ship USS Wasp? Well, as soon as I came on board I was assigned to represent my Division on the Recreation Committee. What we did was also sign a contract with Coca-Cola to supply syrup for our five Coke machines which we had on board.

The first six months that year we sold Cokes for a nickel each. This is why I remember it so vividly. Even though we paid for the Coke and seltzer water and paid for the use of the machines, (but repaired it and re-filled it ourselves), yet after six months we made enough money to purchase a bus, and hire a driver to take us from the ship to the middle of the cities we visited. We had more money left over to set up a recreation hall, panel it, put in curtains, TVs, books, and a dozen lounge chairs and sofas, purchase three nets and a dozen volley balls, and basketballs which we hooked up on the hanger-deck for our use whenever the planes weren't flying.

All that from a nickel Coke. It was a darn good investment.


"A MANAGER HAS NOTHING TO DO, EXCEPT..."

The Visiting Nurse

The woman was either a county or city employee. She was a registered nurse, and with her black bag, sensible shoes, blue uniform, cap and cape, she looked more military than medical.

If you contacted one of the dangerous contagious diseases of the day, she visited the house after having been notified by the school or doctor.

Her first duty upon confirmation of the diagnosis was to fasten an ominous red sign on your front door. Bold black letters spelled "Quarantine" and the name of your disease. It warned one and all not to visit your house and risk contagion. Diphtheria, scarlet fever and measles were the most common signs, and occasionally the dreaded smallpox.

The quarantine sign was not unusual and the nurse would make visits during the illness to insure that you were following the medical advice and also watch for any complications. Measles required a darkened sick-room and the disease was believed to affect the eyes or even cause blindness if the rules were not obeyed.

I remember measles as being a particular nuisance because I didn't really feel

sick, but still had to stay in bed in a darkened room. I couldn't even read the usual old "National Geographics" that were resurrected during every illness.

Worse yet, we didn't have a small bedside radio at the time. Mom would come up with meals and read a story, but most of the day you were staring at the wallpaper. If you followed the rules, measles were a real trial for a little kid. For many years after my measles I had periods of rapid blinking, a sort of tic that still occurs under stress or fatigue. Perhaps I had cheated and was reading while I had the measles.

One rarely hears of diphtheria or scarlet fever today, and there were other diseases then that are rare today or perhaps have acquired a new name. Tuberculosis was often fatal before and after the war, and is still a serious illness. Dropsy and quinsy are two that were frequently known then but seem to have disappeared, yet they can still be found in a dictionary. Dropsy caused bloating of the lower body and legs and sometimes required amputation of a foot, while quinsy was a very familiar throat infection at our house.

Though I can't even speculate why, my mother was the local "quinsy doctor." Friends and neighbors would come to our kitchen asking for the "quinsy cure." It must have been desperation that brought them to our door, because the tonsils were painted with a potent, burning kind of iodine, not the wimpy variety sold today. I bought some recently and the sting was no worse than "Mercurchrome" used to be. Iodine used to burn like fire and have you hopping around blowing on a little finger cut. It must have been more concentrated than what is allowed today.

The throat painting was done with a wad of cotton on the end of a darning needle. It was dipped in iodine and swabbed on the inflamed and infected tonsils of the victim who tried not to retch while being treated. It would take all their will power to avoid this natural reaction. There was no fee for service nor any malpractice insurance. The iceman next door was an annual patient at mom's kitchen clinic, so I assume it worked for him.

Though I never had the "quinsy paint job," I was blessed with all the childhood diseases except for scarlet fever, but I made up for that with a four-month bout with rheumatic fever when I was 20. The chicken pox that remained under my cast when I broke my leg, was one of the more nasty and long-lasting discomforts that are hard to forget.

As for the visiting nurse, I can say this much for certain. She was always respected and welcomed into our home, and we believed that the quarantine sign she put on our front door was a perfectly reasonable practice.



