Vsa živa bitja ljubim. Celotno hrošče imam rad. Vse svet ljubim. V tem je tajna moč moje duše. Rad bi imel leva, da bi se igral z njim.

Henry je nenadoma zaslišal, da nekdo pod oknom žvižga. Bila je znana melodija stare piratske pesmi:

Dedov naših domovina, milo morje, rodni kraj — k zmagi pot si nam edina, tujcem peklo — nam si raj...

Ves presenečen je planil k oknu, toda tisti hip je zaropotala ključavnica in to ga je prisililo, da je počenil na tla in se potuhnil, kakor da spi.

V celico se je približal Ignacio in svečano ponudil Henryju steklenico.

— Hej, čuj, yanki! Naš dobi nadzornik Pedro Zurita te pozdravlja, — je zajecjal Ignacio. — Zelo bi ga veselilo, če napravite par požirkov na njegovo zdravje in pozabite, da se boste jutri gurali na vesalnih.

— Povejte senorju Pedru Zuriti, da ga prav lepo pozdravljam in recite mu ob enem, naj ga vrag vzame skupaj z njegovim žganjem, — je odgovoril Henry. Vrtar se je vzravnal. Naenkrat je bil trezen, tako da se ni več zibal.

Philadelphia, 8. julija. Rev. Charles Coughlin je včeraj prerokoval, da bo letos poslanska zbornica kongresa prisiljena izvoliti bodočega predsednika Zedinjenih držav. Nadalje je Coughlin prerokoval, da bo dobil Lemke, ki je Coughlinov kandidat za predsednika najmanj 10-000,000 glasov. In po mnenju Rev. Coughlina to zadostuje, da ne bo dobil niti Roosevelt niti Landon dovolj veliko število elektoralnih glasov, nakar mora glasom ustave poslanska zbornica kongresa izvoliti predsednika. "Ako bo Roosevelt izvoljen," je dejal Coughlin, "tedaj bo to zadnji izvoljeni predsednik v Ameriki. Ako bo pa Landon izvoljen in se vrne v Hooverjevo dobo, tedaj bo začelo leteti kamenje po vsej Ameriki."

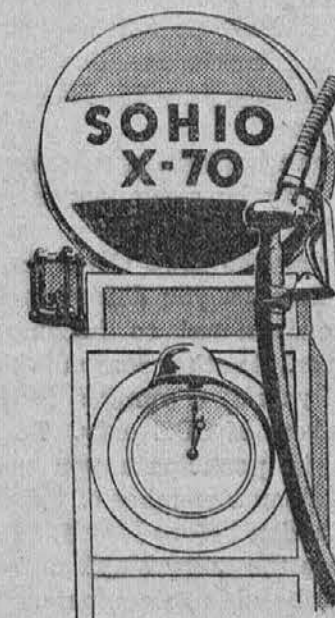

WHAT MAKES A
NEWS STORY?

Here are some of the things that make good copy.

1st. Tell the important facts first with the idea of catching interest immediately. Your story should include the who, what, where and why of an event.

2nd. Be careful of detail. Spell names and places properly. Make notes to insure such accuracy.

3rd. Get the main points. That "nose for news" must get only a brief whiff at the salient features of the story.

4th. Write impersonally in the third person, in simple language clearly understandable to the average reader.

5th. Construct the story with the "unusual outstanding features" and broaden the appeal as much as possible, for "wide appeal" makes more desirable news.

6th. Be timely. Write your copy a day or so before you send it in, for then you will avoid many errors you make in a hurry.

7th. Pictures help tell the story. If you can get a cut to illustrate your story, send it in.

8th. Copy typewritten double spaced on plain paper is ideal for the editor in making necessary changes in the copy.

They'll be toeing their mark, getting set and the bark of the gun that will send the SDZ athletes off in unison means the Third SDZ Olympics will soon be under way. The big day for SDZ is set for Sunday, Aug. 2, at Pintar's farm.

This year's Olympics will be without any doubt the biggest and most competitive fray that was ever witnessed by SDZ.

To make the 1936 Olympics greater than ever the Junior League's athletic committee has added 17 more events to that of the 1933 affair.

Through Frank Krainz's suggestion, the Olympics committee has added an event which probably will enter mofe Slovenian lodges. It's a three-man balinea tourney. This is the only event that limits only one entry from each branch. Some added attractions which will not count in point scoring are the Clairwood girls who will oppose the cream of Junior League's damsels in a ball game. The old-timers of SDZ will battle against the all-stars from the SDZ Baseball League.

Main event, the 12-mile Marathon, is causing a great amount of interest due to being the first time SDZ has sponsored such a tough race.

As an incentive for the marathoners, cash awards are being offered. Fifteen dollars for first prize, ten dollars for second, and the next three will receive five dollars each, providing they finish within half an hour of the winning time.

In all other events first place receives an engraved gold medal, second a silver and those finishing third will be presented with a bronze medal.

To the lodge compiling the most points an extraordinary good trophy will signify their SDZ Olympics champions of 1936.

Positively no entries will be taken after the deadline, which is Saturday, July 25. Don't forget this.

By-Laws of Junior
League Drawn Up

At a regular monthly meeting of the Junior League Monday by-laws of the Junior League, drawn up by the committee on rules of which the chairman is Caroline Sorn, were read and approved for a second, revised version of the by-laws. The second draft will be read to the next meeting of the League, whose date has not yet been set.

Some of the more interesting articles in the constitution as it now is are clauses providing for 4 representatives, the privilege of representatives to vote, the right of all members to hold office.
