Odobravanje Fordove vlade plahni še dalje

Od avgusta je predsednik Ford izgubil v podpori javnosti 29%, verjetno zato, ker je javnost od njega pričakovala preveč.

PRINCETON, N.J. — Zadnje Gallupovo povpraševanje je pokazalo, da odobrava Fordovo vodstvo ZDA le še 42%, med tem ko je 41% vprašanih izjavilo, da ga odklanja in z njim ni zadovoljno. Preostalih 17% je izjavilo, da nima o Fordovem delu jasne slike. Tukaj po konгресnih volitvah v novembra je Fordovo vlado odobravalo še 48% povprašanih. Tedaj ni bilo z njo očitno zadovoljnih le 32% in 20% jih ni imelo jasne sode.

Očitno je, da je javnost od Geraldia R. Forda po razočaranjih z Nixonom in Watergate zadevami pričakovala trdno, odločno in uspešno novo vlado, ki bo vrnila ZDA na zdrav tir in jih potegnila iz stisk.

Gerald R. Ford se je lotil reševanja vprašanj, pa ni mogel delati čudežev. Morda je bil res v nekaterih pogledih prepočasen, premalo odločen, ni kazal občutka nujnosti. Čeprav je oznacil inflacijo za sovražnika št. 1 naše dežele, je v boju proti njej storil le malo, med tem pa je narodno gospodarstvo prehajalo bolj in bolj v krizo. Rastotača brezposelnost in obsežna popolica o še slabsem, ki "še pride", je razdirila negotovost in tesnobo, ki sta legli na vso deželo.

Sestanki s tujimi vodniki in potovanja predsednikov ZDA na tuje so običajno povečala podporo njihovemu vodenju dežele, pri Fordu do tega ni prišlo. V njegove voditeljske sposobnosti ima dober del javnosti še vedno hude dvome. Javna občina te dvome preje chtirajo in množe, kot odstranjujejo.

Karamanlis predložil novo ustavo za Grčijo

ATENE, Gr. — Predsednik vlade K. Karamanlis, ki je znan po svojem visokem spoštovanju pokojnega francoskega predsednika gen. Charlesa De Gaulle, je predložil novo ustavo, ki predvideva močnega predsednika republike, izvoljenega neposredno za pet let.

Predsednik naj bi imel pravico imenovati predsednika vlade in tega odpustiti, pravico veta in pravico razpusta parlamenta. Grčija naj bi tako postala predsedniška republika z omejenimi pravicami parlamenta.

Ker ima stranka K. Karamanlisa v parlamentu trdno večino, je zelo verjetno, da bo ustava, ki jo je predsednik vlade predložil, sprejeti in uveljavljena. Komaj je kaj dvoma, da bo Konstantin Karamanlis prvi grški predsedniški kandidat na temelju nove ustawe.

Millsov naslednik Ullman liberalnejši

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Splošno sodijo, da bo za naslednika W. Millsa v odboru za pot in sredstva izbran Al Ullman iz Oregon, ki je znan kot zmeren demokrat. Pričakujejo, da bo odbor pod njegovim vodstvom pravil obsežno davčno reformo, ki bo trše prijela velika podjetja, kot jih sedanji zakon.

Ciklon uničil mesto Darwin v Avstraliji

Vrtinasti vihar ciklon, ki je sličen našemu tornadu, je uničil večji del avstralskega mesta Darwin.

DARWIN, Avstral. — To mesto leži na skrajnem severnem koncu kontinenta v tropskem delu Avstralije. Ima okoli 40.000 prebivalcev in je važno pristanišče. Ciklon Tracy, kot imenujejo v Avstraliji vrtinaste viharje, pri nas znane pod imenom tornadov, je bil izredno močan in divji, saj je njegova brzina dosegla 175 milj.

Vihar je mesto zajel z vso silo in divjal preko njega na Božični dan. Po prvih poročilih je bilo mrtvih 49 oseb, večje število pa je bilo ranjenih in pogrevščenih. Trdijo, da utegne število mrtvih doseči 80.

Obrambni minister Lance Barnard je izjavil, da je ciklon skupaj s hudimi naliivi uničil do 20% vseh hiš v mestu, neki poročevalci Australian Broadcasting Commission pa je sporočili iz Darwina, da je 20.000 ljudi izgubilo svoje domove in so ostali brez strehe.

