Roosevelt pravi, da so vse govorice, da bo Anglija kmalu vprašala za premirje, ker se je naveličala vojne, samo nemška propaganda, ki jo je Hitler ukazal trositi v Ameriki.

Washington, 6. jun. — Predsednik Roosevelt je danes izjavil, da poslanik Winant, ki se je vrnil iz Anglije, ni prinesel s seboj niti najmanjših mirovnih predlogov in da so vse govorice o mиру samo nemška propaganda. To je predsednik Roosevelt izjavil napram ameriškim časnikarjem.

V potrdilo svoje izjave je rekpel predsednik, da ima na svoji pisalni mizi dva ukaza, ki ju je izdala nemška propaganda agencija v Berlinu in katera sta bila poslana nacijem in fašistom v Zed. države.

Priukaz, je rekpel Roosevelt, naroča nacijem v Ameriki, da naj tukaj širijo govorico, da nima Nemčija nobenega namena kdaj napasti katerokoli deželo v zahodni hemisferi, to je ameriški kontinent.

Drugi ukaz pa je, pravi predsednik, ki naroča nacijem in fašistom takoj ob prihodu poslanika Winanta domov širiti vesti, da poslanik prinaša iz Anglije plăšljive novice, da je Anglia na koncu svoje moći in da se že pripravlja, da ponudi Hitlerju premirje.

Dalje je Roosevelt pripomnil, da je čudno, kako da so take vesti prišle v gotove vrste ameriškega časopisa v istem času, ko je Nemčija poslala svojim pričaštem gori omenjeni ukaze.

Ko je nek časnikar omenil Rooseveltu, da se je širila govorica, da Anglia ne more dolgo vzdržati brez večje pomoči iz Amerike, mu je odvrnil Roosevelt, da taka izjava ni nikdar prišla iz Anglije, ampak morda pa Hitler ne bo dal zopet samostojnost državam: Norveški, Danski, Nizozemski in Belgiji. Pod nobenimi pogoji pa Hitler ne bo dal zopet samostojnost Poljski, Čehoslovaški in Jugoslaviji.

Madrid. — Španska križarka Canaries je priplula v Atlantiku na kraj, kjer je bilo morje posejano s trupli nemških mornarjev s potopljene ladje Bismarck. Španski mornarji so pobrali trupla iz morja in jih potem spustili v morje s polnimi vojaškimi častmi, kot je to običaj na morju.

Jeruzalem gradi zaklonišča proti zračnim napadom

Jeruzalem. — Iz kamnolomov v okolici Jeruzalema so začeli votiti kamenje, s katerim grade podzemna zaklonišča proti zračnim napadom. Ta zaklonišča bodo gotova do konca junija. Angleški in domači inženirji nadzorujejo dela. Izkopali in utrdili bodo po mestu devet kleti, kjer bo prostora za 2,500 oseb. Stopnice v te prostore bodo vodile naravnost s cest.

Na prostem, pred vhodom velikih poslopij, bodo pa zgradili 35 nadaljnih zavetišč, kjer bo prostora za 2,000 oseb. Veliko zavetišče bo zgrajeno v judovskih tržnicah sredi mesta, kjer se vrši glavni promet.

Četrte vrste zaklonišča bo pa zgrajeno v arabskih tržnicah, ki se nahaja pri vhodu v nekdanje staro mesto. Poslopia in trdnave, ki jih je gradil kralj David, bodo porobljena za zgradbo teh modernih zavetišč.

Tako bo do konca tega meseča zgrajenih zaklonišč za približno 70,000 oseb, kar je nekako število ljudi, ki so na ulicah podnevi. Vse to se pripravlja proti nemški zračni sili, čeprav nekateri misljijo, da Hitler ne bo bombardiral Jeruzalem. Toda to ne radi obzira do svetih krajev, ampak zato, ker mesto nima nobene vojaške vrednosti za Nemčijo.

V enega izmed zaklonišč se je zbasalo toliko ljudi, da so popolnoma zaprli vhod s telesi, radi česar ni mogel dohajati v prostore zrak in 700 oseb se je zadušilo. Rdeči križ je vozil s trupki trupla na pokopališče, kjer so jih zakopali v skupnem grobu.

Hitler ima v načrtu zasesti Irsko

Ankara, Turčija. — Vojaški strokovnjaki trdijo, da nemški zračni napad na otok Kreto ni bil vaja za napad na Anglijo, ampak na Irsko. Ako bi Nemčija zasedla Irsko, bi lahko preprečila Angliji vsak dovoz potrebščin iz Amerike in od drugod.

