Ike in Truman - oba pojedeta v volivni boju

Tako Eisenhower kot Truman sta se pobotala z vodniki svojih strank in obljubila pomoč v volivnem boju. Zamere so pozabljene.

NEWPORT, R. I. — Okolina predsednika Eisenhowera je nečakovanov objavila, da se misli Eisenhower osebno udeležiti volivne kampanje. Kdaj in v kakšni obliki, tega seveda volivna strategije nikoli ne pove. Napoved je zanimiva v tem, da služi kot dokaz, da so republikanci potolažili Eisenhowera.

Kot je znano, je bil Eisenhower s potekom republikanske konvencije tako nezadovoljen, da je na sestanku z republikanski voditelji s posebnim povdankom izjavil, da je pol leta že zmeraj on predsednik in nihče drugi. Tačko po tej izjavi je zapustil konvencijo in odletel in Denver, kadar je Nixonu samo formalno gratuliral k izvolitvi za kandidata. Tukrat so vsi misili, da bo Eisenhower imel do konca leta samo par "nepolitičnih govorov," ki se bo v njih izogibal vseh spornih vprašanj.

Slučajno je isti dan javnost tudi zvedela, da sta se Truman in Kennedy pobotala. Truman je pred demokratsko konvencijo dajal Kennedyju "dobre nauke," ki jih Kennedy ni pokazal nobenega smisla, na kar jih je Truman javno ponovil, Kennedy se pa javno zanje zahvalil. To je občajajoč spor med demokratiskimi voditelji, ki ne bisi dosti pomnil, aki ne bo volitev.

To je imel pred očmi senator Johnson, ki je pred nekaj dnevi osebno ob skal Trumana z namenom, da ga pridobi za volivno kampanjo. Da se mu je načrt posrečil, priča izjava o "minrem sožtju" med Trumanom in Kennedyjem.

Tak razvoj so pričakovali vsi, ki pozajmo starega Trumana. Se zmeraj tako živi z vsakdanjo potnikom, da ne more biti pri miru. V agitaciji se počuti kot riba v vodi.

Naša armada preskuša novc letalo brez piloti

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Naša armada ima posebno vodljivo raketno Pershing, ki je namenjena samo taktičnemu vojskovjanju. Raketa leti le kakih 200 milij daleč in uničuje sovražniške formacije in njegovo orodje kar na fronti in neposredno za njo. Da bi za raketno dobili primerne cilje, so konstruirali posebno letalo, ki leti brez piloti.

Takih letal je menda že dosti preskušenih. Sedanje letalo z imenom Drone se odlikuje po tem, da je v njegovem truplu prava razstava vseh mogočih komunikacijskih instrumentov. Tako bo letalo lahko nabiralo fotografije in jih elektronsko oddajalo na svoje domače letališča, lahko bo dajalo nevidne signale, lahko bo odkrivalo zaloge atomskega orožja, še celo lastno televizijsko oddajno postajo bo nosilo seboj. Z bombnika B-52 so uspešno izstrelili raketo

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Vojno letalstvo je objavilo, da je montiralo na bombnik B-52 vodljivo raketo Hound Dog. Bombnik je po toku svojega poleta poslal proti cilju, ki je bil oddaljen kakih 500 milij.

Raketa se je približala cilju "z neverjetno točnostjo."

Vojno letalstvo je hotelo s tem dokazati, da je danes že mogoče z bombnikom poslati raketo kakih 500 milij daleč in zadeti cilj. Bombniku se na ta način ni treba podajati v zrak nad sovražnico zemljo.

Vojno letalstvo je namignilo, da poskuša montirati na bombnik B-52 tudi vodljivo raketo Atlas, ki leti kakih 7,000 milij daleč. Prvi poskusi se niso posrečili.

RB-47 je bil na poti!

Sovjeti so ga sestrelili, ker je ogledoval njihove podmornice pri preskušanju raket.

VARŠAVA, Polj. — Po vestih iz tukajšnjih krogov, ki morajo rez divoma vedeti, kaj govorijo, so sovjete podmornice 1. julija letos priskršale raket na področju Barentsovega morja, ko se je nenadno pojavilo nad njimi ameriško letalo RB-47. V prepričanju, da je letalo tam zaradi nedvranja poskusov, so Sovjeti poslali načenj svoja lovška letala, ki so ga sestrelili.

