Moskva: Ne le Vietnam

Uradno glasilo Komunistične partije "Pravda" navaja še druge ovire za izboljšanje odnosov z Združenimi državami.

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — V včerajšnji Pravdi je znani komentator Viktor Mayevski zapisal, da obstoje poleg vojne v Vietnamu še prenekater druge ovire izboljšanju odnosov med Sovjetsko zvezo in Združenimi državami, za kar se v zadnjem času zavzemata predsed. ZDA L. B. Johnson. Ta je v manj kot v enem mesecu pozval trikrat k izboljšanju teh odnosov, pa naletel vedno na odklonilen odgovor v Moskvi.

Moskva nima namere, piše Mayevski v Pravdi, ustvarjati prijateljske odnose z Združenimi državami "na škodo socializma, narodnih osvobodilnih gibanj in varnosti ljudstev (sveta)". Pri tem priznava, da je trenutno glavna ovira boljšim odnosom vojna v Vietnamu, ki da zastruplja vse mednarodno sodelovanje. Mayevski dolži Združene države, da še vedno prece svoje oborožene sile v Južnem Vietnamu v "brezplodnih sanjah po vojaški magni".

Mayevski trdi, da se je ravnoteže sil v svetu obrnilo v korist komunističnega tabora in da zato iščejo Združene države boljše odnose s Sovjetsko zvezo. Pri tem najde pravo zadovoljstvo, češ da še ni dolgo tega, kar so sledale na nju kot na izobčenca iz mednarodne skupnosti.

V Moskvi zamerijo Washingtonu tudi, da se trudi še vedno za ohranitev NATO in da nuditi moralno podporo Izraelu, ki je lani tako grdo naklestil ruske zaveznike v arabskem svetu.

Kje vidijo v Moskvi tolikšno okrepitev komunističnega bloka, da bi ta prevagala ravnotežje sil v komunistično korist, je težko dognati. V sovjetskem bloku je več notranjega nemira in vrenja kot ga je mogoče ugotoviti v svobodnem svetu, poleg tega pa glede na glavni komunistični sili Rusija in Kitajska kot pes in mačka ter budno zasedljeta druga drugo ob skupni meji. Svobodni svet se ne boji novega ravnotežja sil v svetu, daje le prednost miru in mirnemu življenu pred vojno in napredku gospodarstva ter splošnega blagostanja pred oboroževalnimi tekmami. To, se zdi, vodilnim ljudem v komunističnem bloku ne gre v glavo, ker pač ni združljivo z njihovo miselnostjo.

PARIZ, Fr. — General De Gaulle ni samo nepričakovano napovedal parlamentarnih volitev, je odmeril zanje le kratko volivno kampanjo in izredno zgoden dan volitev. Politični krogovi so zato mislili, da bo volivna kampanja zelo površna in neorganizirana. Pa ni tako. De Gaullovi pristaši so se neverjetno hitro znašli in začeli udrihati po svojih nasprotnikih, ki jim ocitajo zvezne levičarskimi študenti.

Glavni predmet volivnih shodov je seveda študentovski "upor", ki je že v maju in v prvih polovici junija delal povprečne Francoz dosti sitnosti in razočaranja. V Venezueli priprave na predsedniške volitve

CARACAS, Venez. — V Venezuela bodo imeli v decembri predsedniške volitve. Do njih manjka še pol leta, pa je volivna kampanja že v polnem razmahu. Udeležujejo se je 4 stranke. Najmočnejša med njimi je bila pri prejšnjih volitvah stranka demokratske akcije, ki ji pripada tudi sedanji predsednik Leonid Štrank a kandidira voditelja Gonzalesa Barrios. Od stranke se je pa odcepil precešen del, ki kandidira Figuerosa. Tri važne konservativne skupine pa kandidirajo skupaj z nevtralci malo znanega politika Rivasa.

Najbolj zanimiv kandidat je pa predsednik krščanskih demokratov Caldera. Je v Venezuela dobro znan politik z velikim ugledom. Po splošnem mnenju je to sedaj že najbolj konzervativna stranka, ki ve, kaj hoče, in razume tudi tehniko moderne politične agitacije. Se sicer naslanja na srednje stanove, toda njeni hrbitenica so mladi volivci. Vpopovetati moramo, da je v Venezuela 70% ljudi mlajših od 30 let.

Kdo bo pri volitvah zmagal, nihče nočje prorokovati. Tudi v Venezuela je volivec muhast in si lahko premisli. Držalo bo le to, da so levičarske stranke preslabe, da bi kaj pomenile v sedanji kampanji.

