TEŽKE NEMŠKE BOMBE PADAJO NA SEVASTOPOL

Cez sto tisoč ruskih vojakov ujetih na Krimu

LJUTE BITKE PRI KALININU

Berlin, 18. nov. — Nemški letali mečejo dvotonske bombe na Sevastopol, zadnjo sovjetsko nemarično bazo in trdnjavo na Krimu, dočim topovi bruhači na obrežje in mesto. Vrhovno poveljstvo pravi, da so bombe potopile ruski tovorni parni, poškodovale križarko in neki drugi parni v luki.

Vojni poročevalci Oskar Kaefer pravi, da so bombe razbile več skladišč, pomolov in vojaških naprav, toda Sevastopol se je vedno brani. List Deutsche Algemeine Zeitung piše, da so bombe potopile več ruskih vojaških transportov v sevastopolski luki.

Berlin, 18. nov. — Samo dve milij širok pas ozemelja leži med nemškimi armadami in kavkaškimi pokrajinami, kjer so bojna ojna polja, poroča vrhovno poveljstvo, ki je nekaj urejalo naznalo okupacijo Kerča, sovjetske mornarične baze na Krimu ob Črnem morju. Kerč je most, po katerem bodo nemške čete prodirale proti Kavkazu.

Vojna poročila omenajo, da je Kerč padel po ostrih bitkah, nad nemškimi, rumunskimi in ruskih četami. Rumunske čete so prodisele proti mestu z zadnje, nemške pa z južne strane. Okupacija je bila izvršena po ljudnih bitkah na cestah.

Ali je Kerč v razvalinah kot posledica nemškega bombardiranja s kopnega in iz zraka, nismo. V normalnem času je imel Kerč 100,000 prebivalcev. Vojni bulletini pravi, da je bilo 10,000 ruskih vojakov ujetih v operacijah na Krimskem polotoku. Izguba Kerča bo reducirala dotok olja iz kavkaških pokrajij sovjetskim armadam. Opozicija je bilo transportirano po vodni osini iz Kerča v Rostov. Nekaj krogli molči o vojnih operacijah na centralni fronti in v Leningradu.

Vrhovno poveljstvo je naznalo letalski napad na Giarabub, angleški letalski oporišče v Libiji. Bombe so razbile več angleških bojnih letal na tleh in poškodovale vojaške naprave. Moskva, 18. nov. — Ljute bitke se nadaljujejo pri Kalinunu, 95 milij severozapadno od Moskve, prav danes objavljeno uradno poročilo. Dve nemški pehotni diviziji sta bili deloma združeni na tej fronti v zadnjih dveh dneh. Nemška ofenziva, ki se je prilela v soboto, se je izjavila. V več krajih so bile Hitlerjeve kolone pognane v beg.

Poročilo dostavlja, da so sovjetske čete reokupirale več vasi na zapadni strani reke Volge. V bližini Možajske, 65 milij zapadno od Moskve, so Rusi razpršili nemške kolone. Na leningradski fronti so ruske čete začele protifenzivo, v kateri so pognale Nemce z utrjenih pozicij. Rusi prodirajo naprej ob reki Nevi. Sovjeti se niso komentirali nemškega poročila o padcu Kerča.

Berlin, 18. nov. — Uradna časopisna agencija Stefani omenja koncentracijo enot angleške vojske mornarice pri Malti, otoški mornarici na Sredozemskem morju, ki je oddaljena 60 milij od Sicilije. Tja so dosegla tudi bojna letala iz Gibraltarja.

Ameriška obramba Singapora

Angleška vlada naznana sporazum

London, 18. nov. — Vladni krogi so naznani doseglo sporazuma z Ameriko glede obrambe Singapora, največje britiske trdnjave na Dalnjem vzhodu. Ti so dostavili, da sedaj že ni jasno, ali se bo Japonska odločila za invazijo Siama, ker je bila informirana o dosegli sporazumu med Anglijo in Ameriko.

