Predsednik De Gaulle išče izhod iz zagale

Vojna v Alžiriji je povzročila razkol v francoski javnosti; levica je za popuščanje upornikom, desnica za celočno nadaljevanje vojne, De Gaulle hoče po srednji poti.

PARIZ, Fr. — Levica kot desnica zmeraj bolj pogumno napadata De Gaulle in njegovo alžirsko poltiko. General ima trdo kožo in se za napade ni do sedaj gosti zmenil. Sedaj je začel misliti nanje, pa tudi na način, kakško bi se napadom ubranil.

Odperta so tri pota; lahko razpusti parlament in razpiše nove volitve, lahko razpiše referendum, lahko pa uveljavlja tudi diktatorske pravice, ki mu jih daje ustava.

General se menda nagiba na misli, da bi se poslužil pravice, da razpiše referendum. V francoski ustavi ni namreč jasno pogovarjeno, ali se Alžirija lahko odcepí od Francije brez sprememb sedanja ustave. De Gaulle bi rad spremenil besedilo ustave potom referendumu. Prepričan je, da bi na glasovanju dobil veliko večino glasov za svoj predlog.

Glasovanje bi povedalo levici in desnicu, da nosenja od obeh nima na svoji strani večine francoskega naroda. General meni, da se bo lahko kmalu odcepil, po kateri poti bo nadaljeval svojo alžirsko politiko.

Laške volitve bodo malo vplivale na politično življenje v Italiji

RIM, It. — Politični opazovalci misijo da laške občinske in pokrajinske volitve ne bodo dobiti vplivale na razmerje politične sile med desnicu, sredino in levico.

Desničarji se niso pri volitvah predobro odrezali. Sredina je osala kot je bila: krčanska demokracija je dobila nekaj nad 40% glasov, njeni zaveznički pa čak 10%. Lahko torej vlada še naprej.

Na levi strani je nekaj sprememb, ki lahko zelo vpliva na laško politiko. Tam so namreč komunisti dobili 1,700 več glasov kot pri zadnjih volitvah, njihovi zaveznički, to je Nenjivi levni socialisti pa en odstotek manj. Nenjini je torej padel v celi komunista Togliatti kot zaveznički. To bi lahko nagnalo Nenjini na novo smer v domači politiki, kar bi se takoj poznalo v rimskem parlamentu.

Poskus se ni posrečil

Združene države so skušale poslati v vesolje glavo rakete, s katero naj bi prvi človek potoval v vesolje.

WASHINGTON, D. C. — V tretki, na dan volitev, so Združene države skušale poslati glavo rakete, v kateri naj bi v okviru načrta Mercury potoval v vesolje prvi Amerikanec, daleč izven zemeljskega ozračja. Raketa "Mali Joe" in glava se nista ločili, kot je bilo predvideno in obe padli v morje kakih 13 milijard Wallops Island, Va., od koder je bila raketa izstreljena.

To naj bi bil zadnji preskus vesoljskega vozila, ki naj bi dokazal, da je potovanje človeka v tem popolnoma varno.

Potapljalci in strokovnjaki NASA so odločenji dobiti ostanke rakete in vesoljskega vozila z morja, da ugotove vzrok nezpeha presusa.

Sovjetsko olje bo skušalo osvojiti del trga

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Svetovni trg je trenutno z oljem več kot dovolj založen. Za bližaj bočnost se mu obeta še ponudba iz Sovjetije. Ta je skušala svoje olje že nekajkrat praviti na svetovni trg, pa ni mela kaj prida uspeha, ker je bila njegova kvaliteta slaba. Olje z novih ležišč na Uralku je veliko boljše kakovosti in Sovjeti ga mislijo vreči na svetovni trg v borbo z ameriško-angleško zavzvodnijo.

Predstavniki Sovjetske zveze so že navezali stike z italijanskimi in japonskimi bordanarskimi družbami za najem petrolejskih jedaj, ki naj bi vozile sovjetski petrolej.

Debata o Kongu v ZN preložena na kasneje

Glavna skupščina ZN je sklenila odložiti debato o Kongu, dokler tle bo azijsko-afriski posredovalni odbor poročal o položaju.

NEW YORK, N. J. — Glavna skupščina bi moral razpravljati o položaju v Kongu pretelki ponедeljek. Razprava je bila odložena, da bi se je mogel udeležiti predst. Konga Kasavubu, ki je bil na poti s tem. Glavno vprašanje je bilo o tem, kdo naj v ZN Kongu zastopa.

