Vekovito bojno polje

Odkar je po razodetju iz Sv. Pisma Bog Oče vrgel iz raja nadangela "Baklonosca" (Lucifer), se je začela, se nadaljuje in se bo nadaljevala do poslednjega dne človeškega rodu borba med Bogom in Satanom za prevlado nad človeško družbo in nad posameznim človekom. Odkar je umrl božji Sin na križu v spravo med Bogom in Človekom, se je bojno polje premaknilo in se boj vodi med Kristusom in Njegovim božjim kraljestvom na zemlji ter Satanom in njegovimi institucijami na isti zemlji.

Na kateri strani bo končna zmaga, ni vprašanja. Kdaj in kako, to pa je veliko vprašanje. Ko Bog vdahne v človeka dušo, ji priže plamen svoje ljubezni, ki nikoli ne ugasne. Satanova vojska na zemlji, misleč da je ta plamen v sebi pogasila, pa ga je le zatemnila in ga skuša spremeniti v sovraštvo, si na vso moč prizadeva, da bi doseglja podobno pri ljudeh vernega prepričanja. Kjer gde zlepa, se poslužuje vseh vab in sladkosti brezbožnega življenja, pri čemer ji uspešno pomaga današnja seksualna razbrzdanost in boj za enakost med moškimi in žensko, ki razdira družino in njeni verski bazi. To je slika boja v onih delih sveta, kjer je človek še svoboden.

Kjer na svetu ima oblast nad človekom v rokah diktatorska protiverska plast družbe, vlada v verskih rečeh protkana prevara pod masko "znanstvenosti", kjer pa to ne učinkuje, uporabijo brutalno nasilje. To je slika iz dela sveta, kjer vlada marskizem-leninizem. Kako je pridigal "odrešenik" Marx? "Religija je vzdih stiskanega bitja, srce brezsrčnega sveta, duh brezdušnega mrtvila. Je opij za ljudstvo." Lenin ga je dopolnil s strahotno definicijo: "Vsaka religiozna ideja, vsaka ideja o bogu, celo igračkanje s tako idejo je neizrekljiva grdobija" (vileness).

Te dni mi je prišla pod roke kratka razprava o stanju vere in cerkevih organizacij v sovjetski Rusiji. Kar je zgoraj napisano, je sprožila v moji glavi ta razprava. Napisal jo je časnikar David K. Shipler, ki zasleduje ta problem na samem mestu; ni razloga, da bi njegov opis ne bil strogo stvaren in objektiven, saj pri zgleđih navaja kraje in imena. Je zelo poučno, kako omenjeni plamen božje ljubezni na različne načine deluje v ljudeh, ki so v komunističnih vrstah in Boga niti ne poznajo.

Sestajst let starca armenške šolarka v mestu Baku pod Kavkazom stopi iz šole domov večkrat v cerkev se prekriža, priže svečo in skloni glavo v kratki molitvi. Oče in mati sta trdna komunista, sama je članica brezbožne mladinske organizacije Komsomol. Obisk cerkev prikriva, na vprašanje pri Komsomolu, ali veruje v Boga, vedno odgovori: Ne, in pristavi, da je to čisto enostavno.

Nedavno je bilo v uradnem ateističnem listu "Nauka in Religija" objavljeno pismo 33 let stare komunistke, kjer pravi, da o Bogu nič ne ve, vendar vedno nosi križ "kot simbol nepremagljivosti ruskega naroda". V križu vidi mogočno silo, ki odganja vsako zlo in dobesedno pravi: "V križu je zapopaden zgodovina ruskega naroda." Cemu je list pismo objavil? Zato, da pokaze na nevarnost, ki preti leninističnemu brezbožtvu.

