Moskva. — Državni tajnik Marshall in angleški zunanji minister Bevin sta se izjavila za to, da se združi Saarsko kot- lino s Francijo. Mr. Marshall je predlagal, naj začno mini- stri takoj proučevati to točko.

Oba, Marshall in Bevin sta se pa izjavila odločno proti predlogu Francije, da bi se Po- rurje in Porenje ločilo od Nemčije. Francoski minister Bidault je predlagal, da bi se izročilo premogovnike in li- varne v Porurju onim deželam, ki so se bojevale proti Nemčiji, Porurje pa da naj se poli- tično loči od Nemčije ter izro- čijo v upravo koncilu združenih narodov.

Marshall in Bevin sta se ta- koj izjavila odločno proti te- mu, dočim sta priznala Fran- ciji pravico do Saarske kotli- ne.

Sovjetski minister Molotov je molčal pri vsej tej razpravi.

Stroški vojne so se zvišali v enem stoletju v denarju in žrtvah

Washington. — Armada je dala v javnost številke, ki kaže- jo, da so se izdatki za vojno zvi- šali v zadnjem stoletju 245 krat in izguba življenj je bila pa za 24 krat višja. Te številke je iz- dala v javnost ob 30-letnici, kar je stopila Amerika v prvo svetov- no vojno.

Iz teh števil je razvidno, da je padlo v španski vojski 12,946 ameriških vojakov, a vojna je stala \$139,500,208. V špansko- ameriški vojni je padlo 6,742 vo- jakov, stroški so znašali \$992, 159,840. V prvi svetovni vojni je padlo 193,663 vojakov, stroški so bili \$21,850,000,000. V drugi svetovni vojni je padlo 313,000 vojakov, stroški so znašali pa \$340,000,000,000.

Toda v tem še niso zapopadeni vsi stroški 2. svetovne vojne. Kar izda samo vlada za vetera- ne bo dvignilo do 1972 na ogro- mno vsoto \$700,000,000,000.

Turčija kupuje letala od Anglije

London. — Daily Graphic po- roča, da je bilo prodanih Turči- ji 500 bojnih letal in da so jih odpeljali na Turško bivši angle- škiji letalci. Vozili so jih po 12 hkrati in začeli s pošiljkami že kmalu po novem letu.

Business je zahteval, da ima v svojih rokah kontrolo cen. Zdal jo ima in naj pokaže, kaj bo napravil.

Bilo bi nepraktično, če bi vla- da zopet vzela kontrolo cen v svoje roke, ker ljudje tega ne marajo.

Ako gredo odjemalci na stav- ko, to položaja ne bi izboljšalo, ampak še poslabšalo.

Izrazil je upanje, da stavke letos ne bodo tako porazne kot so bile laniako leto in da bodo izlah- ka poravnane.

Predsednik ne bo poročal kon- gresu glede cen, ker kongres sam dovolj sliši o tem.

Rekel je tudi, da ima v rokah brzovojke od kakega ducata trvdik, ki naznanjajo znižanje cen in da je tega zelo vesel.

Izjavil je, da je odpravljen davek na dobiček, da bi se s tem pomagalo businessu. Naj bo to- rej business za to hvaležen in naj nekaj napravi glede nižjih cen produktom.

"Ako bo kakšna debata z rus- kim komunizmom v pogojih, ka- kršne edine more razumeti Ev- ropa, bi bila to debata, v kateri bi bili katoličani zmagovalci. Nobenega dvoma nima, da ne bi mogli zmagati, seveda, če bi ka- toličani v resnici hoteli," je go- voril dr. Shuster.

Zastopniki 19 patriotičnih, verskih, civilnih in delavskih or- ganizacij v Greater Clevelandu se je večeraj združilo ter se pri- klopilo splošnemu gibanju po de- želi, ki naj doseže v kongresu po- stavo, da se dovoli emigracijo 400,000 osebam v Zed. države, ki prebivajo zdaj po raznih be- gunskih taboriščih v Evropi.

Za predsednika te skupine je bil imenovan okrajni sodnik James C. Connell. Skupina bo zdaj najprej skušala doseči v kongresu sprejem predloga, ki je že vložen, da se dovoli naseliti v deželi 100,000 emigrantom vsa- ko leto skozi 4 leta.

Pod imenom "begunci" ozna- čuje ta skupina osebe, ki žive v Nemčiji, Avstriji in Italiji ki so bile prisiljene zapustiti svojo rojstno domovino v drugi svetov- ni vojni in ki se zdaj nočejo vrniti domov ker se boje prega- njanja iz političnih ali drugih ozirov. Teh oseb živi zdaj okrog 850,000 po raznih taboriščih v Evropi. Več kot polovica teh je žensk in otrok.

