"VESTNIK MARIBORSKE" GA OKROŽJA je nekak nadomestek za znani štajerski list "Slovenski gospodar," ki so ga Nemci ustavili, ko so zasedli Štajersko. Novi gospodarji niso hoteli oživiti starega lista, ampak skušajo priti med ljudi z novim "Vestnikom."

POHUJŠLJIVI FILMI V JUGOSLAVIJI. — Komunistični listi v Ljubljani so se zelo pojavljali nad švicarskim filmom Marija Lujiza. Film nekako zagovarja švicarsko neutralnost. Komunisti pravijo, da s tem odvraja ljudstvo od borbe za njegove pravice. Po mnenju pisca v "Slov. Poroč." je vsak, kdor se ni boril proti fašizmu, izdajalec. Taki izdajalci so dejansko tudi švicari. To ni neutralnost, ampak sredinstvo, ki ga je treba iztrebiti. Tako sredinstvo sedaj trebijo "ljudska" sodišča. Ta film je torej proti sedanji veri novih gospodarjev in tedaj slab in pohujšljiv za mladino. Samo kar hvali sovjete in kar je v kontrastu novega režima je dobro in kulturno.

### Okupacija Trsta je v veliko breme tako Ameriki kot je Angliji

New York. — Koncil Velike Četvrtke bo enkrat te dni z vso resnostjo začel reševati vprašanje, kdaj naj Amerika in Anglia odpokliceta svoje čete iz Trsta. Rusija je, kot znano, zahtevala, naj bi odšlo tuje vojaštvo iz Trsta takoj, ko bo začela tržaška država kot edinica zase poslovati. Amerika in Anglia sta pa dozdaj vneto zagovarjali stališče, da je treba najprej videti, kako bo tržaška država poslovala in kakšen bo izgled za njeno varnost, predno vzameta svoje čete domov.

Toda Rusija bo imela za svoje zahteve močno zaveznicno—denarno vprašanje. Okupacija Trsta stane samo Anglijo do \$1,000,000 na teden. Koliko stane okupacija Zedinjene države, številke niso dane v javnosti. Novi ameriški kongres bo pristiskal na armado, naj zmanjša svoje izdatke in pri tem bo moralo prišlo tudi vprašanje okupacije Trsta in Julijskih Krajine na površje. Ker je torej okupacija Trsta v veliko breme Angliji in Ameriki, bo Rusija najbrže prav lahko dosegla svoje zahteve, da vzameta svoje vojaštvo s Primorskega.

Lahko je mogoče, da bo prišlo pri tem do kakega kompromisa, na primer, da se bosta Amerika in Anglia vdali zahtevi Rusije, če bo ta vzela istočasno vse svoje čete z Balkana. Tedni bodo ministri Velike Četvrtke o tem barantali.

San Francisco. — Glavnata solata, ki se jo največ pridelava tukaj, se je izdatno podražila in sicer za \$2 pri zaboju. Prej je bil zabolj \$2.75, zdaj je pa \$4.75. To je rekordna cena za solato.

### Nemškim ujetnikom so obljubili svobodo

Brunselj. — Nemški vojni ujetniki, ki se zaposleni v belgijskih premogovnikih, bodo izpuščeni na svobodo, ake bodo nakopali 80% več premoga kot domači belgijski premogarji. Tako jim je obljubila belgijska vlada.

Washington. — Federalni sodnik Goldsborough je včeraj popoldne ob 5 podpisal listino, s katero je John L. Lewis, predsednik unijskih premogarjev, klican v pondeljek pred sodnijo. Dokazati bo moral, zakaj naj ne bo kaznovan, ker se ni pokoril sodni prepovedi in ni preprečil 400,000 premogarjem iti na stavko.

Ako se Lewis v pondeljek ne bo opral pred sodnijo, bo poklican v sredo, ob 10 dopoldne zopet pred sodnijo in poroto, kjer bo sojen radi preziranja sodne prepoovedi.

Sodnik Goldsborough je podpisal pozivnico na sodnijo potem, ko se je poprej eno uro posvetoval s 5 drugimi sodniki in pomembnim zveznim pravnikom.

Vlada obtožuje Lewisja, da je nalašč prezrl in s tem kršil ukaz sodnije, ki je ukazala, da mora premogarska unija vztrajati na svoji pogodbji z vlado in obravati premogovnike.

Premogarji so že v pondeljek zapuščali delo in danes je skor vseh 400,000 premogarjev doma,

Jeklarska industrija poroča, da bo v dveh tednih, če bo premogarska stavka nadaljevala, zmanjšala obrat za 50%.


Urad za obrambno transportacijo je ukazal, da vse železnicne zmanjšajo prevoz, zatem v pondeljek.