Se od zadnje razprave na izrednem zasedanju sta tu dve delegaciji Konga, Lumumbova in Kasavubujeva. Sovjetski blok skuša s podporo Gane, Gvineje in nekaterih drugih afriških in azijskih držav pripomoči do priznanja Lumumbovim zastopnikom.

Ko so bili izgledi za to slabbi, je Gana predložila, naj bo prava, ki se je začela v torku, odložena na čas, ko bo posredni 15-članski odbor azijskih in afriških držav, ki pojde v bližnji bočnosti v Kongu posredovat med domačimi vodniki, poročal o svojih uspehih. Glavna skupščina je predlog sprejela z 48 proti 30 glasovom. Združene države so glasovale proti predlogu.

Ko se je tekom debate oglašil k besedi belgijski zun. minister Wigny, so ga zastopniki sovjetskega bloka in Gane prekinili z rešenjem po mizah po zgledu Nikite Hruščeva.

Za štrajki komunisti?

Oblasti trdijo, da so štrajki v Argentini, Braziliji in Čilu organizirali komunisti po narečilu Sovjetije.

RIO DE JANEIRO, Braz. — Stavka prometnega uslužbenstva je zadela dejelo tako težko, da je vrla resno razmišljala o oklicu obsegnega stanja. Vojašči so bili postlano na pomoč policiji za vzdrževanje reda. Predsednik je ukazal, naj vojašči pomaga vzdrževati železniški in vojni promet.

Argentinski poslaništvo je obvestilo brazilsko vlado, da sta splošni stavki, ki sta včasih oklicani v Argentini in v Čile, voden iz sovjetskega poslaništva v Uruguayju.

Argentinski gospodarski minister Alsogaray je preko radia zatrjeval javnosti, da je splošna stavka komunistični manever, ki naj pomaga pripraviti dejelo na uvedbo vlade po vzoru Castrove in tako pripraviti pot komunizmu.

Kot v Argentini so imeli splošno ednevno stavko tudi v Čile. Po končani stavki so delavske unije izjavile, da "dajo vidi 8 dni časa, da reši vprašanja delavskega razreda."



VOJAŠKI UPOR V JUŽNEM VIETNAMU VRGEL DIEMA

V Južnem Vietnamu, kjer je od sklenitve premirja v Ženevi, ko je postala dežela neodvisna, vladal Ngo Dinh Diem, je prišlo danes zgodaj zjutraj do vojaškega upora, katrega vodniki trdijo, da so vrgli vlado in da bodo postavili na oblast novo prav tako protikomunistično. — Juž. Vietnam je prejel od ustanovitve sem stotine milijonov ameriške gospodarske in vojaške pomoči.

SAIGON, Juž. Vietnam. — Pet udarnih bataljonov armade je začelo danes zjutraj ob treh upor proti vladi predsednika Ngo Dinh Diema. Vodniki upora trdijo, da so vrgli vlado, toda predsednikova palaca se je ob sedmih zjutraj še vedno držala, čeprav obkoljena z vojaškimi oddelki in težkim orozjem. V borbah je padlo najmanj 15 padalcev. Predsednikova straža se odločno brani. Uporniki so preko radija, ki so se ga polastili objavili, da jim je uspelo vladu vreči. Kakšna je usoda predsednika ob tej uri še ni znana.



Upor se je začel v prestolnici ob pol štirih zjutraj pod vodstvom varnostnih oddelkov polk. Nguyen Van Thya. Gen. Le Van Thy, vrhovni poveljnik oboroženih sil, je padel v roke upornikov in je zaprt.

Zakaj je prav za prav prišlo do upora, ki je zelo sličen onemu v Laosu, iz prvih poročil še ni jasno. Predsednik Diem nibil v deželi posebno priljubljen zaradi agrarne reforme in dajanja prednosti v delitvi visokih služb sorodnikom. Vlada je bila trdno naslonjena na Zahod in je uživala veliko vojaško in gospodarsko pomoč Združenih držav. Imela je velike težave s komunistično gverilo, ki je poslovno od leta 1960 spomladi postala znova izredno napadala.

Uporniki trdijo, da bodo vzpostavili vladu, ki bo odločno protikomunistična in bo znala napraviti red v državni upravi in ukrotila komunistične upornike.

Južni Vietnam je postal samostojna država v smislu v Ženevi sklenjenega miru v Francoski Indokini. Dotedanja francoska kolonija je razpadla v komunistični Sev. Vietnam s prestolnico Hanoj, v Južni Vietnam s prestolnico Saigon, v Kambodžo s prestolnico Phnom Penh in v Laos v glavnem mestu Vientiane. Južni Vietnam je dobil v Diemu odločno zahodno usmerjeno vlado, ki se je trdno naslonila na Združene države. Podobno vlado je imel tudi Laos, toda vojaški udar jo je 9. avgusta letos vrgel in postavil na novo mesto neutralno, ki je pred nekaj dnevi sprejela sovjetsko gospodarsko pomoč.