Oblasti so naglo organizirale obsežno pomoč in hočajo v teku 10 dni spraviti iz mestnih ruševin v zasilna bivališča. 25.000 ljudi. Bolne, otroke in ranjene prevažajo z letali na jug, ker je vihar uničil edino bolnišnico v mestu. Obrambne sile so poslale pomoč v zdravilih in drugih potreščinah z letali in ladjami. Vihar je potopil v pristanišču eno manjšo vojno ladjo in poškodoval štiri druge ladje.

Večjo pomoč so poslale tudi ZDA s svojimi bližnjimi oporišči.

Boji v Eritreji se nadaljujejo

ADIS ABEBA, Abes. — Novi abesinski vladi ni uspelo končati upora Arabcev in z njimi povezanih drugih muslimanov v Eritreji, nekdanji italijanski koloniji, ki je bila Abesiniiji vrnjena po zlomu italijanskega kolonialnega imperija v Afriki ter kom druge svetovne vojne.

Eritrejci se upirajo že dolgo let in uživajo pri tem podporo arabskega sveta. Sprememba vlade, so upali, da bo priveda tudi do končanja upora v Eritreji, kar se ni zgodilo. Preteklo nedeljo so bile vladne čete zapletene v dva večja spopada z uporniki v mestih Asmara in Abes. Ubihih naj bi bilo najmanj 11 oseb, 6 vojakov in 5 civilistov.

Ameriška javnost se odmika pomoči Izraelu

Sindlingerjevo po vpraševanje je pokazalo, da je podpora Izraelu v ameriški javnosti v zadnjem letu močno padla.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — V Kongresu je podpora za Izrael še sorazmerno zelo trdna, kot je razvidno iz zahteve po prosti seleti Židov iz Sovjetske zvezde in močne podpore pri glasovanjih za pomoč Izraelu. Velikokrat je mogoče brati in slišati, da "ameriška javnost ne bo dopustila uničenja Izraela".

Sindlingerjevo povpraševanje javnosti glede Izraela je v tem pogledu prišlo do presenetljivih zaključkov.

Na vprašanje, ali naj bi ZDA z lastnimi oboroženimi silami hitele reševat Izrael, če bi bil ta v nevarnosti uničenja od Arabcev, je 47.7% povprašanih bilo proti temu in le 22.9% za pomoč, 6.7% jih je odgovorilo na vprašanje z "morda".

Pred enim letom je Sindler dobil na enako vprašanje 43.1% pritrdičnih odgovorov. Očitno je strah pred ponovnim bojkotom Arabcev krov sprememb, ljudje se skušajo izogniti stiski, če se jim ne zdi nujna. Skušnje v Indokin so poučile javnost o tveganosti prekomorskih vojaških naštev, te skušnje so še preveč sveže, da bi mogle biti pozabljeni.

Pomanjkanje olja pretekelo jesen in prve mesece letosnjega leta, ki ga je povzročila arabska zapora izvoza olja v ZDA, je vsem še v srečem spomin in nihče ne mara, da bi se take težave povrnile.

Predsednik Ford ima v načrtu nova potovanja

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsednik Gerald R. Ford je kljub sorazmernemu kratki dobi v Beli hiši napravil že preko 45.000 milj poti v tujini in doma. Njegova česta potovanja so naletela na precejšnjo kritiko, pa ga to ni došlo zmotilo. Kljub pozivom v javnosti in Kongresu, naj ostane doma in se loti reševanja nujnih vprašanj, ima v načrtu vrsto novih potovanj.

Tako bo, kot je bilo objavljeno, obiskal LR Kitajsko, pa tudi Indijo, Romunijo in Zahodno Nemčijo. Razmišljajo in pripravljajo tudi obisk predsednika Forda v Latinski Ameriki.

Sparkman bo pazil na ZN


WASHINGTON, D.C. — Sen. John J. Sparkman, ki bo v novem Senatu nasledil odišlega Fulbrighta kot načelnik zunanje politične odbora, je zelo kritičen glede ZN in je napovedoval, da bo skrbno zasledoval njihovo delo.