Medtem ko po škofu Krambergerjevih besedah "še dihamo" dve svetovni vojni, pred prihodnostjo stojimo v strahu, kot da bo tudi tretja. Če bo, bo ta poslednja, meni škof, ker bo človek uničil vse človeštvo. Po škofu Krambergerju sodijo med temeljna vprašanja našega časa tudi ta: Zakaj se človek boji človeka? Zakaj narodi živijo v strahu pred drugimi narodi? Zakaj je potrebno 3,5 tona eksploziva na vsakega zemljana? Zakaj v 32 državah dajo več za oborožitev kot za izobraževanje in zdravstvo skupaj? Zakaj se več govori o smrti kot o življenju? Za mir, ki je božji dar, smo po škofu vsi odgovorni in ga dolžni pokloniti drugim, naj bo to doma, v šolah, v občestvu ali v narodu. (Nedelo, 19. dec.)

Deveta obletnica plebiscita in dan slovenske samostojnosti

Kot poroča STA 26. decembra: Dan samostojnosti, 26. december, v Sloveniji obeležuje dan, ko so leta 1990 uradno razglasili izide plebiscita, na katerem so se prebivalci Republike Slovenije 23. decembra 1990 z veliko večino glasov odločili, naj Republika Slovenije postane samostojna in neodvisna država.

Plebiscita o samostojnosti in neodvisnosti Slovenije se je udeležilo 93,2 odstotka volilnih upravičencev, za samostojno in neodvisno državo pa jih je glasovalo 88,2 odstotka. V skladu s to odločitvijo je slovenska skupščina 25. junija 1991 sprejela temeljne osamosvojitvene akte in dan kasneje tudi razglasila neodvisnost. Temeljni osamosvojitveni akt je bila Temeljna ustavna listina o samostojnosti in neodvisnosti Republike Slovenije.

Razglasitvi neodvisnosti je sledila desetdnevna vojna, v kateri je Slovenija zmagala, ljena sprejeti brionsko deklaracijo, s katero je zamrznila nadaljnje izvajanje osamosvojitvenih aktov. Po izteku moratorija iz deklaracije je Slovenija 8. oktobra 1991 dokončno začela ravnati kot povsem neodvisna država. Uvedla je lastno valuto, vzpostavila

nadzor na vseh svojih mejah ter sprejela novo ustavo in zakone.

Nova ustava Republike Slovenije, sprejeta 23. decembra 1991, je prinesla pomembne spremembe v obliki, organizaciji in pristojnostih parlamenta. Nov ustavni zakon je uzakonil državno ureditev, značilno za večstrankarske politične sisteme. V letu 1992 se je vzpostavila in utrjevala slovenska državnost; Slovenija je postala mednarodno priznana država, članica OZN in številnih drugih mednarodnih organizacij. Decembra 1992 so bile najpomembnejši dogodek predsedniške in parlamentarne volitve, ki so pomenile dokončno slovo od starega političnega sistema."

Pranovanje Dneva samostojnosti

V četrtek, 23. decembra, so se poslanci državnega zbora zbrali v dvorani parlamenta in poslušali govor predsednika DZ, Janeza Podobnika. Mdr. je Podobnik poudaril zasluge Demosove koalicije. Sledila je osrednja proslava Dneva samostojnosti, ki je potekala v Cankarjevem domu. Premier Janez Drnovšek je poudaril, da so Slovenci postali aktivni soustvarjalci svoje in evropske zgodovine, v kratki, a odločilni vojni uspelo jim je ubraniti Slovenijo in uveljaviti suverenost. Najboljša pot v prihodnost je v združenju Evropi, je še povedal Drnovšek.

Brezposelnost v Sloveniji rahlo upada

Trst/Gorica – V Sloveniji brezposelnost že nekaj časa postopno upada. O gibanjih na tem področju objavlja nekaj podatkov nova številka *Ekonomskega ogledala*, ki ga izdaja državni urad

za makroekonomske analize in razvoj.

