**Država Ohio se pripravlja
za pivo. Manjši prodaj-
alci so še v zadregi**

Columbus, O., 5. aprila. Državna komisija za kontrolo piva v državi Ohio je imela včeraj prvi sestanek, potem ko je governer White imenoval četrtega člana te komisije, ki ima sedaj kvorum. Komisija je zagotovila, da bodo še ta teden vse pivovarne dobile dovoljenje za poslovanje in enako tudi prodajalci na debelo, ako bodo njih prošnje odgovarjale predpisom komisije. Ne ve se pa, kako bodo naredili z onimi prositelji za licenco, ki so vložili prošnje za prodajo piva v kozarcih. Komisija pravi, da jim bo sporočeno "potom časopisa," kje naj vložijo prošnje za permit. Državna komisija namerava ustanoviti tozadevne svoje urade v vseh večjih mestih. Toda težko je verjeti, da bodo ti uradi odprti pred soboto. Torej ne bo preostajalo žejnim ljudem v Ohio drugega kot poklicati prodajalca na debelo in naročiti zaboj ali dva pive, da ga pripelje na dom. Komisija pravi, da je to postavno. Poleg tega so pa dobili danes veliko pogreško v Ackerman postavi, ki dovoljuje pivo v Ohio. Ta postava pravi, da komisija lahko prekliče permit za prodajo pive ali ga pa sploh ne dovoli. To je protipostavno, ker vsak državljan ima pravico komisijo tožiti glasom ustave. Popraviti bodo morali to napako pri prihodnjem zasedanju legislature.

Washington, 4. aprila. Poslanska zbornica kongresa je včeraj na vso naglico sprejela postavbo glede priobčevanja diplomatskih in vladnih uradnih dokumentov in brzojavk, toda ko so zastopniki časopisja protestirali, so demokratični voditelji nemudoma povzročili, da je bila postava oblačena tako, da časopisje ni nič prizadeto. Ti tajni dogovori bi bili skoro priobčeni v javnosti, da ni državni oddelek posredoval.

**Kongres bo te dni sprejel
postavbo, ki določa samo
petdnevno delo**

Washington, 5. aprila. Program predsednika Roosevelta je danes običal v debatah v obeh zbornicah kongresa. Z delom se je zaostalo. V senatu debatirajo o predlogu za petdnevno delo, dočim poslanska zbornica nikakor neče odobriti načrt Roosevelta, da se dovoli \$500,000,000 v pomoč brezposelnim v posameznih državah. Demokratiški voditelji v kongresu so mnenja, da je določitev za 30 urno delo na teden preveč drastična. Pravili bodo Rooseveltov predlog tako, da bo dovoljeno delo 35 ali 36 ur na teden. Pričakuje se, da bo senat tozadevno glasoval že jutri. Poleg tega bo senat tudi sprejel posebno določbo, ki pravi, da se omejitev dela na 35 ur na teden nikakor ne tiče podjetij, ki tiskajo časopise, ker v takih podjetjih je nemogoče delovati v omenjenih urah. Medtem je pa Roosevelt dal razumeti kongresu, naj se požuri z delom, ker ima še druge važne predloge.

**Guardian banka je dobila
včeraj vladno posojilo**

Washington, 5. aprila. Vladna R. F. korporacija je včeraj sklenila, da vložijo v Guardian banko v Clevelandu \$9,000,000. Enako svoto dobi tudi Union trust banka. Obe banki sta do- slej omejeno poslovali. Pozneje, ko načrti dozori, se bosta obe banki združili v eno samo, ki bo poznana kot First National Bank of Cleveland. Uradniki in usluž- benci Guardian banke bodo nameš- čeni v First National banki, toda sleherni uradnik mora biti odobren od vlade, in noben urad- nik, ki je odgovoren za kak pre- stop tekem starega poslovanja, ne bo mogel biti zaposlen v novi banki. Vlada je mnenja, da je najbolje za Cleveland, ako ima namesto dveh bank eno samo, v katero imajo ljudje zaupa- nje. Ko bo nova banka reorgani- zirana, bo vlada dala v novo podjetje nadaljnjih \$9,000,000, tako da bo nova banka takoj lahko plačala 20 odstotkov vlog, ostalo se bo pa sčasoma likvidi- ralo.

Telefonske pristojbine

Direktor postav v Clevelandu, W. L. Kerr, je sklical k posveto- vanju deset direktorjev postav iz večjih mest v državi Ohio na skupno posvetovanje v Cleve- landu. Naredili se bodo načrti, da se začne z bojem za znižanje telefonskih pristojbin, ki so ravo- vno tako visoke, kot so bile pred štirimi leti, ko so delavci dobiva- li visoke plače in je bil material drag.

Indijski princ

Princ Winboro Baryakalama- liyou iz Indije je vložil na cleve- landski sodnji tožbo za \$50,000, ker ga je Fairmount Boulevard grozečja dala zapreti radi do- zredne sleparije. Princ je name- ščen kot sluga pri neki bogati družini. Moral je biti devet dni v zaporu, ker ni mogel postaviti varščine, in to je princ povzro- čilo take "duševne muke," da je vredno zanj \$50,000.

Plačilo davkov

Danes nameravajo davčne ob- lasti zapreti davčne knjige. Kdor plača pozneje, bo podvržen kaz- ni in obrestim. Nabralo se je komaj \$20,000,000 namesto \$34- 000,000.

