Utopljeni sta solastnika tovarne zlatnine in srebrnine v Gaberiji, August Pacchiaffo in Alojzij Knez. Trojica je odpotovala še v četrtek 28. junija z limuzino tvrdke Steyr po trgovskih posilih v Celovec, odtov Benetke in nato v Trst, kamor so dospeli v soboto ponoči. Ko so vozili okrog polnoči z avtomobilom po stari Dunajski cesti proti kanalu Sv. Antona je

zraven njega je sedel pokojni Alojzij Knez, medtem ko je Ivan Knez, brat Alojzija, sedel zadaj v avtomobilu. Ivan Knez se je sam rešil iz avta s tem, da je z roko razbil šipo, pri čemer si je precej poškodoval roko. Reševalci so ga našli že čisto onemoglega in tonečega, vzdignili na čoln in odpeljali na resilo postajo. Avta pa dolgo ni bilo mogoče dvigniti, ker vrstnični vrat, kjer stoji ravno vi, ki so jih okoli njega poteg-

nili, niso imele opore. Napoled je gasilec Jožef Scheriani (najbrž Skerjanc) pod vodo z velikim trudem vrvi dobro pretegnil, tako da so dignili ele-

Tuji, ki kraja ne poznajo, lahko zavojijo vanj iz ulic, ki drže pravokotno do njega, posebno če hitro vozijo in če pravocasno ne obrnejo v pravem kotu.

Sedanjih nesreč sta bili samo dve ženski priči, ki sta opisali nesrečo.

## Prvakinja vedeževalk

Madame Lenormandova je pravilno napovedala Robespierre padec, Dantonu smrt in Bernadotte prestol.

Proti koncu 18. stoletja in v prvih desetletjih 19. stoletja je živila v Parizu "madame Lenormand", pravzor vseh današnjih vedeževalk za elegantni svet. Ko so po padcu Napoleona I. Bourboni zasedli francoski prestol, so strogo prepovedali vsako vedeževanje in Lenormandova je svojo obrt uganjala lahko samo na skrivaj, ob največji previdnosti. Le s težavo si dospel do nje, dasi je bila njena čakalnica včasno polna kakor čakalnica kakšnega zdravnika.

Stranke je sprejemala v majhni sobi za komaj vidnim tapetnim vratim. Soba ni imela oken, svetloba je prihajala vanjo skozi odprtino v stropu.

Vsak, ki je prišel prvič k sloveči vedeževalki, se je moral naravnost prestrati. Njeni sodobniki jo opisujejo kot tako grdo žensko, da si je grše človek ne bi mogel izmisli. Bila je videti kakor groznotna, s strupom napolnjena krastača. Eno oko ji je bilo stekleno, z drugim pa je obiskovalca gledala, kakor da ga prebašča. Stene so bile polne pribitih netopirjev nagačenih sov, okostij in podobne ropotije.

Prvo vprašanje, ki ga je vedeževalka zavstavila vsakemu obiskovalcu, je bilo to, da si želi male ali velike igre, nato ga je vprašala z debelim basom po starosti, najljubši barvi in najljubši živali. Končno mu je z zapovedanjem glasom dejala, naj dvigne igro, nakar je začela vedeževati.

Lenormandova se je rodila 1768 in je živelj 1790 veljala za veliko vedeževalko, Samo Re bespiere in Saint-Just sta jo baje često obiskovala in vprašala za svet. Dantonu je napovedala vala padec, ko je bil na višku moči, Bernadotte je prerokovala prestol v severni deželi, pričenjena Napoleonu I. Je tudi napovedovala padec Umrila je leta 1843 in je ostavila veliko imetje, ki si ga je pridobila s svojim vedeževanjem.

## Največji prekomornik

Gradilo ga v Glaskoulu in bo najhitrejša ladja na svetu.

