Legislatura je zavrgla predlog za nov cigaretni davek v ta namen

Columbus, O. — Ohijska legislatura je odobrila predlog, da se predloži jeseni državljanom v odobritev plačilo bonusa vojnim veteranom. Ako bo državljan bonus odobrili, ga bo država izplačala.

Kakor govoril predlog, bo dobil vsak, ki je služil v vojni sili med 7. dec. 1941 in 2. sept.

1945 bonus in sicer za vsak mesec službe v Zed. državah po \$10 in za vsak mesec izven mej Zed. držav po \$15. Noben veterjan pa ne sme dobiti skupno več kot \$400 in ne manj kot \$10. Bonus bi dobil vsak, ne glede na visokost šarže.

Nižja zbornica je bila za to, da se naloži 1 cent dodatnega davka na cigarete, kar bi pomagal plačati \$300,000,000, kolikor bo znašal bonus. Toda senat je bil proti in poslanci so se podali. Nov davek na zemljišča kakih 75c na \$1,00, bo pomagal plačati bonus.

## Senat je odobril mirovne pogodbe z 4 bivšimi sovražniki

Washington. — Senat je včeraj z veliko večino odobril mirovne pogodbe z 4 bivšimi sovražniki: Italijo, Ogrsko, Romunsko in Bulgarijo. Zagradni pogodb z Italijo je glasoval v dvigom rok, 79 proti 10, za druge je bilo pa kar splošno odglasovano.

Predsednik Truman in državni tajnik Marshall mislita, da bo s tem prej prislo do normalnih razmer v Evropi in da se bo zdaj tudi za Nemčijo in Avstrijo hitreje sestavilo pogodbe, katere im se razlikujejo.

Rusija in Francija še nista teh pogodb odobrili, ki stopijo v veljavno šele potem, ko jih odobrijo Veliki Štirje.

Uredništvo je odgovorilo, da ima vsak državljan pravico, da uredi svoje odnose do vere. Stranka pa ne sme biti ravnodušna, kakšno razmerje imajo njeni člani do vere. Lenin je dejal, da stranka smatra vero kot zasebno stvar napram državi, nikakor pa ne z ozirom na posameznika. Stranka temelji na znanstvu in mora zato vero pobjejati. Oni, ki so se sklicevali v svojem vprašanju na ustavo, so v zmoti, ker se ustava ozira na stališče države napram veri, ne pa na stranko. Ako mladi komunist veruje v Boga in se udeležuje božje službe, ne izpoljuje svojih dolžnosti in kaže, da ni prost "verskega praznoverja." To pa pomeni, da je prepovedan obisk cerkve. ## Zanimivo pismo in še kaj

V zadnjem času je postal znano pismo, ki ga je pisal dr. Hilprich, škof v Limburgu leta 1941 tedanjemu pravododnemu ministru v Berlinu: "Večkrat v tednu vožijo v Hadamar mrtvaski vozovi, na katere je naloženo neverjetno število trupel. Kakor hitro se pojavijo ti vozovi, vpijejo vaški otroci: 'Že zopet prihaja mortálni voz!' Čeprav so vaščani že davno na jasem o vožnjah jim nudijo vendar vselej mučni pogled. S tesnотjo opazujejo velik dimnik in pričakujajo trenutka, ko začne spuščati svoj grozni črni dim, in so globoko žalostni, ako veter saje, katere napravljajo strašen smrad, stres ljudem na glave. Popolnoma nemogoče je, da bi si ne predstavljali človeških teles, ki se krivijo v plamenih.

Te razmere so v vsakem oziru obžalovanja vredne. Otroci, ki se prepirajo, končajo vedno svoj razgovor z opazko: "Ti si norec. Še s pečjo v Hadamarju se boš seznanil."

Ljudje, ki se ne morejo ali nočejo poročiti, pravijo: "Poročati se še imeti otroke? Nikoli v življenju! Da končajo v krematoriju!"

Starcev sploh ni mogoče spraviti v bolnico. "Ne posljajte me v državno bolnišnico," prosijo. "Ako bodo pomorili vse slaboumne, pridejo na vrsto starci ljudje kot nepotrebni zajedavci."

Vsa bogoboječ človek smatra uničevanje človeških bitij kot vnebovijočo krivico. In ljudje, ki pravijo, da Nemčija ne more zmagati, aki biva pravični Bog, ne delajo tega v sled pomanjkanja patriotičnega čuta, temveč zgolj iz skrbi za bodočnost, ki čaka naš narod."