SADAT STAVLJA DVA POGOJA ZA PRIZNANJE OBSTOJA DRŽAVE IZRAEL

Egiptski predsednik naj bi bil pripravljen priznati Izraelu pravico do mirnega obstoja, če se umakne na meje pred junijsko vojno 1967 in prizna arabsko palestinsko državo.

Gaze.

Anvar Sadat naj bi bil rekelenekemu avstrijskemu obiskovalcu, da so arabski vodniki na konferenci v Rabatu dokončno sklenili priznati obstoj države Izrael, če se ta umakne z arabskega ozemlja, zasedenega v juniski vojni 1967 in se pobota s Palestinsko osvobodilno organizacijo ter pristane na ustanovitev Palestinske arabske države, sestojecih iz Zahodnega brega danijske Palestine in področja Gaze.



Dosej ta vest še ni bila potrjena z nobene uradne strani, ta končnemu sporazumu. Egiptski predsednik Sadat kaže na eni strani precejšnjo užiranost in izjavlja pripravljenost na ponoven delen dogovor o izraelskem umiku, za kar se prizadeva posebno ameriški državni tajnik Kissinger, na drugi strani pa svari, da je Srednji vzhod bomba, ki lahko vsak čas poči, če ne bodo pogajanja za sporazum v doglednem času privedla do kakega novega uspeha. Sadatu je vsak nadaljnji zasvet pogajanj skrajno neveren.

Med tem se Egipt pripravlja na sprejem sovjetskega voditelja Leonida I. Brežnjeva, napovedan za 14. januar 1975. Tedaj si bo Egipt skušal zagotoviti nove dobave sovjetskega orožja, ki bi ga naj usposobil za morebitni nov vojni spopad.

Opozvalci položajo na Srednjem vzhodu sodijo, da je Sadat za mirno rešitev sporov, za pomiritev Arabcev z Izraelom, toda pod pogoji, ki naj pokažejo arabsko moč in dajo palestinskim Arabcem vsaj nekaj od tega, kar zahtevajo. Nihče pri sedanjem razpoloženju ne more biti gotov, kako se bo položaj v Palestini razvil dalje, če bo ustanovljena tam Arabska Palestine, sestojecih iz Zahodnega brega in Gaze. Brez resnične pomiritve med Arabci in Izraelci v Palestini ne more biti stalnega miru in varnosti za nobeno stran. Do resnične pomiritve, ki ji naj sledi ustvaritev medsebojnega zaupanja in mirnega tekmovanja, je še zelo dolga pot, če bi tudi na kak čudezen način res prišlo do uradne pomiritve med Arabci in Izraelci po priznanju obeh palestinskih držav, Izraela in Arabske Palestine.

Benefit shows \$18,000 for Slovenian Aged Home

It was the third Christmas season in which our volunteer radio committee headed by John Pestotnik sponsored a marathon benefit for the building fund of the Slovene Home for the Aged on Neff Road.

For the first time, the event, which was expanded to a 12-hour marathon from Noon till Midnight on December 21, was held at a local Slovenian hall, namely the Slovenian Workmen's Home on Waterloo Road.

During three WXEN broadcasts from Noon till 1:30, 7 till 8 p.m. and 11 p.m. till Midnight, the three special phones rang constantly with pledges and good wishes from the callers. Hundreds of other patrons brought thousands of dollars in person to the hall, contributed with their attendance gifts, donated kbaed goods, and generally patronized the refreshment counters in conjunction with the dance and show which took place at the Hall. The total pro-

ceeds came to some \$18,000.

At least a dozen well known polka bands, several vocalists, and button box stars added to the color of the entertainment. Our "Tony's Polka Party" radio broadcasts were co-hosted by Eddie and Dennis Bucar and Cy Bartlett of WELW; Sandy Kozel, formerly of WELW; Cilka Dolgan of WZAK; and State Representative-elect Dennis Eckart. Jim Kozel coordinated all of the entertainers.

The \$4,000 donation from the national office of SNPJ, the Slovenian National Benefit Society and the \$1,000 individual cash donation from Emil Krizman helped to boost the total however all donations from \$5 and up were recognized at the marathon.

All of the volunteer helpers, musicians, Waterloo Home directors, and co-ordinators all contributed their time.

Their contribution cannot be measured in dollars but if it were possible, I'm sure it would be another \$18,000 at least.