Victor Gordon Lennox, dopisnik lista Daily Telegraph, poroča, da japonske čete v Indokinu prodrijo proti siamski meji in v koncentraciji angleških in ameriških bojnih ladij pri Singaporu in Malajskem polotoku.

Angleška vojaška posadka v Hongkongu je bila ojačana s prihodom kanadskih in avstralskih parnik.

Lennox je napovedal polom misije japonskega diplomata Kurosu, ki se nahaja v Washingtonu. Diplomat bo spoznal, da Velika Britanija in Amerika zasedeta enake cilje in da bosta storili vse za osvoboditev ljudstev, ki so prišla pod japonsko dominacijo.

Srbijci porazili Nemce v bitki

Velika četniška ofenziva v teku

London, 18. nov. — Časnikarska agentura Reuter poroča iz Jeruzalema, Palestine, da je 320 nemških vojakov padlo v bitki s srbskimi četniki. Ta se je vrnila v bližini razdeljanega mesta Ulbane, južno od Niša v Srbiji.

Poročilo dalje pravi, da so vse četniške grupe v Srbiji združene pod poveljstvom polkovnika Majhajlovića, bivšega časnika v jugoslovanskih divizijah. "Ako Amerika ne bo v tem delu sveta, mora priznati dejstvo, da je v njenih rokah ključ glede rešitve nastalih problemov," piše glasilo. "Japonska je položila svoje karte na mizo in čaka na Ameriko, da ona stori nadaljnji korak."

Premier Hideki Tojo je že objavil pogoje za sporazum z Ameriko. Slednja naj bi preklicala ekonomsko blokado, ustavila kampanjo glede obrožitve Japonske in držala roke proč od japonsko-kitajskega konflikta.

ROOSEVELT SPREJEL JAPONSKEGA DIPLOMATA

Japonski parlament odobril vojni proračun

NOVE ĆETE POSLANE V INDOKINO

Washington, D. C., 18. nov. — Pogajanja med Ameriko in Japonsko glede ublažitve krize na Dalnjem vzhodu so se včeraj formalno prilela, ko se je Saburo Kurusu, vodilni japonski diplomat, oglasil v Beli hiši in konferial s predsednikom Rooseveltom. Tokijska vlad je poslala diplomata v Ameriko v zvezi z napori, katerih cilj je dosegla sporazuma, ki naj bi odvrnil preteki konflikt.

Kurusu je prišel v Belo hišo v spremstvu admirala Kičisabura Nomure, japonskega poslanika v Washingtonu. Tja ju je privel državni tajnik Cordell Hull. Konferenca, katere se je udeležil tudi Hull, je trajala pol-druge uro. Predmet razgovorov ni bil objavljen.

Pogajanja so diplomatskega značaja. Japonska, ki kontrolira že velik del Kitajske in francoske Indokine, se je pritožila, da Amerika in Velika Britanija ovirata njene napore glede raztegnitve sfer vpliva na nadaljnje pokrajine Daljnega vzhoda. Roosevelt je prej obosil japonsko agresijo proti Indokinu in zapretil z akcijo, če bo Japonska storila nadaljnje korake, ki bi ogražali varnost Singapora, Malajskega polotoka in holandske Vzhodne Indije.

Tokio, 18. nov. — Parlament je danes odobril vojni proračun 3,800,000,000 jenov (okrog \$874,000,000). Glasilo zunanjega uradnika piše, da zadeva vojne ali miru na Pacifiku zavisi od Združenih držav. "Ako Amerika ne bo v tem delu sveta, mora priznati dejstvo, da je v njenih rokah ključ glede rešitve nastalih problemov," piše glasilo. "Japonska je položila svoje karte na mizo in čaka na Ameriko, da ona stori nadaljnji korak."

New York, 18. nov. — Časnikarska agentura holandske Vzhodne Indije Aneta poroča, da je 450 mladih židov umrlo v nacističnem koncentracijskem taborišču pri Mauthausenu, Avstrija. V to taborišče so nacisti poslali 680 holandskih židov v starosti 18 do 35 let v zadnjem februarju. Izgon je sledil izgredom v Amsterdamu zaradi uveljavljanja protizidovskih ukrepov po nacističnih autoritetih.

