

### SLOVENE OR SLOVENIAN?

F. J. Kern, MD

Unfortunately, there is still no unanimity in using the proper designation in the English language for our people. The British and many American publications still use the word Slovene, both as a noun and or as an adjective, instead of the more prevalent "Slovenian" in the official government documents.

While compiling my English-Slovene Dictionary in 1918, I decided to use the word Slovene to conform with the official name in the title for the new Yugoslavia after War I, namely: "The Kingdom of Serbs, Croats and Slovenes". Until the establishment of the Federated Republic of Slovenia after War II there was no officially recognized country with the name Slovenia, neither was it found in the world atlases. Under the Hapsburg Empire of Austria-Hungary the Slovenians were scattered through several separate provinces, such as Carniola, Styria, Carinthia, Goriza-Littoral (Kranjsko, Štajersko, Korosko, Gorisko-Primorsko), etc. We were known as a people not as a country.

The British writers always used the word Slovenes for Slovenci. They took the name from the French expression Slovenes, in use since Napoleon's Province of Illyria. Similarly, the Yugoslav diplomats after War I, gave a new Yugoslav state the awkward English title "The Kingdom of Serbs, Croats, Slovenes." (This sounds good in the French language.) An equally disastrous mistake was made by the "Czechs", who called their new state Czechoslovakia instead of Czecho-Slovakia, since the Cz was also used by the French for Slav letter C, imitating Magyar and Polish spelling of the word with Oz.

There is no justification for the use of the English word Slovenia at the present time. Slovenia - Slovenian, Croatian-Croatian, Serbia-Serbian, Romania-Romanian, Italia-Italian, etc. All our publications and organizations should follow this rule.

Not only have we been careless in using various different words for Slovenian, we have been quite negligent in its pronunciation both by the immigrant Slovenians and also by their descendants. According to the grammatical and dictionary usages of the English language the word Slovenian must be pronounced with a long "e", not with the "e" as in Slovenec. The radio broadcasters and speakers should be especially careful in pronouncing the word correctly.

I must admit the bad influence my English-Slovene Dictionary and the English-Slovene Reader has in the above matter. The second and third editions of the Dictionary were, with the exception of a few pages, exact reprints from the original edition of 1919. The word Slovene was retained against my wish.

## This and That from Washington

FROM ALL that can be gathered on Capitol Hill the sentiment there is to reduce rather than increase taxes.

It is well known that Congressman Robert Doughton, the venerable Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, is against increasing the people's tax load. At the moment the Committee staff is hard at work on a tax revision measure under his direction. This is reported to be a revision downward.

Such men as Senator Walter F. George, Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and Senator Harry F. Byrd, have come out strongly against increased taxation on the basis that it would inevitably slow down business. In the west, Senator Edwin C. Johnson (D-Colorado) is opposing increases, and is urging the cutting of expenditures to lower the deficit. He has even suggested that the people of this country should be facing the cold fact that if we are to do solvent we must be willing to do without many things we would like to have.

MEMBERS of the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House are rejoicing that "Mike" Mansfield (D-Montana) has refused the post of Assistant Secretary of State in Charge of Information being left vacant by the appointment of George V. Allen as Ambassador to Yugo-Slavia. Congressman Mansfield is one of the most respected members of the Committee with a seniority that puts him in a position of considerable responsibility.

Secretary Allen served us well as Ambassador in Iran. He is a quiet, fearless, well-equipped career man intent upon one thing— to see America assume a place of leadership in a free world. He has a powerful ally in his charming and very able wife who is a simple, wholesome, delightful and capable exponent of American womanhood. That the moment has come when they must leave their children behind them in America grieves them sorely, but like all our foreign service—indeed all our service people—they are accepting the separation as part of the job.

In this tragedy the House of Representatives suffered an irreparable loss in the death of Congressman George Bates of Massachusetts, whose life has been spent in the service of his country. We who worked with him received from him a constant stimulus to duty, and the giving of increasingly more intelligent service. No one could contact him without realizing that here was a man of honor, a man of high integrity. Quiet, simple, sane, kindly and earnest, his death takes from us one who could ill be spared. The loss is not just to his family and friends but extends from one end of this great country to another, this country that he loved and served with all his mind and heart, his vision and desire.

## STRAIGHT FROM WASHINGTON

Washington.—This may not be flattering to Congressmen but the cruel fact is when Congress recessed recently there was no noticeable suffering in the country. On the other hand, when coal miners and steelworkers receive that can become a very painful matter to our people.

ECONOMY IN GOVERNMENT

President Truman, when a Senator, said, "It is easy to appropriate billions of dollars, but it is not so easy to obtain those billions of dollars. There is a limit, to the amount by which we can safely increase our national debt. The American people are not willing and must not be asked to suffer unnecessary burdens of waste, carelessness and confusion."

The fact is, it would be easy for our government to live within its means and to balance the budget with a substantial surplus were it not for national defense and armament expenditures made necessary by the Soviet Union's aggressive tactics and the "cold war" which we have been compelled to wage. It is a further fact that this nation cannot continue such tremendous spending for national defense purposes. This entire subject must be given the most thorough and most searching examination.

WHAT IS YOUR CHOICE?

Three conflicting health aid plans may be considered in the Congress next year. The Administration Plan provides compulsory health insurance for nearly everybody commencing July, 1951. Workers and employers would pay 1 1/4 payroll tax and self-employed up to 3%, all on the first \$3,600.

Under this plan there would be Federal subsidies for medical schools, students, local health units, hospital construction, rural doctors, etc.; also free medical care including sixty days' hospitalization, hearing aids, glasses. The estimated total cost, if this plan becomes a law, is six billion dollars a year.

The second plan would cost about two billion dollars in five years. This would provide Federal subsidies for medical schools, free examination of school children, free treatment of needy children, and subsidies for local hospital construction. No compulsory health insurance, no special tax.

The American Medical Association favors Federal aid for hospital construction, medical education and research. This association, at the same time, opposes medical care for school children. That would be state socialism, they say. In other words, they favor Federal subsidies for doctors but

not for hospitals. The third plan, sponsored by Senator Hill of Alabama, would be entirely voluntary. The cost would not be great. State health insurance agencies would pay all or part of monthly premiums charged by voluntary health insurance plans for people unable to meet medical bills, the Federal Government to split the costs with the states and encourage expansion of state insurance programs.

Debt should not be the penalty the majority of people have to pay for adequate medical care.

The term "socialized medicine" is the reactionary's cuss-word for National Health Insurance.

ANOTHER TRIAL RUN

The new Republican slogan "statism," which has taken the place of the G.O.P. slogan, "Truman depression" was given a trial run in the New York Senatorial contest of U. S. Senator Dulles to turn back former Governor Herbert Lehman.

If Senator John Foster Dulles wins,

G.C.P. leaders will be convinced they have struck it rich. If Herbert Lehman wins, the G.O.P. big-wigs will begin trying to figure out another slogan. This prediction is written on the eve of that election.
