### Komunistična partija proti vplivom Zapada

Centralni komitet Komunistične partije Sovjetske zveze je sklenil začetki boj proti naraščanju zahodnih vplivov, ki slabe enotnost socialističnih držav.

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Centralni komitet Komunistične partije je na svojem dvo dne trajajočem zasedanju razpravljal o Vietnamu, pa posvetil dober del svojega časa vplivom zahodnega, kapitalističnega sveta na dežele socialističnega bloka, tudi na samo Sovjetsko zvezo. "Celoten, ogromen aparat protikomunistične propagande je sedaj usmerjen v slabitev edinstva med socialističnimi deželami, mednarodnega komunističnega gibanja v podminiranje socialistične družbe od znotraj," trdi resolucija, ki jo je Centralni komitet sprejel na svojih posvetovanjih.

Resolucija zahteva strožji nadzor nad rusko literaturo in učenostjo kot "del programa, ki naj krepiti domoljubje sovjetskega ljudstva". Napoved ostrejše ideološkega nadzora nad rusko inteligenco in njenim delom je bila vidna v svarilih partizanskih vodnikov v zadnjih mesecih, da oblasti in Partija ne bodo trpele javnega nasprotovanja in protestov.

Zborovanje Centralnega komita, ki je odprl pretekli torek glavnega tajnika KP L. Brežnevja z obširnim govorom o mednarodnem položaju in o napravi Komunistične partije ZSSR za združitev komunističnih sil proti "imperialističnim intrigam".

Pri tem je mislil brez dvoma na razvoj na Češkoslovaškem in Poljskem, pa tudi v Romuniji.

Centralni komitet je zboroval dva dni in je izvedel tudi nekaj posebnih sprememb. Tako je bil partijski tajnik v Gorkovu K. F. Katušev imenovan v osrednje tajništvo Komunistične partije, v Centralni komitet sam pa je bilo sprejetih pet novih članov.

### Znaki razočaranja nad demokratizacijo v ČSR

Univerzitetni profesor Ivan Svitak poziva k povečanju svobode, ko izraža dvom v iskrenost in trajnost sedanje sprostite diktature.

PRAGA, ČSR. — Objava programa novega vodstva Komunistične partije pred nekaj dnevi je v vrstah inteligence vzbudila precej razočaranja. Večina bi šla da veliko dalj v demokratizaciji in svobodi, ko vidi v sklepih Centralnega komiteva nevarnost celo za to, kar je bilo doslej dosegno.

### ZA UVOD V POGAJANJA VEČ VOJSKOVANJA! Tito v Tokiu napovedal konferenco "nevezanih"!

CLEVELAND, O. — Morda se bo komu zdel gornji naslov preveč pesimističen. Morda je, toda pri vsem tem ni treba spregledati par novic, ki smo jih zvedeli sredi tedna.

Ne samo generali v Saigonu, tudi državni tajnik Rusk je v Washingtonu trdil pred senatnim odborom za zunanjopolitično, da Ho Či Minh pošilja kar naprej svoje čete v Južni Vietnam. Obveščevalna služba trdi tudi, da Hanoi pošilja nepretrgoma novo orožje in municijo. Vse napravila vtis, da hoče soražnik čim preje postati vojaško tako močen, kot je bil v začetku februarjeve ofenzive.

Kdor se skuša vtopiti v komunistično miselnoščino Ho Či Minha,

se temu ne bo čudil, bo raje občudoval njegovo doslednost. Ho Či Minh se namreč hoče istočasno pogajati z Ameriko in vojskovati v Južnem Vietnamu. V duhu njegove teorije o vojskovjanju, podreja vojaške operacije politični taktiki, to se pravi, od sedaj naprej se bo Hanoi bolj oziral na stanje uradne debate z Ameriko kot na vojaške podvige. Kadar bodo razgovori o premirju zahtevali vojaške uspehe, bo debato ustavil, dokler ne pravoroči vojaških uspehov. Kadar jih bo, jih bo izrabil pri pogajanjih ali vsaj hotel izrabiti.

Zato je trenutno Hočiminhova taktika razumljiva. Hoče v Južnem Vietnamu pripraviti na vojaškem področju vse, kar bi lahko koristilo diplomatskim razgovorom. Seveda Ho Či Minh noče samo zadati udarce ameriškim članom. Svoboda tiska in besede ni posebno trdna, kajti novo vodstvo dežele je že povедalo, da mora tudi ta v "okvir socialističnih zakonov".

