Senat za uravnovešen zvezni proračun 1981

Senat je nepričakovano izglasoval zakonski predlog, ki doliča uravnovešen proračun ZDA v letu 1981.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsednik Carter je ob svojem nastopu izjavljal, da bo dosegel ob koncu svoje prve poslovne dobe kot predsednik ZDA uravnovešenje zveznega proračuna. Veličko jih je bilo, ki so v to napoved dvomili, in končno je vladama sama izjavila, da bo treba ta cilj kot nedosegljiv odložiti za kako leto ali dve.

Sedaj se je nepričakovano oglasil Senat in povedal, da hoče uravnovešen proračun v letu 1981, takrat, kot je to Carter prvotno napovedal. Predlog je bil izglasovan v razmerju 58:29 kot dopolnilo k zakonskemu predlogu, ki odobrava 1.7 milijona dolarjev v International Monetary Fund.

Zakladno tajništvo računa, da bo imela zvezna vlada letos 53 bilijonov dolarjev manj dohodkov kot izdatkov. Proračunski direktor James McIntyre Jr. je predvidel, da bo v proračunskega skupinu, ki bo naj imela vla- da ZDA po sklepu Senata le toliko izdatkov kot dohodkov, primanjkljaj dejansko moguče zmanjšati na 20 bilijonov dolarjev!

O v Senatu izglasovanem predlogu bo razpravljala konferenca Senata in Doma, kateri je bil poslan v nadaljnjo razpravo. Težja po omejitvi zveznih izdatkov, ki jo je pokazal sklep Senata, je očitna tudi v Predstniškem domu.

Dčitki pri razgovorih med Nanojem in Pekingom

PEKING, LR Kit. — V Hanoju, glavnem mestu Vietnama so se ta teden začeli razgovori med LR Kitajsko in Vietnamom o točnosti enega milijona Kitajcev, ki živijo v Vietnamu. Do razgovorov na ravnini namestnikov zunanjih ministrov je prišlo po mesecih javnega prepiranja in napadanja.

Kitajski zastopnik je takoj ob odprtju razgovorov obdolžil Vietnam, kršenja dogovora med obema državama iz leta 1955, ki da je uredil vprašanje kitajskih priseljenikov v Vietnamu.

Kitajci trdijo, da jih vietnameske oblasti zapostavljajo, preganjajo in izganjajo. Okoli 180.000 naj bi se jih že vrnilo v LR Kitajsko, nekaj tisoč pa se jih je preselilo na Formozo. Kitajci v Vietnamu so bili pretežno trgovci in obrtniki. Vietnameske oblasti so jim letos v marcu in aprilu zasegle trgovine in delavnice ter jih hotele naseliti na deželi kot poljedelce, čemur pa se Kitajci upirajo.

Zvezna vlada jamčila posojila New Yorku

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Predsednik Carter je pred kakim 5.000 ljudmi podpisal pretekli torki v mestni hiši New Yorka zakon o jamstvu zvezne vlade za 1.65 bilijona dolarjev dogovora, ki je del dolgov v okviru načrta za postopno ozdravljenje ja so postavili gen. Policarpa Paza Garcia.

Zadnje vesti

Govorce o možnosti povišanja cen olja še pred prihodnjim letom

Ali bo prihodnji mesec posebni sestanek OPEC, še ni odločeno.

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Zadnje dni so se začele širiti govorce, da se bodo zastopniki držav, izvoznic olja, prihodnji mesec se stali na pozelen posvet, ki bi naj razpravljal o povišanju sedanjih cen olja še pred prihodnjim letom. Padanje vrednosti ameriškega dolarja napram trdnim valutam je začelo nekatere od izvoznic olja močnejše pri zadevati.

Cetudi se vesti o takem sestanku vstrajno vzdržujejo, je glavni tajnik OPEC Ali M. Jaid izjavil, da so te preurjenje. Ta eden je prišel v New York na udeležbo razprave Ameriške odvetniške zbornice o vprašanju energije. O napovedovanem sestanku OPEC v septembru je dejal, da odločitev o tem še ni padla.