V clydebanški ladjedelnici v Glaskoulu na prednjem delu okrog trupa je prednjem preko 7000 kvadratnih stopin, ki je vse prednjem delu oblikovan, da bo vsega vredno preko 1000 ton. Toda tega leta so poslali Nemci svoj novi veleparnik "Bremen" v New York in je na glavo potolkel vse dotedanje hitrostne rekordne na morju. To seveda ni mogoči Angležem prav, zato so začeli graditi novi parnik, ki naj bi jim izgubljeno prvenstvo spet vrnil. Še prej pa bo prešlo po vsej priliki v roke Francovov, ki tudi končujejo svoj znameniti ogromni prekomornik "Normandie". Dovrsili bi ga bili že davno, da jih ni gospodarska kriza prisilila kakor Angleži ustaviti za več nego celo leto gradnjo svojega velikana. V ostalem pa bo "Normandie" nekaj manjša od parnika Cunardove družbe. Ta bo meril 1018 četvrtjev "Normandie" pa 962 četvrtjev.

Po vseh računih bo trup izdelan do septembra t. l. Potem se bo vrnila svečana splavitev, ki se je udeleži tudi angleški kraljevi pa Kraljica bo celo za kumico pri krstu.

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## EDITORIAL REMARKS

### QUITTER AND WINNERS

Somewhere, sometime, I heard a saying that stuck in my mind like a burr sticks to a woolen stocking. That saying ran: "A quitter never wins, and a winner never quits." A lot of truth is packed into those nine words.

It would be a great thing if, in some way, those words and all the meaning behind them could be so strongly impressed upon the minds and consciousness of our members that their subsequent thinking and acting would forever bear their imprint.

When the grass is green, and the sun shines hot and bright, then is the proper time to relax, to forget various committee duties, to "cut" meetings, to grouse about the "deadness" of the lodge, yet do nothing to relieve the deadness, and, lastly, to hand in resignations (this in the case of officers and committee heads). Not that this is a local condition, only. Mother Nature, and human nature, too, is so similar the country over that very probably the same situation prevails in Pennsylvania, Illinois, and other localities.

Of course there is something to be said on the "relaxer's" side of the question. Summer is a hard time for organizations that are so constituted that they must depend entirely upon their membership for life. Summer is a hard time for members in whose ears the voices of duty and temptation sound with equal force. Summer is the hardest time for the members in whose ears the voices of duty and temptation sound—and duty wins.

If there is anything that so quickly robs a person of enthusiasm and vitality as an echoing meeting hall, with the rows of empty chairs, and general air of forlornness, I'd like to know what it is.

It gives the dutiful member the uncomfortable and erroneous impression that maybe he's a sap for doing his work, when all about he can see, only too plainly, members who bury themselves, ostrich-wise, in the sands of pleasure and private affairs, indifferent to the demands of their lightly-taken offices.

Once the dutiful member gets the impression he's a sucker, look out. It'll take a lot of explaining and cajoling, arguing and elucidating, before he'll get over it. Maybe he won't get over it at all.

To avert this danger (and a very real and demoralizing danger it is), lodges should beforehand plan out their summer campaigns. Something light and not too strenuous. Allowances should be made for the decreased attendance at meetings and the press of summer outside activities which involve so many of the members. A light program, mapped out with an eye on time and other factors will do the trick. Save the "big guns" for the fall and winter seasons. Then, we trust, there will not be a handful of "played out" members to carry out the arduous work that comes with cooler weather.

Always, in a lodge, as in other things, there are a few faint-hearted individuals who want to quit when the going gets a bit rocky. This "throwing up of the sponge" is a deplorable idiosyncrasy of the biped known as Man. Given a fair wind and a stout craft, anyone with a thimbleful of gumption can sail thru to victory. Even a quitter has been known to come thru when the odds were all on his side. But it's the lad (or lassie), with a leaky, barnacle-infested vessel, who can drive into the "teeth of the boomerang gale" and come out a winner, that merits the plaudits.

Winner—quitter. A world of difference lies between those two names. One subdues adversity, making it his slave, and the other allows adversity to subdue him. Yet there are times when a judicious use of common-sense will prevent quitters from being quitters. Why present opportunities to quitters to show themselves up when a little use of the gray matter can prevent the arising of such opportunities? Why lay snares for them, for that is just about what it amounts to? These snares may not be intentional, but there they lie, the unnecessary, misleading things! —all set for the weary and unwaried...

