Komaj je dorastal za hlačke, že so ga skrbni starši poslali v ondolito tri-razredno šolo. Med učenici je bil vedno prvak in z šestim letom starosti že sedel v šolski klopi. Ko je končal obveznosti ljudske šole z dvanajstimi leti, ga je oče poslal na lastno prošnjo v Zagreb k stricu, ki je bil poznan kot zelo dober ključavniški mojster ter obenem prvorstni strojniki. Učna doba poklica, do katerega je gojil veliko veselje, je trajala dolga štiri leta. Po prestani pomemniški izkušnji je ostal nekaj časa pri stricu Lenartu in z 17. letom starosti se mu je zahotel v svet iskati novih virov praktične izkušnje. Kot "vandrovček" se je ustavil, ko so doobili pri Bohinjski Bistriči predor, in podjetje ga je uslužbilo pri vrtnjanju kot strojnika. ### Baseball Has Two Slovenians

### Prelesnik Possesses Color

What has the new year in store for the ambitious, uprising Slovenian sportsman who at present is staging a valiant effort to reach the pinnacle of his chosen field and consequently become the monarch of that particular sport?

Due to the fact that the average life of an athlete is comparatively short and that temperament and psychology play such prominent parts in all competitive activity, the sporting universe is chock-full of startling upsets and quite frequently a new champion and hero is discovered and placed on a throne, along with the immortals of yesteryear, in honor of his deeds.

Maybe the year 1933 will see one of our own fast developing Slovenians fill the shoes of some former champion, and then we will point with pride to his accomplishments and use this as an inducement for the up and coming posterity.

Let us unfold the blanket of time and see what the future holds for some of our outstanding possible champions.

First, and probably foremost in line, is a young, daring and nerveless heavyweight pugilist, who is rapidly climbing the ladder of fame and may some day reach the heights of a Dempsey, Sullivan or a Corbett. We mean none other than Eddie Simms, the local accordionist, who swings a wicked "box" as well as a terrific right.

Eddie chose to follow up the game of boxing while only a youngster of 18. His desire became keen when brother Frankie was bowing over some 15 opponents in the amateur circle to attract state-wide attention. Immediately after Frankie had turned professional, the younger of the Simms boys started to make a record of his own in the simon-pure ranks. After he exhausted the state heavyweight list and no opponents could be found, Eddie was forced to leave the amateur ranks and turn to professionals for future competition. After an inauspicious beginning he proceeded to score 15 knockouts in succession and had many promoters and managers after his contract.

Next in line were Christner, Wine,

Parker, Shandl and a host of other former top-notch heavies, in which he gave more or less mediocre performances, due largely to the careful style of fighting carried on by these veterans.

Eddie touched the climax of his brief career when he dropped a close decision to Adolph Heuser on the News Christmas Fund Show last December. This bout proved conclusively that Eddie has the makings of a first-class fighter. Franklin Lewis, Cleveland Press boxing critic, made a statement recently that with proper handling and a little thinking in the ring the Slovenian would soon be listed among the best heavyweights in the world.

We believe the Slovenian is not quite ripe for the "Human Freight," but a Simms-Cobb strike would be the proper step for Eddie. If he can surmount the Cobb obstacle he would be in a position to meet any heavy in the business and not step down for anyone, including Schaaf, Sharkey or Baer.

Incidentally, Eddie also has several telegrams from Promoter Ames of Boston, requesting his services, and he may decide to take the Eastern jaunt at any time now.