Med tem postaja precej jasno, da bodo izvoznice olja podražile ne preje z novim letom za najmanj 5%. Če ne bo sestanka v septembru, bodo odločile o tem na rednem sestanku, ki je napovedan za 16. december v Abu Dhabi.

Države izoznice olja bodo razpravljale verjetno znova tudi o tem, ali naj ostanejo pri dolarju kot plačilnem sredstvu ali naj bo za to določena "košarica" trdnih valut skupaj z dolarjem. Negotovost o tem tišči vrednost dolarja navzdol.

Zaposlitev izven kmetij drži ljudi na na deželi

BRUXELLES, Belg. — V včini držav Evropske gospodarske skupnosti se je beg s podeželja v mesta in industrijska središča unesel; od kar so začele rasti manjše tovarne na podeželju, kjer nudijo zaposlitev tamkajšnjemu prebivalstvu.

Kmetij imajo tako možnost delne zaposlitve doma in delne izven svojih kmetij, kar povečuje večje spremembe.

RIM, It. — Včeraj je na tisoče ljudi izkazalo začetno čast pokojnemu papežu Pavlu VI., ki leži na mrtvaškem odu v cerkvi sv. Petra. Nocoj bodo krsto zaprli, jutri pa bodo po pogrebi sv. maši položili truplo umrlega papeža v kripto cerkve sv. Petra. Kolegij kardinalov je sklenil, da se bo začel konklate za volitev novega papeža 25. avgusta.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Cene živiljenjskih potrebnih so pretekli mesec porastle za 0.5%, najmanj od preteklega marca.

Glavni vzrok počasnejši rasti

cen je v padcu cen hrane za 0.3%, prven od lanske jeseni. Zvezna vlada upa, da bodo cene rastle v naslednjih mesecih počasnejše in da v celiem letu 1978 ne bodo porastle nad 7.2%.

TEGUCIGALPA, Hond. — Vodniki so izjavili, da so odstavili gen. Melgarja Castra, kot predsednika republike zaradi občolitve, da je vrla vmesana v tihotapljenje kokaina. Za novega državnega poglavnika načrta za postopno ozdravljenje ja so postavili gen. Policarpa Paza Garcia.

Japonci in Kitajci

iščejo končni dogovor

Japonska delegacija pod vodstvom zunanjega ministra se pogaja za končno besedilo mirovne pogodbe s Kitajsko v Pekingu.

PEKING, LR Kit. — Od srede se vršijo tu razgovori med zastopnima Japonske in LR Kitajske o dokončni obliki besedila za mirovno pogodbo, ki naj ustvari temelj za obsežno gospodarsko sodelovanje in dobre sedne odnose med obema državama. Pogajanja za pogodbo so se začela leta 1972, pa so bila ponovno prekinjena in so občljekovana.

Fred nekaj meseci sta se Peking in Tokio dogovorila, da pogajanja obnovita in končata. V glavnem med obema ni kakih posebnih spornih točk, ki bi se tiskale le njih, glavna težava je stališče do Sovjetske zveze.

V Pekingu hočejo vključiti v mirovno pogodbo stavek, ki naj vezal obe podpisnici k skupnemu nastopu proti taki tretji državi, ki bi si hotela lastiti podstavo nad Azijo. Peking nič ne tudi, da misli pri tem na Sovjetsko zvezo, Tokio pa bi se rad takemu tolmačenju izognil če bi že moral stavek sprejeti v besedilo pogodbe.

Japonsko zastopstvo vodi zunaj minister Sunao Sonoda, kitajsko pa zunaj minister Huang Hua. Japonsko zastopstvo upa, da mu bo, tokrat uspelo dosegiti sporazum, ki bo sprejemljiv za oba strani in ga tudi v Moskvi ne bodo smatrati za proti njej naperjenega.