Maršal M. Sypchalski je bil pred drugo svetovno vojno znan kot odličen arhitekt. Med vojno se je pridružil podtalnemu boju proti nacizmu in pomagal organizirati komunistične borbene oddelke. Odšel je v Sovjetsko zvezo in pomagal tam graditi poljske oborožene sile. Po koncu vojne se je vrnil domov in bil nekaj časa župan glavnega mesta Varšave. Zaradi svojega poljskega nacionalizma je bil

izključen iz Politbiroja Centralnega komiteva Komunistične partije in zaprt. V ječi je preselil 4 leta. S povratkom Go-

### ZDA zavrnile Varšavo

Združene države so odklonile Varšavo za mesto razgovorov, ker jo ne smatrajo za "nevratalen kraj".

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsednikov tiskovni tajnik George Christian je včeraj objavil, da Združene države ne smatrajo Varšavo, glavnega mesta Poljske, za neutralno mesto, kjer naj bi se vršili predhodni razgovori med Washingtonom in Hanojem o končanju vietnamske vojne. Varšavo je predložil Hanoi, ko je Washington odklonil glavno mesto Kambodžo Phnom Penh.

Združene države poudarjajo, da Varšavo ni mogoče smatrati za neutralno mesto, ker Poljska podpira Severni Vietnam v vojskovjanju, ne priznava pa niti Južne Koreje niti Južnega Vietnam.

Tako bi prišlo do težav pri razdrževanju rednih zvez in stikov s predstavniki zaveznih sil, ki so vpletene v vietnamsko vojskovjanje. Združene države o predložili najprej za razgovore Švicarsko Ženevo, kar pa je Hanoi odklonil in predložil Phnom Penh. Tega ni sprejel Washington, ker nima s Kambodžo rednih zvez. Obe strani ehtata sedaj nova mesta, med njimi Bandung v Indoneziji, New Delhi v Indiji, Rangun v Burmi in druga.

Moskva, ki je prva objavila, da predlaže Hanoi Varšavo, se je "čudila", da ZDA delajo toliko vprašanja o mestu razgovorov, ko je vendar predsednik L. B. Johnson svoj čas rekel, da je pripravljen poslati svojega zastopnika kamorkoli, da se sreča in pogovori s predstavnikom Hanoia. Vprašanje izbire mesta je za javnost vprašanje "dobre volje", obe strani hočeta že tu iztisniti največ za sebe, kar je le mogoče. V Washingtonu se zavajajo, da utegne ostati za predhodne razgovore izbrano mesto, tudi kraj za kasnejša pogajanja o končanju vojne. Zato polagajo na izbiro tega mesta toliko važnost.

TOKIO, Jap. — Predsednik SFRJ Josip Broz Tito, ki je s svojo ženo Jovanko in obilnim spremstvom na uradnem obisku na Japonskem, je tam razlagal, da je tekom svojih obiskov po glavnih mestih držav Azije in Afrike ugotovil povsod veliko podporo za sklicanje konference "nevezanih držav", kot sta bili pred leti ona v Belgradu in Kairu.

Tito je trdil, da je podpora za takoj konferenco sedaj še veliko večja in bi se jo torej udeležilo tudi več držav. Na tejbi je razpravljali o vrsti mednarodnih političnih vprašanj, kot sta vojna v Vietnamu in izraelsko-arabski spor na Srednjem vzhodu, nevmešavanje v notranje razmere drugih držav in podobno, pa tudi vprašanje pomoči gospodarsko razvitenih držav nerazvijenih.

DAR AS SALAAM, Tanz. — Vlade Tanzanije, Zambije in Ljudske republike Kitajske so se sporazumele o pregledu in merjenju ozemlja, smeri in trase tisoč milj dolge železniške proge, ki bo vodila od tod v Zambijo. Merjenja morajo biti predvidoma končana v letu 1970, ko naj bi začeli s samo gradnjo železnice. Gradili bo tudi Kitajska bo gradnjo tudi finančira.