Kambodža hodi neutralno pot že od vsega začetka.

Največjo politično korist od republikanske zmage ima severna predsednik ohajsko republikanske stranke Bliss. Njegov ugodil je čez noč narastel v vseh republikanskih vrstah po vsej državi. Njegovi prijatelji trdijo, da je bil on eden izmed tistih redkih republikanskih voditeljev, ki je znal pravčno ubrati pravo pot do vladne zmage.

Naša država bo torej vsaj za par let grenek spomin za demokrate in svetla točka za republikance.

Census Bureau to Collect Employment Info

Information to be used in compiling national figures on employment and unemployment will be collected locally during the week of November 14 in the Current Population Survey, it was announced by Director John E. Tharaldson of the U. S. Census Bureau's regional field office in Detroit.

The information collected from local families will be combined with that collected in 329 other areas of the country to provide the national estimates. Approximately 35,000 households are included each month in the Current Population Survey. These households are selected at random under the Census Bureau's scientific sampling program to provide a representative cross-section of all classes of the population, and all types of areas in the country — large cities, small towns, rural areas, and so forth.

Facts on employment and unemployment collected locally are forwarded to Census Bureau headquarters in Washington to be processed by the Bureau's electronic computer, known as Univac, to provide the national estimates. The national report covering the information collected during the week of November 14 will be issued in Washington early in December.

Current Population Survey information will be collected from a number of local families by properly identified interviewers.


TV and the Printed Word

Competition for shares of the advertising dollar gets tougher all the time. Television has seen to that.

Television people have, on occasion, attempted to sell the idea that their media is a far more effective way of interesting the potential consumer than any other—including newspapers. So a survey made in Richmond, Virginia, is of unusual interest.

Editor & Publisher reports: "An independent research organization found that of more than 41,000 telephone calls only about one-fifth of them had the TV set turned on. Of that number 81% were able to identify the program turned on but 71% could not name any sponsor or product or type of product being advertised on that program. And even if the respondent said 'soap' instead of giving a brand name it was counted as sponsor identification, which seems to us like leaning over backward to be fair."

Reporting from Washington

U. S. STRENGTHENS AFRICA PROGRAM. With the admission of sixteen new African states to the United Nations during the current General Assembly session, the United States has moved to strengthen our program in that continent. We now maintain 20 American embassies, ten consulates general, eight consulates, three branch offices and one consular agency in Africa. This number is expected to be increased shortly when Embassies are opened in the remaining six newly independent nations of the former French community. A State Department team headed by Deputy Under Secretary of State Loy Henderson is currently visiting the capitals of these countries in order to expedite the opening of the new posts. Today there are upwards of 500 State Department personnel serving in the whole of Africa, as compared to only 175 in 1950. Especially significant is the fact that of this total 108 are classified by the Foreign Service as having African specialization, either by virtue of previous service on the continent or training in its problems.

Other U. S. agencies with operations in Africa are similarly expanding their activities. The United States Information Service (U. S. I. S.) maintains 31 offices on the continent, with 12 more information centers planned in the near future. Technical assistance programs are being carried on in 14 African countries, and the International Cooperation Administration has dispatched survey teams to 10 additional countries. By the end of this year, there should be 780 United States technicians operating in the whole of Africa, with the number increased to approximately 1,000 during the next fiscal year. In the important area of student exchange, our program has grown daily. During the present year our Government is pledged to bring 273 Africans here for study and training, and to send 653 Americans to Africa. By such exchanges we may hope that existing bonds of friendship will be strengthened and new ones created, which will be of lasting benefit to future generations.

FELLOWSHIP IN GEOGRAPHY AT COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY
The Society of Woman Geographers

graphers, a national organization of professional women active in geography and allied fields, believes that a greater knowledge of geography is of vital importance in America today and that the developing interdependence of all parts of the world gives to the geographer a special role. Trained geographers are needed in teaching, in government service, in research, and in business. In order to encourage the young women of this country to train in this important field, the Society is offering a Fellowship of \$3,000 to a young woman to go to graduate work in geography at Columbia University for the academic year 1961-62.

