## Vitamin A

Včasih me kdo vpraša: "Ni li zdravo, da pojem vsak dan zjutraj, predno grem na delo, po 3 do 5 jajc, par prepečencev, namazanih s surovim maslom, spijem eno čašo mleka in še eno čašo oranžnega ali paradižnikovega soka?"

Ne, res ni zdravo in to iz dveh razlogov: Če je dan za dan isto hrano, se začne telo temu upirati in reagira z alergijo, ki se lahko izvrže v najrazličnejših oblikah. Vsa, zgoraj navedena hrana, razen kruha, vsebuje precejšnje množine vitamina A, mnogo več kot ga odrasli človek potrebuje. Vitamin A nima lastnosti, da bi se izločil potom ledvje, kar ga pride preveč v krvni obtok, temveč se v telesu deponira, nabira in vpliva kvarno na zdravje. (Tako kot vitamin D.) Dneva poraba vitamina A je zelo majhna (v unicap tabletah ga je le 5.000 enot, v terapeutičnih kapsulah 50.000 enot), primanjkovati ga seveda ne sme. Če ga primanjkuje, človek ne vidi v mraku (ima kurjo slepoto), svetloba ga blišči, koža mu je suha in rad zboli na očeh (keratitis).

Tak pojav pomanjkanja vitamina A srečamo pri ljudeh, ki so v rašči, otroci do 18. leta, in pri onih, ki se nezadostno ali neprimerno hranijo (pijanci, dietiki, zbirčenje), preobilico pa pri vseh onih, ki pijejo redno po dve čaši ali več oranžnega ali paradižnikovega soka, ali soka, ki ga sami pripravijo iz korenja in listov sočivja. Če imajo še navado jesti vsak dan jajca, surovo maslo, sir, jetra, morda pijejo še ribje olje ali mleko, ti zbolijo (ne takoj) po šestih mesecih ali pozneje, pač po količini previška tega vitamina. Njihova koža dobi čudno, lisasto barvo, je suha, srbi, je debela vsed podkožnega otekanka, se rada vname. Lasje postanejo grobi, so krhki in izpadajo. Ustnice so suhe, razpokane. V ustnih kotih sluznica poči in te razpokline rade krvavi. Otečejo jetra in vranica, bolnik postane truden, malokrven (znižanje rdečih in belih krvnih stanic), manj odporen proti infekcijam, utrudljiv, v kratkem: bolan namesto zdrav, kot si je želel, ko se je začel nalihati z raznimi sokovi.

Traja kake tri mesece, da se izrabi in izloči odvišni vitamin. Seveda se je treba izogniti vse one hrane in pijače, v kateri se nahaja vitamin A (jajca, maslo, sir, mleko, jetra, soki iz korenja in sočivja, iz sadežev, razen limone.)

Za zaključek: V ničemur ne pretiravaj, ne v hrani ne v pijači. Za zajtrk ne jej dan na dan jajca ali sir, ne jej vsak dan iste hrane (kokoši), ne pij vsak dan sadnih sokov, za žejo je še vedno najboljša voda, limonada in čaj. Pij peneče se pijače le ob kaki priliki, ne pa dnevno in redno, ker "papi" vsebujejo kislino (CO<sub>2</sub>), katero se bo nabralo preveč v krvi, boš truden in razdražljiv. V mesani hrani bo dobilo telo vse one snovi, ki so mu potrebne, v enolični hrani bo nekaterih snovi preveč, drugih premalo.

## KRIŽARJI

Naposled je začel omahovati, a Čeh je tolkel po njem vse krepkeje. In kakor pod kmetovo sekiro od smrekovega hłoda odletavajo velike tako so se tudi pod čehovimi udarci začeli krušiti in odpadati deli z oklepa nemškega oprode. Gornji rob ščita se je upognil in je pokal, naramnik z desne strani rame je zdrknil skupno s presekanim in okrvavljenim jermenom na zemljo. Van Kristu so se naježili lasje na glavi — in lotil se ga je smrtni strah.

Udaril je še enkrat, dvakrat z vso silo po čehovem ščitu. Ko pa je naposled videl, da spričo silne nasprotnikove moči ni zanj nobene rešiti več in da ga more rešiti le kakšno nenavadno naključje, se je z vso težo svojega telesa in orožja naglo vrpel Hlavi pod noge.

Oba sta padla in se spoprijela na tleh, se valjala in preobračala po snegu. Toda Čeh se je kmalu izkopal na vrh, še za hip krotil obupne nasprotnikove gibe, naposled s kolenom pritisnil železni oklep, ki mu je pokrival trebu, in potegnil izza pasu kratko, trioglatko mizerikordijo.

"Prizanesi!" je zašepetal tih van Krist in dvignil oči k čehovim očem.

Toda namesto odgovora se je čeh razkoračil nad njim, da bi z rokami laže dosegel njegov vrat, prerezel na čeladi jermen pod brado, sunil nesrečneža dvakrat v grlo, mereč z ostrino navzdol proti sredini pris.

Tu sta se van Kristovi zenici udri v očesni votlini, roke in noge so začele otepati po snegu, kakor bi ga hotele očistiti pepela, čez hip pa se je iztegnil — in nepremično obležal; le z rdečo peno pokrite ustnice so se še kadile in krvavel je nenavadno močno...

A čeh je vstal, obriral ob Nemčeve suknjo mizerikordijo, potem je dvignil sekiro, se opril nanjo in začel opazovati težji in trdovratnejši boj svojega viteza z bratom Rotgierom.