PREDSTAVNIŠKI DOM JE ODOLBLIL DAVČNO NAKLADO

Včeraj je Predstavniški dom izglasoval z 268:150 10-odstotno davčno naklado in zmanjšanje zveznih izdatkov v proračunskem letu 1968-1969 za 6 bilijonov. Danes bo o predlogu glasoval Senat, kjer naj bi bila odobritev zagotovljena.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Včeraj je po nad 10 mesecih zavlačevanja Predstavniški dom odobril predlog za povišanje davkov, ki ga je stavljal Kongres predsednik L. B. Johnson še lani v avgustu. Predlog je dobil sorazmerno veliko večino, saj je glasovalo zanj 268 kongresnikov, proti pa le 150. Predsednik L. B. Johnson je odobritev 10-odstotne naklade na dohodninski davek posameznikov in korporacij označil za "zmago za ves narod" in za "bistveno zavarovanje proti gospodarskemu kaosu". "Naša demokracija je prestala kritično preskušnjo," je ugotovil predsednik. Povišanje davkov je povezano z zmanjšanjem zveznih izdatkov v proračunskem letu 1968-1969 za 6 bilijonov predloga, ki ga je stavljal administracija. Predsednik L. B. Johnson je pristal najprej na zmanjšanje proračuna za 4 bilijone in označil to za skrajno mejo. Ko Predstavniški dom le ni maral sprejeti tega in je določil zmanjšanje na 6 bilijonov, je predsednik to sprejel, ker je smatral, da je zvišanje davkov tako nujno, da ne dopušča nobene izbirose.

Davčno naklado bodo korporacije plačevala od 1. januarja letos, privatniki pa od 1. aprila. Naklada bo ostala v veljavni do 30. junija 1969, če jo ne bo Kongres podaljšal, kar pa bo nemara zavisele največ od tega, ali bo vojne v Vietnamu tedaj že končne ali ne.

Zakonski predlog, ki ga je včeraj izglasoval Predstavniški dom in bo danes o njem glasoval Senat, podaljšuje tudi prometni davek na telefon in na prodajo avtomobilov, ki bi bil sicer ukinjen še v smislu določil zakona o znižanju davkov iz leta 1963.

Davčna naklada bo prinesla predvidoma zvezni blagajni okoli 11.6 bilijonov dolarjev. Njen cilj je zavreti gospodarsko rast in s tem inflacijo, pa zmanjšati tudi primanjkljaj v zveznem proračunu in s tem utrditi vrednost dolara kot mednarodnega plačilnega sredstva.

PRAGA, ČSR. — Nova pravna vlada se na vse nač



dostavil Jure. Nato pa je začel o tem razovedevati:

"Ni dolgo tega, je omenjal J. Cary v "JHN", da je verjetno, da se nahajamo v začetkih velikih finančnih kriz. Predznaki kažejo, da se počasi poglabljamo v finančne bolezni. V marcu se je življenje podražilo nad štiri desetinke odstotka. Pravi, da je to največji poskok v zadnjih osmih mesecih.

Glavni srednji problem zaskrbljenosti je sedanja vojna z Vietnamom. Ta že bolj in bolj, kakor nenasitni zmaj. Ta stane nas zdaj že nad 25 bilijonov letno. To je odtok v tujino. Proizvajamo in proizvajamo, pa največ za druge. Dasi še borba v Vietnamu ni zaključena in tudi če kmalu bo, nas bo Vietnam še vedno veliko stal. Delež bo treba obnoviti gospodarsko in bo treba dasti investicij. Gledalo bo vse le na Ameriko, prav tako kakor po zadnji vojni v Evropi. Amerika naj pomaga. Kdaj, če ne pride do take ureditve, bo vse to kaj prinašalo Ameriki nazaj?

Ne povzroča nam gospodarske skrbi samo Vietnam. Tudi doma naše lastne potrebe, ki so zadnja štiri leta zaostale, zahtevajo in bodo zahtevali več in več. To pomeni, več bo vse stalo, višji bodo davki, ki bodo začeli še bolj naraščati. Drugo se draži. Kako ustaviti to — za naše gospodarstvo nevarno inflacijo?

Temu je Jure dodal še svoje mnenje, da noben žakej ni tako velik, da bi se mu ne prišlo dna. Kdorkoli bo že izvoljen v jeseni, bo v službi imel velike skrbi in v Beli hiši se mu bodo pobelili lasje, če že ne bo bele tja prinesel.

Pa tudi nas vse opominja, da naj čuvamo svoje "knofe", kdor jih še kaj ima, ker znajo priti prav, kakor še nikoli!"

Chiang Ching zopet v ospredju na Kitajskem

HONG KONG. — Maova žena Chiang Ching je bila zadnje mesece skoraj popolnoma tiho in v javnosti jo ni bilo nikjer videti. Ko so Ču-En-laja vprašali, kaj je temu vzrok, je tedaj odgovoril, da je "potrebna počitka". Ta njen počitek je bil vezan z zastankom v "kulturni revoluciji" in poskusom pomiritve dežele.