Italijani so bombardirali Gibraltar

London, 6. jun. — Italijanski bombniki so bombardirali giblitalsko trdnjavjo, ki varje zpadni izhod iz Sredozemskega morja. V istem času pa naznajo iz Berlina, da bodo začeli nemški bombniki z vso silo napadati Suez. Angleški bombniki so na metali bombe na zrakoplovno pristanišče Alupo v severni Siriji, kjer so razbili več italijanskih letal. To je bil že 17. angleški napad na razne kraje v Siriji, kjer so imeli Nemci in Italijani oporišča za polete in napade v Iraq.

Napad na Gibraltar in bombardiranje Aleksandrije zadajo sredo se smatra kot začetek kampanje osišča, da zajame angleško brodovje, ki se nahaja točno v Sredozemlju. Nemška poročila zatrjujejo, da bo Nemčija zdaj v

glavnem napadala Suez, ker je tukaj glavna prometna pot, po kateri dobiva angleška mornarica v Sredozemlju potrebščine, enako kot tudi angleška armada, ki se bori v Egiptu in severni Afriki.

Iz Rima se poroča, da so odšli nemški letalci iz Sicilije, kar je verjetno, ker imajo zdaj iz otoke Krete mnogo bližje za napade v Iraq.

Najbolj zagonetno vlogo pa igra Francija z ozirom na Sirijo. Medtem, ko trdi, da ni v Siriji nobenega nemškega vojaka na bo tamkajšnja francoska armada branila to kolonijo tako proti Nemcem kot Angležem, pa se zatrjuje iz Turčije, da prihaja nemški vojaki noč in dan v Sirijo in sicer po suhem, po vodi in po zraku.

Pavelič na posvetovanju pri diktatorju Hitlerju

Berlin, 6. jun. — Danes je bil na posvetovanju pri Hitlerju v Berchtesgaden načelnik hrvatske države, dr. Ante Pavelič. Hitler je ukazal nove stroge odredbe proti Judom na hrvatskem. Ukazano jim je bilo, da morajo v tenu 20 dni sporočiti na vlado vse svoje premično in nepremično premoženje. Vsi Judje morajo nositi rumen gumb s črko "Z," kar pomeni Zionist in pa izraelsko zvezdo.

Pavelič je bil pri Hitlerju dve ure. Navzoča sta bila feldmaršal Goering in zunanjim minister Ribbentrop. V javnosti sicer ne pridejo ti pomenki, toda sodi se, da se ustvarja nova diplomatska kampanja. Gledate Paveličev obisk pri Hitlerju je časopis prineslo, da se je razgovor vršil v duhu "priateljstva, ki veže nemški in hrvatski narod."

Narod pridno kupuje bonde in znake

Washington, D. C. — Zakladniški tajnik z veseljem naznana, da je prinesla prodaja obrambnih bondov in znakov prvi mesec v zvezno blagajno \$441,782,000. To je dovolj denarja, da se lahko zgradi štiri velike bojne ladje, ali 20 križark, ali 100 rušilcev, ali 4,000 bojni letal, ali 1000 bombnikov.

Cigare je prižigal z bankovci, revn umrl

Evansville, Ind. — James MacKey, star 78 let, je bil pokopan kot občinski revez na tukajšnjem pokopališču. V mladih letih je slovel, da si je prižigal cigare z \$100 bankovci. To je bilo še takrat, ko je bil njegov oče milijonar, toda je leta 1915 izgubil vse premoženje.

PAPEŽ NI ZADOVOLJEN Z MADJARI

Rim, 5. jun. — Sveta Stolica je dovolila vatikanskemu glasilu, Osservatore Romano, da je dalno javno klofuto madjarskemu zunanjemu ministru Bardossyu, katerega je sprejel papež v avdženci. Minister je prišel v Rim, da se pogovori z Mussolinijem o novih mejah med Madjarsko in Hrvatsko.

Ceprav je Madjarska katoliška država in je bila vedno v tehnih stikih z Vatikanom in ceprav je prišel minister Bardossyu kot načelnik madjarske vlade v avdžencijo k papežu, pa je njegov obisk omenil Osservatore Romano same med imeni petih drugih oseb, ki so bile isti dan pri papežu. Nobene druge besede ni v vatikanskem glasilu o madjarskem ministru, ki ob takih prilika posveča predstavnikom držav veliko pozornost in cele kbrane. Vatikanovo glasilo niti ne omenja, če je minister obiskal kardinala Maglione, papeževega državnega tajnika, in če mu je to vrnli obisk, kot je to sicer običaj.

Diplomati iz vsega tega sklepajo, da je hotel s tem papežu pokazati svoje nezadovoljstvo z madjarsko politiko, ki je šla z osiščem in padla po Jugoslaviji klicu prijateljski pogodbi z isto. vabljeni.
