Air Cadet Applicants Sought A new Aviation Cadet Training Class will start Oct. 15 (next class March 1, 1948) at Randolph Field, Texas.

Each class starts with 500 cadets and men completing the 12-month course are commissioned second lieutenants and assigned to flying duty with the USAF.

FORTY HOURS' DEVOTION

Amid an array of white and gold, the Blessed Sacrament was exposed during our annual forty hours' Devotion last Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

The ceremonies opened Sunday at the ten o'clock Mass. After Mass were the procession around the Church, and the Litany of the Saints. Sunday evening, the Slovenian sermon was by Father Gabrovsek from St. Vitus. The ceremony also included the Litany of the Blessed Virgin and Benediction.

The Monday sermon was by Father Pramik, who is from St. Lawrence's. He spoke of the Prisoner of the Blessed Sacrament, who is there always and never complains, while we are always murmuring against the Lord. Again there was Benediction, along with the Litany of the Sacred Heart.

Father Gabrovsek was the speaker again on Tuesday, the closing day of the Forty Hours. There was also the procession, of course, and the chanting of the Litany of the Saints by the priests. When the "marchers" came into the Church, the choir started the Pange Lingua, "Sing, my tongue, the Savior's glory," one of the most beautiful of the liturgical hymns in praise of the Blessed Sacrament. The girls in the procession were dressed in traditional white, and carried yellow chrysanthemums, in accord with the color scheme of the altars. Altar boys in black cassocks and spotless surplices followed. Coming after were the red-cassocked boys with tall candles. The eight tiny angels who strewed flowers before the Host had white dresses and crowns of green ferns in their hair.

To the singing of the Pange Lingua the procession moved around the Church, finally coming down the center aisle to the Sanctuary. The Benediction was given and "Hvala Velemu Bogu" closed the ceremony for another year.

Thanks are due to all who contributed in any way to making this year's Forty Hours a success. First of all to the Sisters who decorated the Church so beautifully for the King. To them also thanks for getting the procession together, and for the lovely way they taught the children what to do. 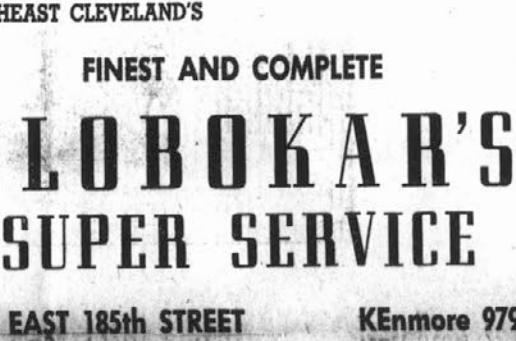