Enako sta opominjala Hitlerjevega pravosodnega ministra škofa v Paderbornu in Kolonu. Uspeha seveda ni noben dosegel. Kako pač? Brezbožneži so zakrknjeni do zadnjega dila svojega življenja. Kakor sejejo, tako žanjeno.

In sejali so samo ljudi — ne le brezbožni, tudibogokletstvo in nalagali zločin na zločin, kot da jim je prišepoval satan. In sejali so ljudi zlasti med mladino.

Kakšna je bila vzgoja nemške mladine, nam kaže tač primer. V šoli Hitlerjevih mladih voditeljev v Zg. Hessenu so 16. jan. 1938 dobila dekleta tale vprašanja, na katera so moralu odgovoriti: 1.) Kdaj ste bili zadnjici v cerkvi? 2.) Ali živi za Vas Bog s svojim sinom v nebesih ali v Vašem srcu? 3.) Ali ste božji otrok? 4.) Kako stališče zastopate napram cerkvi? 5.) Ali je večji Bog ali Hitler? Kateri je močnejši in mogočnejši? 6.) Komu naj se zahvalimo, Bogu ali Hitlerju? 7.) Kdo je Vas vodja in Vaša vera? 8.) Ali Vam je potreben deset zapovedi? 9.) Kako mislite o božicu? Ali verjamete v božično legendu?

Taka bogokletna vzgoja je bila določena deklerom, ki naj bi zanesla te nauke med ljudstvo! To je bila premišljena metoda malikovanja pred Hitlerjem. Od tega malikovanja je živel hitlerijanec tud potem, ko je sledil poraz za porazom. Blazna propaganda je kričala: "Enega nimajo sovražniki, najgotovejšega poročta zmage, neznotljivega genija našega vodje. Zmagali bomo z vero v zmago!" To vero je označil Hitler 1. maja 1935 v svojem razvitem govoru: "Moja volja — to mora biti izpoved nas vseh — je vaše vera."

In ta ošabnost in to brezbožno bogokletje sta končala z groznim padcem.

Vsa strahotna vzgojna, policijska, vojaška in druga zločinska navodila so prihajala iz pruskega Berlina. In kaj je danes Berlin? Kup razvalin. Po strokovnjaškem mnenju leži v Berlinu desetina vseh nemških ruševin. Iz teh bi se dal napraviti jez skozi Nemčijo od Hamburga do Monakevga, ki bi bil 11 m širok in 10 m visok. Za odvoz teh ruševin bi bilo treba sedem milijonov vagonov.

Tako strašno so bili kaznovani brezbožni, oholost, nasilje, brezpravnost, teptanje sleherne osebne, verske, politične in gospodarske svobode. Zdi se, kakor bi čuli glas iz Skrivenega razodretja sv. Janeza: "Sodil je veliko blodnico, ki je s svojimi blodnjami pokvarila svet, maščeval je kri svih hlapcev, katero je preliha."

Ta glas velja vsakemu brezbožtvu in vsaki tiraniji, kjerko! na svetu.

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

### Bell System Code For Spelling Unfamiliar Names Over the Telephone

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## LET'S EXPLORE OHIO

### State Parks



Zaleski State Forest, Old Man's Cave on right.

One of Ohio's newest and in eight respects, most complete, State Forest Park centers about the jewel-like Lake Hope in the 22,000-acre Zaleski State Forest in Vinton County, 25 miles south of Logan.

Here vacation-loving Ohioans may get a pre-view in actual operation of the way most state parks will be developed when funds and materials become available.

Fourteen vacation cabins are now in use, half-hidden in the wooded hills that surround the lake. All have running water, window screens, gas ranges, ice boxes, cooking utensils, dishes, bedding and linens. They may be rented on a sliding scale that starts at \$20 a week for two persons. Each cabin has a shower and the normal occupancy is four, though some will accommodate

Twenty-seven new cabins and a dining lodge are under construction.

Supplies may be purchased at the caretaker's lodge. Applications for renting the cabins should be made to the Zaleski Forest Ranger, Zaleski, Ohio.

The lake itself is well stocked with fish and there is a spacious bath house, with excellent beach and regulation diving boards. Tables, fireplaces and shelter houses are scattered about the forest area for picnics.

Zaleski State Forest is in the heart of historic Ohio, and to the east Route 56 and U. S. 50 lead to Athens and Ohio University's campus, while to the west, Route 56 enters Hocking State Forest with Ash Cave, Old Man's Cave and Rock House, once used by the Indians of the section, as proved by the many relics uncovered.

Farther to the east, on Alternate Route 50, lies historic Marietta, where the office of the Ohio Land Company, built in 1788, still stands as the oldest building in Ohio.

### Bread Preserver Developed
