Byrnes bo povedal  
danes Nemcem, da  
Rusija ovira mir

Ameriška in angleška  
cena bosta združeni v  
ekonomsko celoto

Berlin. — Ameriški državni tajnik James Byrnes je dospel sem včeraj, danes se bo podal pa v Stuttgart, kjer bo imel govor pred nemškimi voditelji iz ameriške okupacijske cone. Z Byrnesom sta prišla senatorja Connally in Vandenberg.

Byrnes bo povedal zbranim Nemcem in vsem svetu o nevarnosti, ker Sovjetska Unija noče sodelovati z ostalimi zaveznicami v Nemčiji. Povedal bo Nemcem, da so Zed. države storile vse, da bi vso Nemčijo združile ekonomsko, da pa Rusija tega načrtu noče sprejeti. Ta razvojitev zaveznicov bo morda povzročila zopetno rojstvo nemškega militarizma.

Istočasno se pa poroča, da so se ameriške in angleške vojaške oblasti zedinile, da se ekonomsko združijo njih okupacijske cone v Nemčiji. Vse bodo imele enak standard življenja, enake živilske odmerke ter skupen izvoz in dovoz. Rusija in Francija se nista hoteli pridružiti temu načrtu s svojima conama.

Rusija hoče prestaviti skupščino združenih narodov na pozneje

Pariz. — Ruska delegacija na mirovni konferenci je predlagala, da se prestavi zborovanje skupščine združenih narodov, ki je določeno za 23. sept. na mesec november. Dalje je predlagala Rusija, da se kraj zborovanja premesti iz New Yorka v Pariz ali pa v Genevo, Švica.

Noben od ministrov Zed. države, Anglie in Francije ni bil za predlog Rusije. Ameriški državni tajnik Byrnes je temu ugovarjal, češ, da mora o tem odločati vseh 51 članic te skupščine.

Ruski pomožni komisar Višinski je rekel, da bi mnogo dežel ne moglo imeti svojih zastopnikov obenem na mirovni konferenci v Parizu in na zborovanju skupščine v New Yorku. V tem je pred vsem imenoval Belo Rusijo, Češko in Jugoslavijo.

"Ta dan 23. sept. ni zapisan v sv. pismu, zakaj se ga moramo tretje držati?" je rekel Višinski. O tem so debatirali dve urki in pol, toda niso napravili nobenih sklepov.

Tornado je divjal po Minnesoti

El Rosa, Minn. — Po centralni Minnesoti je včeraj divjal vihar, katerega označujejo kot pravcati tornado. V tej vasici, ki šteje 450 prebivalstva, je poškodoval prav vsako poslopje. O človeških žrtvah prva poročila ne počačajo.

Vihar je poškodoval farmarska poslopja 20 milij na dolgo. Od 50 do 75 skedenjiev in hlevov, je vihar porušil. Škodo cenijo nad \$50,000.

Girardska godba je zmagala

Girard, O. — Girardska godba, pri kateri igrajo vojni veterani, je že šestič zmagala pri tekmi v Bostonu, kjer je bila konvencija Veteranov tujezemskih vojn.

Zmagale bodo Zed. države,  
toda milijone ameriških  
življenj bo žrtvovanih

Cleveland, O. — Včeraj je govoril pred Rotary klubom v hotelu Statler vojni poročevalce Bruce Thomas, ki je bil prisoten ob poskušu atomskih bomb pri otoku Bikini.

Thomas je izjavil, da bodo Zed. države v vojni z Rusijo v poldrugem letu ali najkasneje v 3/letih. V tisti vojni bo najprej porušenih 50 ameriških mest, zatem pa 50 ruskih. Mi (Zed. države) bomo zmagali, toda na milijone Amerikancev bo dalо pri tem življenje od atomske sile.

Izjavil je tudi, da je v atomski vojni vojna mornarica brez pomena ter dodal, da bodo v prihodnji vojni Japonci najbrže naši zaveznički.

