Johnson delno uspel: Jeklarne znižale cene

Predsednik pritisk na jeklarne, da bi omejile povišanje cen, je uspel. Jeklarne so po 7 dneh popustile.

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Boj med zvezno vlado in jeklarnami o cenah, ki se je začel pretekl te den, ko je Bethlehem Steel Corporation objavila splošno povišanje cen za nekaj nad 5%, je bil v sredo končan. Jeklarne so omejile zvišanje cen za svoje produkte na povprečno 2.5%, torej nekako na polovico manj, kot so to prvotno hotele.

Predsednik L. B. Johnson je prvotno povišanje cen označil za nedopustno in škodljivo celotnemu narodnemu gospodarstvu, prav posebno pa še sedanjemu naporu za ustavitev inflacije. Prve dni je večina jeklarskih družb delala videz, kot da bo vztrajala pri napovedanem povišanju. Ko je Bela hiša objavila naročilo obrambnemu tajništvu, nato pa še vsem drugim zveznim oddelkom in ustanovam, naj kupujejo jeklo in jeklarske izdelke pri jeklarnah, ki cen niso zvišale, se je začelo omahovanje. Najprej je preteklo sredo U.S. Steel, največja jeklarska družba v ZDA, omejila povišanje cen svojih izdelkov na povprečno 2.5%, nato so ji sledile tudi ostale.

Jeklarske družbe imajo trenutno na zalogah veliko več jekla, kot običajno, zaloge so skupno nekje 39 milijonov ton, vsaj 13 ton preko normale. Delale so za zalogo, da bi se zavarovala pred štrajkom. Na poti v ZDA je še jeklo, ki so ga prav tako v povečanem obsegu naročili potrošniki v tujini. Zaradi povečane ponudbe blaga imajo kupci možnost večje izbire in pritiska na cene. Tudi to ni ostalo brez vpliva na odločitev jeklarn za omejitev znižanja objavljenega povišanja cen.

Predsednik L. B. Johnson je dosegel lep uspeh in njegov glavni gospodarski svetovalec dr. A. M. Okun je dejal, da je korak U.S. Steel Corp. vidno zmanjšal nevarnost splošne inflacije pri cenah jekla.

Ogledniki nad Tahitijem

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Sovjetska zveza je v juniju in juliju poslala na pot okoli sveta še enkrat več vohunskih satelitov kot običajno. Od osmih je večina na krožila preko ZDA, eden pa je ubral na svoji poti tudi preko otočja Tahiti v južnem Pacifiku, kjer pripravlja Francozi preskus svoje vodikove bombe.

Nad Tahiti je poslala svoj "ogledniški satelit" tudi Amerika, četudi javno tega ne obeša na veliki zvon.

Bonn previdno čaka

BONN, Z. Nem. — Vlada Zadnjih Nemčije je odločena počakati s podpisom mednarodnega dogovora o omejitvi atomskega orožja, dokler ne vidi, kako se bodo stekle ameriške predsedniške volitve in kako pot bo ubrala nova vlada.

Če bi ta hotela Združene države razbremeniti v Evropi in se počasi od tam sploh umakniti, bo Nemčija podpis pogodbe nemara sploh odklonila, ker se bo smatrala v obrambi vezana na samo sebe.

Sueški prekop postal

Naserjev hud glavobol

Glavno škodo od njegove zapore ima poleg Egipta Sovjetska zveza, zato se zahodne sile prav nič ne žejo za njegovo odprtje.

KAIRO, ZAR. — Prihodnje leto bo minulo sto let, odkar je bil Sueški prekop doigran in odprt. Postal je za tedanj čas najvažnejša pomorska pot, zato ni minilo dolgo, da si ga je Velika Britanija, tedanja nespororna vladarica svetovnih morij, spravila pod svoj nadzor.

