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Komunisti zapeljivci delavstva

Dopis iz Julijske Krajine

Poseči moramo nekoliko nazaj. Bilo je zadnje dni junija. Radi nespametne komunistične politike, ki je po svojih podružnicah OF (Osvobodilna fronta) in SIAU (Slovenska-italijanska antifašistična unija) povsod, kjer se je le dalo, izzivala, dražila in poniževala zavezničke, smo Slovenci pri Angležih in Amerikancih zaigrali ves svoj kredit in namesto naklonjeosti dosegli skrajno nezaupanje. Naspromto so se pa Italijani pod okriljem Zavezniške vojaške uprave čutili vedno bolj udobno in jim je rasel greben. V svojih zahtevah glede Trsta, Istre in vse bodoče meje so postajali vedno bolj obosteni in so z dnevom v dan nastopali bolj drzno. Na praznik sv. Petra in Pavla, 29. junija, so imeli v Trstu "Dan solidarnosti" za Istro, popoldne je bil koncert zloglasne "Lega Nazionale" na trgu "Unita." Oba dogodka so pospremili z demonstracijami.

Drugi dan v nedeljo 30. junija, smo doživeli dogodek v Pieris-u ob Soči, kjer je bila ustavljenia krožna kolesarska dirka. Ta italijanska tridesetdnevna krožna kolesarska dirka po prvotnem načrtu ni vključevala Julijske Krajine. To je bilo tudi edino pravilno, kajti ta je do sklenjenega miru posebno upravno telo, ki ga ni mogoče drugim posečati brez predpisanih potnih dovoljenj. Razgreti laški nacionalisti pa so hoteli tudi v Trst, da pomnože že itak silno razburjenje na tem ozemlju. Delati so hoteli propagando za italijanstvo Trsta v zunanjem svetu. Iz težko razumljivih razlogov je Zavezniška uprava dala dovoljenje za to dirko. Ta korak, ki je bil očvidno proti Slovencem, se je kruto maščeval nad vso deželo in nad zavezniško upravo samo tudi.

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Naslednjih dnevi so potekali v razdraženem vzdušju.

Vsek je vedel, da mora stavka propasti, a vendar so delavci stavkali dalje radi discipline in radi komunističnega pritiska.

Vsek je živo čutil, da je vse samo politična igra komunistov proti zavezničku. Središče mesta je bilo normalno, v pred-

mestjih pa je šla stavka naprej. Nihče ni upal na delo in nihče ni upal odpreti kake trgovine. Stavkujoči so dobivali živila od svojih organizacij, ki so plačevali na jugoslovanski račun tudi denarne podpore.

Položaj delavskih množic pa se je kljub temu hitro slabšal. Zavezniška uprava je pozvala ponovno delavstvo, naj gre na delo. Mnogi so se odzvali in tem je dala uprava svojo zaščito. Časopis je poročalo, kaka škoda se dela vsemu prebivalstvu. Ladje so odhajale, da raztovorijo svoje blago, v Benetke, pristanišče je bilo mrtvo. Ne samo delavci, tudi drugi niso imeli nikakega zasluga. Delavstvo je začelo primanjkovati živil. Vozili so jim živež iz Jugoslavije odnosno iz jugoslovanske cone, toda to ni bilo zadostno. Blago UNRRA-e, ki so ga Amerikanci pripeljali na Jugoslavijo, je prihajalo nazaj v Italijo. Tudi to so zavezniške oblasti kmalu ustavile. Lačni delavci so vedno številne odhajale na delo. Mesto je dobitovalo vedno bolj normalno lice, promet je bil upostavljen, o splošni stavki ni bilo več govora. Kar je še delavcev vztrajalo, so to storili le iz discipline.

V teh dneh stavke je prišlo vsaki dan do nemirov. Zavezniška uprava je videla, kako neumnost je napravila, ko je pustila italijansko dirko na ta vroča tržaška tla. Doživeila je tudi razočaranje od strani tistih Italijanov, katerim je dajala potuh. Pri demonstracijah 6. julija zvečer so ti Italijani navalili na zavezniško policijo in vojaštvo, jih psovali in sramotili ter obmetavali s kamenjem. Zaveznički so mo-

rali močno nastopiti, da so ukrotili te svoje navidezne prijatelje.

