Novi grobovi

Gen. Minh nasprotuje sedanjemu sporazumu

Vodnik sredine v Južnem Vietnamu gen. Minh sodi, da premirje s četami na mestih ni pametno in ne izvedljivo.

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Na 1. novembra so obhajali tu 9. obletnico odstranitev predsednika Diema v vlade. Zaroto proti njemu je vodil gen. Minh, znan kot "Veliki Minh", ker je po naravi za vietnamske razmere res izredno velik. K sebi je povabil za to priložnost kakih 100 politikov in vojaških vodnikov, ki so sodelovali pri prevratu leta 1963.

Tekom razgovora s časnikarji je dejal, da kot vojak odklanja premirje na temelju obstoječega stanja, ko bodo sovražni vojski ostali na mestih, kjer jih bo premirje dobilo. Po njegovem bi bilo veliko pametnejše zbrati nasprotno vojaško skupine na določenih mestih, kot je bilo to premirju leta 1954.

Gen. Minh, o katerem je znano, da ima politične želje, pa tudi da ni nič prida javni upravitelj, je dejal, da on ni ne z vladajo Van Thieuja in ne z rdečimi, en je predstavnik "sredine", ki naj bi igrala glavno vlogo pri pomirjevanju Južnega Vietnamma, ko bo enkrat bojevanja konča. V gen. Minhu vidijo glavnega tekmeča v borbi za vodstvo Južnega Vietnamma po sklenitvi premirja.

STANE KAVČIČ MORAL ITI

V okviru čistke v Jugoslaviji je izgubil svoje položaje tudi Stane Kavčič, predsednik vlade SR Slovenije v Ljubljani. Beogradu in Titu se je zameril še v času znane cestne afere.

LJUBLJANA, SRS. — Kot je svoje stališče, kar je Tita obenito pričakocati, ko je čistka postala občirnejša in temeljitejša, je ta segla tudi v Slovenijo. Glavna žrtve je bil Stane Kavčič, predsednik izvršnega sveta (vlade) SR Slovenije, ki je bil označen na nacionalista še v času znane "cestne afere", davno pred hrvaško krizo. Tedaj si je načopal hudo jezo Tita.

Po dveh dneh zasedanja sekretariata Zveze komunistov Slovenije koncem pretelega tedna je Stane Kavčič odstopil kot predsednik izvršnega sveta, pa tudi kot član predizidija Zveze komunistov Jugoslavije.

Kavčičev položaj že dolgo ni bil trden. Izgledalo je, da se bo obdržal, ker ga je podpiral Stane Dolanc, sedanji glavni Titov pomočnik v boju s hrvaškim in srbskim nacionalizmom v partiji in izven nje. Dolanc, o katerega značaju, razgledanosti in bistrosti je slišati v Ljubljani več slabega kot dobrega, je Titu po vsem sodeč ustregel brez ugovora, ko je ta čistko razširil po Beogradu tudi na Ljubljano.

Stane Kavčič je bil med komunisti v Sloveniji edini, ki se je upal javno postaviti za koristi Slovenije in zagovarjal konec njenega gospodarskega izrabljanja. Ko je bilo leta 1968 odobreno, da dobi Slovenija mednarodno posojilo za gradnjo avtoceste od St. Ilja preko Ljubljane do Trsta in Gorice, pa je bilo nato to posojilo po odločitvi zvezne vlade, katere predsednik je bil tedaj Slovenec Mitje Ribičič, uporabljeno za gradnjo cest na jugu, kjer so bile veliko manj potrebne, je prišlo na pobudo S. Kavčiča in sodelavcev do obsežnih javnih protestov.

Gospodinje so objavo pozdravile z veseljem. Povprečna poljska družina namreč porabi nekako 49% vsega svojega rednega dohodka za hrano. Pri takem položaju je seveda vsako povišanje cen hrane izredno občutljivo. Povprečni mesečni zaslužek na Poljskem znaša okoli \$100 do \$120. Večinoma delata moč in žena, če si hočeta privočiti kolikčaj več preko najnuj-

To je Tita in Beograd strašno razjezilo in Tito je Kavčiča na seji partijskega vodstva trdo in ostro prijemal. Na precejšnje iznenadenje vseh Kavčič tedaj ni ostal tisto, ampak je branil

McGovern proti velikim izdatkom za obrambo

JERSEY CITY, N.J. — Sen. G. McGovern je v svoji volivni kampanji tu krivil prevelike izdatke za narodno obrambo posmanjkanja finančnih sredstev za pomoč propadajočim mestom in za reševanje njihovih problemov.

Predsednika Nixon je McGovern obdobjil, da se ne upa upreti "pozlačevalcem in zavrljivcem" v Pentagonu.

Volivne napovedi v Kanadi so pogresile

OTTAWA, Kan. — Pri zadnjem povpraševanju tik pred volitvami je Gallup Poll of Canada dognal, da je za liberalno stranko 39% povprašanih, za konservativno 33%, za novo demokratsko 21% in za druge 7%.

