## Carter pozval vojaka kritika iz Juž. Koreje pred sebe na odgovor

Načelnik glavnega stana na čet ZDA v Južni Koreji gen. Singlaub, ki je javno označil načrt umika iz Južne Koreje za napako, je bil pozvan na odgovor v Belo hišo.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Kongresni proračunski odbor je prišel do zaključka, da so ameriške oborožene sile v Južni Koreji iz političnih ne iz vojaških razlogov ter jih je zato mogoče brez škode za narodno obrambo Južne Koreje umakniti domov.

Eden od ameriških generalov pri ameriških četah v Južni Koreji je med tem javno označil Carterjevo odločitev te cete umakniti postopno v štirih letih domov za zgrešeno in nevarno.

Predsednik Carter je nato včeraj gen. Johna K. Singlauba, načelnika glavnega stana oboroženih sil ZDA v Južni Koreji, pozval, da se osebno javi pri njem v Beli hiši. Ta je odklonila odgovor na vprašanje, ali je general dobil le ukor, ali je premeščen ali odpuščen.

O umiku teh čet iz Južne Koreje se bosta prihodnji terek razgovarjala z vladom v Seoulu državni podtnajk P.C. Habib in načelnik glavnega stana oboroženih sil ZDA gen. G. Brown. Iz Južne Koreje pojedeta v Tokio, kjer so tudi v skrbih zaradi umika čet ZDA iz Južne Koreje.

## Fanlin prijet v zvezi z umorom petih žensk v glavnem mestu ZDA

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Oblasti so prijele 19 let starega fanta, ki je zapustil šolo, in ga obtožile umora Ursulle Miltenberger, katere truplo so našli 6. marca. Nanj je padel sum tudi za umor štirih drugih mladih žensk v zadnjih mesecih, ki je povzročil pravi preplah v okolici Alexandrie, predmestja Washingtona.

Montie Ralph Rissel iz Aleksandrije je obtožen umora petih žensk, starih med 24 in 34 leti. Štiri od njih so živele v bližini, kjer je živel osumljenc s svojo materjo in bratom. Prijeli so ga pretekli petek v zvezi z nekim drugim prestopkom, pa začeli prisikavati, ko so našli pri njem lastnino, ki naj bi pripadala u-morenim ženskam.

## Razgovori s Panamo obnovljeni

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Pogajanja med ZDA in Panamo o novi pogodbi za Panamski prekop so bila ta teden obnovljena, ko sta se obe zastopstvi vrnila s posvetu s svojimi vladami.

Trdijo, da sta se stališči ZDA in Paname zblžali in da obstaja možnost sporazuma v bližnji bodočnosti.

## Sporazum z Japonsko

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Trdijo, da bo še ta teden dosežen in objavljen sporazum med ZDA in Japonsko o omejitvi uvoza barvnih televizorjev iz Japonske v ZDA, veljavlen za prihodnja tri leta.

## Zadnje vesti

ŽENEVA, Sv. — Pogajanja med ZDA in ZSSR o omejitvi strateškega orožja so se po vsem sodeč premaknila z mrtve točke in upajo na sporazum. Ameriški državni tajnik C. Vance je odložil svoj povratak domov vsaj za en dan, če ne dalj, ko je postal sporazum možen.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Poljedelsko tajništvo je objavilo, da je poraba kave v ZDA v prvih treh mesecih letosnjega leta padla za 17%.

LOS ANGELES, Kalif. — Smučarska področja, ki jih je pozno letosno pomlad pokrili nepricakovani sneg, so ostala odprta za preko konca tega tedna.

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Iz uradnih virov prihajajo vesti, da vlada Velike Britanije ne bo dovolila predsedniku Ugande Idiju Amunu udeležbo na konferenci britanske Skupnosti narodov prihodnji mesec. Amin je napovedal svojo udeležbo v spremstvu 250 domaćih plesalcev in plesalk.

RLAD, S. Arab. — Sem sta prišla včeraj na posvet s kraljem Khaledom predsednik Egipa Sadat in predsednik Sirije Asad. Posebno pozornost so v svojih razgovorih posvetili položaju na Srednjem vzhodu v zvezi z izidom torkovih parlamentarnih volitev v Izraelu in potjo prestonoslednika princa Fahda v Washington, D.C., na razgovor s predsednikom Carterjem.