**Odbornik Pucel dolži, da  
Cleveland ne dobi dovolj  
gradbenega materiala**

Mestni odbor 10. varde, Edward L. Pucel, ki je načelnik mestnega odseka za gradnjo, bo za pondeljek sklical sejo svojega odbora. Mr. Pucel dolži, da mesto ne dobi toliko gradbenega materiala, v kolikor je upravljeno zanj, radi tega bo šel v Washington, da tam dožene, kje je zadržek.

Rekel je, da je v mestu danes v gradnji 3,000 hiš, katerih pa gradbeniki ne morejo dogotoviti, ker ne morejo dobiti žebļevjev, materiala za strehe, za pode, železino in drugo. Ako se more dobiti ta material takoj v Clevelandu, bi bilo 2,000 hiš dograjenih še pred zimo.

Mr. Pucel je povabil na to sejo v pondeljek ob 2 popoldne v dvorano mestne zbornice, gradbenike, skladničnike gradbenega materiala ter zastopnike raznih vladnih agencij, da se dožene, kje je zastoj. Te seje se lahko udeleži tudi publike.

Lisbona. — Portugalska vlada je obvestila ameriškega poslaniča, da za bodoče ne more več dovoliti kazanje ameriških kulturnih in vzgojevalnih filmov v deželi.

Avtna industrija misli,  
da bodo delavci pričeli  
zopet s stavkami

Detroit. — C. E. Wilson, predsednik General Motors, največje avtne družbe na svetu je izjavil, da je pričakovati splošnega stavkovnega vala po vsej deželi. Delavci bodo prišli na dan z zahtevami po krajsih delovnih urah in večji mezdi. Za to, je izjavil Wilson, je že vse pripravljeno od strani unij.

Za vse to dolži Wilson vladno administracijo, za katero se nikoli ne ve, kaj bo napravila. To je tudi vzrok, da industrija ne more napraviti nobenih načrtov za bodočnost, ker ne ve od enega dneva do drugega, kaj bo prišlo.

Dalje je Wilson izjavil, da delavci niso tako vestni kot so bili včasih in to industrijo najbolj skrbi. Poprečen delavec v letu 1946 je samo 80% toliko vosten, kot je bil leta 1941.

Za to je Wilson podal primer. V septembri 1941 je 265,000 delavcev pri General Motorsu produciralo v enem tednu 55,000 avtov, letosnjega julija je pa zgradilo v enem tednu 323,000 delavcev polovico manj avtov. Vrh tega znaša odsotnost delavcev od dela danes 10%, dočim včasih pred vojno nikdar nad 2 1/2, je izjavil predsednik G. M.

**Senator Mead in guy.  
Dewey bosta kandidata**

New York, N. Y. — Demokratska stranka države New York je imenovala senatorja James M. Mead-a za guvernerskega kandidata, dočim so se republikanci odločili, da bodo podpirali sedanjega guvernerja Tom Deweya.

Demokratska konvencija je bila v Albany, N. Y. republikanska pa v Saratoga Springs.

Za urad senatorja Mead-a se bosta potegovala pa Irving M. Ives in Herbert H. Lehman, prvi na republikanski, drugi na demokratiski listi. Lehman je bivši guverner in bivši direktor UNRRA.

**Anglija je vzela čete iz

London. — Anglija je že vzela nekaj svojih čet iz Grčije. Kdaj bo vzela pa vse, ni znano. Kot je rekel nek vladni uradnik, zavisijo od tega razne okoliščine, kje jih pa ni imenoval.

**Cigaretni davek v Ohio  
večji**

Columbus, O. — To se pravi davek ne bo večji, ampak vedno več pričesa državi. V avgustu je prinesel cigaretne davek državi Ohio \$1,430,055, ali \$302,133 več kot v istem mesecu lanskega leta.

**NEW YORK — Stavka pomorščakov je v polnem teku v vseh ameriških pristaniščih. Poročajo, da je do 600 ladij v raznih pristaniščih, ki so zdaj brez posadke in ne morejo nikam. Do pol milijona pomorščakov in pristaniščnih delavcev je na stavki. Morada bo sam predsednik Truman posegel v stavko, ker je nevarnost, da se pokvari na tisoče ton živeža in drugih stvari, ki so namenjene za prevoz in izvoz.**

CHICAGO — 17 letni dijak William Heirens, ki je priznal brutalni umor 6-letne Suzane Degnan in dveh drugih žensk, je bil obsojen na dosmrtno ječo. Sodnik mu je naložil še druge kazni za rope in tativno, katere bo moral odsesti, če bi bil slučajno kdaj pomiloščen za umore.

