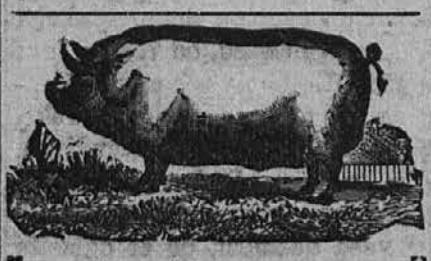

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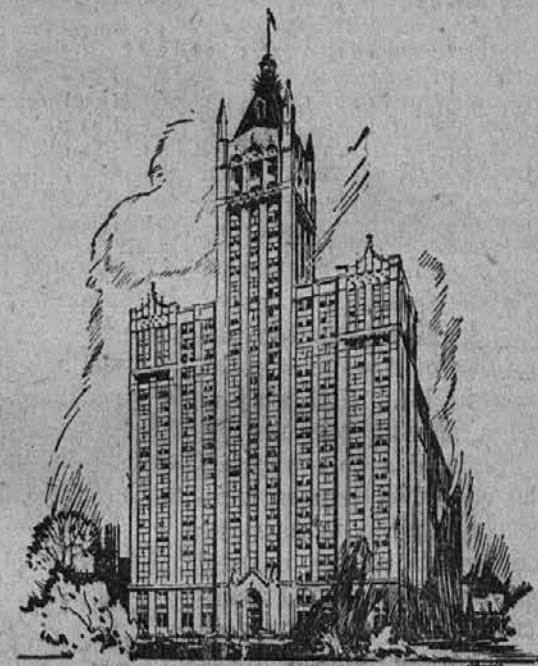

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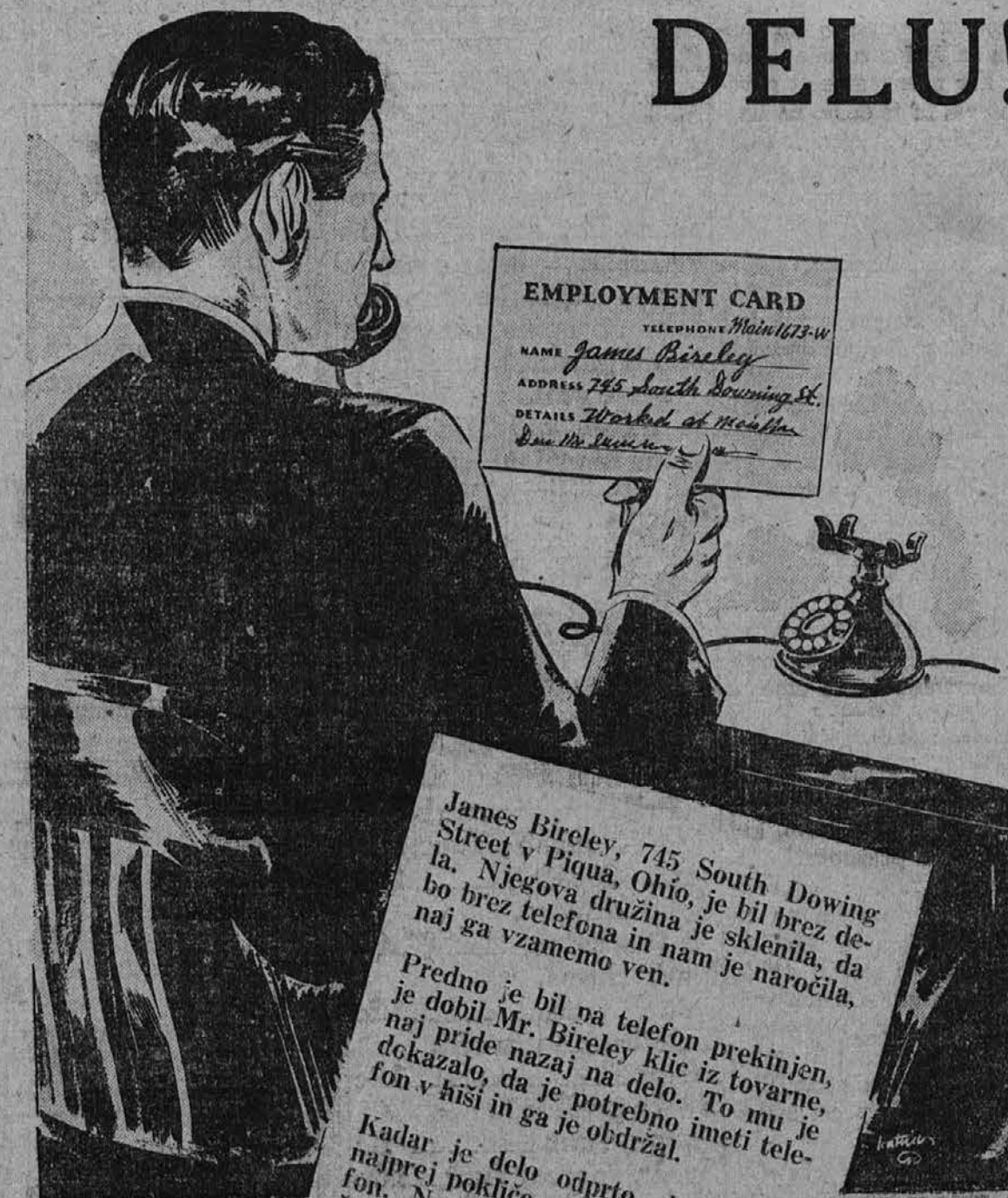

