### NORWOOD LIBRARY NEWS

You will know the bitter taste of defeat, and the strong resistance to it that smolders in the hearts of a freedom-loving people when you read *The Moon Is Down*, by John Steinbeck. Somewhere in Europe, the conquering Nazis marched into a quiet town which was half asleep in the warm sun, and took possession of it. With cold and cynical efficiency the conquerors took over the town's mines and its business, and quartered their troops in the homes of the helpless people.

The traitor within the community, the Quisling who lived in the villages and was a respected member of its society, added to the bitterness in their hearts by his arrogant demands to replace their beloved and honorable mayor.

The story of how the people resisted their masters, how they silently wore the yoke of their defeat, but thwarted the enemy in a thousand sabotaging ways that galled and infuriated them and kept them helpless, is this powerful novel by Steinbeck. As one of its characters says, and the people adopt the thought and sing it in a popular song: "The flies have conquered the flypaper." Read and know what happened in one town which could be your town, in one of the best books about this war: *The Moon Is Down*.

Another book that comes out of the war, and this one from defeated France, is *The Flight to Aras*, by Antoine de Saint-Exupery. A famous and daring aviator, the author of *Night Flight*, and *Wind, Sand, and Stars*, Saint-Exupery has here written a deep and tragic account of the futile resistance of a few valiant flyers fighting in the face of overwhelming superiority. It is a beautiful and inspiring book conceived in a spirit beyond defeat or despair. It is another testimonial to the invincible courage of a gallant and peace-loving people whose only crime was to be civilized.