## Nova pozeba kavovca v Braziliji?

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Brazilski kavni institut je objavil, da je mrzlo in vetrovno vreme povzročilo novo škodo na kavinih našadih in da utegne biti s tem prizadel pridelek kave. Največ škodo naj bi bilo v državi Parana.

Predjedelsko tajništvo ZDA je nedavno objavilo, da pričakujejo, da bo letosni pridelek kave v Braziliji dosegel okoli 75% normalnega, kar bi pomenilo, da naj bi bilo pomanjkanja kave kmalu konec.

## Orient Express na svoji zadnji vožnji

PARIZ, Fr. — Znani neposredni brzovlak Pariz-Carigrad "Orient Express" je odpeljal sinčo od tu na svojo zadnjo pot. Po 88 letih bo ukinjen, ko je število potnikov padlo v takmeri, da vlak ne prinaša več dobička.

Včina teh, ki morajo sedaj na 1900 milij dolgo pot iz Pariza v Carigrad, rajše leti v udobnem letalu, ki je vsaj tako varno kot vlak.

## Angola polna Kubancev

Znani beograjski dnevnik "Politika" trdi, da Kubanci stvarno upravljajo in vodijo Angolo.

BEograd, SFRJ. — Tukajšnji dnevnik "Politika" je objavil obsežno poročilo iz Luande, glavnega mesta Angole, v katerem pravi, da je ta polna Kubancev, ki da so stvarno preboleli poleg vojaških in zdravstvenih tudi skoraj vse druge vladne in javne posle.

Poleg okoli 200 kubanskih zdravnikov so kubanski svetovalci v vseh vladnih oddelkih in se kot taki udeležujejo celo razgovorov s predstavniki tujih držav. "Politika" trdi, da je poleg Kubancev v Angoli tudi več "svetovalcev" iz Sovjetske zveze, Bolgarije, Vzhodne Nemčije in drugih komunističnih držav.

Angolski vodniki "sprejemajo to pomoč s hvaležnostjo, pa ne smatrajo, da bi jim nakladači kake politične obveznosti," trdi poročilo v Politiki. Angola upa, da bo v določenem času sposobna sama voditi svoje posle. Sedaj tega še ne more, ker ji manjka lastnega sposobnega in izvežbanega objektiva, portugalsko pa je odšlo iz Angole, ko je postala neodvisna.

Beograd ima z Angolo dobre stike in, je bil njen predsednik Agostinho Neto ta mesec tu na uradnem obisku, tekem katerega so se domenili o sodelovanju.

## Sudan je izgnal sovjetske svetovalce

Sudan je izgnal sovjetske svetovalce, ko je ZSSR sklenila poslati nove kolonije orožja Etiopiji.

KARTUM. Sud. — Predsednik Sudana, ki je tekom svojega uradnega obiska v Franciji ta teden opozoril na sovjetske načrte v Afriki, je ukazal sovjetskim vojaškim svetovalcem, naj zapustijo Sudan. Preteklo sredo so v 3 letalih odleteli iz Sudana s svojimi družinskim članom vred.

Predsednik Jaafar Numairi je bil na Sovjetsko zvezo nejevlen že dolgo, ker je preveč čitano podpirala komunistično partijo in njeno rovarjenje proti vladni. Numairi je strl popkus komunističnega prevrata, a vendar pustil sovjetske vojaške svetovalce v Sudanu, ker je ta dobitno večji del orožja iz Sovjetske zveze.

Ko se je sedaj Sovjetska zveza tesno povezala z levicarskim režimom v Etiopiji in temu obljubila vso pomoč in sodelovanje, je bilo Numairiju dovolj, sporolj je sovjetski vojaški svetovalcem, naj zapuste njegovo državo. Sudan precej odkrito podpira upor v etiopski pokrajini Eritreji, kjer je večina prebivalstva islamske vere in delno arabske krije.

NATO sklenil okrepite svoje oborožene sile

BRUXELLES, Belg. — Diplomatski viri trdijo, da so se obrambni ministri držav NATO soglasno odločili sprejeti predlog ZDA za okrepitev oboroženih sil vsled neprestane rasti oboroženih sil Varšavske zveze.


Članice NATO so se obvezale povečati sredstva za nardno obrambo za 3%.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsedniška jahta Sequoia je bila prodana za \$286,000, ko je predsednik Carter odločil, da jo ne potrebuje. Kupila jo je Leisurecraft Inc. iz Cranstonia, R.I., kjer jo bodo rabili v tujskem prometu.