MASKS EDGE OUT SOKOLS IN THRILLER

Pioneers and Sokols Stage Big Upsets in Interlodge Tilts

SPARTANS GAIN WITH TWIN WIN OVER CHOPPRS

Pioneers Go on Rampage in Winning Pair From Betsy Ross; Hit 2984

SOKOLS HALT KAY JAYS

Defending Champions Outthit Spartans, But Fail to Stop League Leaders

Three exceptionally good matches were on tap at the Eddy Rd. slides last Sunday when the Interlodge A keggers congregated for their weekly tussle. Two of the matches furnished big upsets, with the Pioneers running wild to take a pair from the Betsy Ross Flagmakers, while the Sokols did likewise to the K. S. K. J. quintet. In the other good match the Spartans added to their league lead by copping a pair from the Tree Choppers.

Although they outthit the Spartans 2907 to 2890, the Washingtons could win but one game, the last. The Spartans were taking no chances as they copped the first tilt, 1022 to 1001, and the second on an 18-pin markin. They lost the last game, 976 to 930. Incidentally, it was "Ox" Kromar who stole the applause of the spectators with his high 623. The stars for the winners were Peterlin and Milavec, with 616 and 606, respectively. Wysopal missed the 600 mark by one pin and Krainz hit 589 for other good totals.

In one of the best battles of the current seasons, the Pioneers took two games from the Betsy Ross in a surprise result. In copping the verdict the winners staged a rampage and garnered 2984 pins to take second place in the team three-game standings. They opened with 944 and followed with 1039 and 1001 for their high total, while their foes were clicking off 904, 938 and 1015 for a neat 2857 mark.

Jimmy Meehan led the onslaught with his high 660. Meehan bagged a 208 game to win the weekly suit cleaning prize. His other games were 190 and 202. Christy tallied 641 to bear the brunt of the Flagmakers' cause.

The Rossmen were handicapped by a blind, losing the services of Johnny Skufca, one of the loop's outstanding performers. With him in the lineup the Gonfalon Producers would have made things much tougher for the Pioneers and the result might have been somewhat different.

When the Sokols rolled only 787 in their first game against the Kay Jays, it looked as if they were off form and in for a severe drubbing at the hands of the holders of the third place. But they came back strong to win the next two games and the series with fine 900 scores.

Joe Kogoy continued his high kegling when he chalked up a big 630 on single game counts of 188, 226 and 216. Stan Kromar did best for the victims with 562.

The Collinwood Boosters made short order of the Clairwoods, capturing all three games. The S. D. Z. were suffering severely from a bad case of lack of men and were forced to roll with two blinds. Laurich's 573 and Julius Bokar's 569 were the outstanding totals of the fracas.

The S. Y. M. C.-Comrade tilt was postponed.