Cerkev (pravoslavno) imenuje pisatelj Lev Kopelev, ki je bil dolgo Solženicinov drug v delavskem kamputu, "sobor" (zbor), skupnost, kjer čutiš, da tja spada. Drugi pisatelj opisuje verski položaj z ugotovitvijo, da so pred takimi 15 leti ljudje pričakovali razvezit novih idealističnih idej iz socializma, pa so doživelj, da ni učinka. "Komunizem je kakor poganstvo." Toda iskanje idealov, iskanje smisla življenja se nadaljuje. Ideali marksizma-leninizma so se zgubili v sistemu birokracije in prevare, članstvo v partiji ali Komsomolu je zgodil formalnost brez globine za doseg ugodnih položajev in karriere.

Ortodoksnemu duhovniku Dmitri Dudku, ki je že mnogo komunistov krstil, zatrjuje, da tako krščevanje znači parades, ker so krščenci pravi verniki in pravi komuništi. Vendar to razloži, češ da imata krščanstvo in komunizem skupne in združljive humanitarne osnove

in zato ne treba, da so odnosi med njima antagonistični.

Seveda je to šibek argument, rojen bolj iz oportunitizma, ki se ga kdaj opsluži tudi rimska Cerkev v svoji "Ostpolitik", ker je resničen. Osnova Marksovega nauka o preprečitvi izkorisčanja človeka po človeku se ni rodila prvič v Marksovedem umu, pač pa v Kristusovi zapovedi. Ljubi svojega bližnjega kot sam sebe. Kar ima komunizem pozitivnih socialnih postavk v svojem nauku, so vzete iz krščanstva. A na vseh področjih je bojevito sovražen krščanstvu in vsaki religiji. Zato gre boj naprej iz veka v vek. Kar hočem z izvlečki iz Shipterjeve študije povedati, je to, da luč božje ljubezni gori naprej tudi v dušah ljudi, ki se imenujejo komunisti in ateisti.

In ta luč je poroštvo pribodnje zmage na bojnem polju vekovite borbe med Bogom in Satanom.

V DVEH DNEH UMRLI ŠTIRJE SLOVENSKI

Slovenska Cerkev je v teku dveh dni tega meseca izgubila kar štiri svoje duhovnike. Tri v domovini, enega pa tu v Ameriki, v našem Clevelandu. Od teh je bil eden svetni duhovnik, trije pa so bili redovniki: jezuit, frančiškan in salezijanec.

Dne 4. januarja tl. je umrl v Ljubljani salezijanski duhovnik, v zadnjem času samo že spovednik, ANTON LOGAR, rojen 11. 10. 1888, Šujič-Dobrova pri Ljubljani. Na Skaručni, župnija Vodice na Gorenjskem, pa je umrl prav tisti in LEOPOLD GOVEKAR, župnik v pokolu, rojen 17. 11. 1894 v Smledniku za Smarno goro.

Dne 5. januarja tl. pa je v strosti 63 let umrl v Ljubljani jezuit p. DR. KAREL VLADIMIR TRUHLAR, vpokojeni protesor teologije na papeški univerzi Gregoriani v Rimu, doma z Jelenic na Gorenjskem. Tu v Clevelandu, na zapadnem strani mesta pa je tudi na ta dan umrl slovenski frančiškan iz Lemonta p. MARK HOCHEVAR.

Izguba kar štirih duhovnikov v teku dveh dni je gotova velika izguba za Cerkev, kakor je naša slovenska, in to se posebej v današnjih časih. Vendar božjih načrtov mi ne poznamo.

V naslednjem več podatkov o rajnem p. Marku HO-CHEVARJU, saj gre pri njem za našega ožrega slovenskega rojaka, duhovnika, frančiškana s slovenskih ameriških Brezij, iz Lemonta.

P. Mark HO-CHEVAR je umrl, star 47 let, pri nas v Clevelandu. Zadeba ga je srčna kap. K nam v Cleveland je prišel iz Lemonta, da čez praznike obiše svojo sestro go. Mary Agnes, poročeno Tadsen, in svojega brata Anthonyja kakor tudi svoje drugo sorodstvo, katero ima še v tem mestu. Rajnki je že več časabolehal na srcu. Celo dvakrat je bil na njem že tudi operiran. Ko se je za praznike podal na pot, je bil zdrav. Na zdravstvenem pregledu niso ugotovili nič nevarnega. Verjetno pa ga je stisnil hudi mraz, ki je že toliko ljudi pobral med nami v letosnji nenavadno ostri zimi.