## MIR NA SREDNJEM VZHODU POSTAL NEVARNO NEGOTOV

Parlamentarne volitve v Izraelu pretekli terek so prisnele zmago skrajni nacionalistični stranki Likud, ki bo po vsej verjetnosti sestavila novo vlado. V arabskih državah so začeli govoriti o nevarnosti nove vojne, ko misijo, da je pot k dosegbi njihovih zahtev mirom pot zaprt.



WASHINGTON, D.C. — Carterjeva vlada previdno čaka in opušča vse nagle sodbe in izjave, ko je arabski svet postal vznemirjen in začel govoriti o novi vojni. Menahem Begin, vodnik stranke Likud, je eden najvnetejših sionistov, zavojnikov obnove judovske države v Palestini v njenem celetnem nekdanjem obsegu. Zanj sta del Jordanije na zahodnem bregu Jordana Judeja in Samaria, nelečivi del zgodovinskega judovskega narodnega ozemlja. Odločno je proti temu, da bi Izrael vrnil to ozemlje Jordaniji ali na novo se snjuči Arapski palestinski državi.

Arabi zahtevajo za pomiritev z Izraelom in priznanje tega izraelski umilj z vseh arabskih področij zasedenih v junijski vojni 1967 ter ustanovitev države palestinskih Arabcev, ki bi naj obsegala nekdanji jordanijski palestinski državi.

Menahem Begin je v imenu svoje stranke pozval k sestavi skupne vlade narodne sloge, ki bi jo naj sestavile vse "sionične stranke". Objavil je praviljenost za pogajanja z arapskimi sosedi, zatrdil svojo pravilnost miru.

Sprejem teh njegovih izjav je različen, povsod je združil več držav in zaupanja. Vodniki Delavske stranke so sodelovali v Likudom odklonili, vendar še ni gotovo, če je to nujno končno stališče. Strankini vodniki misijo, da bi bilo za stranko najboljše ostati v opoziciji in se odločno in jasno vzvzemati za skupne narodne konstituci, kot jih ona vidi.

Poleg Likuda in Delavske stranke, sta važna še Demokratisko gibanje za sprememb, ki ima 14 poslancev, in Narodna verska stranka z 12 poslanci, ki je tudi precej nacionalistična.

Komunisti imajo 6 poslancev v novem parlamentu, ostali pa priznajo raznimi manjšimi skupinami. Izgleda, da prevladuje v novem parlamentu nacionalistična desnica, ki ni pripravljena na nobeni večji popuščanje Arabcem. Zato so postala pogajanja, katera so napovedali za drugo polovico leta, negotova, s tem pa negotova tudi sedanje zatišje na Srednjem vzhodu.

V glavnih mestih arabskih držav odkrito govorijo o nevarnosti nove vojne, najumirnejši so v Kairu, kjer trdijo, da so "vse karte v rokah ZDA" in da bodo morale te pač trše pritisniti na Izrael, če hočejo imeti na Srednjem vzhodu mir in zagotovljeno — dobavo olja.

**Odprta meja . . .****II.**

Torej odprta meja Italije proti Sloveniji je tisti veliki doseg z uspeh sedanjega režima v Jugoslaviji in Sloveniji na konferenci v Osimu, ki ga zgovorno povejuje prvak slovenske partije Ribičič in smo o tem pisali v prejšnjem članku. Komaj mesec dni po objavi Ribičičeve razprave v AD je v našem listu izšel dopis s Primorskega pod naslovom "Primorska v krizi", ki je v zvezi s to razpravo in odgovorom nanjo od nepodpisanega uvočincarja, zbudil posebno pozornost. Navedli bomo na kratko, kakšna stvarna dejstva navaja pisec T.R. in kako z njimi zavrača "napredne" načrte komunističnih oblastnikov v Ljubljani.