Več zaposlujejo velika javna podjetja kot tudi manjše gospodarske družbe v zasebnem sektorju. Vendar je stopnja brezposelnosti še vedno previsoka in znaša, glede na število aktivnega prebivalstva, pri moških 7,2% in pri ženskah 7,9%.

Vlada je skladno z zakonom o zaposlovanju in varovanju za primer brezposelnosti sklenila, da se upokojenci, študentje, dijaki in udeleženci izobraževanja ne morejo upoštevati kot brezposelne osebe.

Pri tem pa intenzivno izvajajo program izobraževanja brezposelnih oseb, da bi jih usposobili za zaposlitev in delo v različnih dejavnostih, zlasti tistih, kjer je povpraševanje po novih delavcih oz. uslužbencih največje.

Pri tem največjo skrb namenjajo predvsem mlajšim brezposelnim osebam brez poklicne oz. strokovne izobrazbe ter osebam, ki sicer imajo tako izobrazbo, vendar ne morejo dobiti zaposlitve in so prijavljene kot brezposelne že več kot šest mesecev.

V letu 1999/2000 se dodatno strokovno izobražuje po lani začelih programih 3 tisoč brezposelnih, dodatno pa so v razne izpopolnjevalne programe vključili še 4.300 oseb.

Za postopno rast zaposlovanja kažete tudi podatka, da se je v Sloveniji število zaposlenih prebivalcev povečalo od lanskim 654 tisoč na 676,4 tisoč v prvih devetih mesecih letošnjega leta.

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PO SMRTI DR. FRANJA TUĐMANA

Hrvaška na razpotju

JURIJ PALJK

S smrtjo predsednika dr. Franja Tuđmana se za Hrvaško odpira novo obdobje, saj bo morala mlada država prestopiti iz obdobja, ki ga je s svojo močno osebnostjo in avtoriteto, ki je mejila že na trinoštvo, označeval Tuđman, v novo obliko demokratično urejenih družbenih odnosov.

Kam bo Hrvaška šla in katero pot bo ubrala, pa bo vsaj deloma jasno že po 3. januarju prihodnjega leta, ko bodo parlamentarne volitve, katerim pa bodo sledile še predsedniške; le-te bodo najverjetneje v začetku februarja.

Kdo je bil pravzaprav dr. Franjo Tuđman? Rodil se je 14. maja leta 1922 v družini znanega aktivista Hrvaške kmečke stranke. Tuđmanov oče Stjepan je bil tudi član ZAVOH in AVNOJ-a, a so ga leta 1946 umorili, in sicer zaradi kritik tedanje jugoslovanske oblasti.

Franjo Tuđmanu je mati umrla, ko mu je bilo sedem let, eden od bratov pa je padel med drugo svetovno vojno kot partizan.

Tuđman je mlad sodeloval v demokratičnem nacionalnem gibanju in so ga zato leta 1940 zaprli, od leta 1941 pa je sodeloval v narodnoosvobodilnem boju na Hrvaškem; po vojni je v Beogradu dokončal višjo vojaško akademijo, bil v samem vrhu poveljstva JLA, postal izjemno mlad general leta 1960, a se je že leto kasneje na lastno prošnjo upokojil.

Od takrat dalje se je posvečal svoji drugi ljubezni – zgodovini. V Zagrebu je ustanovil Inštitut za zgodovino delavskega gibanja, katerega direktor je bil do leta 1967, bil pa je tudi eden glavnih sodelavcev slovitih *Jugoslovanske vojaške enciklopedije*; leta 1965 je doktoriral iz zgodovinskih znanosti na zagrebškem vseučilišču.

Leta 1967 so ga izključili iz Komunistične partije, l. 1971 ga prvič obsodili, leto kasneje zaprli. Leta 1981 so ga obsodili še na tri leta zaporu, ki ga je prestajal v zloglasnem zaporu Lepoglava.