Vladne oblasti bi vsako teh oseb natančno pregledale, pred- no bi bila dopuščena v Zed. drža- vo. Američanom, kriminalcem ali osebam, ki propagirajo str- moglavljenje vlade, ne bo dovol- jen vstop v deželo.

Ker bo vsako teh oseb vzel k sebi kak sorodnik, se ni treba bati, da bi ti naseljenci povzro- čili kako pomanjkanje stano- vanj, je izjavil izvršni odbor te nove akcije.

Anglija ploska Don Juanu, ki je okrcal gen. Franca

London. — Angleško zunanje ministrstvo je dalo ves blago- slov besedam španskega presto- laslednika Don Juana, ki je pred par dnevi napadel genera- la Franca, češ, da hoče biti do svoje smrti diktator v Španiji.

Kot znano je gen. Franco predložil parlamentu novo usta- vo, glasom katere bi bil on na vladi, dokler bi hotel biti, potem bi pa imenoval za svojega na- slednika, kogar bi hotel v spora- zumu s parlamentom, nakar bi postala Španija zopet monarhi- ja.

Don Juan, sin kralja Alfonza, je ta načrt generala Franca ostro napadel in izjavil, da ne bo on nikoli pristal na to. Rekel je, da je to samo Francov na- men, da ostane za stalno dikta- tor. Dalje je Don Juan izjavil, da tak zakon ne bi bil izraz vo- lje naroda, tudi če bi ga parla- ment sprejel, ker je parlament skupščina ljudi, postavljenih od vlade v parlament.

Anglija pravi, da je Don Juan izbral pot prav po volji Anglije in upa, da se je s tem Francovo stališče zelo omajalo. Upal je, da bo pridobil na svojo stran monarhiste, pa mu je spodeloto izdaj je zdrsil po opolzki de- ski še nekoliko nižje.

V TORNADU 154 OSEB UBITIH

Več kot 1000 oseb je bi- lo ranjenih, škode je na milijone

Woodward, Okla. — Včeraj je divjal v pasu 100 milj strahovit tornado, ki je zahteval najmanj 154 človeških žrtve. Ranjenih je bilo več kot 1,000 oseb in škoda na lastnini cenijo na milijone dolarjev.

Policija države Texas in Rde- či križ mislita, da so v razvali- nah še dodatne človeške žrtve.

Tornado je najhuje zadel kraj Woodward v Oklahomi. Mrtvih poročajo do 100 oseb, ranjenih pa od 800 do 1000. Mesto je šte- lo 5,500 prebivalcev in 100 blo- kov poslopij je tornado do tal porušil.

Drugi prizadeti kraji so: Shattuck 20 mrtvih, Higgins (Texas) 24, Glazier (Texas) 8, Earler 2 in Gage, Okla. 2.

Tornado je divjal v smeri se- verno zapadno od White Deer, Texas, 50 milj od Amarillo. Mnogo ranjenih so odpeljali v bližnja mesta, kot v Wichita, Kansas. Policija in milicija je bila takoj poslana v razdejane kraje, da prepreči ropanje. Po- sloplja je tornado prenašal kot alumnate bilke.

Tornado je najprej zadel White Deer v Texasu ob 5:45 po- polodne v sredo. Dvignil je neko hišo s temelja, strl neko garažo in pometel s tira vlak z 21 vozo- vi Santa Fe železnice. Tornado je potem zadel Higgins v Texasu in planil nato čez mejo v Oklaho- mo, kjer je divjal po mestih Woodward in Gage. Tipično je, kar je napravil vihar z družino Long v Woodward. Bila sta oče in mati ter 5 otrok. Mati in en otrok sta ubita, 14 mesecev sta- ra deklica je bila ranjena, očeta in tri otroke pa še pogrešajo.

Neka priča pripoveduje, da je gledal tekomo viharja skozi okno in videl, kakor je vihar nosil po ulici avtomobile, sode in druge predmete, kot bi bilo to kurje perje.

Nekateri pravijo, da je vihar divjal 10 minut, vsaj tako se jim je zdelo, drugi pa pravijo, da je bilo vse končano v 3 minutah.

Ruski narod je nemiren, ker ministri ne morejo priti do sporazuma

Moskva. — Rusko časopisje ni niti z besedo omenilo izjave angleškega zunanjega ministra Bevin, ki je rekel: "Stiri tedne že sedimo tukaj, pa nismo še iz- vršili absolutno ničesar."