Z dvignjenim glasom je Homola pribil: "Mi določamo, kdo bo poučeval na teoloških fakultetah. V tem ne dopustimo debate z nikomer!" V istem referatu je Homola omenil, da je kljub vsemu prizadevanju partije prosilo za vpis v semenišča za prihodnje leto na Slovaškem 70 kandidatov. To je "kričeči dokaz", dejal Homola, "da veram nekakor ni le zadeva starih bab".

Zaupno poročilo katoličanov iz Slovaške pravi, da jih manj skrbi to, kar je bilo že v aprilu jasno, da namreč pogajanja med Prago in Vatikanom ne bodo uspeli. Bolj jih skrbi, da bodo komunisti pod pretvezo, da se pogajajo z Vatikanom, delali s Cerkvijo, kar bodo hoteli. Poročilo iz Češkoslovaške izzveni v bojanem, da v primeru, če bo šlo vse tako naprej kot doslej, ne bo ostalo nič, o čemer bi se sprostili mogli pogajati.

TITO STAVLJA VSE UPE NA ZVEZO Z ZAHODOM?

PARIS, Fr. — Znani L'Aurore

vo afrokomunistom v Angoli, Tanzaniji in Etiopiji. Ti sami si podpirajo vojno v Ogadenu, ki so jo vodili Rusi in Kubanci... Imenuješ to neodvisnost?

Tu drug primer twoje skrivne pravovernosti: Ko se je Kitajska, katera je, kot veš, ogrožena po sovjetskem imperializmu, kot sem jaz, približala Zahodu? in NATO ter se odločila kupiti od Italije orožje in celo poslati vojaško zastopstvo, da bi Te obiskalo v Rimu, kaj je Tvoja svobodna komunistična partija storila? Ti si napadel Peking in podprli rusko vrhovnost?"

Bil je namerno tajen sestanek. O njem ni bila puščena v javnost nobena vest, četudi je občljekoval del sveta bližje nam, kot sta Afrika ali Bližnji vzhod ali katerakoli druga vroča točka na zemlji.

Uporabljajoč priložnost občanja 30-letnice Zveze komunistov Jugoslavije v Beogradu v velikem obsegu je stari maršal Tito zrazil željo po sestanku z vodnikom Italijanske Komunistične partije Enricom Berlinguerjem. Z njim je hotel imeti pomembnejši razgovor. Tito ve, da so njegova leta šteta, da je bodočnost njegove dežele na tehnici in da nevarnost vpadu v zvezno postaja določnejša. On ne morevači v prazno. On nima več časa za to.

Bistri in občljivi Berlinguer je vedel, kaj ga čaka in se je zato skušal temu izogniti ter poslati svojega tovariša Pajetta na jugoslovansko slavje. "Mislim odvreči vse s svojimi prsi," je rekel Tito. "Četudi Ti greši in poveči vse Brežnevovo. Jaz se ne brigam, on ve, kaj jaz mislim in Ti mi ne moreš povedati nič novega."

"Toda Berlinguer, Ti bi naj ne pozabil, da si Italijan in pred vsemi drugimi patriot. Ti si moraš zapomniti, da moraš braniti neko deželo in da more priti trenutek, ko se boš moral upreti vpadu!"

Berlinguer je bil ospel in Tito mu je mrzlo rekel, da stavlja vse svoje upe na težno vojaško in gospodarsko zvezo z Zahodom, pri kateri bi mogla Italija igrat bistveno vlogo. "Ce seveda ne bo sprejela twoje vrzti komunizma!"

Italijanski diplomat, ki poznava celotno zadevo, nam je dejal: "Stvari so tajno že v teku. Deželi, ki se nista mogli trpeti in je Trst postal sporna kost med njima, Italija in Jugoslavijo, sta izmenjali vojaška zastopstva."

Komaj pred nekaj leti, kadar je imela Italija vojaške vaje v Furlaniji in Benečiji, je Beograd avtomatično okreplil svojo mejo, kot da bi mogla od tam priti nevarnost. Zdaj, pred nekaj dnevi, so bili Titovi vojaški opazovalci navzveči pri vajah italijanskih oklopnih divizij v zvezi z ameriškim povojljstvom NATO.