Pri volitvah pretekli ponedeljek je dobila liberalna stranka 38%, konservativna 35%, novodemokratska 18 in ostale 9% glasov.

Zadnje vesti

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsednik Nixon je sinoči v govoru vsej deželi preko televizijskega dežela, da je dosežen sporazum o končanju vojne v Vietnamu, da pa tega ne bodo ZDA podpisale, dokler ne bo gotov v vseh podrobnostih in bo res jamčil mir. Demokratični kandidat je kasneje priznal temu, da se sprašuje, če bo Nixon res kdaj končal vojno v Vietnamu ali ne.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Cene na debelo so v oktobru povprečno padle za 0.2% na 120.

Deželnimi pridelki so ob upoštevanju dobe porastli za 0.2%, dejansko pa so za 1% v ceni padli. Cene industrijskih izdelkov, ki so za ustajene cene najvažnejše, so se na debelo znižale za 0.1%, med tem ko so preje povprečno rastle za 0.4%.

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Pretekli teden so bili v vojaških nastopih mrtvi 3 Amerikanci, 17 je bilo pa ranjenih. Domača vojaška sila so imela 504 mrtve, rdeči pa preko 2,000, kot trdi uradno poročilo v Saigonu. — Boji se nadaljujejo na vseh bojiščih in ameriška letala, vključno B-52 so bila včeraj in danes znova nad sovražnikovimi vojaškimi cilji.

OTTAWA, Kan. — Predsednik vlade P. E. Trudeau je po dolgih posvetih s svojimi tovariši v vladni odločil, da ne bo odstopil, dokler ga parlament ne bo k temu prisilil. Novo izvoljeni parlament bo sklican na zasedanje v januarju.

But it all proves that these politicians and their supporters are working like mad to keep the American system of office by election the best and soundest system of government in the world!

Ed Ryder wishes to remain Dist. 18 state rep.

The governor of the State of Ohio has increased the number of state employees by 6,198 since taking office — no wonder he needs a state income tax to fund his administration," Representative Ed Ryder said.

Statistics obtained from the State Department of Personnel show that state employees have increased from 49,327 in January 1971, Gilligan's first month in office, to 55,525 in August 1972 — an increase of 6,198.

Among the increase in state employees, as reported by the Columbus Dispatch, was a 60% increase in the Governor's personal staff.

The budget for this staff, which was almost three times as high as that of the Rhodes administration, was \$1,641,000 compared with \$551,000.

"It is very clear to me that the Governor does not know the meaning of economy in government. He has constantly called for new tax money while spending these taxes on enlarging the state bureaucracy, redecorating the governor's office, personal trips out of state, and

Last Sunday evening, October 29th, nearly 1000 Holy Name Officers from the Cleveland Diocese paid tribute to their Bishop Clarence B. Isenmann at a dinner session at Sheraton Cleveland Grand Ballroom.

Attending from our St. Vitus Parish were Fr. Rudolph Praznik, President Al Orehek, Vice-President Anton Oblak, Secretaries John and Joe Hocevar, and Board members Edward Thomas, Joseph Strumbel, Frank Kern, Ted Zak and Frank Zupancic.



Judge Francis J. Talty is one of the best known and most distinguished public personalities.

A resident of Euclid for 37 years, Judge Talty currently resides at 19651 Edgecliff Drive with his brother-in-law, Martin O'Neill.

In his position as Probate Court Judge, Francis Talty is the highest ranking Euclid citizen in the Cuyahoga County government.

Like many Euclid citizens, he was born and raised by immigrant parents in the "Little Europe" sections of the old St. Clair neighborhoods. To this day his family has maintained close ties to the home neighborhood by keeping a family business at 64th and St. Clair Ave.

The Judge continues to maintain close personal relations with many of his former neighbors. It is not unusual to find him during the lunch hour driving out from the Courthouse to the restaurant owned by his good friend, Lou Slapnik, to enjoy Slovenian home cooking and renewing St. Clair acquaintances.

He graduated from Holy Name High School where he

captained the basketball team and was an honor graduate. His athletic and scholastic achievements mounted while he attended John Carroll University. At John Carroll he was president of the junior and senior classes, basketball captain, and on the dean's honor roll for three years.

He graduated cum laude with a Ph B degree and entered the U.S. Military Academy in 1942. Three months later he incurred a spinal injury in training exercises and was given a medical discharge.

He taught at East High School for five months and received a Ranney Scholarship to Western Reserve University Law School.

For two years he studied law and served as physical director at St. Clair Recreation Center, receiving his law degree in 1946.

He taught an adult night division at West Tech High School in 1946 and in 1947 was named varsity basketball coach at John Carroll.

For seven years he was an associate of the late Harold C. Heiss, general counsel for the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen. He participated in trials across the country and appeared before the Interstate Commerce Commission and special presidential boards. In 1955 he became a partner in the law firm of Kane, Ray and Talty.

In 1964, shortly after becoming President of the Cuyahoga County Bar Association, Judge Talty was elected to the Court of Common Pleas.

While serving on that Court the Judge became nationally known for his original standards establishing Fair Trial procedures.


