Vsega sirovega ma- sla je danes v hladilnicah do 35.000.000 funtov. Odredba bo v veljavi do 6. marca, 1943.

ITALIJA SE ŽE TRESE

Zavezniški gl. stan, severna Afrika, 20. nov.—Iz glavnega stana zaveznikov v severni Afriki se poroča o prvem spopadu med zavezniško in osiško armado v Tuniziji. Zavezniki so dozdaj preprečili še vsak poskus Nemcev, da bi se pognali iz Bizerte ali Tunisa. Včeraj so se pograbile ameriške motorizirane čete tri- krat z osiškimi. Eno tretjino nemške oklepne kolone so razbili, ostalo in še dve drugi koloni so pa prisilili k umiku.

Ameriške in angleške čete se od vseh strani zgrinjajo proti močno utrjenima pristaniščema, Bizerte in Tunis. Prednje zave- zniške kolone so samo še 30 milj od obeh mest.

Hitlerjev glavni stan pa poro- ča, da je bežeča Rommelova ar- mada zapustila pristanišče Ben- gasi v Libiji. To je zadnje osi- ško pristanišče vzhodno od Tri- poli.

Toda radio iz Moroka je vče- raj naznanjal, da so dovedli Nemci nova ojačenja v Bizerte. Dobili so tudi tanke, katere so pripeljali z letali.

Iz Washingtona so včeraj po- ročali, da so ameriški in angle- ški bombniki z velikim uspehom bombardirali Bizerte in Tunis.

Dočim je maršal Petain iz Vichy apeliral na svoje čete v Afriki, naj se ne pridružijo Amerikancem in Angležem, je francoska afriška komisija raz- glasila amnestijo vsem, ki bi se pridružili zaveznikom.

Osišče kontrolira še 850 milj obrežja v severni Afriki. To zdaj zožujejo zavezniki od vzhoda, od juga in zahoda.

Italija je začela uvidevati svo- jo usodo. Na rimskem radiju so včeraj govorili, da je severna Afrika odkakovalna deska, od- koder bodo Amerikanci razbija- li po Evropi in da je "napočila ura za Italijo."

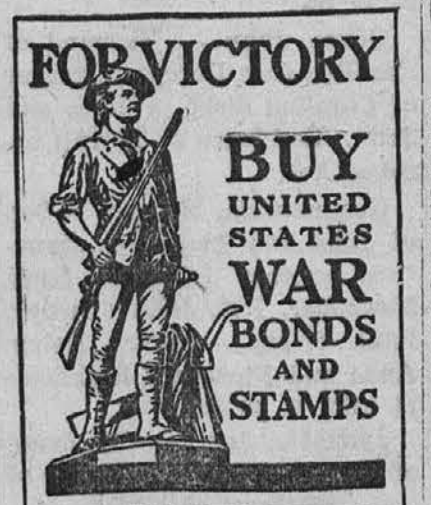

Not only did the Slovene demand that their ruler know their language, but they retained the right to use their language in courts and before the very emperor himself. Set in the annals of the courts we find this: "Insuper Solavica, qua hic utitur perlocutione, in conspectu imperatoris cullibet querulanti dese, et non in lingua alia tenebatur respondere." (Moreover he [the peasant] had the right that in the presence of the emperor he defend himself against the accuser in the Slovene language, which language was used here, and is not bound to answer in any other tongue.)

In Demitz' Geschichte Krain Vol. 3 pg. 297, we see "Windisch wird gehandelt," that is to say "The Slovene language is used in all legal proceedings."

The ancient chronicles in very many places make definite mention that the Carinthian dukes knew Slovene, and that

they too, when accused defended themselves before the emperor in the Slovene language only. This custom however ceased after the 16th century, because the Carinthian rulers from about that time on, no longer made any effort to acquaint themselves with the language of the land.

This symbolic investiture survived for eight centuries. When the Habsburgs came into possession of Carinthia in the closing years of the 13th century, they often endeavored to escape the democratic ceremony, but to no avail. Ferdinand II in 1597, however, was the last Carinthian Duke who was invested at the ducal stone. He was the last duke who answered the questions put to him at the ritual, in the Slovene language. After this the investiture ceremony degenerated into a pure farce. The last time the ducal chair was used was in 1651, when Count Sigismund of Diethichstein, proxied for Emperor Ferdinand.

From all this we can however draw one positive conclusion in spite of what our enemies may say or try to prove. We can with apodeictic surety say that Carinthia (Koroška) was and is Slovene from the time that it was definitely settled. Of course in time its ruling dukes who like everywhere else in the Slovene lands were landed gentry of German descent forced upon the Slovenes from the second decade of the ninth century when the Slovenes lost their independence.

Germany has for several centuries not only minimized the existence of the Slovene nation, but with a well studied and planned procedure has bent all efforts to completely ignore the Slovenes. Today, under the impetus of the present war, she is not only ignoring the Slovenes, but brutal as it may sound, it is nevertheless the truth that Germany is determined that the Slovenes be exterminated from the face of the earth.