Nova železniška proga naj napravi Zambijo neodvisno od Rodesije in Mozambika, preko katerih mora sedaj izvajati svojo rudo in vse drugo do morskih pristanišč ter od tam uvažati lastne potrebuščine iz tujine. Zambija, nekdajna Severna Rodesija ima obsežna ležišča bakrena rude, ki jo izvaja v glavnem v zahodni svet.

Progo imajo že dalj časa v načrtu. Kitajci so ponudili svojo pomoč, ko so zahodne sile omahovale v "proučevale" dejansko potrebo te proge. V Londonu so mnenja, da nova železniška proga ne bi bila potrebna, če bi ne vladal spor med Zambijo in ostalimi državami črne Afrike na eni strani ter med Rodesijo in Portugalsko na drugi.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Podpredsednik H. Humphrey bo po vsem sedeč objavil svojo kandidaturo prihodnji teden. Bivši predsednik H. Truman je prejel častno načelstvo nad odborom, ki je odločen pridobiti imenovanje za predsednika kandidata demokratske stranke Humphreyju.

## Velika noč 1968

"Gospod je vstal", bodo v nedeljo veselo peli zvonovi. Srca vernih bodo polna blaženosti in vrskajoče sreče, saj je Gospodovo vstajenje jamstvo za naše vstajenje, temelj naše vere. Živa vera nam daje moč, nas polni z zaupanjem; ko pritisnejo stiske in težave, nam te lajša in nas varuje pred tem, da bi pod njihovo težo klonili, da bi nas pognale v obup.

Ko čakamo zore Velike noči, je ves svet, tudi naša domovina, zavit v skrbi; z negotovostjo in bojažnijo gleda v bodočnost. Vojne divlajo v raznih predelih sveta, najhujša od vseh v Vietnamu, kjer skušajo sile svobodnega sveta ustaviti komunistični napad, zavreti komunistično osvajanje in zavarovati svobodo in neodvisnost Južnem Vietnamu. Nekje na obzorju se je prikazal žarek upanja, da bo te vojne le konec. Te dni se bodo začeli predhodni razgovori, ki naj pripravijo tla za pogajanja v miru.

V naši deželi, ki nosi glavno težo vojskovanja, poleg Južnega Vietnamu seveda, je vest o začetku razgovorov s Hanojem vzbudila veselje in upanje, da bo vojne kmalu konec, da se bodo naši fantje skoro vrnili domov in da bo prešla tudi "nevarnost za dolar", ki v zadnjih mesecih marsikateremu izmed petičnikov ni dala mirno spati. V Južnem Vietnamu je drugače: Tam so v skrbah zaradi svoje bodočnosti. Nič kaj preveč ne zaupajo, da bodo Združene države, ki imajo trenutno same s seboj dovolj opravka, zadostno poskrbeli za njihovo varnost, za njihovo bodočnost. Boje se številnih glasov iz Združenih držav, ki se zavzemajo za "mir za vsako ceno".

Zal je res v naši deželi precej takih, ki se ne brigajo za usodo 17 milijonov Južnih Vietnamcev, katere smo hiteli pred 4 leti "reševat pred komunističnim nasiljem", sedaj pa bi jih nekateri temu nasilju radi izročili brez pomisleka in brez čuta odgovornosti. Ob razmišljjanju o tem se človek nehote spomni na W. Churchilla in na Jugoslavijo. McLean, ki ga je Churchill poslal k Titovim partizanom gledat, kaj ti počenjajo in kake načrte imajo za bodočnost, je sporčil v London: Tito je komunist in hoče v Jugoslaviji uvesti komunistično diktaturo. Churchill ni brigalo, kaj bo z Jugoslovani, ki komunizma niso marali, McLean je odgovoril z vprašanjem: Ali mislite Vi živeti v Jugoslaviji? Ko je ta odgovoril, da ne misli, je Churchill zaključil: Jaz tudi ne!

Ameriški poskus končati vojskovanje v Vietnamu s pogajanjem je povzročil negotovost in skrb tudi v vseh drugih državah jugovzhodne Azije, od Japonske in Filipinov do Indije. Vse države tega prostora, prvenstveno seveda sosedne Kitajske preudarajo o tem, v koliko se bodo Združene države po umiku iz Vietnamoma še brigale za jugovzhodno Azijo, v koliko v slučaju nevarnosti lahko računajo na njihovo pomoč. Celo v Avstraliji in Novi Zelandiji so izgubili svojo trdnost in neomajno zaupanje v Združene države.

