Msgr. Jožef Kvas — novi ljubljski pomožni škof

CLEVELAND, O. - Ljubljanski nadškof in metropolit dr. Alojzij Šuštar je za 14. tm. sklical izredno sejo konzistorije (zbora) svojih najstarejših svetovalcev. Pri seji jim je naznanil, da mu je sv. oče Janez Pavel II. imenoval msgr. Jožefa Kvasa za drugega pomožnega škofa. Škofovsko posvečenje bo 12. junija ob četrti uri popoldne v ljubljanski stolnici. Nadškof je že 7. decembra 1981 zaprosil apostolski sedež, naj bi za Ljubljano imenoval še enega pomožnega škofa. Novoimenovani škof je že do sedaj opravljal službo škofovega vikarja in dekana mesta Ljubljane.

Novi škof je doma iz Zaloga pri Cerkljah na Gorenjskem. Rodil se je 9. septembra 1919. V domačem kraju je opravil osnovno šolo, nato pa je stopil v ljubljansko Marijanišče in obiskoval klasično gimnazijo. Po maturi l. 1939 se je vpisal na teološko fakulteto. V duhovnika je bil posvečen 5. junija 1945 v Zagradu pri Gospe Sveti na Koroškem.

Prva tri leta je služboval kot kaplan v Bovcu v goriški nadškofiji; l. 1948 pa ga je škof Vovk poklical za kaplana v Semič. Od 1952 do 1962 je bil župnik v Stopičah pri Novem mestu, takrat pa je postal kanonik kolegialnega kapitlja v Novem mestu. Opravljal pa je tudi službo vikarja.

Leta 1968 ga je nadškof Pogacnik poklical za kanonika v Ljubljano, kjer je do sedaj opravljal vrsto služb. Bil je konzistorialni svetnik, sodnik cerkvenega sodišča, arhidjakon, dekan mesta Ljubljane in škofov vikar za Ljubljano. Od l. 1977 je imel odn. ima pravico izrednega birmovalca ter je v tej službi obiskal že veliko župnij. Svoje duhovniško poslanstvo je vedno pojmoval kot službo, zato ne preseneča geslo, ki si ga je izbral za svoj škofovski grb: Služiti v veselju!

K imenovanju novemu škofu iskreno čestitamo tudi verni Slovenci po ZDA in Kanadi; nebeškega Očeta pa prosimo, naj bogato blagoslovlja njegovo delo!

»Kardinal Kuharić v Sloveniji«

(Konec)

LJUBLJANA, 4. maja - Kardinal Kuharić, ki je vodil mašo v lepi slovenščini, je v prav tako lepem jeziku, v katerem verni Slovenci častimo Boga, prebral tudi daljši nagovor, ki ga objavljamo skoraj v celoti.

Ko je kardinal vse pristrčno pozdravil in se zahvalil za gostoljubje, je najprej spregovoril o svojih dosedanjih stikih s Cerkvijo na Slovenskem. Še kot župnik v Samoboru se je s slovenskimi škofi in duhovniki srečeval v naši obmejni župniji Veliki Dolini, kot škof pa je pogosto prihajal v Slovenijo. Tudi prejšnji zagrebški nadškofje so imeli prijateljske stike s Slovenijo. Tako je nadškof Bauer rad prihajal v Stično, kardinal Štepinac je med vojsko rad sprejel nad 200 izgnanih slovenskih duhovnikov in jih nastavil po župnijah zagrebške nadškofije. Tudi kardinal Šeper je imel pristrčne odnose s slovenskimi škofi.

Tudi njegovo današnje bivanje v Sloveniji naj bi bilo potrditel in nova spodbuda za tradicionalno dobre odnose med našimi delnimi Cerkvami.

Ko se je kardinal zahvalil vsem tistim Slovincem, ki so mu čestitali za kardinalsko imenovanje, je spregovoril o nekaterih lepotah Slovenije, ki ga vedno znova prevzamejo. Posebej je omenil cerkve in cerkvice na naših gričih in gorah, med katerimi jih je zelo veliko posvečenih božji Materi. Nato je nadaljeval:

»V tem svetem letu odrešenja želimo jaz in moja sobrata pomožna škofa in generalna vikarja dati temu obisku značaj svetoletnega romanja v vašo stolnico. Naj bo to preprosto izraz naše katoliške skupnosti, v katero smo v moči odrešenja povezani tako katoliški Slovenci kot katoliški Hrvatje v Jezusu Kristusu v milostno bratstvo iste vere, upanja in ljubezni.

Vsak narod ima svojo identiteto-svojskost, ima in pozna svojo zgodovino, zaveda se povezanosti z vsemi prejšnjimi rodovi, izraža se s svojim jezikom, svojo pesmijo in kulturo, s svojim načinom življenja. Zato ima vsak narod kakor tudi vsaka človeška oseba svoje dostojanstvo, svoje prirojene pravice in zasluži, da ga spoštujejo drugi narodi kakor tudi sam izraža spoštovanje do drugih narodov in njihove svojskosti. Tako je to že na ravni tuzemskih vrednosti. To velja tako za slovenski kot tudi za hrvatski narod v naši državi in na svetu.

Nad tem pa je še nekaj višjega, lepšega in globljega, kar narode zbližuje, povezuje in krepi v njih resnične prijateljske odnose in dobrohotnost enih do drugih: to je navzočnost Cerkve v narodnem bitju.

V slovenskem in hrvaškem narodu je Cerkev navzoča - čeprav je zgodovina obeh narodov zelo različna - Cerkev zbira okrog sebe večji del sinov in hčera vsakega naroda od teh dveh narodov, zbira jih v cerkveno skupnost in vsebino iste vere.