Prekop je sedaj že več kot eno leto zaprt in svet se je nekam navadol na to. Petrolej vozijo s področja Perzijskega zaliva z novimi, velikanskimi ladjami, ki so prevoz pocenile v taki meri, da bi lahko uspešno temovale s cenami petroleja, ki bi prihajal v Evropo skozi Sueški prekop, če bi bil ta seveda odprt. Poleg tega so začeli Izraelci graditi velik naftovod iz Elatha v Akabskem zalivu proti obali Sredozemskega morja. Sedaj se pripravljajo na gradnjo takega naftovoda tudi Egipčani. Njihov tekel od Sueza v Rdečem morju proti Aleksandriji ob Sredozemskem.

Zahodne sile so prišle do zaključka, da je zapora Sueškega prekopa bolj prizadela Sovjetsko zvezo kot nje, zato se tudi prav nič ne ženejo za njegovo odprtje. Če bi bil prekop odprt, bi ruske vojne ladje, ki imajo sedaj svoja oporišča v egipčanskih pristaniščih ob Sredozemskem morju, lahko plule skozenj v Rdeče morje in v Indijski ocean in tam ogrožale zahodne postojanke. Dokler je Sueški prekop zaprt, je pot za Ruse v Indijski ocean precej dolga.

ZDA bodo izpustile

14 ujetih mornarjev

PARIZ, Fr. — Vodnik ameriške delegacije pri tukajšnjih razgovorih s Severnim Vietnamom A. Harriman je izročil zastopniku Hanoia na 16. sestanku preteklo sredo imena 14 ujetih severnovietnamskih mornarjev, ki jih bodo ZDA skoro poslale domov. Ujeti so bili julija 1966.

TITO DANES V PRAGI

PRAGA, ČSR. — Včeraj je bilo objavljeno, da bo prišel danes, v petek, sem na uradni obisk predsednik SFRJ Josip Broz Tito. Pričakujejo, da bo Tiko, ki je ves čas odločno podpiral ČSR v njenem sporu z Moskvou, sprejet z vsemi častmi in pozornostmi. Predvidoma bo ostanil Tito tu dva dni in bo imel posebno tiskovno konferenco.

Tito je hotel priti v Prago že v začetku spora, pa je svoj obisk moral štirikrat odložiti na prošnjo praske vlade. Zadnjih preteklih dneh, ko so se vodniki ČSR govorjavali z vodniki SSSR v Černi nad Tiso.

ČSR hoče gospodarske vezi z Vzhodom omejiti

PRAGA, ČSR. — Češkoslovenska išče v zahodni Evropi 400 do 500 milijonov dolarjev posojil, da bi mogla kupiti stroje za svojo industrijo in jo tako usposobiti za temovanje s svobodnim svetom. Nalogu na takih strankah in med njenimi pristaši. Zvečer je N. M. Nixon v govoru, s katerim je sprejel imenovanje za predsedniškega kandidata, pozval vse k skupnemu naporu za zmago pri novembriških volitvah. Združena republikanska stranka lahko spremeni Ameriko v deželo, v kateri bo prostor za vse rase in kjer bodo lahko vsi razredi uspevali in imeli priložnost za napredek. Nixon je ponovno poudaril, da bo prva naloga njegove administracije doma vzpostavitev in vzdrževanje zakonitosti, miru in reda.

Klub vsemu se Čehi in Slovaki v pretesnem gospodarskem obdobju Sovjetije ne počutijo dobro, zato bi radi te vezi zaznali in povečali svoje zveze z zahodnimi državami.

NIXON ZA RED IN MIR

OTTAWA, Kan. — Strajk poštne uslužbenstva je končan, toda pošta opozarja vse, naj malo potrepe, dokler ne bo odposlan to, kar se je nabralo v tiskovništvo.

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Južnovietnamska pehota je s podporo topov in metalcev min udarila na rdeče napadalce vzhodno od Gio Linh nedaleč od Demilitarizirane cone in v štirinajstih bitki pokončala 107 napadalcev, med tem ko je imela sama le 7 mrtvih. Ob stoletnici prvega slovenskega taboru v Ljutomeru

I.