Vojna se nadaljuje v Jemenu, kjer si še vedno stoje nasproti pristaši kralja Al Badra in republike. Premirje med Izraelom in arabskimi državami je skrajno negotovo, ker ga arabski gverilci ob vsaki priložnosti kršijo, Izraelci pa na njihove napade in sabotaže odgovarjajo.

Vojno imajo še vedno v afriški Nigeriji, kjer se republika Biafra, ki so jo lani oklicali vodniki plemena Ibo, upira trdovratno zveznim četam. Vojna dobiva bolj in bolj značaj gverilskega vojskovanja, ko se bojevnikи plemena Ibo umikajo v težje dostopne predele svoje domovine in od tam napadajo svoje sovražnike.

Črna Afrika nadaljuje svoje vojskovanje proti portugalskim področjem Angole in Mosambika, prav posebno pa proti Rodeziji, kjer se bela manjšina trdovratno upira priznanju političnih pravic črnski večini.

Od Castra podpirani rdeči gverilci se še vedno skrivajo po gozdovih in gorah Južne in Srednje Amerike ter čakajo na priložnost za poživitevo vojskovanja, ki je po smrti Guevare v Bolivijskem zastalo, ker trenutno nima pravega vodnika.

V naši deželi so vojskujemo z revščino z malim uspehom. Izgredi, požiganje in plenjenje v črnskih predelih naših velemest koncem preteklega tedna so pokazali problem v vsej njegovi grobosti. Učinkovitih, naglih zdravil zanj ni nobeden. Vsi se strinjajo, da tega vprašanja s samim denarjem ni mogoče rešiti. Prav tako je le malo dvoma, da je treba ljudem pomagati iz revščine, da je treba razmere v črnskih naseljih izboljšati, poskrbeti za zaposlitev črnske mladine. Brez sodelovanja poštene črnske večine vse ti napori ne morejo imeti pravega uspeha. Nič manj kot za gospodarski dvig, je namreč treba poskrbeti tudi za moralni,

kulturni in socialni dvig črnskih množic v nemirnih črnskih naseljih.



## Home Visit Program Slated For Next Sunday

The Sixth Annual Interracial Home Visit Program is planned for Sunday, April 29, from 3 to 5 p.m.

Sponsored by the Cleveland Community Relations Board, the program is aimed at bringing members of white and Negro communities together to informally discuss problems of mutual concern.

Discussions are held in both white and Negro homes. Homes are volunteered by family hosts.

There is no set formula or outline for the conversation that takes place during a home visit. With the help of a discussion leader, provided by the Community Relations Board, each discussion pursues its own course, depending upon the interests and experiences of the participants.

Normally, discussion includes such topics as the meaning of "black power", how white parents can prevent prejudice in children, the problem of Negroes moving into all-white communities, and how Negro parents prepare their children to face segregation and discrimination.

The discussions are mostly learning sessions. Learning about other people. There are no obligations or commitments to participants other than to reflect on what was seen, heard and learned during the discussion. The discussions are personal; the decisions are too.

### N. L. Expansion Group Hears Franchise Plans

Cincinnati, O.—The National League will go into a meeting at Chicago April 20 with its Expansion Committee fully informed on the plans of the five bidders for new franchises.

The cities involved are Montreal, Buffalo, Milwaukee, Dallas-Fort Worth and San Diego.

President Warren Giles telegraphed the franchise groups and directed them to make presentations of their cases to each member of the Expansion Committee individually. Additionally, the groups were told to file reports on their financial responsibility.

The Expansion Committee members are Walter O'Malley of the Dodgers, John Gabreath of the Pirates and Roy Hofheinz of the Astros.

With complete data available, they will be in a position to make recommendations that may determine whether or not the N. L. joins the American League in expanding to 12 clubs in 1969.

### Tigers' Ticket Sales Up Despite No Newspapers

Detroit, Mich.—Advance ticket sales in Detroit were up 30 percent this year, but the Tigers figure it could improve.

"The Detroit newspaper strike hurt us," said General Manager Jim Campbell.

The Tigers went through spring training without the two Detroit daily papers, the News and Free Press, whose long winter strike carried over into the baseball season.

Meanwhile, the resourceful Tiger Club staff got the park ready for the new season under handicaps. Detroit had a foot of snow some 2 weeks before the opener.

