Francija je edina dežela na svetu, ki še ni občutila depresije

Japonci bodo najbrž prilistili si Mandžurijo. Razlaga generala Honjo

Washington, 21. januarja. Francija je edina država na svetu, ki zadnja leta ni občutila gospodarske krize, kot jo čutijo ostale države sveta. Toda po novem letu se je položaj tudi v Franciji spremenil. Industrije poslujejo 20 procentov pod normalo, prvič po dolgih letih. Število brezposelnih narašča, kar posebno čuti narodna blagajna. Francija je začela čutiti posledice visoke colnine, ker ne more eksportirati svojega blaga. Zato je te dni odredila visoko colnino na izdelke drugih držav. Zlasti so prizadete ameriške radio družbe. Računa se, da je v Franciji danes že 500,000 brezposelnih. Gospodarska poročila iz Italije so redka in nezanesljiva. Brezposelnih je danes nekaj nad en milijon. Položaj v Nemčiji je neizprenjen. Za spoznanje je mogoče boljši, ker ne padajo več vrednosti. Jako slab je položaj tudi na Češkem, kjer so ljudji doseg uživali še precejšno prosperitet. Visoki tarifi drugih držav so pa preprečili, da Češka ne more izvajati svojih produktov.

**Velika kompanija znižala plače delavcem**

Chicago, 21. januarja. Velika kompanija Sears, Roebuck & Co., ki ima 30,000 uslužbencev, je začela zniževati plače svojim uslužbenecem. Plače bodo znižane o 5 do 10 procentov in gre znižanje v poštěv 30. januarja. Kompanija trdi, da prodaja letos blago za 30 procentov ceneje kot druga leta.

Sovjetska mašinerija je padla 45 odstotkov pod normalo v pridelkih

Moskva, 21. januarja. Uradni boljševiški časopis "Pravda" potrjuje danes poročila, ki so že nekaj časa krožila okoli, da se nahaja v sovjetskih tovarnah pomanjkanje rude in kovine ter druga materiala, ker slednji material ni bil izgotovljen v tovarnah, kjer je bil naročen. Razdtega se v mnogih sovjetskih tovarnah le počasi dela, in nekatero tovarne so pa popolnoma prenehale z delom. "Pravda," uradno glasilo sovjetske vlade, slika žalostno sliko industrijskega gibanja v Rusiji, zlasti pa kar se tiče najnovješje boljševiške industrije — izdelovanju poljedelskih strojev. Kot se poroča so tovarne v letu 1931 nazadovale za 45 procentov normalne produkcije. Vladna tovarna v Rostovu, kjer se izdelujejo poljedelski stroje, se je do 16. januarja, že zadolžila za 10,000,000 rublev, ali \$5,000,000. Na prostem, v snegu in mokroti leži dobrega materiala v vrednosti 3,000,000 rublev, kar bo v kratkem uničeno od vremenskih neprilik. Toso plugi, poljedelski stroji in traktorji. Celo v slučajih, kjer je blago zgotovljeno, pa se ne more poslati naprej, ker ali pričakjuje zabojev ali pa ni na razpolago dovolj železniških voz. Manjka pa tudi premoga rudnin in prevoznih sredstev. In to se godi v Rostovu, katero tovarne vladu najbolj podpira. Kako morebiti še drugje!