Takole piše (AD št. 53, 5. aprila 1977): "Prihodnost za slovensko skupnost na Primorskem (Italija) ni prav nič ročnata. Razlaščanje slovenske zemlje se nadaljuje. Prvič pod Gorico, za ogromen mejni prehod in za skladnišča, razlaščeni bodo kmetje vasi Štandrež. Še hujša skrb čaka tržaški Kras... Po zadnjem sporazumu v Osimu... bodo zgradili na Krasu ravno na obeh straneh meje industrijsko cono, za katero bodo razlastili ogromno slovenske zemlje." Pisec trdi, da bodo v to cono naseži ljudi iz južne Italije in iz Jugoslavije, toda to ne bodo Sloveni. Nato pravi: "Slovenski ljudje se bojijo, da te neprimerne cene ni narekovala samo gospodarska korist, ker je v resnici njen namenitev zgrešena, (podčrtali mi), ampak ji je botrovalo tudi na cionalistično gledanje (po naši: integralno jugoslovensko). Tisoci in tisoči Jugoslovanov (po naši: Bosancev, Makedoncev, Škiperjev itd.) na pragu Trsta, oziroma med Reko in Trstom bodo zaprli Slovencem pot do Kopra, na italijanski strani pa bodo dokončno raznordili slovenstvo."

To so strahotno težke besede na račun odprte meje in industrijske cone, ki krvavo režeta naravost v slovenski narodni teritorij, ker meja teče skoraj po čisto slovenski zemlji. Zato razumemo pisca T.R., ko zapiše: "Skrbi nas za lasten obstoj. Njihove množice (južnjakov iz Jugoslavije) nas lahko čez noč preplavijo, tako da postanemo na lastni zemlji manjšina." To velja za eno stran meje, ki leži v Sloveniji.

Kaj pa druga stran, ki leži sedaj dokončno v Italiji? Tudi to je slovenska zemlja, a tja bodo prišli prebivalci s Sicilije in južnega dela "škornja" in s tem ustvarili ugodna tla za narodno uničenje tako izoliranih slovenskih ljudi na Tržaškem, Primorskem in v Beneški Sloveniji.

Pri teh načrtih in njih uresničevanju jim zelo učinkovito pomaga partija v Sloveniji in Jugoslaviji vse od druge svetovne vojne daje do današnjega dne. Zato se ne smemo čuditi, če dopisnik T.R. z žalostjo govori v krizi na Primorskem in jo utemeljuje s temi besedami: "Levi tabor na Primorskem (komunisti) razpolaga poleg dnevnika še z mesečnikom, močno založbo, knjigarno, porocevaško službo... z razpredeleno mrežo kulturnih in športnih društev, ki skušajo, na žalost, spodbujati krščanske vrednote..." Povrh vsega lahko sklepamo, da vodstvo naših levicarjev nič ne da na slovenstvo kot vrednote (podčrtali mi)... Kar ni uspel italijanskemu pritisku v času fašizma, je uspel v prečiščenem titovski politiki bratstva z italijanskimi komunisti (Fratelanca). Ubuli so med levicarskimi Slovenci slovensko narodno zavest."

(Ob znanim sporu Tito-Stalin 1. 1948 je takrat stalinična italijanska partija pritisnila na slovenske levicarje, da so vse svoje otroke iz slovenskih šol in jih vpisali v italijanske. S tem je propadla celo vrsta slovenskih šol, druge pa so opesale. Dopisnik T.R. pravi: "Idejni razkol v levicarskem taboru tik pred letom petdeset je na območju Trsta povzročil pravo opustošenje.")

Pri taki kritični situaciji med primorskimi in tržaškimi Slovenci, povzročeni s protinatrdno partijsko politiko, lahko pomeni osimske sporazume prav zaradi določil o odprtji meji in nameravani industrijski coni na obeh straneh. Taka meja, nasejena z Italijani na eni in "Jugoslaviji" na drugi strani, bo odrezala Primorce in Tržašane od direktnih, tesnih stikov z matičnim narodom, saj bodo po celem pasu Slovence razlastili in izselili — in to zaradi gospodarskih koristi, ki jih bo pobusal v svoj žep — Beograd.

Kaj takega se narodu v vseh dolgih stoletjih se ni dogodilo. Treba je bilo diktatorskega režima vsemogučne Partije, da je Slovencem vsilila tako porazno rešitev z odprtjo mejo do Italije, slovenskemu delu pod Italijo pa zapisala počasno umiranje... Lahko je razumeti, da je primanjnjega slovensko čutečega ljudstva, kakor tudi tožbo, da je Primorska v krizi.

Slovenski izseljenci v združenstvu obsojamo osimsko mejno rešitev kot zgrešeno in narodu škodljivo, Primorjem pa kličemo, da ni vseh dni konec. "Narod moj je star tisoč let, težkih tisoč let," je zaklical pesnik. Ta narod v tisoč letih borbe z viharji ni propadel, tudi pod komunizmom ne bo, tudi njegov primorski žlahtni del ne bo.