To qualify for the Fellowship, students must in the first instance be eligible and acceptable for admission to Columbia University under the Graduate Faculties and have a B. A. degree or its equivalent. A good background in the social sciences and in general geology or geography is desirable, but candidates who have given evidence of superior ability in other fields are also eligible. Application for the award must be made on the Columbia University fellowship application form with an indication that it refers specifically to the Society of Woman Geographers Fellowship in Geography. Qualified applicants will also be considered for the award of other fellowships, scholarships, and grants-in-aid offered by Columbia University. Applications must be received on or before February 1, 1961.



Ringling Star Gambles Life on His Heels

Gerard Soules is a handsome young man who daily gambles his life on a pair of educated heels.

Working 40 feet above the center ring of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus, at Cleveland Arena (Nov. 16-20) unprotected by a net or other safety devices, Gerard turns audiences pale with his smiling disregard of death.

Spectators gasp as this 22-year-old daredevil swings through the air and drops to a mere heel catch on his slender bar high above the arena floor. Angle and toe catches are also part of the routine that never fails to thrill onlookers. They are tricks that startle even old hands with The Greatest Show on Earth.

Perhaps his most nerve-wracking trick comes when, swinging at the top of his arc, he launches himself forward into space and catches the trapeze bar only by his heels.

Gerard is a native of Detroit, Mich., and as such is a rarity among circus folk, most of whom come from European circuses. He decided when he was seven that he wanted to be a circus star. So his father set up a trapeze in the family backyard and Gerard began practicing. Eight years ago he felt he was ready to appear professionally, and since that time he has appeared with several circuses in this country. Now he has at last reached stardom in the greatest of all circuses.

Gerard's trapeze number is a highlight of many similar acts high up in the air in the best Ringling tradition. Some of these have been imported from Europe for the first time by circus President John Ringling North. Others are old favorites of the American public.

Red Cross Warns About Fires

The home fire season has arrived — and it will get worse unless home owners and tenants exercise greater care than in the month of October.

This warning was issued by F. J. Blake, volunteer chairman of Disaster Service of the Greater Cleveland Red Cross. Blake, who heads up a corps of 600 trained disaster workers, cited October statistics on fires as a harbinger of worse things to come. Red Cross last month provided material aid to 108 persons involved in 12 different home conflagrations — with the heavy disaster season, winter, still ahead. In all, the local Red Cross Chapter will respond to some 200 disaster calls during 1960.

Greatest cause of fires in the Cleveland area, according to Bill Shay, Director of Disaster Service, are 1) careless smoking, 2) children playing with matches and 3), defective heating apparatuses.

Figures released by the Cleveland Fire Department note that there were 3,800 fire calls in 1959, or about 10 per day. Red Cross' role is to provide food, clothing and shelter — at no charge — on an emergency basis. This is one of the basic services in all 3,900 Red Cross Chapters, by congressional mandate.

Disaster Service volunteers reside in every Greater Cleveland community and are alerted by radio or telephone to emergencies in their areas. Swift-moving teams known as Disaster Units are ready to respond at a moment's notice in 9 major suburban areas. They include volunteer specialists in first aid, survey, housing, canteen and caseworkers — all trained to assist in local fires or national emergencies.



OHIO IN THE CIVIL WAR

Major-General W. B. Hazen

It is a long way from Huron, Ohio to Chattanooga, Tenn., but the Civil War brought these two communities close together.

Major General William B. Hazen lived at Huron before he entered West Point, to graduate in the class of 1855. After serving in the Army in the West, he was assistant professor of infantry tactics at West Point at the start of the Civil War in 1861.

As Colonel of the 41st Ohio Volunteer Infantry, made up largely of Cleveland men, Hazen was with Ohio General Buell at Louisville, Shiloh, Corinth, Perryville and Stone River.

On Oct. 26, 1863, at Chattanooga with 1300 picked men in 52 boats, Gen. Hazen floated past Lookout Mountain along seven miles of Confederate picket lines on a night expedition to capture Brown's Ferry.

and the short railroad to open a supply line for the Union forces.

The Richmond, Va., Press said at the time: "By the admirably executed coup on the morning of Oct. 27 at Brown's Ferry, the Confederacy loses the fruits of the Battle of Chickamauga. The occupation of Chattanooga by the Federal army is no longer problematical."

General Hazen's brigade was among the first to reach the crest of Mission Ridge in the Battle of Chattanooga and this brigade was prominent in Ohio General Sherman's Atlanta Campaign.

About Gen. Hazen, historian Whitelaw Reid said: "The measure of his greatness was filled when he rode down Pennsylvania Avenue (in Washington, D. C., May 24, 1865) at the head of the 15th Corps on the day of the Great Review."