Predsednik vlade Katange je dejal, da hoče, da pride celotno vprašanje pred Združenimi narodovi. Po razgovoru z Buncem je izjavil, da je dobil vtip, da čete ZN morda sploh ne pridejo, pa dodal, da zadevno nima nobenega zagotovila od ZN. Poudaril je, da se je Katanga ločila od Konga 11. julija, med tem ko je Varnostni svet ZN razpravljal o Kongu in sklenil poslati tja čete ZN šele 14. julija. Tedaj Katanga ni bila več del Konga in sklep Varnostnega sveta pošiljal v Kongo za njeno velja.

Za danes zjutraj je predviden sestanek Buncha z vodniki plemen v Katangi. Combe je dejal, da bodo ti predstavniki ZN povedali jasno, da prebivalstvo Katange ne mara prihoda čet ZN.

Indijski Nehru gre v Pakistan na obisk

NEW DELHI, Ind. — Nehru je izjavil v parlamentu, da bo šel kmalu na obisk v Pakistan k predsedniku Ayubu Khanu, da tam podpiše sporazum o uporabi vode iz reke Indus in njenih pritokov.

Pri tej priliki bo obravnaval tudi celo vrsto drugih spornih zadev. Ne misli pa Pakistanom na nobeno skupno obrambo, kajti takega bi zahtevalo, da imata Indija in Pakistan tudi paralelno zunanjou politiko. Te pa Nehru noče.

Mnogi indijski parlamentarci ne odobravajo take politike, ker smatrajo nevarnost s kitajsko strani za veliko večjo kot Nehru.

ČETE ZDRUŽENIH NARODOV GREDO JUTRI V KATANGO

V krogih Združenih narodov napovedujejo, da pojdejo njihove čete jutri v skladu z načrtom v Katango. Ta naloga je izročena švedskim oddelkom. Z njimi pojde nemara tudi Tuniziani in Maročani. — Namestnik gl. tajnika R. Bunche je po razgovoru s predsednikom vlade Katange dejal, da je odločitev pri glavnem tajniku Hammarskjöeldu. — Kongoška vlada ukazala beliškemu poslaniku, naj zapusti deželo.

ELIZABETHVILLE, Kongo. — V vsej pokrajini vlažna bolj radovednost kot napetost, ali bodo čete Združenih narodov v resnici prišle v pokrajino ali ne, kot je bilo napovedano. Po včerajšnjih razgovorih z namestnikom gl. tajnika ZN Buncem je predsednik vlade Čcombe izrazil nekakšno o tem. Poglavjarje plemen je pozval, naj stoje odločno za vlado, ni pa več tako odločno govoril o tem, da si bodo morale čete ZN proribiti vstop v Katango. Sodijo, da je prislo do tega dogovora, ki dovoljuje prihod omejenega števila čet ZN z omejeno nalogo.

Nobene spremembe načrtov

LEOPOLDVILLE, Kongo. — V krogu ZN ne izgleda, da bi spremenili prvotne načrte o odhodu čet v Katango. Švedske čete, ki so določene, da gredo prve tja, pospravljajo svojo opremo in se pripravljajo na pot.

Njim se bodo verjetno pridružile tudi vojaške enote Tunizije in Maroka.

Predsednik vlade Katange je dejal, da hoče, da pride celotno vprašanje pred Združenimi narodovi. Po razgovoru z Buncem je izjavil, da je letalo tam zaradi nedvranja poskusov, so Sovjeti poslali načenj svoja lovška letala, ki je upravljalo v preteklosti med drugim tudi letalo, s katereim je potovala kraljica Elizabeta po Kanadi.

Zadnje vesti

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Vlada ZDA je ponovno odločno zahtevala od ZSSR, da izpusti letalca, ki ju je zajela, ko je protizakonito sestrelila letalo RB-47 1. julija. Sovjetija je napovedala, da prideta ob letalca kot vohuna pred sovjetsko vojno sodišče.