Sedaj se je Chiang Ching nedavno zopet pojavila v javnosti in to celo na vodilnem mestu takoj za samim Maoom in njegovim namestnikom vojnimi ministrom Lin Piaom. Eden od vojaških poveljnikov je zadnjič dal ukaz četam, da se naj "uče od tovarisce Chiang Ching". Dosej so priporočali učenje le od Mao-Tsetunga samega in od njegovega namestnika Lin Piao.

Rusi bodo imeli skoro več medcelinskih raket

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Po podatkih Pentagona bodo imeli Rusi ob začetku novega leta skupno 1100 medcelinskih raket, spravljenih globoko v podzemnih silosih. Združene države na letu 1054. Kot znano so ZDA gradnjo medcelinskih raket omejile na tisoč in bodo morda to število povečale še kvečemu na 1200. Trenutno se prizadeva v glavnem za njihovo izboljšanje in povečanje njihovega števila.

Združene države se seveda zanašajo na 656 Polaris A-3 raket, ki so spravljene v atomskih podmornicah in predstavljajo atomsko udarno silo, ki je po svoji moći vsaj enaka polovici sovjetskih medcelinskih raket. Ker so podmornice skrite globoko v svetovnih morjih, jih sovražnik ne more uničiti z iznenadnim napadom.

Republikanska volivna propaganda je že začela opozarjati na "raketno vrzel", ki da je demokratska administracija dovolila na škodo varnosti dežele. Pritisnila bo na pospešeno obroževanje naše dežele, ki naj dohit "izgubljeno".

Belgia dobila novo vlado

BRUXELLES, Belg. — Predsednik Gaston Eyskens je objavil svojo vlado, ki jo je sestavil iz krščanskih demokratov in socialistov. V novi vladi je 28 ministrov, med tem, ko jih je bilo v prejšnji le 23, vladna koalicija je ostala sicer ista.

Vlada je padla v preteklem februarju zaradi valonsko-flamskega jezikovnega spora na univerzi v Louveinu. Ko vladne krize ni bilo mogoče rešiti, je kralj razpustil parlament in razglasil nove volitve. Položaj v parlamentu se ni bistveno spremenil, okreplili sta se le obe skrajni nacionalistični skupini. Vlada ima skupno v parlamentu 128 od 212 poslancev, torej za vladanje zadostno večino. Manjka jih pa dvotretjinska večina, ki je potrebna za spremembu ustaw, kar naj bi edino moglo voditi do trajne rešitve spora. Če pri tem načrtu ne bo dobila podprtje drugih strank, se nova vlada ne bo mogla dolgo držati.

Papež prvič sklical svoj "ministrski svet"

VATIKAN, It. — Reorganizirana uprava vatikanske države je dobila tudi nek organ, ki je podoben ministrskemu svetu v

civilnih državah. Ta ministrski svet sestavljajo načelniki kongregacij, komisij in uradov. Jih je vsega skupaj okoli 20. Sedaj jih je papež prvič sklical na posvet.

Prišlo jih je 17, poleg tega sta bila prisotna še dva vodilna člena papeževega državnega tajništva. Vatikanski ministrski svet je brez predsednika, to funkcijo opravlja sv. oče. Je tudi le posvetovalni organ. Imel bo pa večino besed v upravi katoliške cerkve. Papež je bil samo na začetku seje, potem je odšel. Svet je razpravljal o tekočih poslih, med drugim tudi o romanju sv. očeta v Bogoto in o stanju katoličanov za želesno zaveso.



Mince Meat Goes Creole



Dreaming of New Orleans—its beauty and its continental atmosphere, but, most of all, its Cajun cooking? Translate such whimsy into delicious reality with this shrimp creole from the Borden Kitchen... shrimp pungent with the tantalizing spices and smells of mince meat, dappled with the reddishness of tomatoes and the greenness of fresh pepper. And it's less work than meets the eye: the mince meat is ready-to-use right from the jar. No more wearisome mincing, peeling, and dicing.

Shrimp-Mincé Creole
(Makes 6-8 servings)

1 pound shrimp, uncooked	1 teaspoon salt
3/4 cup chopped onion	Dash pepper
1 cup coarsely chopped green pepper	1-1/8 cups (one-half of 28-oz. jar) Borden Ready-to-Use None Such Mincé Meat
1 cup coarsely chopped celery	2 cups (1 lb. can) whole tomatoes
1 cup uncooked long grain rice	1-1/2 cups boiling water

Shell and devein shrimp. Do not cook. Wash and split each shrimp in half lengthwise. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Sauté onion, green pepper and celery 5 minutes, or until almost tender. Add shrimp; stir briefly. Add rice, salt, pepper, mince meat, tomatoes and boiling water. Mix well. Pour into a buttered 2-1/2 quart casserole. Cover. Bake in a moderate (350°F.) oven, 1 hour or until liquid is absorbed and rice is tender. (Add a little more boiling water if necessary.) If desired, garnish with chopped parsley. Serve immediately.