Moja navzočnost med vami naj bo znamenje te nadnaravne skupnosti, te povezanosti po Srcu našega Gospoda Jezusa Kristusa; skupnosti, katero izpovedujemo, ko molimo: Oče nas, ki si v nebesih.

Prav tako smo povezani na tem nadnaravnem nivoju po češčenju in ljubezni do božje Matere, ki je duhovna Mati vseh narodov in jo zato povsem svobodno in primerno vsak narod kliče za svojo Kraljico. Če jo mi kličemo Kraljica Hrvatov, jo z isto pravico in z isto ljubeznijo tudi vi kličete Kraljica Slovencev. Ti naslovi si ne prisvajajo nečesa, kar ne bi pripadalo tudi drugim; taki nazivi ne izključujejo, pač pa povezujejo. V Bogu ni meja, tako ni meja tudi v srcu božje Matere, meja, ki bi delile, ker materinska ljubezen vse povezuje.

Zato imam za dobro, da se tudi na ta način z obiski duhovnega značaja, razodeva naša povezanost, pogloblja prijateljstvo in krepi ljubezen.

Vedno rad slišim, da slovenski verniki romajo v svetišča Matere božje na Hrvaškem, posebno v Marijo Bistrico in na Trsat. Prav tako, ko hrvaški romarji obiskujejo svetišča Matere božje v Sloveniji, rad poslušam o lepih vtisih, ki jih prinašajo z Brezij ali Svetih gora...

Vsak vernik, ne glede na to, kateri narodnosti pripada, se v vsaki cerkvi Matere božje počuti kot doma. Ker pa je vsaka naša cerkev božja hiša, smo kot božji sinovi in hčere v vsaki cerkvi v svoji hiši. Zato naj tudi to naše kratko in preprosto romanje v vašo stolnico izraža, da se tudi tukaj med vami počutimo kot bratje med brati v božji hiši, okrog istega oltarja, okrog istega Odrešenika.

Nato je kardinal Kuharić kratko razložil evangelij dnevnice maše, ki je obsegal Jezusovo priliko o trti in mladikan. Povedal je tudi, da daruje mašo za skupnost, med katero se nahaja, za vse skupaj in za vsakega posebej.

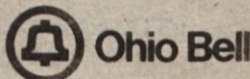

He came from a family of 14 children. Under Austrian Imperium he had to wear a soldiers uniform and serve seven years including World War I from 1914-1918 on the battlefields of Russia and Italy.

During the ruling of King Alexander, he was in 1932 arrested and confined in Ljubljana and Maribor; but in spite of this persecution, he won office in the election as a candidate of the Slovene People Party in his home town.

In the beginning of World War II in 1941 he was arrested as a Mayor of Kamnik by the German Secret Police, jailed and transported to Siberia. His estate was confiscated. After the war, in 1945, it was nationalized and Nande, true to God and country, was forced to flee and seek refuge again.

He later became a citizen of the USA and he always had confidence in victory of "Human rights and honest economic regulations for all people in the world."

Euclid Memorial Parade Will Be Largest in All of Greater Cleveland

Euclid's Memorial Day parade will commence on Monday, May 30 at 10:00 a.m. from E. 228 St. and march to Memorial Park on E. 222 St.

Euclid's Joint Veterans Council sponsors the 30th anniversary program with the involvement of American Legion Post 343, Jewish War Veterans Post 712, Euclid Veterans Club, and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1056, and Polish Legion of American Veterans.

Special guest from Washington, DC will be Senator Frank J. Lausche who served in WWI as an officer in France. He will accompany Honorary Chairman of the Parade Mayor Anthony J. Giunta.

Giving the Memorial Day address will be Brig. General James M. Abraham who served under General George S. Patton.

Armament in the parade will be an "M-48", a 52-ton U.S. Army tank from the Ohio National Guard, from the Navy a float of a replica of the U.S.S. Constitution (oldest commissioned Navy vessel afloat.) 92 Servicemen Honored
The names of 92 Euclid Servicemen lost in action in World War II, Korea, and Vietnam will be revealed for the first time. They will be inscribed on a Veterans Monument located next to Euclid City Hall, in Veterans Memorial Park.

Traditionally, the Mayor accompanies Euclid's Joint Veterans Council for a

ceremony at both Euclid cemeteries. Commencing at 8 a.m., Mayor Anthony J. Giunta offers a salute to the fallen heroes, with the color

guards and firing squads and the veterans from each group participating. Geraniums by the score are placed upon all servicemen's graves.

Slovene Home for Aged Annual Meeting Notes Progress

The new board members were sworn in at the regular monthly meeting. Board officers for the coming year include:

Marie Shaver, president; Rudy Kozan, vice president; Jean Krizman, recording secretary; Alma Lazar,

treasurer; and Rudolph M. Susel, corresponding secretary.

These officers also constitute the Executive Committee.

Recipes

MEATBALLS SUPREME

Soften three slices of bread in 1/2 cup milk, add 1 beaten egg. Mix 1 pound ground beef, 3 tablespoons grated onion, 3 tablespoons snipped parsley, 1 teaspoon salt, and 1/8 teaspoon pepper. Combine bread and meat mixtures; form into 118 balls; roll in flour.

In skillet brown balls in 2 tablespoons hot shortening, drain off excess fat. Add 2 cups tomato juice, 1 cup water, 1/2 cup chopped carrots, 1/2 cup chopped celery, 1 teaspoon kitchen bouquet, and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Cover and simmer 45 minutes. Serve sauce with hot cooked rice or mashed potatoes.