**Rusija se bo morda  
umaknila iz zveze  
združenih narodov**

Komunisti vidijo, da so  
zapadne demokracije  
absolutno proti njim

London. — Londonski časopis Daily Mail poroča iz zanesljivih virov, da se bo Sovjetska Unija morda umaknila iz zveze združenih narodov. To zatrjuje v listu diplomatski poročevalci Wilson Broadbent iz Pariza. Ta sicer trdi, da nima o tem nobenih uradnih virov, da pa eika na to vse sovjetska politika in sicer iz sledenih razlogov:

"Odločitev (štirih ministrov) vsebuje najmanjšo pravico, pa bi morala vsebovati največjo justico. Toda včasih ni mogoče imeti največjo pravico, ce se pogaja s političnimi ozirji. Včasih, kadar delamo s političnimi ozirji, dve in dve niso štiri, ampak so včasih celo pet."

To je bil že četrtek dan debate na uravnati Trsta, Istre in Julijskih Krajinc. Ameriški senator Connally je poudarjal, da želi imeti Zed. države avtonomno tržaško vlado, ki bi jo spoštovati Jugoslavijo in Italijo.

Višinski je izjavil, da zahteva Italije po Trstu ni nič drugega kot star italijanski način po aneksiji in ekspanziji. Cilj Italije ni nič drugega kot nagrabiti si tujo lastnino. Jugoslovanske zahteve pa slonijo na ogromni večini slovenskega prebivalstva v okolici pristanišča, ki ima sicer italijansko večino v mestu samem.

Včasih je tudi označil Rapallov pogodbo, glasom katere je dobila Italija Trst po prvi svetovni vojni, kot čin ropanja.

Včeraj se je vrnil v Pariz sovjetski komisar Molotov, ki se je gredoč iz Moskve ustavil tudi v Berlinu.

**Euclid bo dobil več  
vode od Clevelandu**

Washington. — Vladni kontrolni odbor je preiskal ceme mleka in mlečnih izdelkov in dogonal, da še niso "uše iz roke" in da zato še ni treba vladne kontrole nad njimi.

Ko je ta odbor določil 20. avgusta, da pride meso in zabela zopet pod vladno oblast, je tudi odločil, da mleko in žito ostane prosto vladne kontrole. Rekel pa je, da bō pazil na cene teh produktov in če bi se neprimerno visoko dvignile, bi jih zopet spravil pod OPA. Tega zaenkrat še ni treba, pravz zatrad, ko je preiskal te cene.

**Ladja je odpeljala po  
trebščine v Jugoslavijo**

New York. — Kljub temu, da je v Ameriki vstal splošen protest, da bi se v Jugoslavijo pošiljalo nadaljnji relif potom UNRRA, pa je včeraj odpeljala ladja Brown Victory, do vrha naložena z raznim relifom za Titojev Jugoslavijo. Ladja vozi živilo, obleko in zdravila.

Ameriška legija je poslala zadavni protest vladu v Washington, ki se pa na to ni oziral. Pošiljka vsebuje: mesne konzerve, peanutse, sočivje, juhe, posušeno mleko, sadne soke, sirov maslo, riž, pecivo sodo, ribe ter armadne K in C odmerke. Med zdravilnimi potrebsčinami je tudi 13 zabojev žganja.

Na ladji so tudi potrebsčine za Avstrijo in Ogrsko.

**Cerkev in komunisti**

V "Denver Catholic Register" bremo 29. avg. besedilo komunističnega proglaša Denverju. Ker je miselnost komunistov povsod ista, naj navedemo iz tega letaka najznančnejše mesto. Takole govorita komunistični proglaši: "Cerkev mora biti uničena. Predolgo je stala Cerkev delavski revoluciji na poti. Cerkev je orožje vladajočega razreda in mora biti uničena. Naši junaki tovariši v rdeči armadi so enkrat za vselej strili tega smrtnega sovražnika na Poljskem, v Jugoslaviji, Latviji, na Litvanskem, v Estoniji, Rumuniji, na Ogrskem in v Bolgariji."

