



CORRECTED TYPE LOCALITY DESIGNATION FOR *ACRONEURIA COVELLI* GRUBBS & STARK, 2004 (INSECTA, PLECOPTERA)

ABSTRACT

An erroneously listed type locality for *Acroneuria covelli* Grubbs & Stark, 2004 is noted herein and replaced with the actual location where the type specimen was collected. The common name River Stone is a replacement name for Shawnee Stone, which is currently also in use for *Perlesta shawnee* Grubbs, 2005.

INTRODUCTION

During current work on Indiana stoneflies it was discovered that the type locality for *Acroneuria covelli* Grubbs & Stark, 2004 was listed erroneously as “New Albany”. This was subsequently carried forward in Stark (2004). Although the actual type locality was correctly georeferenced by the author with Acme Mapper 2.1 (<https://mapper.acme.com>) during follow up work on the fauna of the state (DeWalt & Grubbs 2011), “Jeffersonville” is the city where the holotype (28 June 2002) and some paratype specimens (28 June 2002; 5 July 2003) were collected. The holotype and paratype labels in question will be replaced with accurate location and GPS coordinate data. The holotype is housed at the Illinois Natural History Survey (Champaign, Illinois) and all paratype series at Western Kentucky University (Bowling Green, Kentucky). Type locality information will also be corrected in

Plecoptera Species File (DeWalt et al. 2017).

In addition, the common name River Stone is proposed as a replacement name for Shawnee Stone (Stark et al. 2012), which is currently also in use for *Perlesta shawnee* Grubbs, 2005. The use of Shawnee Stone was applied for both species inadvertently by Stark (2004).