Tito, ki sumi, da imajo Sovjeti načrte vpasti v Jugoslavijo po njegovi smrti, se tajno močno naslanja na krščansko-demokratsko Italijo; ker taka resnično atlantska Italija bi se čutila nepravilno ogroženo in začrljeno ob jugoslovanskem vprašanju. Ne bi se igrala s prsti, ki bi se sto tisoč jugoslovanskih partizanov borili z napadalcem.

Dejansko računa Tito na italijansko brodovje, ki ima precejšnjo ognjeno moč, pri obrambi dalmatinske obale, če bi bilo potrebno, in na ameriške rakete na področju Verone, ki bi lahko služile kot svarilo. Tajna pogajanja med Rimom in Beogradom se morda že bolj napredovala kot ljude mislijo. Jaz lahko rečem, da bo italijansko brodovje letos prvič tekom svojih poletnih vojaških vaj med Sicilijo in Malto poslano v avgustu in Benetke in Trst za posebne vaje.

In orožje iz Italije, težko orožje in drugo, se ušiva v Južne Amerike in drugo, da se ušiva v Južno Ameriko. Toda stori samo v besedah in da Tvoja dejanja nasprotujejo temu, kar govorijo, ker Ti dejansko podpiraš moskovsko politiko v Evropi in v Afriki.

Hocé žigled? Pajetta poje slavno splošno za dosti umirjen in zanesljiv list, kljub temu pa je treba gornje poročilo jemati "z zrnom sclo".





65th Anniversary

June 22, 1978

Cleveland, Ohio — June 22nd commemorates the 65th anniversary of the FIRST GRADUATION, taken place in ST. VITUS SCHOOL.

This class entered the portals of the educational era in September 1905. There were about a 100 of us then. We were met by a nice petite warm hearted — with a kind smile Ven Sister Mary Manette who greeted us in Slovenian — which made us feel sort of at home right away. She was a wonderful teacher, but a little later on we learned that she also had an iron hand. The size of our class, through the years, by people moving from community to community to other parts of the city and a few years later when St. Paul's parish built their school, began to dwindle from year to year. Also at that time when a child was twelve usually quit school and went to work — so the classes never went beyond 7th grade. Then in September of 1912 — 7 of us showed up for the 8th grade. Three boys and four girls. We were then met by Ven Sister Mary Candida, who was thrilled to have the honor of putting through the first 8 grade to GRADUATE. We were very enthusiastic and studied hard and were bound to make Sister Candida and our parents proud of us. Then, in mid-year one of the boys notified us that he is quitting school right there and then. That he has a job lined up and he will be getting on the job training. He walked out and never came back. So, the 8th grade had 6 of us left. Two boys, Frank Kastelic and Victor Hrovat. Four girls — Angela Ermakora, Mary Hrovat, Mary Macerol and Emma Zakrajsek.

When we were notified that all 6 of us passed our exams with honors, we began preparation for our graduation, which was to be on June 22. When the day finally came — a beautiful, sunny Sunday, it was with Holy Mass in the morning in the old St. Vitus Church on Norwood Rd., and graduation exercises at 7:30 o'clock in the evening in the old St. Vitus School on Norwood Rd., which is now gone forever. In honor of this occasion, the whole school participated. Every grade performed, either with recitations, songs, skits, playlets and little farewell poems. Then came time for the graduating class to do their thin. We were to sing "Whispering Hope", a favorite of Rev. John Oman, the assistant at St. Vitus. I can just visualize — what a time Mr. Matt Holmar, organist, had to get us ready to a degree that we could give a decent rendition for a fare-well performance.

A few words from our beloved Pastor, Rev Father Ponikvar, and then he proudly presented us with the diplomas. Were the six of us happy and exuberant, stepping up one by one to receive the emblem of our 8 year goal. Then a nice talk from Father Oman, giving us instructions on what we can expect when we get mingling with the rest of the outside world. Father Oman then presented each of us a prayer book. The boys received "The Catholic Young Men's Guide, and the





TWO WORLDS - DVA SVETOVA

By Rudolph M. Susek

During the last year several books contributing to the history of Slovene Americans have appeared in print and generally have not received the attention — or the sales — they deserve. Partly this has been because the authors or editors have not been inclined to promote themselves and their work and partly because no one has written reviews of these books and thus brought attention to them in a more informative way than advertisements can provide.