"Mi delavci razumemo, da so klerikalni fašisti na Španskem, v Jugoslaviji in na Nemškem polagali temelje za Hitlerja ... in sami zrušenjem teh klerikalnih fašistov moremo rešiti svet pred novim Hitlerjem."

Vgori nevedenem letaku je v sicer malo besedah veliko nespameti. Vsak otrok ve, da je bil Hitler prej kot Franco, toda letak govoriti kot da je bil v Španiji položen temelj za nemški nacizem. Komunistični verniki pač veliko preneso. Tudi zgodovinske neresnice. Samo da slišijo nekaj proti klerikalcem, pa so srečni ... Kako naj bi dalje polagali temelje za Hitlerja v Jugoslaviji, te skrivnosti tudi ne razlože denverski komunisti. Drže se pač načela znanega sovražnika Cerkve Voltaire-a: "Krepko laži, nekaj bo že ostalo." Ameriški in slovenski komunisti in še njih sopotniki po vrhu si sami naslikajo na steno vrata "klerikalnega fašizma," da bi tako lahko udarjali proti Cerkvi. Kadar jih vpraša, kaj je to "klerikalni fašizem" ali klerofašizem," čisto zaston pričakuje kakega točnega odgovora. V kalnem je najlažje ribarit in načlajeje je mase zapeljevati z nejasnimi besedami.

-Toda pustimo nespametne laži tega proglaša. Bolj zanimivi sta dve izjavi te komunistične okrožnice.

Prva je tale: "Cerkev mora biti uničena." Ti denverski komunisti so vsaj toliko pošteni, da to naravnost povedo. Drugi premnogokrat skrivajo ta svoj namen. Le berite dopise partizanskih prigrajančev po slovenskih "naprednih" listih. Koliko jih je, ki govorite, da so za vero, da celo za Cerkev, da pa so samo proti škofu, proti papežu, proti duhovnikom. Postavljajo se v pozno branilcev "prave vere," da bi lažje na tihem zastrupljali. Ti denverski komunisti se ne gredo skrivalnice, ampak naravnost povedo, da je namen komunizma uničiti Cerkev.

In zakaj hočjo uničiti Cerkev? Letak pravi, da je Cerkev stala delavski revoluciji na poti. Ob tej besedi se nehotite vprašujemo, ali ni stala in še stoji na poti revolucije tudi država. Ali morda Zedinjene države ameriške dovoljujejo kako revolucijo? Zakaj ne pravijo komunisti naravnost, da mora tudi ameriška država biti uničena, ker je na poti revolucije? Res je, da stojita Cerkev in država revoluciji na poti. Ne ena ne druga ne more reči, da je prav prelivati kri, da je prav oropati druge njih zasebne lasti, da je prav delati krivico, pa naj bo to v imenu delavca ali koga drugega. Obe ti ustanovi stojita na stališču, da še drže naravnost zapovedi, da se ne sme uzbijati, krasti itd.

Cerkev tedaj res ni in ne more biti za krvavo revolucijo, kot jo izvajajo komunisti po nesrečnih deželah, kjer so se dokopali do neomejene oblasti. Toda nastane vprašanje, ali je bila kdaj Cerkev proti delavstvu ali proti kakim njegovim pravicam? Vsi vemo, da nikdar ni bila katoliška Cerkev proti delavstvu. Predno je bil kje kak komunist, je ta Cerkev učila, da je vnebovijoč greh zatiranje ubožev, vdov in sirot ter da prav takoj vpije do nebes, če kdo delavcem in najemnikom odtrguje njih zasluzek. S svojim naukom je varovala pravice delavstva, ni pa mogla in nikoli ne bo mogla oznanjati, da se dajo varovati pravice s krivicami, z umori in ropi, ki jih prinaša komunistična revolucija. In kadar vprašate komunističnega vpijata, naj pove, kdaj je Cerkev učila nekaj, kar bi bilo proti delavstvu, ravno tako ne dobiti odgovora, kot ce ga vprašate, kaj je "klerofašizem." Za take odgovore jih vselej obseže mutasti hudič, čeprav so drugače tako glasni.