Veliko je pisal predvsem iz vojaške znanosti, zgodovinskih ved in politologije ter filozofije zgodovine.

Leta 1990 je s svojo Hrvatsko demokratsko zajednico (HDZ) zmagal na volitvah, bil leta 1992 in spet leta 1997 z veliko večino glasov izvoljen za hrvaškega predsednika.

Hrvaški narod ga ima za očeta sodobne države, tuji opazovalci pa so mu očitali samodržstvo in pretiran nacionalizem; zaradi znamenite protiofenzive Oluja-Nevihta proti srbskim silam leta 1995, ko so Hrvatje sami spet osvojili svoja ozemlja (predvsem Krajino in del Slavonije), je postal za Hrvate tudi vojaški junak. Slovenci se ga spominjamo kot trdega in nehvaležnega sogovornika, ki do nas ni gojil simpatij.

Franjo Tuđman je tri leta bolehal za neozdravljivim rakom, umrl pa je v bolnišnici Dubrava v Zagrebu 10. decembra 1999.

“Naša domovina je žalostna, mi pa smo zbrani v molitvi za dušo umrlega predsednika,” je dejal 12. decembra zagrebški nadškof Bozanić, ki se je še najbolj umirjeno spomnil pokojnega Tuđmana. Na Hrvaškem so namreč oklicali ob smrti svojega predsednika tridnevno žalovanje, pred parami, na katerih je v Predsedniških dvorih ležal pokojnik, pa so se vile desetisočglave množice Hrvatov, ki so se klanjali njegovemu spominu.

V Zagrebu, kjer je mesto umrlega predsednika začasno prevzel predsednik hrvaškega parlamenta-sabora Vlatko Pavletić, se je zgrnilo na tisoče ljudi, prispele pa so tudi brzojavke z izrazi sožalja z vseh koncev sveta.

Omenimo še, da se je kot eden prvih tujih politikov spominu umrlega v Zagrebu poklonil slovenski predsednik Milan Kučan, svoje sožalje pa so med drugimi poslali tudi italijanski predsednik Ciampi in italijanski premier D'Alema, srbski predsednik Slobodan Milošević in domala vsi politiki in predsednika sveta.

Pogreba v ponedeljek, 13. decembra, pa se je

udeležilo izjemno malo pomembnih političnih predstavnikov iz razvitega sveta, še posebno iz Evropske unije. Slovenijo je zastopal slovenski premier Janez Drnovšek, bila pa sta prisotna tudi njegova kolega iz Bosne in Hercegovine ter Makedonije, Madžarsko pa je zastopal predsednik države.

Politični opazovalci na Zahodu so mnenja, da je bila odločitev za tako majhno in simbolično udeležbo na Tuđmanovem pogrebu nedvoumen signal Hrvaški, naj že končno stopi na pot resnične demokracije.

Ameriški veleposlanik pri Organizaciji Združenih narodov in veliki pogajalec na Balkanu Richard Holbrooke, ki je hrvaškega predsednika dobro osebno poznal, je ob novici, da je Tuđman umrl, dal tole izjavo:

“Brez njega ne bi mogli podpisati mirovnega sporazuma v Daytonu, vendar pa je njegov nacionalizem veliko prispeval za vojne na Balkanu, pa čeprav je glavna odgovornost za omenjene vojne na strani Slobodana Miloševića.”

Še ne osemnajstletna nova hrvaška zvezda v svetovnem alpskem pokalu Janica Kostelić je 12. decembra zmagala na drugi slalomski tekmi v tej smučarski sezoni v italijanskem kraju Sestrieres. Po zmagi je na vprašanje časnika, kaj bi rekla o smrti hrvaškega predsednika, odgovorila preprosto, a iskreno takole: “Veliko mi je pomenil dr. Franjo Tuđman, bil je naš predsednik, oče naše države. Brez njega tudi mene danes tukaj ne bi bilo.”