## CONTINUED

We saw Jamestown, where the first settlement in America took place about 370 years ago. Had the pleasure of seeing some glass blowers performing their art. This is put on by the "Dept. of Interior." After 4 they go to their homes. Nobody lives in Jamestown. The whole vast area is open country. All that remains of Jamestown is the foundations of the homes which are there by the James River.

Richmond, smaller in population than Akron, had no "one way" streets when I was there, as a soldier, 35 years ago. Now, there's quite a few. I liked Richmond better before, not as busy. In Public Square is a small park where G.I.'s and I spent time. Now, my wife and I went thru there and sat on the benches.

West of the park, across the street, is the "Cathedral of The Sacred Heart." It makes a Catholic proud to see it.

Twenty-five miles south of Richmond, is Petersburg. We went to Mass at the same church I used to go to, St. Joseph's. Just around the corner was St. Paul's Episcopal Church. There is history behind it. On the 3rd pew from the altar was a nameplate reading "Gen. Robert E. Lee, 1864-1865". It's where he sat when he attended services.

Petersburg hasn't changed, it seems that time has stood still, except for a Holiday Inn three miles east of Petersburg, is where I trained, and it was called Camp Lee. Now it's Fort Lee.

It was Sunday when we were there. Everyone was in civilian clothes. Soldiers don't have to wear uniforms on Sunday. They still have a Post Exchange store "that's like an Uncle Bill's discount store" for army personnel. And inside was a restaurant where female soldiers and male soldiers were sitting around at the same tables. A good arrangement.

Showed Bronita around the Fort. It once was like a field camp, dirt drives and barracks built right in amongst the pine trees. Now asphalt and there are large administration buildings of brick and it looks more like an industrial park now. Many World War II barracks from the 7th to 36th streets are torn down. From the 1st to the 6th, they are still up but they looked weatherbeaten and old.

We saw one of the new barracks, was surprised, indoors it looks like a motel, with a hallway and individual rooms on each side, two soldiers to a room. When I was there there were 20 of us in one large room, 10 on each side. I liked it that way, think it's the better way. You get a chance to talk to, and know more fellows. We gathered around in the evenings and sang songs. Some Southerners had guitars and sang "Beautiful, Beautiful Brown Eyes, We'll Never Love Blue Eyes Again," and we all joined in.

In Petersburg, we met Mrs. Irene Graves, 82 years of age. She asked about us and we told her we were from Euclid, Ohio. Irene smiled with friendliness. "You are Catholics and we are Episcopalians but we pray to the same God. We like people from the north, you have such good manners. I want to tell you a story about a Yankie, Capt. Haskell (the story has been handed down to us). He and his men overran this area in 1865. The Captain was seizing all our horses. On one farm, my great grandmother, Katherine Graves, then 17, a dark haired beauty came charging up to the Captain. 'How dare you steal our horses, it has been said — that you boasted your are gentle-

men? You are savages.' The Captain was more stunned by her beauty than her accusation. He bowed and answered, 'My dear young lady, we do not want your horses, our horses from the north are of the aristocracy, thoroughbreds, and are better than yours but since we are short of them at the moment, military necessity requires that of the stage, which was built

interesting lady, Mrs. Irene Graves. Hope we meet again.

One evening in Williamsburg, we went to see the play "Common Glory". It was at the open air "Lake Matapaka Amphitheater". Behind the stage, boats were going back and forth. It created the illusion of being part

right on the edge of the lake. Then it dawns on you that there is a lake back there. I read that the ancient Greeks and Romans liked to think up original ideas. The ancient amphitheaters I saw in Italy were not by any kind of river or lake. They would prob-

ably praise this American outdoor idea.

The play was about the events that took place in "Old Williamsburg" the highlight of the show was when Washington,

Jefferson, Madison, Franklin and Patrick Henry took part in

a lively, rollicking song.

Our goal in 1976 was — to see where a lot of American history was made. We like to see the United States. There is so much to see in this country.

These trips were only 2,500

miles in all, but we're thankful that we had no accidents and got home safe. What a magnificent place that is — home.

Father Prosen grew up in St. Lawrence parish, Newburgh, where he also celebrated his first Mass on May 23, 1971.

The Rev. Dr. Prosen specialized in social science education, American history, educational administration and sociology in the Ball State University College of Science and Humanities. 