Po desetih dneh stavke so voditelji uvideli, da so igro s stavko izgubili. Za konec so hoteli še dvigniti moralno svoje armade in svojim rdečim pristašem vleti malo poguma klub izgubljeni bitki. Priredili so divje demonstracije proti italijanskim protikomunistom in proti zavezničkom. Vojaštvo je moralno zopet nastopiti in razgnati nahujskane minoice. Drugi dan je sedem partizanskih organizacij pozvalo delavstvo, naj "začasno" prekine stavko in gre na delo.

Tako je bila velika stavka po 12 dneh končana brez vsakega uspeha za delavstvo. Bila je čisto politična stavka. Delavstvo je na ukaz komunistov trpel zaston.

Toda žaloogra še ni bila končana. V pondeljek 15. julija je prišlo po prepiru po ladjedelnicih med komunisti in tistim delavstvom, ki je na poziv zavezničkov šlo na delo. Iz prepiru so nastali pretepi. Ta prepir je izrabilo vodstvo obeh velikih podjetij. Vrglo je na cesto 9.000 delavcev "za nedoločen čas." Zavezniška uprava je morala poseči vmes. Izjavila je, da ne more trpeti izpora tolikih delavcev in zastoja dela v tako važnih industrijskih panogah. Obe veliki ladjedelnici je postavila pod vojaško upravo. Tako je končno bil upostavljen red. Ro širinajstih dneh je bila vojaška uprava ladjedelnic ukinjena.

Radi nepremišljene stavke, ki so jo začeli komunisti, je delavstvo izgubilo svojo dosedjanje moč. Razbito in razklanno je. Gospodje "tovariši" pa so odnesli pete v Titovo varstvo. Imelo pa bo tudi to svojo dobro stran. Delavstvo namreč vidi, da je komunistom vse njihova politika in nič resnične delavske koristi. Ne vidijo tega vsi naenkrat, toda resnica o komunistih postopoma prodira.

Solze so bile opravljene prav tako, kot vaše, ko ste zapseli svoj dragi dom in domovino.

Ko je ladja poleg Denverja zopet sedla na zemljo, je padal dež s tako silo, da smo morali kake četrte ure ostati na svojih prostorih. Razen naših najstarejših samostanov in njih podružnic v Istri (v Pulju, Biljanu, Lemenu) in v Červinjanu v Furlaniji, ki so bili vsi izročeni varstvu sv. Mihaela, so pri nas tudi vse krstne cerkve in kapelle posvečene sv. Mihaelu. Večino so nahajajo ob reke, potokih in jezerih. Tako je bila leta 864 v čast sv. Mihaelu posvečena v Kocljevi kneževini cerkev v Ortuhi, ki je bila po vsej priliki krstna cerkev za tamošnjo panonsko pokrajino. Na Koroškem so bile take cerkve v Pusarnici za lurnski kraj v gornji dravski dolini, v Blatnem gradu (Moosburgu) severozapadno od Celovca, v Rožeku južno od Drave, v Podjuni pa v Smihelu pri Piberku. Na Gospovskevem polju je baptisterij ali krstna kapela še danes ohranjena poleg cerkve pri Gospici Sveti. Na stropu se v baptisteriju še sedaj pozna podoba sv. Mihaela. Spodnji del Gospovskega baptisterija je v sedanosti kostnika, kar so potem, ko so bili baptisteriji opuščeni, postale vse krstne kapelle. Na Kranjskem so bila nekajna krščanska središča z baptisterijem za večje okolišne verjetno cerkvi v Mengšu in Smihelu pri Novem mestu, na Štajerskem med drugimi. Piscice, na Primorskem pa župni cerkvi v Kamnjah in Biljanu v goriških Brdih. Vendar to niso bile edine, dasi so verjetno najstarejše naše krstne cerkve. O mnogih kostnicah (ossarlijih ali karnerjih), bodisi da so ohranjene ali pa jih pa le iz starih poročil poznamo, je znano, da so bile posvečene sv. Mihaelu. Mogli bi zaslediti še druga najstarejša krstna središča za posamezne okolišne.