Revolucionarno leto 1848 je pomembno za Slovence zlasti zaradi tega, ker smo tedaj dobili svoj prvi narodno politični program. Člani dunajskega društva Slovenija, kateremu je bil prvi predsednik svetovno znani slavist dr. Franc Miklošič, ga je izpovedalo z naslednjimi slovenskimi narodno-političnimi zahtevami:

"Da političko razkrojeni narod Slovencov na Kranjskem, Štajerskem, Primorskem in Koroškim kakor eden narod, se tudi v eno kraljestvo z imenom Slovenija sklene, in da ima za se svoj zbor."

Da ima slovenski jezik v tem Slovenskem Kraljestvu popolnoma tiste pravice, ktere ima nemški jezik v nemških in laških deželah; da tedaj Slovenski jezik v šole in kanclje vpeljemo, kadar hočemo in kakor hočemo."

To je bil za tedanje čase važen dogodek. Slovenci so se začeli zavedati svoje narodne biti. Hoteli so si zagotoviti svoje narodno življenje in svojo bodočnost. Zato je slovenska študirajoča mladina šla s tem programom med narodno zavedno slovensko izobraženstvo, ki ga je potem ohranljalo živega med ljudstvom in z njim klubovalo vsem napadom nemštva, madžarstva ter italijanstva v bivši Avstriji pod Bachovim absolutizmom.

Leta 1859 je avstrijska vojska doživelna lud poraz v Italiji. Njeno vojsko so potolki Francozi in Piemontesi. Tedanji avstrijski oblastniki so l. 1860 hoteli nezadovoljne narode pomiriti s federalistično ureditvijo države. Namerna bila iskrena, ker so federativno ustavno spremembo že naslednje leto znova zamenjali s centralistično. Kot protest proti takim odločitvam dunajske vlade zastopniki Madžarov, Hrvatov in Italijanov niso hoteli priti v dunajski parlament. Leta 1867 so isto storili tudi Čehi.

Nezadovoljstvo nenemških narodov v Avstriji je postalo vedno večje. Avstrijskih oblastnikov ta okolnost ni doči vznemirjala. Šele vojna nevarnost z Bismarckovo Prusijo je leta 1865 prisilila tedanjega avstrijskega cesarja Franca Jožefa, da je ustavil izvajanje centralistične ustawe. Naslednje leto je pruska vojska premagala Avstrijo.

Po izgubljeni vojni v Prusiji se je Avstrija pobotala z Madžari ter je z njimi leta 1867 sklenila pogodbo o dualistični ureditvi monarhije, ki se je iz prejšnje Avstrije spremenila v Avstro-Ogrsko monarhijo. S to pogodbo so si Nemci in Madžari razdelili oblast nad nemškimi in nemadžarskimi narodi. Tako preurejena monarhija je ostala še naprej krivična oblastnica zlasti slovanskim narodom. Ti so se začeli organizirati ter na javnih shodih-mitingih, kot so jih imenovali, zahtevati svoje narodne in politične pravice.

Prvi so se oglasili Čehi s svojim velikim ljudskim taborem maja meseca l. 1868 na hribu Ržip, kakih 30 km severno od Prage.

Radikalni nastop čeških narodnih in političnih voditeljev je naletel na veliko navdušenje in odobravanje med mlado slovensko radikalno mladino, katere glasnik je bil tedaj Fran Levstik, ki je takoj pisal dr. Valentini Zarniku ter mu predlagal, naj bi tudi Slovenci začeli prirejati javne shode-tabore na prostem.

Dr. Zarnik, zelo izobražen mož ter tedaj eden redkih Slovencev, ki je obvladal angleščino ter je prebiral angleško beletristiko in politično literaturo, je v odgovoru na pismo Levstika sporocil, da se je takoj odločil, "da naj tak meeting naredimo, kar je bilo z veseljem sprejet."