KRITIZIRAMO SAMO ZATO, DA IZBOLJŠAMO!

Kdor pazno zasleduje članke br. gl. tajnika, ki jih objavlja v Prosveti že nekaj tednov in v katerih kritizira nekatero sklepne zadnje konvencije, lahko vidi, da ta način kritiziranja ne more škoditi nikomur, lahko pa koristi organizacijo kot celoto.

Med drugim na primer br. Viider opozarja, da je konvencija ignorirala nekatera dobro prenobljena priporočila gl. odbora; precej priporočil gl. odbora — popravke pravil — je večina delegatov upoštevala, nekaterih pa ni. Pravilno je, da je članstvo o tem informirano, glavno je pa to, da člani izvedo, česa nam je še treba, da bo jednota na boljem.

Na drugi strani pa ne bodo člani nicesar pridobili z negativnimi kritikami, v katerih dopisniki samo zabavljajo in opravljajo gl. odbornike in delegate zadnje konvencije in jim podstavijo razne nečestnosti ter sebične namene sami pa nimajo — razen morda fantazij — nobenega konkretnega predloga ali načrta za kaj boljšega.

POLITIČNA AKCIJA ZA STARO DOMOVINO

Ameriški Slovenci smo pozvani v politično akcijo v interesu stare domovine. Pozvane so naše centralizirane podporne, politične in kulturne organizacije, ki reprezentirajo najmanj 95% vseh ameriških Slovencev, če ne več, vsed česar ne more biti dvoma o njihovem pravem predstavnosti.

Sedem teh organizacij je 15. novembra poslalo v Chicago svoje zastopnike, ki so zaključi-

li, da se sklice za 12. februarja 1942 slovenski narodni kongres v Chicagu sestoji iz celokupnih glavnih odborov vseh slovenskih centraliziranih podpornih organizacij; poleg tega imajo pravico poslati po dva zastopnika slovenske centralizirane politične in kulturne organizacije v povabljeni bodo tudi posamezni slovenski pisatelji, časnikarji, kulturni delavci itd.

V luči resnice o dvanajstji redni konvenciji
Piše glavni tajnik VIDER

Vprašanje gotovinske vrednosti certifikatov ali "endowment" smo na naših konvencijah že parkrat pretresali in enajsta redna konvencija je celo zaključila, da jih smemo upeljati, ako glavni odbor dožene, da so koristni in za jednotno potrebeni. Izvršni odborniki smo iskali zadevne podatke pri organizacijah, kjer že imajo take vrste zavarovanje; posvetovali smo se z ljudmi, ki imajo večne izkušnje o endowment-zavarovanju itd. Nekateri člani glavnega odbora so se potrudili in posvetili del svojega časa temu sprašjanju, da se preprčajo, ali je za našo organizacijo dobro, če to upelje, ali ne. Glavni odbor je na podlagi predloženih faktov sključil, da ne vidi nobenih koristi ali potrebe takega zavarovanja pri naši jednoti in naložil je glavnemu uradu, naj pripravi prerno pojasnilo, zakaj upeljave endowment ne priporoča in posiljajo na bilo prejel vsak delegat dvanajste redne konvencije. Potrudili smo se in izvršili nalogo glavnega odbora ter ob kratkem v glavnem orisali razloge, zakaj se od strani glavnega odbora ne zavarovanja ne priporoča. Vsak delegat pa je prejel zadevno posmernino pojasnilo.

Ce bi ne bilo navedenih nobenih drugih razlogov v dotednici knjiži, ki tota, da v sedanjih časih vedno nižjega obrestovanja od naših investicij ni skoromogoče upeljati zavarovanja kot je endowment, ki bazira na 3% obrestni meri, brez riskiranja, bi že to lahko dalo kot merodajan vzrok za opustitev misli na endowment. Omenjeno zavarovanje ni izključno le zavarovanje, pač pa je komercijska zavarovanja in hranilne vloge, ki se ima obrestovati po obrestni meri. Jednota bo pa kmalu — če se bo tako nizavala obrestna mera bondom kot se zadnje čase — prejela dva ali k večjemu dva in pol odstotka obresti!