Mihaelov dan je nekaj mejnik pastirskega leta, “Sv. Mihael leta za pašo zapre, sv. Jurij ga pa odpre.” Nekoč, ko so bili pašniki še skupni, so pastirji sklepali pogodbe za pristojne pastirske leta, za nazaj pa prejeli plačo. Na Koroškem tudi drugi posli so Mihaelovem delajo pogodbe za drugo leto.

Cleveland, Ohio

Friday, September 27, 1946

Superior and St. Clair Ave., streetcar riders can expect quite an improvement in service when the new "Transitliner" service will be inaugurated on Oct. 1 as the time between cars will be cut from six to four minutes during rush hours.

Gold has been discovered in Crescent City, Cal. Reports affirm that the rush is on from all sides and that there are 300 who have already registered their property. It is said that there are 20,000 acres of land where gold may be found.

The National Association of Retail Meat Dealers estimated that at least 36,000 of the nation's butcher shops have been closed by the meat shortage and predicted that the situation will grow worse.

Jeweler Barney Lachman of Detroit heard the sound of broken glass and ran out of his store. Two men standing outside told him that the robbers ran down the street. While he ran after them, these two men reached inside of the display window and carried away 5 watches and other jewelry.

On Wednesday, Sept. 25, the 5 American airmen killed in Yugoslavia were buried in Arlington cemetery in Washington.

Cleveland police have orders to arrest any "thumb" riders who step out in the middle of the street seeking a lift. If they stay on the curb or in the safety zone, the police won't bother them.

The tank of Marit II broke in two on the Newfoundland coast almost on the exact spot where it was torpedoed by a German submarine four years ago. Six of the crew were rescued and brought to Lewes, Del., and 18 were brought to Norfolk, Va., while 14 are still missing.

The building of the new plant of the General Motors Corp., at Parma has been held up due to shortage of building material.

Visiting our office last week was Andy Zakrajevski of Madison, O., an old subscriber.

VETS WARNED TO REGISTER TROPHY GUNS

Local internal revenue agents today renewed their warnings to veterans to register certain types of firearms brought into this country as war trophies.

Owners of unregistered automatic pistols and machine guns are subject to penalties up to five years in prison or a \$2,000 fine.

Louis W. Hinton, agent in charge of the Alcohol Tax Unit which handles all registrations, said there were many souvenir guns still in violation of the National Firearms Act.

"Most of the guns unknown to us belong to vets who just don't realize the law requires registration," Hinton said.

Hinton pointed out that although each serviceable gun is assessed a \$200 tax, weapons permanently deactivated may be recorded free. His unit, he emphasized, can make all types of firearms "fire-proof" without detracting from their appearance or souvenir value.

CATHOLIC ATTITUDE ON INDUSTRY

Conquest, Conflict or Cooperation! Those are the three principles by which the industrial life of a nation might be governed. In a complex society each of them involves trying difficulties. Two of them, Conquest and Conflict, are accompanied by lamentable sufferings and injustices.

Conquest is by far the simplest method of solving the intricate entanglements that arise from economic enterprises. Just as suicide or insanity are the simplest ways out of personal problems. It merely means the assertion of the slogan that "might makes right" and action suitable to the thought follows. Complete economic dictatorship by a relatively small number of men, whether in the name of the State or of rugged individualism or of one class of people is the principle of conquest in action no matter what fancy title may be attached to it. A minority lives on the fat of the land and the majority fight for the lean. The Catholic Attitude condemns it totally. It is unjust, inhuman, indefensible. No matter what its form, no matter what be its claim to necessity, it is "practical only in the sense that robbery, murder and rape are "practical" only under certain circumstances.

Conflict, as a principle of enterprise, is a compromise with the weakness, cowardice and selfishness of human nature. Under the title of "Competition" it wears the smile of highest endeavor; beneath the mask is the sinister, knife-scared countenance of piracy and plunder. Calling cut-throat callousness "Competition" will not give a new nature to the monster.