Drysdale Acclaimed N.L. Player of Month in May

Cincinnati, O. — Don Drysdale, who pitched five of his record six straight shutouts in May, was chosen the National League Player of the Month for May by a landslide margin.

Forty-four of the 50 writers comprising the selection committee voted for Drysdale. Five voted for Rusty Staub, Astro's first baseman, and one for Braves' pitcher Ron Reed.

Drysdale's over-all performance was outstanding. The big righthander completed five of eight starts,

lost only once during the month, allowed just 46 hits in 68 innings, walked 12 and struck out 45. His earned run average for the month was 0.53.

Staub batted .368 in May with 39 hits in 106 at-bats. He hit three home runs and drove in 19 tallies.

Red also won five of six decisions and posted an impressive 2.54 ERA. He yielded 32 hits in 46 innings, walked 11 and whiffed 18.

Change In Weight Limit On Parcels

High Altitude Vacations Possible For All Says Heart Ass'n.

Golf pros taking part in a match at a mile-high course in Colorado complained of feeling "tired" and "listless." Gurkha troops manning the Indian border in the Himalayas have been knocked out of commission by an invisible foe.

Both of these groups experienced in different degree some effects of high altitude sickness, caused by the oxygen-poor air at higher levels. If conditioned athletes and responders responded in that fashion to a changed climate, what is the significance for heart patients planning vacations at altitudes where their hearts would suddenly be asked to work harder to provide sufficient oxygen in an unaccustomed atmosphere?

Most heart patients, according to the Heart Association of Northeastern Ohio, can travel safely to high altitudes, if simple precautions are taken to minimize the effects of sudden change. Your doctor is the best judge whether high altitudes may affect you, so visit him before completing vacation plans.

It would be desirable for heart patients accustomed to living at sea-level, who have medical approval to vacation in altitudes of 7,000 feet or above, to make the ascent gradually. Over a period of several days, the body would adjust to the "thinner air." But today's jets zip across borders and even continents in a few hours, whisking people from flat country to sky-high climates. The fast change can cause high altitude sickness. Symptoms include headache, drowsiness, blueness of nails, lips, nose or ears; a feeling of warmth and flushing of the face; poor sleep, poor appetite and even dizziness.

The plane ride should not pose any problem, since passenger cabins are pressurized to meet high-altitude oxygen needs.

The Heart Association does suggest you get a good night's sleep and eat a light breakfast before the trip. During the flight, go easy on food and skip alcoholic beverages. On arrival in the high-altitude areas, get some bed rest if possible, and take it easy, especially in the first 24 hours. If you begin to feel uncomfortable, be sure to seek medical help.

½ cup salad oil
1 10-ounce bottle of Sprite

Federal Firearms Laws Still Valid, IRS Says

Federal firearms statutes remain in full force for persons possessing firearms or engaged in their transfer, manufacture or importation, Mr. F. S. Turbett, Jr., District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Cleveland, Ohio said.

The recent decision by the U.S. Supreme Court in the Haynes firearms case has been misinterpreted by some firearms dealers and others, as relieving them of the requirements imposed by the National Firearms Act.

In the Haynes case, the Court held that the constitutional privilege against self-incrimination could be invoked against criminal charges brought under the National Firearms Act, for failing to register a firearm or possessing an unregistered firearm.

The Supreme Court did not, in its decision, hold the National Firearms Act or any of its provisions to be unconstitutional, Mr. Turbett pointed out. The underlying objective of the Act is to prevent criminals from obtaining gangster-type weapons such as machine guns and sawed-off shotguns.

Weapons which are covered by the National Firearms Act may be legally acquired and possessed subject to regulatory requirements. However, any such weapon which is not properly registered is contraband and subject to seizure, Mr. Turbett said.

A person who possesses a gangster-type weapon is still subject to criminal penalties if it was, at any time, illegally made or transferred.

The recordkeeping and reporting obligations imposed on firearms dealers, manufacturers and importers, by the National Firearms Act, have in no way been altered by the Haynes decision. IRS will continue to conduct inspections of records to insure compliance with Federal law.

Occupational, transfer and other taxes imposed by the National Firearms Act remain in full force.

The Federal Firearms Act, a separate statute which regulates the interstate transportation of weapons, was not involved in the Haynes case and is not affected by the decision.
