## Kanadčan vodi obrambo Madrida

General Emilio Kleber, katerega prihod v najkritičnejšem času v Madrid je obrnil bojno srečo, je postaloveljnik najvažnejše madridske fronte.

Fašisti, nervozni, ker ne morejo nikamor naprej, pravljajo novo ofenzivo.

MADRID, 28. nov. — General

Emilio Kleber, naturaliziran Kanadčan nemško-francoskega porekla, katerega imenujejo "misterioznega moža madridske bitke", je včeraj imenovan za vrhovnega poveljnika severne madridske fronte, kateri se smatra za najvažnejšo in na kateri se bo po mnenju vojaških opazovalcev odločila usoda dolgotrajne bitke za Madrid. Kleber je prišel v Madrid na čelu brigade inozemskega protifašističnega prostovoljcev v času, ko so se madridske obrambne vrste najbolj majale in ko so se razni opazovalci strinjali, da je bilo vprašanje padca Madrida v fašistične roke samo še vprašanje nekaj ur. To je bilo tedaj, ko se je rebelni general Franco bahal, da bi mu "fest mož zadostovalo da zavzame Madrid" in ko je že dela načrte, kako bodo njegove čete zmagovali vključno v glavno mesto republike. Kleber je prišel v Madrid na čelu brigade inozemskega protifašističnega prostovoljcev na bojišče na severozapadnih obročnih mest na fašisti od tedaj niso mogli več nikamor naprej.

Kleber je star okrog 50 let. V svetovni vojni se je boril s kanadsko armado v Franciji. Po svetovni vojni ga je zaneslo v Sibirijo, kjer se je boril na strani belogradistov. Boljševiki pa so kontra-revolucionarje premagali in Kleber je postal častnik v rdeči armadi. Pozneje se je pojabil v Hamburgu v Nemčiji, kjer je kmalu postal znana osebnost v nemških komunističnih krogih. Sam sebi imenuje "profesionalnega revolucionarja."

## 1936 Edition of Yugoslav All-American Has Much Line Talent But Lacks Backfield Stars

No first or second teams, but just a listing of the Yugoslav gridiron stars takes the place of the annual All-American team picked by this sheet. This was done for several reasons.

A full quota of candidates for line positions, but a surprising lack of backfield material made selections a difficult matter and a matter in which injustice would be done to some and too much credit given to mediocre performers. The backfield task was very simple. Once the list of eligible candidates was counted it was found that only four rip-smashing, driving machines from major colleges could be considered, so that was that. The line was so much more difficult. It almost broke one's heart to relegate to the second team men who deserved to be on any All-American but had the misfortune to play during a season when others just as good also performed.