EDWARD AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. — Raketen letalo X15 je postavilo včeraj nov hitrostni rekord, ko je doseglo 2,150 milij na uro. Letalo je vodil Joe Walker.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Sen. Estes Kefauver je svojega tekmeča v demokratskih primarnih volitvah porazil v razmerju dve proti ena. To je bila v resnici borba med liberalno usmerjenimi skupinami in južnimi konservativci, ki skušajo še vedno v vsem sredstvi ohraniti segregacijo.

Oče, mati in žena gredo v Sovjetijo k Powersu

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Sovjetsko poslanstvo je izdalo vize očetu, materi in ženi letalca Francis Powersa, ki pride 17. avg. pred sovj. sodišče zaradi predlaganja na znamen U-2 letalom na ZSSR 1. maja letos.

Imenovane tri bosta na poti v Sovjetsko zvezo spremljala tudi zdravnik in odvetnik. Ne upajo, da bodo mogli s Francisom govoriti pred sodno razpravo.

RIM, It. — Novi ministrski predsednik Amintore Fanfani je predstavil svojo vlado obema domoma laškega parlamenta in prosil za zaupnico. Debata o zaupnicu bo končana ta teden in zaupnica izglasovana, ker so zato tudi tri sredinske stranke, akoravno niso zastopane v vladi.

Uspeh tega pozdrava se je pokazal po zborovanju, ko se je kongresnik Feighan zelo prijazno razgovarjal s posameznimi člani odbora in se zahvalil za udeležbo. Avco Names Mihalic As Crosley Head

Cincinnati, O. — John Mihalic of Nashville, Tenn., and a former Clevelander recently became president of the Crosley division of Avco Corp.

He succeeded F. C. Reith, who died of a gunshot wound at his home last month.

In announcing the appointment, Kendrick R. Wilson, Jr., president of Avco, said a man was needed with demonstrated ability in managing production, engineering and marketing programs.

In 1953 Mihalic was named works manager of Crosley's Richmond, Ind., plant, and later became general manager of that facility. He moved to Cincinnati as general operations manager in 1955 and in 1956 was made vice president of manufacturing for the Crosley division.

Later, Mihalic became vice president of marketing for defense products and served in that dual capacity until December, 1958.

At that time, Avco organized its Nashville facility into an operating division with Mihalic as president. He was also elected a vice president of Avco Corp.

The Crosley division produces classified ordnance for the U. S. Army, ground and airborne communications systems, Marine electronics, missile components, including arming and fusing devices.



HORSES, WATER AND GASOLINE

Everyone has heard the saying that you can lead a horse to water but you can't make him drink.

It is equally true that you can force up certain taxes to the point where the government's revenues decrease instead of increasing.

Take the gasoline tax, which now averages about 40 per cent of the retail price of the gasoline, and reaches 50 per cent in some states. A proposal now in the works would further increase the federal tax bite on the motorist.

The motorist is showing what he thinks about the high price of gasoline — which is due to the high price of taxation. He is buying more and more of the compact economy cars, both domestic and foreign. The result, according to a New York Times story, is that if the trend to smaller cars continues at the present rate, gasoline tax revenue by 1964 will be \$543 million dollars below the current estimates, with the federal government losing \$217 million dollars of this and the states the rest.

Thus, there would be greatly diminished funds to finance road improvement at the precise time when the vast multi-billion federal road-aid program is supposed to reach its peak. This obviously, would spur demand for still higher gas taxes. Then, if the higher taxes were imposed, small-car sales in all probability would show a further jump and great numbers of people would do less and less driving.

The law of diminishing return applies to taxation, and especially excise taxation, just as it does to so many other things. The lawmakers can fix the gas tax at any level. But they can't stop the public from defeating its purpose by cutting consumption.



MERGING AFRICA. The year 1960 may well be remembered by historians as the "Year of African Independence," so rapidly are new African states moving into freedom. Already this year eleven African countries have gained their independence, with nearly as many more expected to be added to the list before the year is over. The pace of change may be measured by the fact that it took nearly 3,000 years to bring about the creation of the first nine independent African states, but only 12 days to establish the next nine. This rapid emergence of Africa into freedom challenges us to form close relationships with the new nations, relationships which will make democracy meaningful and fitted to the unique features of the African situation.