Da je časopisje to prezrlo, je značilno vzpričo dejstva, da po- staja ruski narod že nemiren, posebno v Moskvi, ker se mini- stri ne morejo sporazumeti gle- de nemških problemov.

Sovjetske voditelje je že začel skrbeti rastoči nemir med narodom. Ta nemir je podoben oner- mu tekam vojne, ko je "Pravda" prinesla poročilo iz Kaira, da išče Anglija separaten mir z Nemčijo.

Jugoslavia Finally Admits U. S. Graves Registry Unit

Belgrade, Yugoslavia, March 26 — A United States Army Graves Registration Unit finally has received permission to enter Yugoslavia to search for approximately 700 bodies lost here during the war. John Moore Gabot, charge d'affaires at the Embassy here, said today.

The Yugoslav Government agreed to provide up to twenty United States Army men with about 400 Yugoslav soldiers to assist in an extensive search throughout the country. Most of the dead are flung from planes forced down during combat, although it is believed some were escaped prisoners seeking to return to United States forces in Italy.

For more than a year and a half, Yugoslav officials have held up permission although, according to Mr. Gabot, about 300 bodies have been recovered and buried in the United States military cemetery in Belgrade.

The Bells of St. Mary's

EASTER St. Mary's held all the lovely Holy Week ceremonies with great beauty. On Sunday the palms were blessed at the ten o'clock Mass, with Father Joseph Celestik officiating. Curled and braided palms in vases were the only altar trimming; well in keeping with the season.

Thursday was a joyful day, for it was the anniversary day of two Sacraments: Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders. It was lit from the inside, so that light shone on the Face of the dead Christ. Also inside, were white blossoms and ferns. Taking the venerated Cross down, we thought, "Poor Jesus!" He was all covered with lilies!

Saturday anticipated Sunday. Any- one who went to the ceremonies, which began at seven, came home hungry, but satisfied and already imbued with the Easter spirit. The new fire, incense, water, and Paschal Candle were blessed. Monsignor Hribar sang the triple Alleluia and the bells were rung.

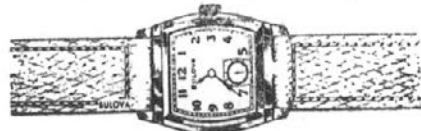

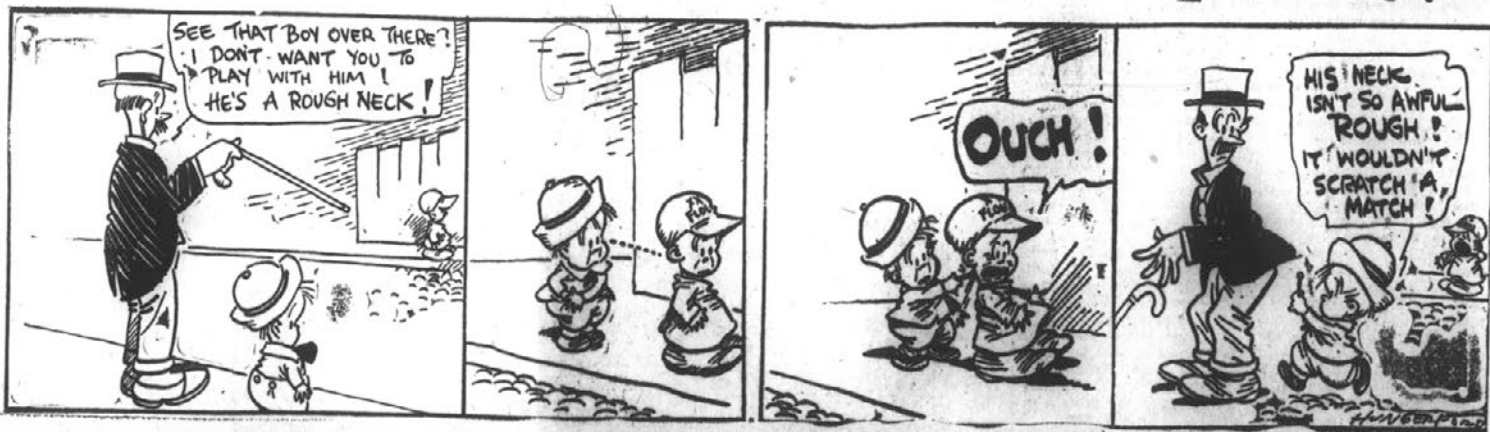
