

Kakor so nam pisatelji opisovali zadnje žalostne dneve v novemu stanovanju Mrs. Jeruzalema, tako bodo nekoč opisovali zadnje dneve Berlina. Država nacijev, ki naj bi živela po Hitlerjevem načrtu en tisoč let, leži zdaj v razvalinah. Rusija, katere hrbtenico let je bivala v svojih hišah, seso naciji strli, tako so namreč mislili, 1,430 milj od Berlina pri Stalingradu leta 1942, se je zagrizla v srce Nemčije in planila v samo toliko opevano nemško prestolnico, kakor so to napravili Kozaki pred par sto leti. Ameriški plutokrati kakor so nas nazivali naciji, so se pripeljali preko morja ter od zapada udarili v Rajh. Nad arogantno junkersko državo, ki je hotela zagospodovati vsemu svetu, je zagorel plamen toliko let. škuljevi se niso izuničevanja. 