Zapadni vitezi so bili že navajeni ugodnega in razkošnega življenga, medtem ko so graščaki v Malopoljski in Velikopoljski, zlasti v Mazovji živeli še surovo in trdo, zaradi česar so tuji in neprijatelji občudovali moč njihovih teles in vztrajnost v prenašanju vsakovrstnih naporov, bodisi trajnih bodisi trenutnih. Pokazalo se je tudi sedaj, da Zbiško nič manj ne prekaša križarja po sili rok in nog, kakor je prekašal njegov oproda van Krista, a pokazalo se je prav tako, da v svoji mladosti zao-

kazati le hladnokrvnost, a ne vroča strast.

Rotgier, ki se je bil udeležil nemalo vojn in se bil v gručah ali v dvoboju, je vedel iz izkušnje, da so ljudje kakor ptice roparice rojeni za boj in obdarovani od narave, da nekako uganejo vse to, do česar prihajajo drugi po dolgoletnih vajah, in je takoj spoznal, da ima opraviti s takim človekom. Po prvih udarcih je spoznal, da tiči v tem mladenču nekaj takega, kar je v jastrebu, ki vidi v nasprotniku le svoj plen in ne misli na nič drugega, kakor da ga zgrabi s svojimi kremlji. Vkljub svoji moči je vendar opazil, da ne dosega Zbiška, in če se izčrpa prej, preden se mu posreči zadati usodni udarec, utegne biti boj s tem strašnim, četudi manj izkušenim mladenčem, zanj poguben. V tej misli je sklenil, da se bo boril s čim najmanjšim naporom;

potegnil je k sebi ščit, ni preveč umikal, omejil je gibe, zbral vso moč svoje duše in telesa za odločilni udarec in čakal pravega trenutka.

Medtem se je še zjasnilo zimsko bledo jutro, pretrgala se je siva zavesa megle in sončni žarek je osvetil modrikasti križarjev oklep in srebrnato milansko Zbiškovo opravo. V kapelici je zazvano k službi božji, a z odmetom zvonov so se zopet razpršile z grajskih streh jatekavk, loputajočih s perutnicami in presunljivo vreščecih, kakor bi se veselile, videc kri in truplo tistega, ki je že nepremično ležal na snegu. Rotgier je med bojem nekajkrat vrgel pogled nanj in naenkrat se je čutil strašno osamljenega. Vse oči, ki so zrle nanj, so bile oči sovražnikov. Vse molitve, želje in tih zaobljube, ki so jih delale ženske, so bile na Zbiškovi strani. Vkljub temu, da je bil križar popolnoma prepričan, da se Zbiškov oproda ne vrže nanj od zadaj in se ga izdajalsko ne dotakne, sta navzočnost in bližina te grozne postave nehote v njem vzbujali tak nemir, kakršnega občuti človek ob

pogledu na volka, medveda zdaj od zadaj, zdaj od sprejali tura, od katerega ga ne daj, povešajoč pri tem glavo loči omrežje. In tega čustva se in mu zlovesče zroc skozi odni mogel ostresti, tem manj, prtine v žleznem vizirju, a ker se je čeh, hoteč slediti včasih nehote dvigajoč okraboju, premikal in menjal menjal vljeno ostrino.

## SHORTS ON SPORTS

NBC Pays \$13,044,000 for Grid TV

College football's rich status as a television attraction rose to new heights, December 17, when the National Broadcasting Co. obtained exclusive rights to the National Collegiate Athletic Association's games for two years at a record price of \$13,044,000.

NBC's bid was almost \$3,000,000 more than the price of \$10,200,000 paid by the Columbia Broadcasting System under the previous contract for 1962-63.

It was announced that NBC will telecast college games on 13 Saturdays, starting on September 12 and ending on December 5, plus Thanksgiving Day. Many of the programs will be in color.

Nine games will be televised nationally. NBC will present four regional games on each of the remaining five dates. In previous years, only three games were shown on the regional schedules.



Rutherford Eduardo "Chico" Salmon (pronounced SAY-MOAN), a 23-year old native of Panama who was purchased this fall from the Milwaukee Braves, is expected to make a spirited bid for outfield consideration, and the young man brings some impressive credentials after four seasons in the professional leagues.

In addition to an outstanding hitting record during these four years, Salmon has the strong recommendation of his 1963 manager, former Detroit Tigers' pilot Jack Tighe, who had Salmon had Denver all last summer.

At the winter baseball meetings early in December, Tighe advised Tribe manager Birdie Tebbets that he might have to make room in his outfield for Salmon.

"The kid is not a powerful hitter," Tighe advised. But he can hit all kinds of pitching, throws well and he can run like a deer."

"His only weakness is ghosts. When he was a youngster, his mother told him to watch out for ghosts — and he does. When he goes to sleep at night he leaves the light on, plugs the keyhole with chewing gum and keeps the windows closed.

Salmon appeared in 148 games for Denver this past season, and his .255 batting average led all Pacific Coast League batters. His 192 hits included 33 doubles, eight triples, and eight homers. He also had 67 runs-batted in and had 19 stolen bases.

In 1962, his .330 batting mark at Knoxville tied him for fourth place with Pete Rose of Macon among the Sally League hitters. Rose, incidentally, is the youngster now with the Cincinnati Reds and was the National League Rookie of the Year for 1963.

In 1961, Salmon batted .292 at Durban and the previous season he hit .345 for Pocatello. In four seasons he has stolen a total of 105 bases for an average of more than 25 per season. His lifetime batting mark in organized baseball is .324.

Tribe midwest scouting supervisor Walter Shannon, who recommended Salmon to Gabe Paul, labels him an exciting player both at bat and afielid. Shannon originally scouted Denver to ascertain the abilities of another player, but Salmon's play quickly gained his attention.