Seveda se sedaj odpirajo nove težave na poti v večjo demokratizacijo hrvaške države, ki bo morala na pot večjega odpiranja Evrope.

Za prihodnje in skorajšnje volitve v hrvaški sabor 3. januarja leta 2000 napovedujejo zmago opozicije, ki pa je razpršena. HDZ naj bi izkoristila prav to in pri tem uporabila ves “medijski kapital”, ki so jim ga slovesnosti ob Tuđmanovi smrti prinesle.

Težko je napovedati izide volitev, še težje, ko potekajo te na Balkanu. Zgovoren pa je že podatek, da se bo na bližnjih hrvaških volitvah predstavilo 35 strank in 14 različnih političnih koalicij ter 20 neodvisnih kandidatov...

S pesmijo, skioptičnimi slikami in besedo nas je povabil v ono majhno, lepo deželico, razpeto med Muro in Rabo, objudeno z ljudmi dobrega in gostoljubnega srca.

Proslava se je začela s kanadsko in slovensko himno, katero sta zaigrala Matija Lebar in John Kolanko.

Jože Hozjan je pozdravil veleposlanika Slovenije dr. Božota Cerarja, častnega konzula Jožeta Slobodnika, častito duhovščino in vse navzoče prijatelje. Nato je podal nekaj besed. Njegov nagovor navajamo v celoti:

"Dober dén! Bog daj, dragi Prekmurci!

Mislil sem že, da bo 80. obletnica priključitve Prekmurja Sloveniji nekako šla tiho mimo vas kanadskih Slovencev, ko me je prijeto presenetilo vaše vabilo prekmurske skupnosti na današnjo slovesnost.

Prekmurški Slovenci so bili v preteklosti, še posebno pod Štefanovo krono, izpostavljeni silovitemu raznarodovanju. Kljub vsemu pa madžarski vladarji niso mogli zatreti prizadevanj narodno ozavešenih rojakov, med njimi je bilo tudi več duhovnikov, ki so se stoletja ločeni od matičnega narodovega telesa, med Muro in Rabo, prizadevali za ohranitev svoje slovenske identitete in celo več.

'Prebivalci Slovenske krajine slovesno izjavljamo, da smo vsekakor bili in hočemo biti in ostati Slovenci. Mi hočemo biti združeni s Slovenci na drugi strani Mure v Združeni Sloveniji' je v Bogojinsko resolucijo ob koncu I. svetovne vojne zapisal tamkajšnji župnik Ivan Baša. To željo je dokončno potrdil mogočni ljudski zbor v Beltincih avgusta 1919.

S sklepi Pariške mirovne konference in kasnejšo Trianonsko meddržavno pogodbo so prekmurški Slovenci (južni del) prvič ne samo državnoopravno temveč tudi jezikovno in civilizacijsko kulturno zaživel skupaj z ostalimi deli slovenskega naroda. Konec I. svetovne vojne pa je prinesel slovenskemu narodu tudi veliko bridkosti, saj je bil razdeljen med štiri države. Izgubili smo četrtino etničnega

ozemlja na Primorskem, Koroškem in tudi slovensko Porabje.

Tudi čas po priključitvi matičnemu narodnemu telesu ni vedno prinesel le zadovoljstva, ampak marsikdaj tudi razočaranje in težko življenje. Zaradi tega so se Prekmurci izseljevali ne samo v druge dele Slovenije, ampak tudi čez mejo, tudi v Kanado. Za prekmurskega človeka, ki je izredno navezan na svojo rodno zemljo, ta ločitev ni bila lahka. Velikokrat sem od marsikaterega prekmurskega govornika slišal: 'Prekmurje je doma, Prekmurci pa smo po celi Sloveniji in po vsem svetu.'