To se je zgodilo 7. julija 1868 v Mariboru, kjer so se na povabilo dr. Matije Preloga zbrali štajerski rodoljubi in sklenili, da bodo prvi slovenski meeting-tabor 9. avgusta v Ljutomeru. Drugi tabor pa naj bi bil kmalu za tem nekje v Savinjski dolini. Za Ljutomer so se odločili iz dveh razlogov, ker je bil kraj v narodnem pogledu močno prebuju ter je v bližini nemške in madžarske narodne meje. Poleg tega je bila tedaj v Ljutomeru zelo delavnata tamošnja Narodna čitalnica, ki jo je vodil odvetnik dr. Jakob Ploj, njeva desna roka pri vsem narodnem delu je pa bil njegov koncipent, že omenjeni dr. Valentin Zarnik.

Narodnjaki so za prvi slovenski tabor določili slovenske narodne zahteve. Z njimi so potem nastopali na vseh ostalih slovenskih taborih. Glavna zahteva je bila Zedinjenja Slovenija. Ena od zahtev je bila tudi določitev roka, do katerega se morajo uradniki na slovenskem ozemlju naučiti slovensčine. V šole in pisarni naj se uvede slovenski jezik in tudi cerkvena oblast naj uraduje v narodnem jeziku.

Zaradi zahteve po Zedinjenju Sloveniji je cesarsko namestništvo v Gradcu prvi slovenski tabor v Ljutomeru preposedalo, toda na brzjavno zahtevalo predsednika pripravljalnega odbora dr. Ploja na notranjega ministra dr. Giskra na Dunaju, je dunajska vlada naročila cesarskemu na-

mestniku, da ga mora "brezpopogojno dovoliti".

Tako je bil 9. avgusta 1868 v Ljutomeru prvi slovenski tabor, na katerega je prišlo 7,000 ljudi. Za tedaj velika množica. Ljudje so prihajali z okrašenimi vozovi. Trg je bil ves v zastaval, prav tako zborovalni prostor. Igrali sta dve godbi. Iz Ljubljane so prišli Sokoli v uniformah, nastopali so pevski zbori, ob sprejemjanju resolucij so pokali možnarji. Zvečer pred taborom so po vsej okolici zažigali mogočne kresove.

Taboru je predsedoval dr. Razlag, začel ga je pa domači župnik Klemenčič, za njim je kmet Kukovec zahteval uvedbo slovenščine v javne urade. Dr. Zarnik je zahteval uporabo slovenščine tudi na škofiji in v bogoslovem semenišču; župnik dr. Sv. Barbare Božidar Raič, daleč na okoli znani govornik, je odločno nastopal za ustanavljanje slovenskih šol in za ustanovitev Zedinjene Slovenije. Govorila sta še dr. Prelog in dr. Vošnjak, ki je zlasti napadal dualizem ter zahteval enakopravnost za vse narode.

V smislu zahtev govornikov na taboru je množica izglasovala 6 resolucij, v spomin na tabor so pa vsi udeleženci dobili spominske svetinje z napisom "Slovenci, zedimo se."

BESEDA IZ NARODA

Nastop orkestra "Veseli Slovenci" in plesne skupine "Kres"

Prva avtomobilska cesta
v SFRJ

Nedavno smo poročali, da so se v Ljubljani odločili graditi moderno avtomobilsko cesto Šentilj-Gorica. To naj bi bila avtomobilska cesta, kot jih poznamo v naši deželi, s širokim zelenim pasom v sredini, brez križanj v isti ravni. Za to cesto bo treba še dobiti denar, Ljubljana upa, da bo dobila za ta načrt posojilo Mednarodne banke za razvoj in obnovu. Med tem so Hrvatje načrt svoje avtomobiliske ceste Zagreb-Split spravili tako daleč, da bodo v bližnji dočnosti že začeli z gradnjo. Tako bo to prva prava, "deljena" avtomobilska cesta v Jugoslaviji. Dolga bo 290 kilometrov in bo stala preko 2 milijardi novih dinarjev ali okoli 160 milijonov dollarjev.

Ta prva moderna avtomobilска cesta bo "tollway", za vožnjo po njej bo treba plačevati, kot je to na nekaterih "turnpike" cestah pri nas. Avtomobilска cesta Šentilj-Gorica bo odprta vsem brez "cestnine", če pojde vse po sreči.