In my responsibility as a member of the Subcommittee on Africa of the Foreign Affairs Committee, I am brought into contact continually with the aspirations and the needs of her peoples. Disease is common, illiteracy is widespread, and poverty is pervasive. Every kind of assistance—educational, technical, medical, economic—is urgently needed if sound economic and political development is to be achieved. As more and more African states become independent, they will look increasingly toward the United States and the United Nations in solving the prodigious problems which confront them. Just how can we be of assistance?

One of the more acute requirements in many parts of Africa is that of trained administrative and technical personnel, with civil services staffed until recently largely by European administrators and technicians. Understandably, new governments wish to staff their agencies with indigenous personnel as rapidly as possible, a task complicated by the failure to anticipate the rapidity of change on the Continent. Thus, a considerable part of the United States Technical Cooperation programs in Africa have been directed toward meeting the requirements of technical and managerial skills. In Ethiopia, for example, the program has helped es-

tablish a broad base of educational institutions and training programs so essential to that country's future development. By the end of June, approximately 780 American technicians were at work throughout the whole of Africa, a number expected to increase to about 1,000 in the coming year. These efforts are supplemented by the United Nations, which, following a line of action similar to ours, maintains upwards of 600 technical experts in Africa and provides fellowships for study abroad to well over 400 persons.

Education, of course, forms perhaps the most pressing need for these emerging nations, and we can be helpful through such ways as technical guidance, direct assistance to African educational institutions, and student exchange. In the Mutual Security Program for 1961, the Congress has included a sum of \$20 million for a Special Program for Tropical Africa. This sum is planned for use in assisting African leaders with basic educational planning and program development, teacher training, language training, vocational and agricultural training programs, and related fields. It is designed to provide assistance at critical points where basic improvement in education methods and systems is essential, and will be used to supplement the existing Technical Cooperation program. Student exchange forms an important part in our accelerated programs, and is reflected in the growing number of African students studying in American universities—1,190 in 1959. At the diplomatic level the United States has rapidly expanded its representation facilities, and currently maintains 15 central U.S.A. posts in Africa.

Certainly Africa's surge toward independence provides us with both challenge and opportunity. By virtue of our own parallel history, the United States is uniquely equipped to understand African problems and aspirations, and to lend necessary moral support. Our positive response to her needs may well determine the future course of this strategic Continent of 200 million.

There's Sense in Swimming Ability

Clevelanders who swim in unguarded places may be endangering their lives, Dr. J. Glen Smith, Commissioner of Health, and John S. Nagy, Commissioner of Recreation, warned this week.

Drowning, which next to motor vehicle fatalities is the leading cause of accidental death for people between 5 and 44 years of age, last year claimed the lives of 6,000 Americans. In 1959, 52 Greater Clevelanders drowned, 12 of them in swimming accidents.

Commissioner Nagy pointed out that the Cleveland Division of Recreation maintains 18 guarded pools where swimmers are supervised, and that the water in these pools is tested daily by the Division of Health for chlorine content and bacteriological count.

Dr. Smith recommended that water-lovers follow this "Swimmer's Code":

1. I will wait until an hour after mealtime to go swimming.
2. I will not enter the water when I am overheated.

3. I will never swim alone.

4. I will not dive into water of unknown depth or take "dares."

5. I will not try to learn to swim in deep or running water.

6. I will leave the water before I become chilled.

7. I will swim distances only when I am accompanied by a boat.

8. I will dive from a boat only when there is someone else aboard.

9. I will not tax my strength in water.

10. I will not endanger or scare other with dares or pranks.

11. I will swim only in clean water patrolled by trained lifeguards.

12. I will not go swimming if I have any doubts about my health.

13. I will learn to float.

Commissioner Nagy reminded parents of the Division of Recreation's Learn-To-Swim programs at all city pools. Registration for the program, open to children through age 16 who are four feet tall and taller, is now open. The swimming lessons, given by Red Cross certified personnel, are free.


