vila brezposelnih, temveč le pri-
rastek brezposelnosti od leta
1925. Ako so številke delavške-
ga departmanta pravilne, tedaj
je danes na podlagi teh števil
8,331,000 brezposelnih delavcev
v vsaj deželi.

Konferenca balkanskih imi- grantov.

Detroit, Mich. — (Izvirno.) —
Dne 25. marca je bila tukaj prva
konferenca imigrantov iz bal-
kanskih dežel v svrhu, da položi
temelj združitvi in bratski soli-

ski vladi radi zatiranja delavcev,

lastnina United States kompa-
nije, Dun Glen štev. 1 in Dillon-
vale štev. 1, lastnina Wheeling
in Lake Erie Coal kompanije.

Sodnik ni dovolil stanovanj-

je razgallia delavne razmere v
tovarnah, da so priporočili, da
se tedenska minimalna mezda
poviša od dvanajst na štirinajst
dolarjev.

Liga konzumentov je a svojimi
odkritji nastopila prvokrat
uspešno pred dvajsetimi leti, ko
je razgallia delavne razmere v
departmentnih trgovinah, v ka-
terih so prodajalke prejemale
od pet do šest dolarjev tedenske
mezd.

in ali papirja, mila in gorke vode.
Delavke morajo imeti pred-
pasnike prek vrhne obleke, na
raspolago morajo biti kupce iz
papirja.

TROPHY FOR BASEBALL

From the many requests pouring into the head office for a more extensive program of athletics in the SNPJ, the Supreme Board has visualized a growing demand and a tendency to expand into this field to assist in the development of the English-speaking movement of the SNPJ. Giving this question the importance that it deserves, the Supreme Board has decided to stimulate interest in athletics and in the organization by awarding a big trophy valued at \$75.

INDOOR BASEBALL TO BE PLAYED

Provisions are as follows:

1. The trophy to be a national award, going to the Champions (victors) of the season.
2. The team first to win the championship three times (in three different seasons) shall have the right to keep permanent possession of the trophy.
3. Fobs will be awarded sectional winners.
4. Leagues should be organized according to districts. One in Cleveland, and adjacent towns; one in Pennsylvania, one in Illinois, Wisconsin, and possibly one in Minnesota etc. The finalists to compete as per arrangements to be made later and the awarding of the trophy to become an annual event in connection with some lodge doings.

RULES GOVERNING COMPETITION

- A. Every team must register with the league. The league in turn registers with head office.
- B. Every player must be a member of the SNPJ at least thirty days.
- C. Every team must register all players with its league.
- D. The regulation sixteen inch (16") ball to be used (for uniformity).
- E. Rules governing indoor baseball to decide all complaints.