Nove in obnovljene ceste

V preteklem letu je bilo zgrajenih novih ali popolnoma obnovljenih cest v dolžini 216 km, 1,337 pa je bilo moderniziranih. Tako ima sedaj Jugoslavija od 78,932 km cest moderniziranih in modernih s trdo površino 15,483. Le te so kolikor toliko primerne za vožnjo z avtomobili.

Lani so uvozili 28,120 osebnih avtomobilov

Lani se je uvoz raznih strojev, posebno avtomobilov in Jugoslovijo povečal za 40% na okoli 800 milijonov novih dinarjev. Uvoženih je bilo med drugim 28,120 osebnih avtomobilov in 6,595 tovornih. Uvozili so dalje 3,700 pletilnih strojev, 9,000 kosičnic, 984 traktorjev, 450 mlatilnic, 400 motornih škopilnic in 600 električnih žag. Vsi ti avtomobili v vsi ti stroji so bili kupljeni za privatnike in za potrebe samostojnih obrtnikov, kmetov in vseh drugih.

Slovenska mesta

V republiki Sloveniji je bilo leta 1967 51 mest. Največjih 10 od teh ima sledile število prebivalstva: Ljubljana 199,700, Maribor 111,900, Celje 33,600, Kranj 25,800, Jesenice 16,700, Trbovlje 16,600, Koper 14,700, Nova Gorica 11,600, Novo mesto 11,200, Velenje 10,000.

Ljubljana je imela pa letos v aprili po uradnih podatkih že 203,000 prebivalcev, pa je po številu prebivalstva v SFRJ zdaj še na 4. mestu, za Belgradom, Zagrebom in Skopjem.

Novo dravsko korito je iz letala vidno kot moderna avtomobiliska cesta. Ze to jesen bodo v kanal spustili vodo ter bo to nova vodna žila v Sloveniji, ki bo dala Dravskemu polju novo podobo.

Od 6 bilijonov dolarjev, za kolikor mora biti po sklepku Kongresa zmanjšan zvezni proračun za leto 1968-69, bo za 3 bilijone prikrajšana narodna obramba.

Heart Assoc. Gives High Altitude Tips

Most heart patients can travel safely by plane, and to high-altitude areas, says the Heart Association. However, it is advisable to check with the family doctor first.

A quick change from sea-level living to high altitudes may cause discomfort because of the lessened supply of oxygen in the air. Making the ascent gradually can be a help, according to the Heart Association of Northeastern Ohio.

Most heart patients can tolerate a change in climate, but if he finds himself uncomfortable at high altitudes, he should seek medical help.

Medical experts are of the opinion that most people with heart or lung disease who get along well at sea-level, can tolerate altitudes of 7,000 or 8,000 feet without serious effects.

Heart patients traveling to higher climates can help their bodies adjust to the oxygen-poor "thin" air by making the ascent gradually. If this is not possible, resting before, during and after the trip may help you avoid high altitude discomfort.

Mayor Stokes Plans Clean Up Program

Mayor Stokes announced a substantial and far-reaching Clean Up Program for the City of Cleveland, starting Aug. 1st, and continuing for six weeks. The objective will be to improve the sanitary conditions and the appearance of our residential and business districts.

Every vacant lot and vandalized property, treelawn and alleyway in the city will be cleared of debris. Inspection and enforcement officials will support the effort of the Service Department. Existing codes and ordinances are presently being studied by Director James with the view to strengthening the City's authority to control the problems created by vacant lots and abandoned vehicles.

The Service Department, under Director Ralph C. Tyler, has scheduled its equipment and collection crews so as to provide three days of service each week instead of just one.

300 young people have been hired as temporary summer help to assist regular crews in all service districts.

The cost of this project will be about \$200,000 — which amount will come from the General Fund, made possible by the recently approved increase in the City Income tax.

Neighborhood and community organizations have volunteered to distribute leaflets and information to retail and other business establishments, emphasizing the importance of their cooperation.