### Delavski list napoveduje padec cen za življenje

Washington. — Unija AFL napoveduje v svojem mesečnem pregledu padec cen življenskih potrebsčinam in sicer se bo to čutilo že zgodaj v 1947. Vsled tega bo trgovina za spoznanje padla iz sedanjega etovočega obsega.

Kljub temu pa običajni življeni, AFL in CIO, govorita že zdaj o novi zahtevi po višji mezdi. Uniji stojita na stališču, da mora imeti odjemalec, to je delavec, več denarja v rokah, če hoče imeti trgovina kupčijo.



Največje letalo na svetu. — Slika nam kaže največje letalo na svetu v njegovem prvem poletu nad Washingtonom, D. C. Je to vojaški bombnik B-36. Preko kril meri 230 čevljev in dolg pa je 163 čevljev. Ima šest motorjev s skupno pogonsko silo 18,000 konjskih sil. Lahko ponese eno atomsko bombo v kateri kolik del sveta in se vrne nazaj brez pristanka. Prostor za bombe je v velikosti enak prostornini štirih tovornih železniških vagonov.

Moč in slabost njihove politike je samo v masah, ki stojijo za njimi, in da te pridobe, uporabljajo vsa mogoča sredstva.

## Vabilo na plesno veselico

Naše društvo sv. Cirila in Metoda št. 18 SDZ bo praznovalo v soboto 23. novembra, t. l. 30. obletnico svojega obstoja z veselico, ki se bo vršila v auditoriju Slov. narodnega doma na St. Clair Ave. Začetek bo ob osmidem zvečer. Vstopnina, v kateri pa je začela prihajati na dan resnica. Izgrednik je po navodilih svojega voditelja, da reši teroriste iz rdeče zanke, pri zaslijanju priznal zdravniku, da je on krv spora s paznikom, in obenem izjavil, da je njegov tovariš nedolžen. Da ne bi politični obsojeni zvedeli o njegovem vedenju pri raportu, je prosil, da se mu disciplinska kazen odgodi za teden dni. Demonstrantom pa se je zlagal, da sta oba oproščena.

Moskovljani so se zamantrudili in metali svojo marksistično vrv, da bi ujeli teroriste, za gladovno stavko jih niso mogli pridobiti. Toda kaj zato? Čeprav že malo negotovi, so se bojevali iz načela.

V komuni je pet in dvajset kaznjencev glasovalo za stavko in se od teh precej iz strahu pred priimkom "oportunist". Po načelu revolucionarne discipline pa so morali tudi tisti, ki so bili proti, glasovati na zborovanju kot "masovna vez" za stavko. Našlo se je trinajst neutralnih zajedničarjev, ki so se s tem, da so glasovali za stavko, hoteli pokazati borbeno revolucionarje. V resnicu se je izjavilo za boj osem in trideset komunistov, sedem in sedemdeset pa proti. Toda da se pokorijo načelom razrednega boja, je moralo sto petnajst komunistov v gladovno stavko, v boj na življenje in smrt za trumbo moskovskih eksperimentistov in rehabilitantov. Pri zadnjem glasovanju se je celo hajduk Milenko vzdržal glasovanja, da, če stavka ne uspe, lahko reče: "nisem bil za", če uspe, pa: "nisem bil proti". Take olajšave veljajo v razrednem boju seveda le za voditelje, ki lahko brez odgovornosti načenejo proletariju na barikade, odgovornost pa nosi "proletariat kot razred v sebi in za sebe . . ."

Jetičen komunist je na zborovanju sprožil vprašanje, kakšno stališče naj zavzamejo namproti manj odpornim in bolehnim tovarišem. Vsi rdečelični junaki so se z brezobzirno odkritosrčno izjavili, da se morajo bolniki brezpogojno solidarizirati, če hočejo uživati plodove boja. Razen tega bodo ti gotovo prej omagali in če kdo umre, bo buržoazija iz strahu ugodila vsem zahtevam komune, zdravi bodo pa ostali, ker jih proletariat bolj potrebuje kakor bolezne.

"Tovariši, boj bo hud, vendar se ga mi ne bojimo! Pripravljeni smo žrtvovati dvajset bolnih tovarišev, samo da komuna zmaga in drugim zagotovimo prijetno robijo," je v ognjevitem govoru dejal delbeluasti nadkomisar. Bolniki so prebledeli in molčali iz strahu pred revolucionarnim tribunalom, v žepu pa so držali figo.

Revolucionarni strah je prikazen, ki jo je najti samo med marksisti. Zanje je masa vse, posameznik nič. V masi so pogumni, ker se čutijo zavarovani, kot posamezniki pa so strahopetci. Vedno se potegujejo za maso in z njo držijo, četudi