A New Year's Resolution

EXERCISE: THE NEW MIRACLE DRUG

Heart disease is the prime killer in the U.S.A.

If you have heart disease, should you take it easy?

Not on your life, according to a new trend in medicine which is prescribing sports instead of drugs.

Today's world is full of aggravation, anxiety and anger. The best defense against these is to keep your heart at work. It makes good sense. Whether the person has heart disease or not, he must maximize himself. He must seek his optimum function physically, psychologically, and spiritually. This natural health of mind and body comes from inside, not outside. To attain this, the patient needs advice, not medicine. And the best advice is very simple: 'Be an athlete.'

There was a time when our existence depended on being an athlete. Simple day-to-day living called on all of man's adaptive functions, required no less than physical excellence. 'Man attains his highest development,' wrote biologist Alexis Carrel, 'when he is exposed to the rigors of the seasons, when he conquers food and shelter at the price of strenuous efforts.'

For the great majority of us, that state no longer exists. Today's rigors are entirely different. Exposure in today's environment is exposure to tensions and aggravations, to anxiety and guilt and anger and boredom.

It is exposure to sugar and salt and alcohol and cigarettes, to superficial goals and unrewarding achievements. It is exposure to what is destructive and not purifying. It is exposure to things to which there is no adaptation.

Today's diseases are the interaction of a susceptible individual with that destructive environment. A matter of his inborn inadequacies meeting head-on with an affluent, competitive, physically immobile culture.

The athlete, on the other hand, returns to the original struggle of life. He returns to a discipline that protects him from affluence and its effects.

Returns to competition that is free from guilt and self-destruction. Returns to physical excellence that restores his self-image and corrects his life-style. Man has to train his muscles. He must tire and rest himself, he has to fight and suffer and be happy. His will needs alternately to strain and relax. He must strive against his fellow men or himself. He is made for work and not for idling.

The presence of heart illness only accentuates the need for these activities. If disease is, in part, due to the environment, we must act against that environment. And the first act is action. The less the body does the less it can do. The less the mind does the less it can do. The muscles are set into motion and then follow all the adaptive mechanisms of the heart, the respiratory system, the digestive system, the kidneys, the sweat glands, the endocrine glands, the nervous system. This also sets in motion emotional and psychological and spiritual events that are less easily charted but equally important. As we return to fitness, to a state where we are bone and muscles and no more, we also remove the psychological and spiritual fat that had contributed to our bloated lives.

When the patient becomes an athlete, he accepts the discipline that same sport imposes. What he eats, how much he sleeps, when he rests. And for the heart patient, when he walks instead of rides in a car, when he pedals a bike instead of drives a car.

Walking is the most inexpensive, readily available sport to all heart patients. It requires no membership, no equipment, no dues. But it does require desire, devotion and determination.

Be an athlete in 1975.

The Sisters of Charity were living in a small frame house for 35 years at Fulton and Monroe streets. In 1885 they moved into quarters at St. Vincent Charity Hospital. After 5 years they resided at the Motherhouse and Novitiate at 14808 Lake Avenue. In 1957 the sisters moved into their present motherhouse in Richfield, Ohio.

The sisters are continuing their work in the apostolates of health, education, and welfare, thru hospitals, social agencies, and other works of charity.

Presently St. Vincent Charity Hospital has the following units: Acute Section, Cardiac Pavilion, Intensive Care Unit, Medical and Surgical Unit, Neurosurgical Unit, Pediatrics, Private Units, Psychiatry Unit, and Surgical Cardiac Unit, plus Rosary Hall.

Here are some of the highlights and achievements over the years:

In 1872, a surgical and amphitheatre, and operating rooms were built, one of the first in the nation, to instruct students and other physicians in surgery.

A free medical dispensary for the poor was opened in 1894.

The school of nursing opened in 1898. In 1900 an eye clinic, a women's surgical wing in 1902.

The building was wired for electricity in 1907.

A major addition in 1916, a new hospital wing adding 100 surgical beds.

The electrocardiograph lab opened in 1932, blood bank in 1938, and cancer clinic in 1947.

Rosary Hall was opened in 1952, one of the first in the United States to open a unit for the rehabilitation of victims of alcoholism.
