Emerik B E R A N (17.10.1868. - 11.3.1940)

"Idila" za veliki orkester / III. del Suite za veliki orkester.

Prva izvedba je bila v Brnu dne 19. decembra 1897 pri koncertu moravskih skladateljev, ki ga je priredilo Društvo za vzdrževanje češkega orkestralnega združenja v Brnu. V Mariboru se je skladba izvedla dne 5. marca 1920, v Celju pa dne 18. marca 1920, obakrat pri simfoničnih koncertih mariborskega pomnoženega vojaškega orkestra. Vse izvedbe je vodil avtor sam.

V Brnu so to skladbo skupaj z "Legendo I." izvajali tudi v mestnem, tedaj nemškem, gledališču dne 10. septembra 1897 o priložnosti, ko so uprizorili dramo Friedricha Hebbela [1813-1863/ "Cyges und sein Ring". Skladatelj je prejel pismo čestitke društva "Brünner Musikerbund" z dne 14. oktobra 1897. Oceni sta v dnevniku "Marburger Zeitung" z dne 10. marca 1920, štev. 57, ter v "Novi Dobi" /Celje/ z dne 23. marca 1920, štev. 36. Obe oceni, ki sta ju napisala glasbenika (Davorin Beranič in Hermann Frisch/, sta pohvalni, naglašata posebej uspelo instrumentacijo.

V smislu določil zakonov o varstvu avtorske pravice (§ 6 avstr. zak. z dne 26. 12. 1895 d.z. 197, § 8 jugoslov. zak. z dne 26. 12. 1929 Sl. Nov. 304-CXXIX, čl. 54 zak. FLRJ z dne 10. 7. 1957 Sl. l. 36-482/ se šteje prva javna izvedba skladbe za objavo. Od tega časa dalje je pod avtorsko-pravno zaščito po veljavnem zakonu.

Avtor je bil v svojem rojstnem kraju, v Brnu učitelj glasbe na češkem moškem učiteljskem od 1890 do 1898, hkratu pa osem let honorarni predavatelj na konservatoriju za nekatere teoretične predmete. Od jeseni 1898 dalje do upokojitve leta 1926 pa je bil profesor glasbe na moškem učiteljskem v Mariboru. V letih od 1928 do 1936 je deloval kot honorarni profesor na konservatoriju v Ljubljani. Veliko si je prizadeval razvijati slovensko glasbeno življenje v Mariboru vse od leta 1898 dalje skozi težkih trideset let.