**Von Papen, nemški pod-
kanceler, obišče diktatorja
Mussolinija v kratkem**

Berlin, 5. aprila. Podkanceler nemške republike von Papen ob- išče koncem tega tedna laškega diktatorja Mussolinija v Rimu da razpravlja z njim načrte raz- orožitve in načrte glede zveze štirih veseli v Evropi. Uradno potrjen ta obisk še ni. Ko se je mudil angleški ministerski pred- sednik MacDonald v Rimu, se je govorilo, da pride tja tudi nem- ški kanceler Hitler. Četverozve- za naj bi se ustvarila. Toda na- črt je zavrgla Francija, ki je iz- javila, da se morajo čuvati pravice Poljske in Male antante. Nadalje se javlja iz Berlina, da fašisti ne bodo nadaljevali z boj- kotom proti židovskim trgovin- am, razven ako nemški židje zopet začnejo s propagando proti fašistom v tujih državah.

Nesrečni Akron

Baje je pokvar- il zrakoplov v notranjosti, 22. februarja, 1932, ko je dospel v Akron poseben odsek kongres- manov, ki naj bodo priča poskus- nega poleta, se je Akron v pričo kongresmanov zajetel tako, da je zgubil eno krilo in sta bila dva zrakoplova ranjena. Tri mesece pozneje je Akron dospel v Californijo, ko se je spustil na tla, sta bila dva delavca ubita. In dočim so lajki trdili, da or- jak ni popolen, so mornariške oblasti neprestano trdile, da je perfekten.

Župan je iz- javil, da je glasom 18. amende- menta Zed. držav ustave vsaka opojna pijača prepovedana, in ker je 3.2 odstotno pivo opojno, je torej nepostavno prodajati ga. Toda mestna zbornica bo sklica- la tozadevno izredno sejo še pred 7. aprilom in odobrila 3.2 od- stotno pivo še enkrat z dvetretin- sko večino, nakar županova pre- poved pride ob veljavo.

Zrakoplovna industrija v tem mestu je dajala stotinam delav- cem zaslužek. Dočim je vlada upeljala trojno preiskavo, da do- žene vzroke, zakaj se je Akron ponesrečil, pa molčijo uradniki Goodyear-Zeppelin kompanije o dogodku. Medtem se pa moštvo novega zračnega orjaka "Ma- cona" pripravlja, da dovrši zad- nja dela na novem zrakoplovu. V pondeljek bodo pripravljeni za prvi polet kot za preskušnjo. London, 5. aprila. Vse tuje- zemske vlade so izjavile svoje globoko obžalovanje ameriški vladi radi katastrofe zračnega orjaka "Akrona" in zlasti radi zgube tako velikega števila iz- vistnih zrakoplovcev. V Lon- donu se je v poslopju ameriške- ga poslanstva zglasilo nenavad- no veliko število Angležev, ki so izjavili svoje sožalje. Prvi lord angleške admiralitete je izjavil svoje iskreno sožalje. Anglija se spominja lastne enake nesre- če, ko je zgubila svojega zračne- ga orjaka R-101. Iz Berlina je poslal predsednik nemške repu- blike, Hindenburg, predsedniku Rooseveltu iskreno sožalje. Ro- munska vlada je brzojavila Roo- seveltu enako. Zlasti pa je vz- budila pozornost brzojavka v. Eckenerja, nemškega voditelja Zeppelinov okoli sveta, in ki je svoječasno pripeljal iz Nemčije zrakoplov "Los Angeles" in ga oddal ameriškim oblastem. Dr. Eckener je brzojavil: "Neizmerno me žalosti vaša zguba. No- vica o "Akronu" me je globoko sožalje ameriškemu narodu. Novica me je toliko bolj potrla, ker je pri tem zgubilo življenje toliko mojih najdražjih prijate- ljev."

Neprestano nadziranje vseh pro- storov, kjer se postavnam potom prodaja dobro pivo, bo prepre- čilo raketirjem, da bi nadlego- vali enake prostore. Vsi pro- stori bodo morali biti taki, kot predpisuje postava, poleg tega pa čisti. Računalo se bo enče- trtinko centa davka za vsako prodano steklenico pive in 60 centov za vsak sod pive. Licen- ca za prodajo pive v Clevelandu bo samo \$10.00 na leto, poleg dr- žavne licence \$100.00 na leto. Računa se, da bo mesto dovolilo približno 2000 osebam licenco za pivo. To bo prineslo mestu \$20- 000 na leto. Nadalje se računa, da bo 10,000,000 steklenic pive prodane tekem leta, kar bo zne- slo nadaljnjih \$25,000 davka, in 500,000 sodov pive bi prineslo mestu nekako \$300,000 nadalj- nega davka. S tem bi bilo ob- ubožani mestni blaginji precej pomagano.

Oblasti so mnenja, da pet mesecev izrednega časa je dovolj, da se plačajo davki. Vsega skupaj je do danes na- branega \$19,954,000, dočim zna- ša skupna svota davkov \$32,000- 000. Pričakujejo pa, da bi se nabralo vsaj \$24,000,000, ker si- cer ne more niti mestna niti okrajna vlada nadaljevati s posli.
