KONCEM TEDNA

Jugoslovanski četniki povzročajo težke izgube italijanski vojski

Carigrad. (ICN) — Tajna jugoslovanska radijska postaja počela iz Jugoslavije, da so se posrečili vsi nemški in italijanski poizkusi, da bi zavzeli kraje, ki so jih osvobodili oddelki četniške in dobrovoljske vojske v Sandžaku in Bosni. Vojska zasednih oblasti je imela velike izgube.

Italijanske sile, ki se pomikajo ob reki Drini pri Goraždu, so bile zadržane na črti Pljevlja-Cajniče-Goražda, kjer se je vneta bitka, ki je trajala vso noč. Poveljništvo četniške in dobrovoljske vojske je izdalо ukaz, naj se dvignejo v zrak vsi mostovi na reki Drini. To je ustavilo napredovanje italijanske motorizirane pehoty. Italijani so imeli posebno hude izgube v ostrih bitkah pri Goraždu, od koder so poslali v Mostar po pomoč. Četniški oddelki so poslano pomoč z uspehom napadli in jo uničili blizu Mostara.

V zadnjih spopadih so jugoslovanski rodoljubi zajeli veliko število vojakov, podčastnikov in častnikov. Ujetniki priповedajo, da so med vsemi italijanskimi enotami posejani agenti Gestapa, ki se skriva pod imenom nemških "instrukturjev."

Več skupin hrvatskih vojakov, ki jih je Pavelić nasilno mobiliziral v vstaško vojsko, je prešlo v Bosni k četnikom.

Italijanske vojaške sile imajo velike težave z oskrbo. Četniki redno napadajo njihove transporde na cestah proti Pljevlju. Sedaj poiščajo Italijani posljati obkoljenim italijanskim vojašnicam v Sandžaku in Bosni-Hercegovini pomoč z letali. Večino materijala, ki so ga spustila letala, so pobrali četniki.



All the Slovene land between the Danube and the Adriatic was now divided into frontier baronies by the emperor in 828. Eastern Border March" took in the land between the Danube and the Drava Rivers. The districts south of the Drava including Furlania constituted the "Furlanian Border March." This was broken up into four baronies by the emperor in 828. Both Marches were ruled by special representatives of the Emperor.

Under the supervision of the Emperor's representatives, the various fiefs, districts and localities were ruled by domestic and foreign princes, counts and barons. Charlemagne found it politically more expedient to permit the local chieftains to remain and retain their respective controls. It was, of course, more prudent to let the Slovanes accustom themselves to the new rule as it was interpreted by their own native chieftains, instead of by foreign counts. Christianity also was given a greater impetus when the Slovanes saw that they were not actually oppressed. Thus it was that for a few years longer there remained small states among the Slovanes, in Carinthia and Pannonia which were headed by local men.

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