We ask every citizen to clear his property of debris and place it on his treelawn the day following his regular trash collection day. On the second day after regular collection streets and gutters will be swept and flushed mechanically.

It is hoped that, during these six weeks, the appearance of our city will be so improved that we shall all want to continue a special effort to keep it that way.

PRICE OF LAWLESSNESS

Tolerance of violence and property destruction may diminish when the price of our "permissive anarchy" hits home. An inkling of that price has been given by a spokesman for the insurance industry. He says, "No business... can continue to operate in a society where order, reason and confidence do not prevail. The insurance business alone cannot continue to offer security to property owners when these spasms of lawlessness which at times seem to approach insurrection become so widespread and frequent..."

No business or industry can turn a wheel without insurance. Legislation is now pending in Congress for the federal government — the taxpayers — to provide reinsurance. However much one may deplore further involvement of government in the financial and economic life of the nation, the alternatives in this instance are even more grim. Excessive riot losses could bring about a total collapse of insurance coverage in metropolitan centers. Whether the taxpayers could then be expected to assume the awesome cost of rebuilding and insuring our cities is doubtful.

Reestablishment of law and order in the land is the only permanent solution. On this depends our survival as a nation. We should not lose sight of the fact that a subsidy for anarchy in the form of taxpayer guaranteed insurance coverage for the uninsurable risk of urban warfare is a stopgap measure. It will ease for the time being the pain of the disease, but it most surely will not cure the malady that afflicts this nation.



Just this past season he completed a two-year appointment as the New York Philharmonic's senior guest conductor. Mr. Steinberg also has an impressive list of guest appearances with the leading orchestras of the United States and Europe and has appeared with The Cleveland Orchestra in 1950, 1952 and 1957.

All four of the soloists for the weekend will be making their first appearances with The Cleveland Orchestra.

Vladimir Ashkenazy is a product of the Central Music School in Moscow and the Moscow State Conservatory where he was a student of the celebrated Lev Oborin. He attracted international attention in 1956 by winning First Prize in the Queen Elizabeth Competition in Brussels and immediately embarked on a busy career of touring throughout Europe. Mr. Ashkenazy made his American debut in 1958 with great success, and he has returned regularly to this country for numerous recitals and appearances with some of the leading symphony orchestras.

Norwegian soprano Ingrid Bjoner began her operatic career at the urging of Kirsten Flagstad. She sang leading roles in the principal opera houses of Scandinavia, Germany and Austria as well as at the Gergen and Bayreuth festivals.



**THE CLASS OF 1873**

The newspaper account notes that the class valedictorian's address "illustrated the trials and difficulties encountered by women in the study and practice of medicine."

WOMEN WANTED IN MEDICINE!

Wanted: Midwife to practice obstetrics. Salary: none. Fees paid by the job, either in currency or product. No medical degree is necessary.

Unbelievable? Not 200 years ago, when delivering babies was considered a woman's province. Achieving equality in medicine has been a hard struggle for women. Less than a century ago, in fact, in 1873, the first graduating class of America's premier women's medical college had just six members, and even they were outnumbered by a

tiny minority of eight. The situation is quite different today. Women are wanted by medical schools. Women now comprise about 10 per cent of all medical students, compared with less than 5 per cent in 1940. However, in spite of this upsurge, the United States trails badly behind other countries in training women for medical careers. Many more are needed. Right now, there are 3,000 internships that are vacant because there are not enough trained men and women to fill them.

Where Women Are Wanted

Our nation will need 100,000 more doctors by 1975. Woman power must help meet this shortage. Where? Just about every area of medicine, from family practice to public health. Exciting, well-paying oppor-

tunities also abound in the fields of medical research, teaching, school health, industry, administration, foreign service and the military forces.

Specialization

Individual areas of medical practice also need women. To gynecology, obstetrics and pediatrics, for example, a woman doctor brings her own unique experience and empathy to bear on patients' problems. As one woman doctor has said, her own three children provided her "most valuable postgraduate education."

