

Vaš denar v banki je naj- boljše investiran, trdi zvezna zakladnica

Washington, 22. junija. Amerikanci, ki so držali svoj denar v ameriških bankah, namesto da bi ga rabili za špekulativne ali druge namene, so v teku zadnjih treh let prihranili dvanajst tisoč milijonov dolarjev, odkar je nastal krah na brozi v New Yorku, in ta prihranek izvira zlasti iz dejstva, ker je ameriški dolar danes toliko več vreden. Skupni prihranki ameriškega naroda, namreč onega, ki je držal denar v bankah, znašajo \$12,000,000,000, in pri tem ni všteti oni denar, ki je začasno zadržan v bankah, ki so v likvidaciji. Svota tega denarja znaša \$3,000,000,000. Sledeče so številke, katere podaja zvezni urad glede denarja v prometu: dne 4. oktobra, 1929, so znašali skupni prihranki ameriškega naroda v bankah \$55,180,000,000. Odtod je več bank zaprlo vrata, in vložniki začasno ne morejo dobiti \$3,058,728,000, torej znašajo vloge v ameriških bankah v resnici \$52,121,272,000. K temu moramo prišteti obresti po tri procente v dveh letih, kar znaša \$3,174,185,464. Radi zvišane vrednosti dolarja tekom zadnjih treh let je pa skupna hranilna vloga Amerikancev danes vredna \$67,460,458,106, dočim so zgubili oni, ki so vzeli denar iz bank in špekulirali, ne sama ves svoj kapital, pač pa tudi obresti, katerih bi bili deležni, če bi denar obdržali v banki.

Ameriški časnikarji obso- jajo razsodbo rokoborbe Schmeling-Sharkey

New York, 22. junija. Izmed 25 ameriških znamenitih sportnih pisateljev in poročevalcev, se jih je 23 izjavilo, da razsodba v rokoborbi Schmeling-Sharkey ni bila pravična, in da ne morejo razumeti, zakaj je Sharkey dobil prvenstvo. Grantland Rice se je izjavil: "Nobenega vprašanja ni bilo, kdo je zmagoval, deklari ni padla razsodba. To je najslabša razsodba v zgodovini rokoborbe. Schmeling je zmagal v osmih nastopih, Sharkey v štirih, in trije so bili enaki." Westbrook Pegler piše: "Nemškega rokoborca so oropali za zmago." Alan J. Gould pravi: "Razsodba ni dobila ugodnega mnenja pri gledalcih. Schmeling je zmagal v sedmih nastopih, Sharkey v šestih in dva sta bila enaka." Damon Runyon pravi: "Schmeling je bil boljši in močnejši." To so mnjenja samo nekaterih odličnih sportnih pisateljev. Ravnatelj Schmelinga, Joe Jacobs, se je izjavil: "Očividno je, da so oropali Schmelinga za zmago. Vsi pisatelji in sportniki, ki so prisostvovali borbi, so bili mnjenja, da je Schmeling zmagoval. Sharkey se je samo igral v areni. Njegovi udarci so bili brezuspešni. Le parkrat je udaril, da je kaj zaleglo, dočim se je skoro neprestano umikal Schmelingu. Že pred dvema tednoma mi je bilo znano, da bo referent rokoborbe Gunboat Smith. In pred dvema tednoma sem povedal, da imajo zaroto, da uničijo Schmelinga v razsodbi, ker ga v boju ne morejo. In zgodilo se je tako." Rokoborba je privabila mnogo več ljudi, kot so jih pričakovali. Splošno mnenje je bilo, da bo udeležba nekako od 40,000 do 50,000. V resnici je bila udeležba 72,000, da je bila stadion na Long Islandu napolnjen do zadnjega sedeža. Računa se, da je znašala vstopnina nad \$500,000. Od te svote dobi Schmeling \$212,000, Sharkey pa \$50,000. Tudi dobička bo nekako \$25,000, kar bodo uporabili za mleko sirotin otrokom. Oba boreca, Schmeling kot Sharkey sta se izjavila, da sta pripravljena ponovno nastopiti. Sharkey je tehtal pred začetkom boja 17 funtov več kot Schmeling, toda udarci Schmelinga so bili ves čas silnejši kot udarci Sharkeya.