Poučeni smo, da marsikje, kjer imajo večletne izkušnje z "gotovinsko vrednostjo" certifikatov, iste v teh časih omejujejo ali celo opuščajo, ker jih smatrajo za preveč riskirane. Mi, ki jih se dan poznamo največ v teoriji in ki nam so bili tudi odsvetovani po aktuarju, smo jih pa vzdile temu upeljali.

Dasi se ne more glavnemu odboru ocitati, da ni pretekla štiri leta delal v interesu skupnega članstva, niti ni napravil take pogreke ali prestopkov, da bi kdo mogel upravičeno izgubiti zaupanje v istega, kljub temu skupni glavni odbor ni imel pred večino delegatov toliko zaupanja, da bi upošteval v tem oziru njegovo priporočilo. Iz tega se lahko sklepa ter sodi, kaj in koliko je bilo posameznemu glavnemu odborniku ali upravnemu odseku mogoče dosegiti na zadnji konvenciji.

Da pa ne bo nikče pod vtisom, da bomo izplačali \$1000 po preteklih dvajsetih letih plačevanja z malo razliko v asesmentu, naj tu nekaj številki plačevanja asesmenta za razna zavarovanja poleg smrtnine.

Napačno bi bilo misliti in še bolj govoriti, da je kdo izmed glavnih odbornikov nasproten zavarovanju ali upeljavi certifikatov, ki so priznani za dobre ter v interesu delavskih mas, saj bi vendar nihče takim nasprotovanjem ničesar ne pridobil.

Ker je naša jednota demokratična ustanova in ker verjamemo v demokracijo ter v odločevanje večine, so nekateri člani mnenja, da kar je konvencija sprejela ali zaključila, je tako sveto in nadvečno kritično, da bi se nihče ne smel oglašati s kakšnim ugovorom. Učna demokracija, kako čudno te tolmačijo! Če bi moral pri takem držati, potem bi se tudi ne smelo kritizirati mestnih, državnih ali federalnih zbornic glede sprejetih zakonov, kajti, kolikor je podpisanemu znano, povsod odloča večina, pa najprej je večje budostali ali za ljudstvo skodljive zakone. Nihče, ki ima le malo zdrave razsodnosti, se ne more strinjati s takim spornim razlaganjem demokracije.

Ijudstvo se ni borilo v preteklosti in tudi dandanes se ne bori za demokracijo zato, da se bo pod njeno začito in na njeno odgovornost na mesto izboljšavanja, kar služi človeštvo do boljše društvene nekaj oviral ali celo škodovalo. Konstruktivna in dobrodelna kritika je najboljša obramba demokracije, obenem pa šola za izpolnjevanje človeka. Ne mislim, da bi moral biti vse po svojemu človeka ali umerjeno po enem kopitu, dobro pa je, da se oziramo na owna priporočila, v katerih vidimo, da lahko služimo spornim interesom članstva ali delovnega ljudstva vobče, pa tudi mogoče prihajajo po ljudi ali članov, ki slučajno niso naši boljši prijatelji. — (Se nadaljuje.)

Issue Call for Slovene National Congress

My Week

By Louis Beniger

Carroll Binder, foreign editor of the Chicago Daily News, says in his weekly review of last Saturday, that the revision of the Neutrality Act would have been more effective if it had been enacted much earlier. Another drawback is the fact that it was passed by rather small congressional majorities.

First of all, prompt action would have forced the totalitarian powers to change some of their ideas about pacifism, military effectiveness and internal disunity. And the nations doing the actual fighting against totalitarianism would have kept up the struggle with greater courage and vigor.