S samostojno Slovenijo se je marsikaj spremenilo na bolje in prepričan sem, da bo to veljalo tudi za naše Prekmurje. To postaja vse bolj razviti del Slovenije, ki ga odlikuje narodnostni, kulturni verski pluralizem, multikulturalnost in spoštovanje razlik.

Dovolite, da se vseh tistih Prekmurcev in ostalih, ki so k temu prispevali, spomnim s sledečimi besedami:

**"NA VEKE ŽIVÉ, ŠTERI
ZA DOMINO MERJÉ"**

Temu toplemu in poučljivemu pozdravu je sledil dvodelni program, katerega so vodili Jože Hozjan, Agata Žoldoš, Miha Zakož in Marjanca Padar.

Program se je začel s pevsko skupino pod vodstvom Lujza, ki je zapela Račičev Oče naš, ganljiv pomurski napev in Kleklovo (Srčen) Slovensko Krajino, katero je uglasbil dr. Cigan.

V stvarno preteklost in značaj te majhne deželice nas je povedla Ftičarjeva pripoved, katero je podal g. Žižek v sočni prekmurci "rejči". Slišali smo izpoved S. Zvera "Daleč od doma... Slovenska krajina", katero so prebrali Marjanca Padar, Milan Vinčec in Lujz Žižek.

Črtico nemirnega popotnika in plodovitega pisca Evalda Fliserja, "Prekmurje, moj dom" je prebral Miha Zakož. Štefan Ritlop pa je za konec prvega dela programa prebral oznanilo o osvoboditvi, "Prekmurkim Slovincem na znanje", katerega je objavil v tedniku *Novine* njegov urednik in ustanovitelj Jožef Klekl st., pet dni po priključitvi Prekmurja Sloveniji 17. avgusta 1919. *Novine* so postale temelj novi pismenosti, ki se je razvila v prekmursko književnost in umetnost.

Po kratkem odmoru nas je pevsko skupina spet po-

zdravila s svojimi lepimi glasovi in prislunli slovenski prekmurški ljudski "Vsi venci bejli", in slovenski narodni "Kje so tiste stece".

Pesnika Jožefa B. nam je predstavil Miha Zakož, njegovo pesem "spomn" pa je recitirala Lidija Fotivec. O dr. Vilku Novaku in njegovih zaslugah je spregovoril Miha Zakož, Lojze Žižek pa nam je seznanil z njegovo pravico "80 let svobodnega Štefan Ritlop je prebral rahovo zahvalno pesem posvetilo slavnim možem Prekmurja.

Zaključek programa pričel z "Venčkom okrogline slovenske", ki je zaigrala glasbena skupina: John Kolanko, Silvo Kolarič-Ovčjak, Marjan Kolarič in njihov vodja Matija Lebar. Temu venčku sledila najprej Lujzova zahvala vsem tistim, ki so korkoli pripomogli pri oblikovanju in izvedbi te plemenite obletnice deželice na levem bregu Mure.

Njemu pa se je zahvalil Jože Hozjan ob navdušenem ploskanju množice in povabil vse navzoče na dobrote, ki so jih pripravile in postregle mlade roke dobrih prekmurških žena, da si ob njih izmenjamo prijazen pozdrav in besedo.

Še predno smo se ozvali temu povabilu, nam je pevsko skupina zapela slovo tri pesmi, v srce so gajoče melodije "San se s tao...", Edna ftica priletejala in Šou san gor po Büköji" ...

Pokojni Oton Županec je po svojem obisku Prekmurja v maju 1934 zapisal v potopisu med drugimi spoznanji naslednje: "Slovenska nija mora poznati tudi svoje obrobne pokrajine, ak hoče poznati sebe... In Slovenijo v celem mor biti važno tudi to: 'kaj kipece štrk na dimnikih, kaj meljejo mlini na murskih ladjah'."

Ta spoznanja je skupina, ki je pripravila to slovesnost, na svojstven način uprizorila in prikazala svoj domači kraj. Prekmurje je doma, Prekmurci pa posod po "s v e j t i".