The Problem of Money

Financing is a major factor in deciding upon a medical career. To become a professional today, three to four years of liberal arts study at a recognized college or university are required, followed by four years of medical school, internship and residency. The average cost of this schooling is \$20,000.

In contrast, it cost a male about \$700 to become a doctor in 1768. Women, as we noted, weren't even eligible.

Today, for a professional woman who may also be a wife and mother — and many are — costs are compounded when provision must be made for daily care of her children. Without doubt, a career in medicine does demand a sizeable investment of both time and money.

**AMERICA'S FIRST WOMAN M.D.**

Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell, who was refused admittance by many medical schools because of her sex, did achieve her degree at Geneva College in 1849, and went on to found the first hospital staffed solely by women, the New York Infirmary. Later, she established the Infirmary's Women's Medical College, one of the first in America. A native of England, she returned there to practice, and after an illustrious career, died at the age of 89.

Ways and Means

Happily, more scholarships, loans and grants are available for deserving students than ever before in history, and women are getting an increasingly larger share. Student loan programs are available through the government, private agencies and associations.

A case in point is the 44 million-dollar program administered by the American Medical Association's Education and Research Foundation which has awarded some 35,000 loans to medical school students,

interns and residents. This program provides a reservoir of credit for student loans, which are repaid after training is completed and wage earning begins. The cooperation of public-spirited companies enables the Foundation to make more money available to more deserving students at low interest rates. Contributions to the fund pharmaceutical organizations like Pfizer Laboratories, which has contributed \$450,000 in the past six years.

Cross Section

Since 1962, Pfizer also has given \$1,000 yearly scholarship grants to each of the nation's medical colleges, totaling more than \$630,000. A sampling of students receiving financial aid through the Pfizer scholarship program reveals that 12 percent of the recipients have been women. A good number of them stood first in their class, ahead of the men. Others are also wives and mothers. In fact, one winner shared a scholarship with her husband — both were adjudged the outstanding members of their class!

Scholarship aid, of course, is one important means of easing the

tions. Among other witnesses were Edward T. Anderson, Friends Committee on National Legislation; Dr. Walter H. Judd, Committee of One Million Against the Admission of Communist China to the United Nations; Eugene A. Bartkus, Lithuanian-American Council; Charles Rosmarek, Polish American Congress, General Dale O. Smith, co-author of a book with General LeMay entitled "America Is In Danger"; Dr. Lev E. Dobriansky, National Captive Nations Committee; William H. Draper, Jr., National Chairman Population Crisis Committee, and Dr. Arthur L. Flemming, National Council of Churches and former Secretary of H.E.W. in the Eisenhower Cabinet.

The testimony of Mr. Bartkus, Mr. Rosmarek, and Dr. Dobriansky pointed up the plight of Eastern European nations in the Soviet sphere. My former colleague on the House Foreign Affairs Committee, Dr. Walter Judd, made a compelling case against admitting Red China to the U.N.

The week-long hearings gave all of us on the Platform Committee an opportunity to hear wide-ranging recommendations on domestic and foreign issues. The formal adoption of the Platform was one of the first orders of business after the Convention began. I shall report next week on the history-making events of the convention itself.

There'll be the customary Friday night fireworks display immediately following the game. The Indians and White Sox have a single 2:15 PM Saturday LADIES DAY game scheduled on August 17. All ladies will be admitted for \$1.00 less than regular seat prices. Golden Agers can take advantage of Tribe hospitality by paying only 50¢ at Gate B at all Tribe Saturday home games.

The Indians and White Sox will conclude their series with a 1:00 PM doubleheader at the Stadium on Sunday, August 18. The Boston Red Sox, 1967 American League champs, will round out the next home stand with a four-game series (all 7:30 night games) on August 19, 20, 21 and 22.

A total of 674,279 fans have seen the Indians play 52 dates at the Stadium thus far this season, which is 6,656 more people than passed thru the turnstiles for the entire 1967 campaign — which drew a total of 667,623.