Rajnki p. Mark je bil rojen 14. 2. 1919 v bridportskem Ohio. Bil je sin rajnih Mr. in Mrs. Anton Hochevar. Družina je spadala v bivšo clevelandsko župnijo sv. Tomaža Akynta na Superior Ave. V osnovno šolo je hodil k Sv. Vidu; tu v Clevelandu je opravil tudi benediktinsko srednjo šolo (Benedictine High School), nato pa obiskoval v Westmont, Ill., St. Joseph Preparatory Seminary, odtej dalje pa je obiskoval naslednje frančiškanske vzgojne in učne zavode v Croghan, N.Y., v Butler, N.J., in končno v Lemontu, Ill., kjer se je pridružil slovenski ameriški Frančiškovi družini.

Bogoslovne študije je p. Mark opravil v Lemontu ter bil tam nato tudi 13. junija 1953 posvečen v mašnika. Posvetil ga je rajnki ljubljanski škop dr. Gregorij ROŽMAN. Obenem z njim sta bila posvečena - prav tako po škopu Rožmanu - še druga dva lemontska slovenska bogoslovca-diakona, in sicer p. Blaž CHEMAZAR, današnji komisar lemontske samostanske postojanke, in p. Lavrencij GROM, današnji lemontski frančiškanski poverjenik za redovniške poklice, ki je kot tak prav lastno leto obiskal clevelandsko slovensko župnijo.

Posvečenje teh treh slovenskih fantov-sinov slovenskih staršev, p. Blaža Chemažarja, p. Lavrenca Groma in p. Marka Hochevarja, je bilo zadnje mašniško posvečenje, katero je podelil škop dr. Rožman. Na tej poti ga je spremljal takratni slovenski kaplan pri Sv. Lovrencu v Newburgu g. Julius Slapšak, ki je poleg lemontskih samostanskih sobratov tudi škopu stregel pri posvečevanju.

Torej še enkrat, če še nimate Ameriške Domovine, ste prošeni, da si je takoj naročite. Tudi jaz Vam jo rada naročim, samo poklicite 251-2579. Po tej boste spoznali kaj ste do sedaj pogrešali. Naj ne bo slovenske družine med nami, ki ne bi bila naročena na Ameriško domovino. Če za vse drugo imamo denar pa ga še imejmo za to potrebo v svojo lastno dobro.

Ce bomo slovenski tisk v Ameriki pokopali, nas ne bodo več pozvali. Boljše je, da kličemo kot so klicali naši predniki pred dolgimi leti: "NAPREJ ZA NAROD IN BOGA! DOBRO DELO MORA NAPREJ!"

(Continuation) countryside. A gun has been fired promptly at noon for the Marine Studio, originally built past 150 years. Housed is also sometime in 1850. At that time within Nova Scotia Museum it was twice as large as it is to-day. A general store then, you could purchase food products, and all essentials used by fishermen. A storm Feb. 14, 1898 lifted this building across the road, by a thunderous explosion. Some and half of the building hanging 2 thousand lives were lost, and in the water. A decision was about 5 thousand persons were made to saw it in half. A mecca left homeless, causing damage for painters. Peggy's Cove amounts to about \$35 million. tracts artists from all over the world. In the studio are paintings, works of famous marine artist W. E. de Garthe.

The old town clock on the slope of the hill has been here since the founding of this city. In royal artillery park, nearby a white frame house was built in 1805, is occupied by the commanding officer of the royal artillery. Many old cannons are on the park grounds. We then return to our hotel.

chopped walnuts, then slowly fold in egg whites.

Grease and flour tube or bundt pan, pour in mixture and bake at 350° for 1 hour in center of oven.

When cool, turn upside down and sprinkle with powder sugar or a glaze frosting.