"We had to fish out the sod and get it down while the field was wet," said stadium manager Jess Walls.

Because cold weather adversely affects the right hand Allen cut severely last August, Richie may wear a heated glove on that hand. The glove is heated by two miniature batteries worn higher on the arm, with connecting wires.

## Jottings From The Baraga Land

Marquette, Mich.—We have a new bishop. The former auxiliary bishop of Grand Rapids in Michigan was solemnly installed as the 8th successor of Bishop Frederick Baraga on March 25, the feast of the Annunciation. His name is Carl Salatka. The name is undoubtedly Polish, but he comes from a Lithuanian family. He made his studies in the U.S.A. and two years of canon law in Rome. He arrived here three days before the installation.

The solemnity of the installation was magnificent: there were 16 bishops and 270 priests present. It is clear that there are not so many in our diocese, but only from Grand Rapids 50 came. The bishop's sermon was explicitly religious. He mentioned Bishop Baraga, his first predecessor and his model. Baraga was mentioned also at the banquet in the university auditorium.

Bishop Noa, now retired, said that when the new bishop left Grand Rapids, it was raining and when he came to Marquette, there was sunshine. Msgr. Carmody, chairman of the banquet, remembered the first successor of Baraga, Bishop Mrak, who after his nomination rode by train to 10 miles distant Negaua and then by a horse-drawn carriage to Marquet. When he presented himself as the new bishop, the cook couldn't believe it. "I couldn't imagine that a bishop would wear such a shabby coat."

In the delegation who expressed their loyalty to the new Bishop Salatka in the cathedral were Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Stupar, who will bring the Baraga candle from Marquette to St. Mary's in Collinwood and then later to the concert of the "Mladi harmonikari"—Young accordion players—in the auditorium of St. Vitus, on Sunday, April 21.

Sunday, April 21 (the first after Easter) will be THE BARAGA SUNDAY for the Slovenians of Cleveland. In the morning Rev. Victor Tome, pastor of St. Mary's, twice will light the candle, before the Masses at 8:00 and 10:30. At the Mass at 8:00 a.m. Mr. Matt Tekavec will serve and at the Mass at 10:30 Mr. John Grdina, who both served when the Baraga candle made its pilgrimage trip through Europe.

Other Baraga pilgrims will assist at the Masses with the special Baraga candles. Those candles will be lighted and blessed once again with the Baraga candle. ALL FRIENDS are invited to attend these ceremonies.

The same day (April 21) in the afternoon, there will be the celebration at St. Vitus. At 3:30 "Mladi harmonikari" with their Director Rudy Krez, will give a concert. 80 young players and singers will perform on various instruments: accordions, guitars, flutes, pianos... Such concerts are well known and attractive for some time already now in Cleveland.

Because the concert is given to honor the Centenary of Bishop Baraga, a short ceremony of the lighting of the Baraga candle will take place before the beginning of the concert. Rev. James Wolf, historian at the Baraga Association in Marquette, will light it. He was the first to light this candle in Salzburg on July 27, 1967 and was present at the ceremony of lighting it in the cathedral in Ljubljana on July 30, 1967. He will also greet in English the Slovenian people of Cleveland who are enthusiastic for Baraga. He will say the Mass and give the sermon at St. Mary's at 10:30. Mr. and Mrs. Stupar will bring the candle on the stage in the auditorium, and from Marquette some other guests will come to the concert.

In the meantime the members of the Baraga Association already received by mail the new pamphlet from the Baraga Association, with the information how the Baraga Centenary is being celebrated all over the world. It is entitled "Baraga Land" with the sketches of Marquette, Ljubljana and L'Anse.

Under this name short news will be given from the Baraga Association to its members.




## EASTER - AN ANCIENT OBSERVANCE

## Reporting from Washington

**THE PRESIDENT'S SPEECH:** As I write, Washington is still in the midst of assessing and analyzing President Johnson's speech delivered on nationwide television, Sunday evening, March 31. We may hope that whatever other effects his withdrawal as a candidate may have it will serve as a step toward a peaceful solution of the war in Vietnam. The President's action reducing the scale of bombing in North Vietnam is a promising first-step move toward such a peaceful solution. It is good to know that the president's action has brought some hopeful response from the North Vietnamese government.