One such volume is "Two Worlds", an English translation of *Dva svetova*, which was published originally in Ljubljana in 1932 by Ivan Molek (1882-1962). Molek was a very well-known figure in the Slovene American community in the first half of this century. Intimately associated with the newspaper *Prosveta* between 1916 and 1944, Molek served as editor from 1929 to 1944, leaving in a policy dispute centering on his refusal to support the pro-Partisan (Tit) stance favored by Prosveta's parent organization, the SNPJ.

Throughout his journalistic career Molek wrote voluminously. "Two Worlds", which has been translated and published by his widow, Mary Molek, is one of his longer works. The story deals with a man named Anton Plesetz from his birth in a poor and tiny hamlet in Bela Krajina in the early 1880's. (Molek was born in 1882 in a village near Metlika) through his journey to the United States (Molek came in 1900), and to his hard early years in different Slovene American settlements, especially Calumet and in Pennsylvania (Molek was in Pa. from 1900-1902 and in Calumet from 1902-1906). Thus a fair share of the material is autobiographical.

Because Molek's perspective was, in today's terms, "leftist", the tone of "Two Worlds" generally is pessimistic, stressing mainly the kinds of hardships the early Slovene immigrants were inclined to encounter. There is much description of the economic injustice practiced on the Slovenes by their employers and, to some degree, by fellow Slovenes. The "Church" comes in for criticism, as does what Plesetz-Molek sees as the too passive nature of the immigrants, their refusal to stand up for their rights.

Why is this translation of "Dva svetova" so valuable a contribution to the still sparse literature on Slovene American history? First, it helps give some flavor to that history. It is not that there are specific facts contained in it that are useful to a historian, nor even that there is any obligation to accept the interpretation as entirely accurate. Rather, it discourses in subjective

and revealing terms concepts which scholars of ethnic history are debating today among themselves. What kind of knowledge about America did Slovenes have prior to departure? How accurate was it? Molek discusses this at some length. How much of a shock was the real America to these pre-1914 immigrants and in what ways did they adjust? "Two Worlds" explores this. What were living conditions really like for these low-paid workers who mostly, when jobs were available, had to labor under back-breaking conditions? This too is presented.

Second, "Two Worlds" is a most useful corrective to much of the literature about early Slovene American life which appears not only among Slovenes but among other ethnic groups as well, namely, the tendency to stress only the positive, the good, the achievements. That there were many of these certainly is true, and they deserve to be recorded for posterity. But the history of Slovene Americans of any group, even of any individual, is more complicated than this. There are hardships and failures too, and these must be presented as well as achievements. Otherwise, it is not history but propaganda, and the more perceptive will see such one-sided approaches more as a joke than anything else. Even though many might find "Two Worlds" unpleasant reading to some degree, it serves a very useful purpose, gives a degree of balance that more filiopeitic writings, to use a technical term, do not present.

"Two Worlds" does have certain problems. The translator attempted to follow the Slovene original too closely — her deliberate intention, it must be said — and so many of the sentences are choppy, with awkward phrasings and word usage. But these and some other difficulties should not dissuade persons interested in learning more about the history of the Slovene American group from securing a copy of the book. It is available at Tivoli Enterprises, 6419 St. Clair Ave., in Cleveland, for only \$3.45. This probably is less than the costs of production for the 164 page paperback. Or, the book can be ordered directly from Mary Molek, P.O. Box 438, Dover Del., 19901. In this case the cost includes 50 cents extra for postage.

Finally, Mrs. Molek published a book of her own childhood and young adult memoirs under the title "Imigrant Woman". This also is available at Tivoli for \$3.95 and from Mrs. Molek for \$4.45. In some ways it is better than "Two Worlds", but interested Slovene Americans and others would do well to have copies of each on their shelves.