Binder thinks that the concept held in the postwar period that America can best guard its national interests by remaining isolated, was based on a misconception of the history of 1914-17. There is no doubt that this factor encouraged aggression by Japan, Italy and Germany during the past decade. In short, the aggressors thought they could get what they wanted, and almost got it!

All this brings the present war situation close to our own interests, for today Slovenia with the rest of continental Europe, except England and Russia, is enslaved. The captive nations cannot speak for themselves, therefore their countrymen particularly here in America have taken up their cause.

Last Saturday twelve representatives of seven centralized Slovene organizations met at the SNPJ Main Office for the purpose of launching a political action for the liberation of Slovenia. The goal is to unite all European Slovenes after the war into one state which shall be a part of a democratic federation. A Slovene National Congress will be held in Chicago on February 12 next to determine the exact nature of action in the interest of Slovenia and its state.

The fact that the representatives adopted a resolution for a united Slovenia within a democratic setup in future Yugoslavia, unanimously, gives much hope that the action will receive united approval. It is necessary that we act unitedly and that we have a democratic representation at our meetings for this purpose.

Nothing would be more detrimental to effective action than separation. Even the most skeptical of us would put aside his personal beliefs and convictions and join his brethren for this great purpose. Neither religion nor politics should deter any American Slovene from supporting the action which will bring hope and new life to our poor, broken homeland across the sea.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR FIRST YEAR TERM INSURANCE

Whereas the Slovene National Benefit Society is in need of additional funds in order to promote more effectively the growth and expansion of its membership, and

Whereas the present income and condition of the expense fund does not permit more extensive and more successful moves in this respect, and

Whereas the present members of the SNPJ cannot support financially the Society's efforts for such purpose and objective,

Now therefore it is resolved that the Executive Committee of the SNPJ shall, under the provisions of Section 13 (d) and Section 45 of the By-laws, take the necessary steps to place all mortuary benefit certificates issued on January 1, 1942, and thereafter on the preliminary term basis with full non-forfeiture values, and to enter all the mortuary assessments paid to the Society on account of the first certificate year into the general expense fund, provided, however, that any death claims occurring under such certificates during the first year shall be paid out of the expense fund.

Bro. Frank Zaitz of resolutions committee opposes resolution. Bro. Kuhel supports and recommends it. Resolution adopted.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A FUND TO AID AGED MEMBERS

The Twelfth Regular Convention of the Slovene National Benefit Society herewith goes on record to establish a fund to aid its aged members, for which purpose the following plan is proposed and adopted:

A special committee composed of three members of the newly elected Executive Committee shall be chosen whose duty shall be to prepare a plan providing how Old Age Aid shall be paid from such a fund, and who shall be entitled to such Old Age Aid. It shall further be the duty of this committee to study and prepare a plan to what extent old needy members may be helped, from the Mortuary Fund and from other possible sources.

The creation of this committee became necessary because no scientifically sound plan has been proposed to this Convention, whereas the Resolution Committee merely received a large number of recommendations from various delegates that something be done to alleviate the condition of aged members living in distress.

After a thorough examination of this problem, it shall be the duty of this Special Committee to submit its plan to the Supreme Board and when approved by the same, it shall be submitted to the membership for a referendum vote. If necessary, the Special Committee shall have the power to hire an actuary and a legal counselor to advise it relative to a possible transfer of money from the Mortuary Fund and other legal implications.

Furthermore, this Convention hereby directs the entire Supreme Board to seek ways and means how to improve the system of aid for the aged members insofar as that is feasible under existing conditions.

Resolution adopted. Sister Ambrozich moves, Stokel seconds that special committee provided by resolution shall consist of supreme president, secretary and treasurer. Motion carried.

Tellers report Sister Moenik has 166 votes for judicial committee (elected), Tercelj 161.

Tellers report Olip has 193 votes, Malga 181, Kvartich 165 for supervisory committee. Moved that two highest, Olip and Malga, shall be considered elected.

Tellers report Arch has 179 votes for medical director, Zavertnik 152, Dr. Arch is elected.