O vemo, kako radi kažejo na napake posameznih kataličanov, ki da niso bili pravčni. Toda, ali odgovarja vsa Cerkev za napake posameznih članov? Zakaj bi bilo potreba uničiti Cerkev, če je v njej kak posamezen človek, ki se ne drži njenih naukov? Tudi med cerkevnimi uslužbencami so lahko slabe navade in razvade. Tudi ti lahko greše proti nauku svoje Cerkve. Lahko so slab duhovniki, lahko kak slab škof, lahko je slab papež. Vse to je mogoče, ker so vti služabniki Cerkve ljudje. Če bi komunist povedal, katero napako ima kak posamezen katoličan in če bi zraven našteval, kako naj se taka napaka popravi, bi mu bila še Cerkev hvaležna. Toda komunist izjavlja naravnost: "Cerkev mora biti uničena."

Menda mora biti že tudi slepcu jasno, da se danes bije veliki boj: Na eni strani komunizem, na drugi oni, ki zaupajo krščanstvu. Komunist trdi: "Cerkev mora biti uničena," mi pa smo mnenja, da mora biti strta komunistična propaganda in izruvana iz človeških src protikrščanske zmote. Kdo bo mogel v tem velikem boju ostati neodločen.

Druga zanimiva izjava gori imenovanega proglaša pa je priznanje, "da so junaki tovariši v rdeči armadi strili tega smrtnega sovražnika (Cerkev) v Jugoslaviji." Denverski komunist je prepričan, da je Cerkev v Jugoslaviji enkrat za

vselej strta. Mi smo mnenja, da se moti. Zanimivo pa je, da se komunisti bahajo, da so strli katoliško Cerkev v Jugoslaviji. Če tudi ameriški komunisti pretiravajo, vendar s svojo trditvijo živo podprtavajo, da je njih namen uničiti katoličanstvo v tej nesrečni deželi.

Večkrat smo pisali, kako preganjajo komunistični partizani katoličanstvo v Sloveniji. Poudarili smo, da so napravili ogromno škodo, da pa so vzbudili tudi velik odpor ljudstva proti razkrstjanjenju. Nikakega dvoma ni za nas, da delajo partizani po načrtu in da bodo skušali zatrepi pologama vsak verski izraz, če bi jim to moglo upseti. Gornja izjava denverskih komunistov, ki se kar bahajo, da so njih tovariši že strli Cerkev v Jugoslaviji, le znova potrjuje, kar smo mi pisali.

Zato pa je ob vsem tem tako nerazumljivo, da še more kak ameriški slovenski katoličan pomislovati s komunističnim partizanstvom in kako more zagovarjati Titovo diktaturo. Saj ni nikjer zapisano, da mora kdo verjeti ravno našemu listu! Danes vsi najdejo to, kar smo mi opisovali, povedano po vseh ameriških listih. Naj vendar mislimo s svojo glavo, pregledajo dogodek, pretehtajo dokaze za in proti. Predvsem pa, naj se iztrgajo iz mreže komunistične propagande. Po njih sadu jih boste spoznali, pravi sveto pismo. Ali res sadovi, ki jih roditi Titovo gospodarjenje, ne morejo odprieti spoznanja nekaterih? Ali bodo skušali sedeti na dveh stolih tako dolgo, da jih še novi dogodki, ki se pripravljajo, s silo vržejo na tla?

Gornja izjava komunistov morda koga le pripravi do lastnega mišljenja in mu dopove, da se bo moral rad ali ne rad odločiti za en tabor. In a paper presented to the convention of the American Pharmaceutical Association, Drs. James C. Munch and A. B. Slone, both of Philadelphia, said mice can be used in the biological tests by injecting them with saliva taken from a horse.

The paper said if the drug is polluted with morphine the mice's tails will curl into the shape of a letter "S". Other drugs produce other effects. The test requires only 5 minutes to complete, the paper said.