Položaj na borzi

New York, 22. junija. Ker ni bilo kupcev na borzi, so pričele cene raznim delnicam in investicijam padati, ne sicer močno, pač pa za spoznanje. Na denarnem trgu je sicer vse v redu, toda novih špekulantov ni, nobene energije ni zadnje dneve. Edina investicija, ki se je dvignila za spoznanje, so delnice železnice. Tekom dveh dni ni bilo eksportiranega nobenega zlata iz Amerike, pač pa so prejeli v New Yorku \$21,000 v zlatu iz Mehike in \$78,000 iz San Salvadorja. Republikanska kampanja razbita radi senatorja, predno se je začela

Washington, 22. junija. Voilni krogi republikanske stranke so pričakovali, da bodo dobili oster napad od strani suhačev radi svoje platforme, toda da bi napad prišel od senatorja Borah in tako oster, tega niso pričakovali. Vsi načrti republikanske stranke za predsedniško kampanjo so uničeni, še predno se je kampanja pričela. V resnici se nahajajo pristaši republikanske stranke v skrajno kočljivem položaju. Suhači jim očitajo, da so mokri, mokri jim pa očitajo, da so suhi. Lausanne, Švica, 22. junija. "Evropa se mora razorožiti, ali pa Amerika ne bo dovolila, da se znižajo ali odpustijo vojni dolgovi." To kratko povelje je bilo izdano včeraj zastopniku francoske vlade od strani ameriškega zastopnika. Francoski kot ameriški vladni zastopnik sta se sešla v mli sobici nekega priprostega hotela ob potu med Lausanne in Genevo. To je prvo obvestilo javnosti, da nameravajo Zedinjene države Evropi odpustiti vojne dolgove, seveda le pod obvezjo od strani Evrope, da slednja ne bo potem rabila denarja za oboroževanje. V mali sobici priprostega hotela so se sestali Hugh Gibson, ameriški poslanik v Belgiji in Norman Davis, svetovalec ameriških ekspertov v Evropi, z francoskim ministrom. Francoski ministriški predsednik je imel prej dolg pogovor z angleškim premierjem MacDonaldom. Kot se čuje, Francija ne bo pri volji izdatno znižati svoje armade, dokler nima absolutnih garancij, da ne bo napadena od Nemčije.

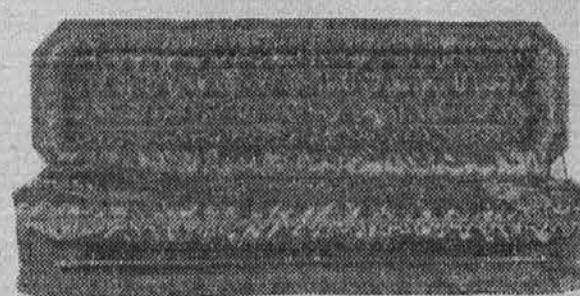

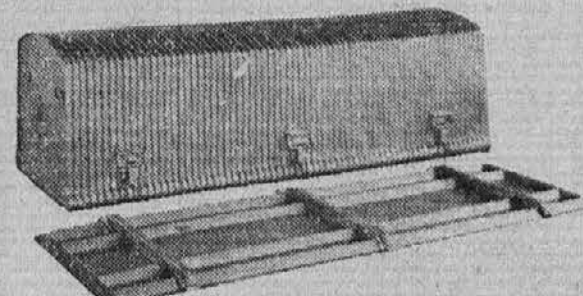

The Modern Crusaders, so far, are the only group that have ladies entered in this great classic. The committee is quite positive that there will be at least one group that will have more female entries than those of the henpecked sex, and that is the Martha Washington.

The following general rules shall govern this tournament: Preliminary rounds are to be handled by each lodge, and persons having the four highest scores on July 31 shall represent their group at the play-off in August.

Tables and Partners

Tables shall be numbered 1, 2, 3, etc. Cards shall then be drawn by all contestants, the four lowest seating themselves at table No. 1, the next four lowest at No. 2, etc. After all tables are filled, cards are drawn again at each table; the persons drawing the lowest cards being partners. Play shall then commence.

Games

A game shall consist of four played hands (each person at the table dealing once). Partners having the highest score at the termination of four hands

shall be considered the winners of that game. Each person should mark his total for each game on an individual score pad. The person in charge should also keep such a record in order to avoid confusion.

Rounds

A round shall consist of at least four games (16 played hands). This can be increased to any number if such is the desire of the group, but no decrease shall be countenanced.

Rotation

Rotation takes place after each game, in the following manner: With the exception of the first table, all losing teams remain seated, while the winners move up one table. At the first table the winners remain seated and the losers move down to the last table. After each change of tables a draw for partners is made. Under no circumstances are persons to remain partners for more than one successive game.

Bidding

Bidding is contract, i. e. each person is allowed only one bid. The lowest bid that can be made is 150 if a pass is not made. Subsequent bids must be made in multiples of 25, for instance, 175, 200, etc. In opening play the bidder must lead trump.

Mention and other points not specifically covered are as in conventional pinochle, but the rules committee reserves the right to make the final decision in the event of any untoward situation.