To be a winner is a fine thing, but winning it not one-half as contagious as quitting, and when opportunities are presented to quitters to do just that, demoralization is swift to follow. It is a vicious cycle.

# "We Are the Dead!"

"We are the dead!"  
"Long months ago we struggled, wrote—"  
"Saw our page grow,"  
"Acclaimed, and were acclaimed,"  
"But now we lie"  
"In Flanders Fields."

Has an epidemic of slothfulness struck our contributors, and have they succumbed to it?

Is this page to continue steadily on its downward trend to a literary Flanders Fields?

Is the SSPZ merely sinking the hundreds of dollars that it takes to run this page every year in a profitless hole, from whence it shall receive no good?

Are you so-called contributors and members reading between the lines of this article, and comprehending the issue at stake?

This page has been in existence for approximately three years. Hark back to the period preceding the Forum. You recall the situation at that time? It was deplorable. A few desultory articles amidst a mass of irrelevant reading matter.

You took matters into your own hands. You decided you wanted a full page, a whole page dedicated only to the English-speaking lodges, or else... You agitated for the page. You wrote and wrote...literally reams of literature as to just why you were entitled to a full page. You "bellowed" for it. You left stone unturned in your efforts to get it.

You got it.

But what have you done with it?

Time and again the page, after its institution, was the bone of controversy.

Let me cite one instance.

Last year, in 1933, we held our first Olympic meet.

After the meet there were a series of articles in the Forum, put in by the publicity committee of a Cleveland lodge, relating the triumphs of that particular Cleveland lodge at the meet.

There was nothing wrong in that. The publicity committee was perfectly within its rights. The page was open to any lodge whose publicity committee was energetic enough to settle down and write about the part its particular unit had played.

But one Illinois scribe did not see it that way.

He cocked one highly indignant eye-brow at this high-handedness, for so he considered it, sat down, and wrote a pompous article telling the SSPZ world just what his lodge had done at the Olympics.

So far, so good. But—when he went on to berate the Cleveland lodge for stressing its own activities at the meet—he overstepped the limits.

He forgot that this page is impartial—it prints what articles it receives from SSPZ English-speaking lodges and these articles only. He forgot that it cannot print what it never received. He did not see that the Cleveland lodge was well within its rights—and that he was not. The blame was not the Clevelanders'. The fault lay with the scribe's own lax publicity committee. But enough of opening up old wounds that only rankle afresh.

This misunderstanding was only recited to bring out one point: that the Forum is not partial to one group, one lodge. Each English-speaking unit has a voice in the Forum. Don't blame this page that many of those voices never let out a peep. We cannot force them to speak, save by visual exhortation. Mental telepathy has not advanced to the stage whereby thoughts may be transmitted here to us, and we put them down, prettily and appropriately, in black and white, thus saving the lodge scribes the arduous labor of writing their articles themselves and sending them to us.

Don't flick this page away with a grimace of disgust because there is nothing in it about your lodge. Find out why there isn't, and if nothing else can be done, if it is not asking for too much, how about plumping yourself down and dashing off a few lines about your lodge and its activities?

You may even send us the article "collect."

On Armistice Day we honor our hero dead, those who sleep beneath white marble crosses, both here at home, and in Flanders Fields. Their work is done, nobly done. They are the dead.

Here, in the SSPZ ranks we also have our dead. Not hero dead. Anything but.

We have those dead, those unproductive people who slumber peacefully on, dead to all care, thought of responsibility. Dead to all knowledge that they are needed to "carry on." Their work is not done. In some cases it has barely begun. Only a small scratch has been made on the surface.

Oh, verily, we have our dead. No "Flanders Fields" for them, but they have managed to bury themselves very competently. Too much so.

What can be done about it? What shall be done about it?

Shall we calmly stand by and watch our page, that began with such splendid ambitions, such unmolded enthusiasm, settle down gradually into the morass of mold, decay, and dissolution, without lifting one finger to save it?

A literary Flanders Fields looms in the offing for the Forum. Help, reinforcements, recruits, in the form of articles and steady contributors are needed.

Shall it be said of us...

"We are the dead!"
