Nemci si utirajo pot za invazijo v Anglijo

Na prelazu Brenner, 4. okt. — Adolf Hitler in Benito Mussolini sta se danes razgovarjala tri uri na oklopnom vlaku ter dela načrte za novo potevo v boju proti Angliji in pogon rimske berlinske osi za "nov red" v Evropi. Ko se je Mussolini odpeljal proti jugu po končanih razgovorih, ni črnih nobene besede o vsebini razgovorov.

Rim, 4. okt. — Benito Mussolini in Adolf Hitler sta se danes sestala na zgodovinskem prelazu Brenner. Da so bili razgovori važni, se sklepa iz tega, ker je prisostvoval konferenci tudi nemški feldmaršal Keitel, ki je vrhovni poveljnik nemške armade.

Seji so prisostvovali tudi laški zunanjji minister Ciano ter nemški zunanjji minister von Ribbentrop. Dalje je bil navzoč Dino Alfieri, laški poslanik za Nemčijo, Hans von Mackensen, nemški poslanik v Rimu ter uradniki zunanjih ministrstev obeh držav.

Ciano in Ribbentrop sta imela svojo posebno sejo, kar da sklepata, da sta Hitler in Mussolini konferirala brez navzočnosti svojih zunanjih ministrov. Seja se je pričela ob enajstih dopoldne, eno uro prej kot je bila napovedana. Mussolini je čkal na kolodvorskih peronu na avstrijsko-italijanski meji, ko je došel Hitlerjev vlak, ki je vozil do zaključka.

GUIDO AND HIS REFORMS IN MUSICAL NOTATION

The invention of musical notation and the solfeggio are ascribed to Guido, a medieval musician and Benedictine monk. He introduced the names "Ut," "Re," "Mi," "Fa," "Sol," and "La" for the first six notes of the scale and originated the four-line staff, employing extra lines above and below whenever necessary.

Guido noticed that each line of the hymn to St. John began a note higher than the preceding, and adopted the first syllable of each line as the name of its corresponding note:

"Ut queant laxis
Resonare fibris
Mira gestorum
Familii tuorum
Solve polluti
Labii restum
Sancte Johannes."

Later the "Ut" was changed to "Do" except in France, and the "Si" or "Ti" was added. So was evolved the sight-reading system which is still in use, consisting of the syllable signs — Do, Re, Mi, Fa, Sol, La, Si, Do.

Guido was born probably near Paris about the year 995. He was educated at St. Maur des Fosses. At the Benedictine monastery at Pomposa he taught singing and introduced new methods in music. These met with local disfavor, which resulted in his flight to Arezzo. About the year 1030 he was summoned to Rome to demonstrate his musical discoveries to Pope John XIX.

PLAIN PASTRY

1½ cups flour
¼ teaspoon salt, level
¼ cup shortening
¼ cup butter
1 tablespoon ice water
½ teaspoon Baking Powder
Sift flour and salt; cut in shortening with two knives or pastry blender until mixture is the size of small peas. Add water, a tablespoon at a time, mixing and pressing ingredients together with fork until dough is just moist enough to hold together. Form in a ball. Chilling dough facilitates handling.

CITY SPEED LIMITS

There are many reasons that can be advanced to explain traffic accidents. Pedestrian action is an important factor in many serious accidents. Drinking drivers are responsible for many crashes and there are dozens of other causes but most important and the most frequent cause is excessive speed. The careless action of a pedestrian doesn't mean disaster unless there is a vehicle moving fast enough to strike the fatal blow. Skidding, failure to observe a traffic sign and question of the right of way will cause traffic accidents but they are most often serious when they are combined with speed. Excessive speed figured in more than thirty-five per cent of the fatal accidents last year.

Drivers should make frequent checks of the speed they are traveling. Modern cars move along at high speed without noise or effort and the driver is often surprised to find that his speed is far in excess of the legal limits. The speed rate in Cleveland is twenty-five miles an hour except school or congested districts where twenty miles per hour is the limit. On main thoroughfares outside the business and congested districts, speeds up to thirty-five are permitted. To save yourself from traffic accidents or a visit to traffic court check your speed frequently to be sure you are within the legal limit.