**TO HELP THE STATES PROTECT CONSUMERS.** This week I introduced a bill (H.R. 16334) to provide Federal grants-in-aid to help the States establish and strengthen Offices of Consumer Protection. Total amount to be provided the States would be \$9 million over a three-year period. The \$9 million would be distributed on a three-to-one basis of Federal to State funds and would include a State population factor.

Some 30 States have consumer protection offices with a wide range of powers and in a wide range of sizes. Our own State of Ohio has a Consumer Frauds and Crime Section in the Office of the State Attorney General. A concerted effort to strengthen the existing offices and to assist other States in establishing Consumer Protection Offices could be the beginning of a nationwide campaign against unfair, deceptive and sharp practices of an interstate or national character. Except for certain interstate operations, this area properly belongs with the State governments and the objective of my bill is to give the States assistance, on a limited basis, to protect their own consumers. The modest sums called for in this legislation should be returned to the taxpayer-consumer with interest in a very short time. The bill would require each State to prepare a plan for its consumer protection office to meet certain minimum standards stated in the legislation.

By strengthening State Offices of Consumer Protection many instances of unfair and deceptive practices could be stopped before they develop into problems of interstate proportions. It is my hope that the House Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce will give this legislation favorable consideration in the near future.

**OHIO LANDS BILL.** The House has passed and sent to the Senate H.R. 13176, which I introduced in behalf of the Ohio Delegation, to amend the Acts of February 1, 1826 and February 20, 1833, to authorize the State of Ohio to use the proceeds from the sale of certain lands for educational purposes. Back in the frontier days to encourage settlement in what was to become Ohio, Congress set aside nearly 2 million acres of land for the support of education and religion. The care of these lands was in the hands of the Federal government until 1803 when Ohio became a state and the lands were given in trust to the General Assembly of Ohio. Later, by Acts of Congress in 1826 and 1833, Ohio was given permission to sell these lands and apply the proceeds for educational purposes. However, cumbersome restrictions were placed in the laws which made such sale impractical. Moreover, it was required that, when lands were sold, the interest from the proceeds should be distributed annually according to a formula that is long outdated and exceptionally costly to employ.

I introduced H.R. 13176, in behalf of the Ohio delegation, after the

## New 1968 Phone Books Delivery Begins Apr. 15

Distribution of the new, 1968 Cleveland phone books begins Monday (April 15), Ohio Bell said. Delivery of the white and Yellow Pages directories throughout the entire metropolitan area by some 1,500 carriers will require more than a month and be completed by about May 17.

More than 960,000 copies of the white pages will be distributed, more than 821,000 copies of the Yellow Pages—a combined increase of 57,000 copies since the present phone books were distributed a year ago.

There are more than 352,000 listing changes and additions in the white pages alone, including all-new individual phone numbers for the city of Cleveland, its officials and departments. These numbers go into effect Monday (April 15). To reach city offices until you receive your directories, call 694-2000.

Sports fans will find the Cleveland Indians 1968 game schedule on the last page of the new Yellow Pages directory instead of the inside back cover, along with the 1968 soccer game schedule.

The cover of the new white pages repeats the present Ohioana map and Ohio products panel—both introduced last year—on a soft brown, wood-grain background. The Yellow Pages cover also repeats the theme in yellow over the same wood-grain background.

## Peace Corps Test Set For April 20

Cleveland area residents interested in putting their skills to use in developing nations around the world are invited to take the Peace Corps Placement Test at 1:30 p.m. Saturday, April 20 at 4240 Main Post Office Bldg., W. 3rd and Prospect Avenue.

The Peace Corps uses the Placement Test to determine how an applicant can best be utilized overseas. The test measures general aptitude and the ability to learn a language, not education or achievement. The test requires no preparation and is non-competitive; an applicant can neither pass nor fail.

Persons interested in serving with the Peace Corps must fill out an application, if they have not already done so, and present it to the tester before the test. Application forms are available from post offices or from the Peace Corps in Washington, D.C. 20252.

Twelve thousand volunteers are currently serving in Asia, Africa,

Latin America and the Pacific Islands, working with the people of those nations in self-help projects ranging from agriculture and nutrition to auto mechanics, education and health. Many volunteers are needed for programs which will begin this spring and summer.

Lioce believes that student interest stems from the fact that only teens are enrolled, and all casting is done from within the group. Incidentally, previous dramatic and speech training is not required.
