Beseda predsednika HBZ
Potruje, kar je Prosveta pisala!
HBZ ni jugoslovanka!
"Nas Hrvate pustite na miru!"

V Zajedničaru, glasilu HBZ, se je zadnji teden oglašil Ivan D. Butković, gl. predsednik Hrvatske bratske zajednice, s članom, v katerem bera levite uredniku Prosvete. V tem članku je Butković ponovil v glavnem ono, kar je povedal na zadnji konferenci Jugoslovenske bratske federacije — in s tem je sam potrdil, da je jedro našega članka v Prosveti "SNPJ mora napraviti!" z dne 31. oktobra t. l., ki je izval njegov odgovor, resnično in pravilno.

Danes lahko povemo, da je omenjeni naš članek — ki je takoj provociral nepotrebno polemiko s predsednikom SSPZ — v glavnem odgovor na afront predsednika HBZ na clevelandski konferenci. Butković je tamkaj kritiziral SNPJ, namreč naš način kampanje za nove člane, obenem pa je nekako ohloplodahnih z roko, da o kakem "ujednjenu nema niti govor." Vse to zdaj priznava v Zajedničaru.

Zadeva je torej jasna. Mi smo svoje že povedali in skoro nismo več kaj razglabljati. Nejam komentarja pa Butkovićev članek le zasluži.

Sporna kost v tej praski je pred več mesecih v Prosveti objavljena primerjava števil solventnosti. To je užalilo predsednika HBZ, dasi se ne spotika nad avtentičnostjo dotednih številk (posnete so bile iz uradnih glasil prizadetih organizacij in deloma iz "Statistics of Fraternal Societies, 1934"). Butković piše, če že hočemo primerjati moči organizacij, naj primerjamo slovenske organizacije, hrvatske naj pa ustimo pri miru, "jer Hrvatska Bratska Zajednica nije niti slovenska niti jugoslovenska, več jedino HRVATSKA."

All right! Ce je tako, zakaj je pa HBZ članica Jugoslovenske bratske federacije? In zakaj vzame tudi Slovence in Srbe za svoje člane, če je "jedino hrvatska"? Oprostite, nas ne briga, kako se vi imenujete in poslujete, to je popolnoma vaša stvar, ampak — zakaj tako v teoriji in drugače v praksi?

Stvar ni tako enostavna in može, ki so na čelu največje hrvatske — in največje jugoslovenske podporne organizacije v Ameriki! — bi ne smeli nastopati v javnosti tako naivno. Mi bi se osmeli, če bi proklamirali, da je SNPJ "jedino slovenska", ker je okrog 5000 Hrvatov in Srbov v naši sredi in mnogo drugih, ki ne znajo nobenega slovenskega jezika, kljub temu so nam bratje, ki jih spoznajemo kakor svoje.

Hrvatske podporne organizacije radi ustimo na miru. Do danes sploh nismo imeli konflikta z njimi — niti ne gojimo kakih iluzij, da je združitev vseh jugoslovenskih organizacij mogoča v bližnji bodočnosti.

Logično pričakovanje je, da se slovenske jednote in zveze, ki so si po načelih najbliže — vse zbližajo in se skušajo spojiti.

Toda mi vsi, ki smo člani jugoslovenskih jednot, zvez, zalednic in savezov, smo v — Ameriki, ki je danes naša domovina in ta nova domovina nas nekega dne prisilila, hočeš, da bomo morali pokukati preko naših malih kotičkov, nacionalnih predalčkov in predstavnikov, ki v ameriški splošnosti ne pomenijo — nič. Čas odpravi vse in čas ozdravi vse!

KAKO PODJETNIKI STRIŽEJO PRAVILNIŠKE MEZDE

Navadne delavce promovirajo za "supervizorje", da jim lahko plačajo kolikor hočejo

Washington. — (FP) — Od kar imamo v deželi "new deal", je bilo že precejšnje število delavcev "povišanih" iz navadnih težakov, komijev in klerkov v "supervizorje", eksekutivne uradnike in podobne odličnjake. S promocijami navadno pridejo tudi višje plače, toda ne v teh "newdealskih" slučajih.

Te vrste "promocije" imajo to značilnost, da pomenijo znižanje plače. Splošna lastnost vseh pravilnikov namreč je, da se minimalne plače ne tičajo "supervizorjev" in eksekutivnih uradnikov. Tem lahko podjetniki plačujejo kolikor hočejo.

Med drugimi industrijskimi, v katerih se je zvišalo število "nadzornikov", "eksekutivnih uradnikov" in podobnih šarž je tudi oljna. To je bilo razvidno na zaslišanju o zahtevi za revizijo pravilnika oljne industrije.

J. C. Long, vodja unije oljnih in rafinerijskih delavcev v Houstonu, Tex., je pred NRA rekel, da se vse družbe, ki operirajo v tamkajšnjem kraju, poslužujejo te takte. "Mnogim delavcem, ki opravljajo navadna težaška dela, so dale šaržo "supervizorja", da jim lahko plačajo manj kakor določa pravilnik".



Industrial Ingrates

During the first nine months of this year the Houde Company, a steel corporation unnetted a profit of \$853,824. Over the same period in 1933 the company netted only \$76,024. The Budd Wheel Company, also an affiliate of the steel combine, netted a profit of \$116,112 this year. Last year this same corporation lost \$262,775. The Weir National Steel Company earned \$2,569,876 in 1933. This year its net earnings amount to \$4,582,896.

Yet these three corporations are still fighting the NRA in federal court in an effort to invalidate Section 7-A of the National Industrial Recovery Act. They have consistently opposed the unionization of their workers and have discharged scores of employees because of their union affiliation. They have refused to permit the organization of their workers under threat of discharge to any employee joining a Labor union; they scorn any and all efforts at collective bargaining; they have all proudly display the blue eagle and boast that they are supporting the new deal 100%.

The steel trust is one of the chief beneficiaries of President Roosevelt's new deal for the special interests, but it is the most stubborn opponent of the President's so-called new deal for Labor. And while Labor marks time waiting some favorable action from the Department of Justice, the steel kings are piling up millions in surplus profits sweated out of the laboring class—and okayed by the NRA.

Why We Have Depressions

Statistics usually are pretty dry stuff, but occasionally they conceal information of the most impressive importance.

That is true of figures casually released this week by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, showing who owns \$36,000,000,000 now on deposit in banks and drawing cobwebs because bankers have lost confidence in the integrity of their country and are keeping tight rein on the purse strings.

About 49,000,000 small depositors are said to own a total of \$12,000,000,000, which figures out at an average deposit of \$240, scarcely enough to enable the owners to escape the heavy service charges bankers have recently imposed on their customers as a penalty for being poor.

At the other end of the line are 800,000 accounts with deposits of \$24,000,000,000, or an average of \$30,000.

Still further along are other millions who are not fortunate enough to possess bank accounts, including the 18,000,000 who are being kept alive through relief provided by Uncle Sam.

The picture is so perfect it would be spoiled were anything added to it, beyond the observation that it is perhaps unnecessary to seek further to discover the cause of the depression.
